The programme seeks to encourage cooperation at national and regional level between cultural organisations and operators and the cultural institutions of the Member States, to promote the flowering of cultural creation by ensuring the viability of artistic projects, and to support measures which, by their European scope and character, promote the spread of European cultures both inside and outside the Union.

- to develop exchanges and cooperation between the various operators in the plastic arts sector,
- to facilitate the movement of creations, works and artists in Europe,

# II. Description of implementing measures

The objectives of the activities described in Section I will be implemented by means of the following measures:

 Support for integrated activities in the context of structured transnational cultural cooperation agreements

The Commission shall encourage closer relations and joint working, particularly by the networking of operators, cultural bodies, cultural institutions involving in particular professionals in different Member States with a view to realising structured cultural projects both within and outside the Community. This measure relates to significant quality projects on a large scale and with a European dimension, involving at least five States participating in the Culture 2000 programme. The 'cultural cooperation agreements' proposed in this way for up to three years shall comprise some or all of the following activities:

- co-productions of works and other large-scale cultural events (e.g. exhibitions, festivals, etc.) making them accessible to as many EU citizens as possible,
- cultural events, and enhancement of cultural sites and monuments within the Community with a view to raising awareness of European culture,
- activities aimed at developing further education and mobility for professionals in the cultural field (artists, restorers, museum curators, etc.) both in academic and practical terms, including the use of new technology,
- study and research projects, public awareness campaigns, activities for teaching and the dissemination of knowledge, seminars, congresses, meetings on cultural topics of European importance.

After the opinion of the Committee referred to in Article 4a of this Decision has been heard, Community support shall be granted for the realisation of 'cultural cooperation agreements'. It shall be intended to cover not only part of the funding of the project, but also expenses relating to the establishment of lasting cooperation, which may be multiannual, in a legal form recognised in one of the Member States of the Union.

In order for the agreement to be eligible, the activities it covers must involve operators from at least five States participating in the 'Culture 2000' programme.

Community support shall not exceed 60% of the budget for 'cultural cooperation agreements'. It shall not exceed ECU 200 000 per year.

Priority access will be given to those young people most in need.

Support for 'Youth Initiatives' shall encourage extension of these projects to include similar initiatives conducted in other Member States in order to strengthen their transnational nature and greatly expand exchanges of experience and cooperation between young people. This aid may include organising meetings of young promoters of Europe-wide initiatives. Financial aid may be granted towards the effective establishment of stable partnerships designed to enhance the impact and permanence of transnational youth initiatives.

Initiatives designed to encourage tolerance and the acceptance of differences, as well measures combating all forms of exclusion, should be given specific encouragement and stimulation.

The Community shall be receptive to initiatives involving cultural and sporting activities as a vital form of communication between young people at Community level.

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission communication (COM(98)0333 C4-0410/98),
- having regard to the conclusions of the Presidency following the European Council in Cardiff on 15-16 June 1998 (¹),
- having regard to its resolution of 18 June 1998 on the outcome of the meeting of the European Council in Cardiff on 15-16 June 1998 (2),
- having regard to European Parliament and Council Decision No 2179/98/EC on the review of the European Community programme of policy and action in relation to the environment and sustainable development 'towards sustainability' (3),
- having regard to Articles 6, 2 and 3 of the Amsterdam Treaty,
- having regard to the Agenda 2000 package and the legislative proposals contained therein,

- having regard to the EU's Kyoto commitments and to Parliament's resolution of 17 September 1998 on climate change in the run-up to Buenos Aires (¹),
- having regard to the European Community biodiversity strategy adopted by the Commission (COM(98)0042 — C4-0140/98) and the recommendations made by the European Parliament and Council on this subject,
- having regard to the future enlargement of the European Community and the negotiations in progress,
- having regard to the conclusions of the joint Environment/Transport Council of 17 June 1998,
- having regard to its resolution of 14 May 1997 on the Commission's communication on implementing Community environmental law (COM(96)0500 — C4-0591/96) (<sup>2</sup>),
- A. whereas the Commission's communication 'Partnership for Integration' clearly and concisely outlines the issues at stake and highlights the need for further integration, which, in its own terms, is no longer an option but an obligation,
- B. whereas the recommendations contained in the communication are not sufficiently detailed and concrete to ensure rapid and steady progress towards integration,
- C. whereas the Presidency conclusions of the Cardiff European Council in June 1998 (paragraphs 32-36) deliver a clear message to the Council of Ministers in all its relevant formations aimed at ensuring that integration of the environment into all other Community policies becomes a reality,
- D. whereas the present internal organisation of work in the Council and the Commission does not provide an appropriate basis for implementing the integration principle as laid down in the Treaty,
- E. whereas the Community lacks the guidelines and indicators needed to monitor the degree of integration achieved and also lacks mechanisms to correct a situation of insufficient integration,
- F. whereas, recognising the prerogatives of the European Court of Justice to interpret the Treaty's integration requirements, the objective can in the end only be attained by a change in attitude by decision-makers away from traditional sectoral processes and thinking,
- G. whereas no legislative proposals to implement the integration principle are planned,
- H. whereas the review of the Fifth Environment Action Programme has strengthened the requirement of environmental integration and has listed detailed Community priority objectives in respect of other policy areas such as agriculture, transport, energy, industry and tourism,
- whereas Article 3c of the Amsterdam Treaty (Article 6 of the consolidated Treaty) lays down the
  obligation to integrate environmental requirements into the definition and implementation of all
  Community policies and activities,
- J. whereas the 'Agenda 2000' package, the Community strategy for implementing the Kyoto protocol and the Commission communication on a European Community biodiversity strategy are major challenges for the Community, not only in their own right, but also as regards application of the integration principle,
- K. whereas the enlargement process could create the perfect opportunity to apply the integration principle at the beginning of a legislative process, ie. the applicant countries' fulfilment of the *acquis communautaire*,
- L. whereas there have only rarely been joint meetings of the Environment Council with other Councils,
- M. whereas there is a close link between integration of environmental requirements into other Community policies and the efficient implementation and enforcement of EU environment law,

- 1. Welcomes the Commission communication and believes it to be a realistic and solid launchpad for attaining the overall objective of sustainable development through integration of environmental requirements into other EU policies;
- 2. Regrets, however, that the recommendations it contains are not sufficiently ambitious and considers that a much more detailed action plan, including specific measures to be taken by individual institutions and timetables, is necessary to achieve the desired result;
- 3. Acknowledges the part it is called upon to play in the proposed 'partnership for integration' between the Council, Parliament and the Commission with the objective of including the environment in other areas of Community policy; is prepared to contribute to promoting that partnership, and calls for matching contributions also to be made by its partners;
- 4. Is prepared to share responsibility jointly with the Council and the Commission for the practical implementation of the provisions of Article 6 of the Treaty of Amsterdam;
- 5. Undertakes to review its organisational procedures to ensure that the need for environmental aspects to be included in decision-making is taken into account;
- 6. Calls on the Commission to arrange for all relevant proposals to be accompanied from now on by environmental impact statements, modelled for instance on those used to evaluate the impact of proposals on small and medium-sized enterprises;
- 7. Calls on the Council to consider as a matter of urgency the Commission proposal for a Council Directive on the assessment of the effects of certain plans and programmes on the environment (COM(96)0511 C4-0191/97) (1) and to reach a common position without delay;
- 8. Repeats its request for binding legislation on the integration of environment and sustainability and on consumer protection in the form of a framework Directive;
- 9. Calls on future Council Presidencies to plan at least one joint Council meeting every six months involving the environment ministers on the one hand and ministers responsible for the following areas on the other: agriculture, transport, energy, industry and tourism, identified by the Fifth Environment Action Programme as most environmentally sensitive; these joint meetings should not replace ordinary environment Council meetings and the agendas should focus specifically on practical integration issues and legislation under consideration; all Ecofin and other Council meetings dealing with Structural Funds issues should consult the Environment Council on the practical implementation of integration;
- 10. Calls on the Council to ensure that integration, implementation and enforcement are discussed by relevant sectoral councils at least once each half year, so that progress towards sustainable development can be monitored;
- 11. Calls on the Commission in its annual work programme to indicate clearly how it is going to proceed in implementing its communication;
- 12. Calls on the Commission to establish clear guidelines and indicators for monitoring and evaluation of the degree of integration attained; guidelines already established or under consideration for codes of good agricultural practice could serve as models in this process;
- 13. Calls for the importance of environmental questions to be recognised in connection with Agenda 2000, the Community strategy for implementing the Kyoto protocol and the European Community biodiversity strategy, and is receptive to the prospect of talks with the Council and the Commission on mechanisms that will guarantee that those initiatives can be implemented; considers that it will also be necessary for provisions to be laid down to enable joint monitoring of the progress achieved;

Takes the view that major challenges facing the Community, such as enlargement, the 'Agenda 2000' reforms, the post-Kyoto strategy and the European Community biodiversity strategy provide opportunities for Community institutions and Member States to demonstrate their commitment to realising the EU Treaty principle of integration;

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission report, COM(97)0362 C4-0484/97,
- having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community, and in particular Article 100a thereof,
- having regard to Directive 92/73/EEC widening the scope of Directives 65/65/EEC and 75/319/EEC
  on the approximation of provisions laid down by law, regulation or administrative action relating to
  medicinal products and laying down additional provisions on homeopathic medicinal products,
- having regard to Directive 92/74/EEC widening the scope of Directive 81/851/EEC on the approximation of provisions laid down by law, regulation or administrative action relating to veterinary medicinal products and laying down additional provisions on homeopathic veterinary medicinal products,
- having regard to the decision of the Court of Justice of 12 February 1998 in case C-144/97 (1),
- having regard to its opinion at first reading of 13 June 1991 (2) and its decision at second reading of 8 July 1992 (3) on the proposal for a Directive widening the scope of Directives 65/65/EEC and 75/319/EEC on the approximation of provisions laid down by law, Regulation or administrative action relating to medicinal products and laying down additional provisions on homeopathic medicinal products,
- having regard to its resolution of 29 May 1997 on the status of non-conventional medicine (4),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection and the opinions of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development, the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy, the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy and the Committee on Legal Affairs and Citizens' Rights (A4-0378/98),
- A. whereas between one fifth and one quarter of the citizens of the European Union make use of homeopathic medicinal products and whereas such products account for one percent of the turnover of the Union's pharmaceuticals industry,
- B. whereas the differences between the Member States concerning the authorisation or recognition of homeopathic medicinal products distort competition and the market,
- C. whereas the accessibility and reliability of homeopathic medicinal products need to be guaranteed and whereas users need to be assured of information,

- D. whereas transposition of Articles 2, 3, 4, 5, 10 and 11 of Directives 92/73/EEC and 92/74/EEC has resulted in a number of problems but no insuperable complaints or objections,
- E. whereas transposition of Articles 1 and 8 and of Article 9 of Directive 92/73/EEC has resulted in problems in the registration or authorisation of homeopathic anthroposophic medicinal products,
- F. whereas in a number of Member States homeopathic anthroposophic medicinal products are of considerable importance and whereas they appear in an official pharmacopoeia,
- G. whereas Article 6(2) of both Directives provides for the possibility of refraining from establishing a 'special, simplified registration procedure for homeopathic medicinal products', but whereas the Member States have made no use of this provision which, accordingly, is redundant,
- H. whereas transposition of Article 6(3) of Directive 92/73/EEC concerning advertising for homeopathic medicinal products and Article 9(1) of the two Directives concerning the authorization and labelling of homeopathic medicinal products other than those covered by a special, simplified registration procedure has not given rise to any particular problems,

# Recognition

- I. whereas Article 6(1) of the two Directives specifies that Member States 'shall take due account of registrations and authorizations granted by another Member State'; whereas this provision is so unclear *de jure* that transposition differs substantially from one Member State to another and is *de facto* too open-ended to act as an effective bar to distortions of competition; whereas a more uniform provision would result in fewer problems of interpretation and whereas only a binding provision will ensure the free movement of the products in question,
- J. whereas separate assessment of every homeopathic medicinal product in each Member State is a considerable waste of time and money and is the cause of barriers to trade because assessment criteria and margins differ; whereas such assessment must be carried out in accordance with criteria involving full guarantees of the quality and harmlessness of the product,

# Special, simplified registration procedure (SSRP)

- K. whereas a number of Member States, in transposing Article 7(1) of the two Directives, have changed the provision in question or included other provisions such that there is a risk of unfair competitive advantages arising,
- L. whereas, in accordance with the wording of Directives 92/73/CEE and 92/74/CEE, homeopathic medicinal products are only eligible for the SSRP if the degree of dilution per preparation does not exceed one part per 10 000 of the mother tincture or more than 1/100th of the smallest dose used in allopathy with regard to active principles in medicinal products requiring a doctor's prescription; whereas a number of Member States depart from this obligation; whereas this limiting of the degrees of dilution in which homeopathic active principles may be included in homeopathic medicinal products is entirely arbitrary, taking no account of factors linked to pharmaceutical form, means of administration and the formula of these products; moreover, the result of such a limit would be to withdraw from the market homeopathic medicines which have been on the market for decades, having given proof of their harmlessness, and whereas this would be very detrimental to a number of homeopathic laboratories,
- M. whereas Directive 92/73/EEC restricts the SSRP to homeopathic medicinal products for oral or external use, although this does not follow from any generally accepted health and safety rules based on scientific research; whereas a number of Member States ignore this and allow other forms of use, too; whereas the safety of the form of dosage is guaranteed, not only by its inclusion in an official pharmacopoeia, but also through application of the rules of Good Manufacturing Practice,
- N. whereas, notwithstanding Regulation (EEC) No 2377/90 laying down a Community procedure for determining residue limits of veterinary medicinal products in foodstuffs of animal origin, Directive 92/74/EEC reserves the SSRP for homeopathic medicinal products for pet animals or exotic species not intended for human consumption,

#### Labelling

- O. whereas the obligatory use of the scientific name on labels and, possibly, in the package insert does not make for clarity; whereas this is the cause of confusion and errors; whereas clarity and ease of identification are an important aid for patients and consumers,
- P. whereas the dosage provides the patient or consumer with information about the nature and purpose of a specific medicinal products,
- Q. whereas the compulsory mention of 'homeopathic medicinal product without approved therapeutic indication' on the label and, where appropriate, in the package insert is applied by the Member States in different ways; whereas specifying therapeutic indications which may or may not be approved is no part of the registration procedure; whereas this phrase has pejorative overtones which have a clearly discriminatory effect,
- R. whereas homeopathic medicinal products intended for humans must contain on the label and, where appropriate, in the package insert a warning to consult a doctor should symptoms persist 'during the use of the medicinal product'; whereas this warning is evidence of a lack of understanding of how medicinal products work and of the course of treatment or recovery; but whereas late intervention during long-term treatment should be avoided,

#### Special rules

- S. whereas it is at Member States' discretion, with regard to the testing of homeopathic medicinal products for which the SSRP is not applicable, to lay down special rules for the pharmacological, toxicological and clinical tests; whereas some Member States have done so but others have not; whereas this makes it possible to take account of differences between countries and medical cultures, but whereas this also leads to distortions of competition,
- 1. Notes that, according to Article 10 (3) of Directives 92/73/EEC and 92/74/EEC, the Commission should have reported not later than 31 December 1995 to Parliament and the Council concerning the transposition and application of the Directives by the Member States; deplores the delay incurred, whatever the reasons for this delay;
- 2. Calls on the Commission, pursuant to the report on homeopathic medicinal products and on the basis of the suggestions made by the European Parliament, to submit a proposal to amend Directive 92/73/EEC and a proposal to amend Directive 92/74/EEC;
- 3. Calls on the Commission to modify Article 1 of Directive 92/73/EEC in such a way that homeopathic anthroposophic medicinal products described in an official pharmacopoeia are given the same status as homeopathic medicinal products;

# Recognition

- 4. Calls on the Commission to investigate whether, and to what extent, a system of mutual recognition of homeopathic medicinal products can be set up on the basis of binding principles and appropriate standards:
- 5. Calls on the Commission to lay down rules for the composition of registration requests applicable by all Member States and carrying full guarantees of quality and harmlessness;
- 6. Calls on the Commission to look into the desirability and feasibility of a system of recognition of homeopathic medicinal products by a Community body of persons with expertise in this field;
- 7. Pending the setting up of such a system of coordination or harmonisation, calls for Article 6(1) of the existing Directives to be modified in such a way as to create an unmistakable obligation on the part of Member States actually to recognise registrations carried out, or authorizations granted, by other Member States, and to define exactly under which specific conditions national registration should be mutually recognised or endorsed by other Member States;

- 8. Calls on the Commission to ensure safeguards for a system of coordination or harmonisation whereby the quality of registration procedures is monitored;
- 9. Is of the opinion that the application of the mutual recognition principle should be made dependent on the application, including appropriate control mechanisms, of Good Manufacturing Practice (GAMP) and Good Laboratory Practice (GAP) and on provisions which would ensure that no Member State would be forced to lower its standards relating to problematic residues or contamination of the substances used;
- 10. Is of the opinion that common safety criteria should be defined at EU level and that the Member State in which a homeopathic product is first registered has to evaluate and document compliance with such criteria;

# Special, simplified registration procedure (SSRP)

- 11. Calls on the Commission to investigate whether homeopathic medicinal products administered by means of injection, plaster, spray, drops, suppository or by any other route other than orally or for external use with no risk to the health or safety of the user can be considered for the SSRP and, if so, to make the rules more flexible;
- 12. Calls on the Commission to investigate ways and means of producing a valid Community list of degrees of dilution determined for the mother tincture and, in the absence of such a list, to revise and, if possible, to increase the existing degrees of dilution;
- 13. Calls for homeopathic medicinal products for veterinary use to be given access to the SSRP regardless of the species of animal which the product is intended to cure;

# Labelling

- 14. Calls for the lifting of the ban on fantasy names, in particular for combination preparations, on condition that this does not lead to a therapeutic indication being introduced or suggested;
- 15. Calls for an obligatory indication of the dose on the label and, where appropriate, in the package insert;
- 16. Calls for an end to the obligation to use the statement 'homeopathic medicinal product without approved therapeutic indications', and calls on the Commission to examine whether the obligation to use the statement 'application in accordance with clinical homeopathic pharmacology (pharmacological picture)' affords a viable alternative;
- 17. Calls for the obligatory warning, on specific homeopathic medicinal products intended for humans, advising the user to consult a doctor if the symptoms persist 'during the use of the medicinal product' to be modified, and calls on the Commission to propose doing away with the words 'during the use of the medicinal product';

# Special rules

- 18. Calls on the Commission to submit a proposal, with the full participation of experts in homeopathic medicines, obliging Member States to draw up special rules for the pharmacological, toxicological and clinical tests for the testing of homeopathic medicinal products which are not eligible for the SSRP;
- 19. Calls on the Commission to submit to the European Parliament and the Council a report, no later than three years after the entry into force of the Directive amended in this way, on the progress achieved in regard to completion of the market and the free movement of homeopathic medicinal products;
- 20. Calls on the Commission to report without delay on the studies and surveys conducted on research into the effectiveness of homeopathic and other alternative treatments within the framework of the Community R&D programme for Biomedicine (budget heading B6-7142);

Considers that, as part of the biomedicine section of the Fifth R&D Framework Programme, research activities in the field of alternative medicine should be promoted on the basis of the report called for in the previous paragraph, with particular attention being paid to individualised and holistic approaches, the preventive role and particular features of alternative medical disciplines. These activities should include programmes for basic research into homeopathy, to be carried out by bio-medical institutions, designed in particular to explain the process of homeopathic potentisation and prove the efficacy of homeopathic high-level potencies. They should also include programmes to promote international pooling of the experience of experts in homeopathy;

Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council and the Member States.

Resolution on the report from the Commission on the Coordination of Activities to Assist Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) and the Craft Sector (COM(97)0610 - C4-0019/98

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission report, COM(97)0610 C4-0019/98,
- having regard to the motion for a resolution, pursuant to Rule 45(2), by Mr Robles Piquer on the European quality certificate for SMEs, B4-0106/98,
- having regard to the motion for a resolution, pursuant to Rule 45(2), by Mrs Ferrer on small and medium-sized businesses, B4-0430/98,
- having regard to its opinion of 19 September 1996 (1) on the proposal for a Council Decision on a third multiannual programme for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) in the European Union (1997 to 2000) (COM(96)0098 - C4-0232/96 - 96/0087(CNS)),
- having regard to its resolution of 24 April 1997 (2) on the Commission communication to the Council and the European Parliament on the integrated programme for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and the craft sector (COM(96)0329 - C4-0490/96),
- having regard to its resolution of 18 September 1997 (3) on the fourth annual report of the European Observatory for SMEs (C4-0292/97),
- having regard to its opinion of 1 April 1998 (4) on the proposal for a Council Decision on financial assistance measures for innovative and job-creating small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) the Growth and Employment Initiative (COM(98)0026 - C4-0138/98 - 98/0024(CNS)),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy and the opinions of the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy, the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs and the Committee on Regional Policy (A4-0359/98),
- A. whereas SMEs comprise 99,8% (5) of enterprises outside the primary sector and provide employment for 66% of the workforce,

- B. whereas SMEs provide jobs for relatively large numbers of women, young people and unskilled workers.
- whereas SMEs contribute to economic democracy and help to spread risks and distribute goods and services in rural areas,
- D. whereas the coordination of activities to assist SMEs and the craft sector has a twofold aim, namely to integrate the SME dimension in Community policy and to increase the participation of SMEs in Community programmes,
- E. whereas policy on SMEs falls largely within the competence of the Member States, which makes it necessary to coordinate not only internally (between Commission departments) but also externally (with and between Member States),
- F whereas the report is based on two pillars:
  - improving the climate for SMEs from the administrative, legal, financial, fiscal and social point
    of view:
  - programmes and measures to assist SMEs (access to financing and credit, structural aid and innovation, research and development, assistance with Europeanisation and internationalisation, enhancing competitiveness, promoting a spirit of enterprise, supporting specific target groups),
- G. whereas the European Parliament has already on a number of occasions had the opportunity to state its views on the various aspects of policy on SMEs, and whereas its opinions on the subject have not fundamentally changed,
- 1. Welcomes this coordination report, which provides an extensive and comprehensive overview of Community policy on SMEs;
- 2. Welcomes the fact that this report has been published in a convenient brochure format, and urges that the brochure be distributed widely, thereby helping to provide information from and about SMEs;
- 3. Endorses the statement that a small or medium-sized business is not a miniature version of a large business but possesses specific characteristics which must be taken into account in policy-making;
- 4. Agrees entirely with the Commission that legislative proposals relating to industry must be examined from the point of view of a small business and that the representative SME organisations should be systematically and duly consulted while they are being drafted;

#### Definition of the field

- 5. Expresses its appreciation of the Commission recommendation of 3 April 1996 concerning the definition of SMEs (¹), which makes a precise distinction between the medium-sized, small and micro-enterprises and is convinced that the systematic use of this definition will improve the consistency and effectiveness of all measures to assist such enterprises and will raise the profile of such measures;
- 6. Observes that this definition is not yet used in all programmes (e.g. in connection with the Structural Funds) and that the programmes in question are precisely those in which SMEs have been found to be participating too little;
- 7. Urges that aid to SME's should continue to be a priority during the programming period 2000-2006 and expects the Commission, in its proposals for this programming period, to use the definition from its own recommendation and to formulate quantitative and verifiable objectives for the participation of SMEs in these programmes;

# Sources of information and consultation

8. Draws attention to the need for authorities at the various levels of policy-making to have adequate information about SMEs, and is satisfied with the data provided by the European System of Statistics on SMEs and the European Observatory for SMEs;

- 9. Stresses that these theoretical data must be supplemented with practical experience and findings and draws attention, in this connection, to the wealth of information held by the SME organisations and the Euro-Info Centres;
- 10. Reiterates that, in order to pursue a credible policy on SMEs in general and an effective social policy in particular, it is necessary for specific representative SME organisations to be involved in the European social dialogue at every stage;
- 11. Is gratified that, at the insistence of Parliament, the Commission has announced a study of the degree of representativeness of the European social partners currently involved in the social dialogue; notes, however, that this announcement was made in the Commission's communication of 18 September 1996 on developing the social dialogue at Community level (COM(96)0448) and deplores the fact that the Commission's second communication of 20 May 1998 on adjusting and promoting the social dialogue at Community level (COM(98)0322) is still unable to report any result;
- 12. Calls on the Austrian Presidency of the Council to carry out the action agreed at Cardiff, namely the organisation of a meeting between the social partners and representatives of SMEs to study ways of improving the European social dialogue;

#### The SMEs environment

- 13. Supports, in general terms, the Commission's approach of using recommendations, communications and exchanges of best practices to encourage Member States to create a better climate for enterprise and a better apparatus of government;
- 14. Advocates that, with due regard for the division of powers and the subsidiarity principle, binding measures be proposed where necessary, and in this respect welcomes the proposal for a Directive on time limits for payment of debts as a good example;
- 15. Advocates that in fields where the EU itself does not possess any legislative powers but performs a purely external coordinating role, the Commission should where necessary also effectively encourage the Member States to make the necessary changes in their conduct to enable SMEs to benefit tangibly from coordination;
- 16. Calls on the Commission to use SME impact assessment as a fully fledged policy-making technique and to indicate in its explanatory memoranda on legislative proposals whether and in what respect such an assessment has influenced a proposal;

#### Community programmes and support measures for SMEs

- 17. Regrets that the information in the various sections of Chapter 2 of the coordination report is of unequal value and that it sometimes does and sometimes does not indicate the extent to which SMEs actually benefit from the measures intended for them and, if so, to which type of enterprises (by size and sector) this applies;
- 18. Regrets in this respect the lack of data in the section on regional aid and in various sections on the financing of and access to credit for SMEs;
- 19. Expected to be able to welcome the detailed reporting in the section on enhancing competitiveness and participation in R&TD programmes and to observe on the basis of the report that things were moving in the right direction here; is however compelled by the Court of Auditors' annual report (1996) of 18 November 1997  $(^1)$  which states that the data cited by the Commission are not reliable to call on the Commission to adjust its reporting and policy and to improve coordination between the various Directorates-General;
- 20. Notes the activities to promote the introduction of environmental management systems at SMEs, but at the same time observes that regrettably the extent to which these measures contribute to compliance with the Treaty obligation to integrate environmental policy into policy on SMEs is not being assessed;
- 21. Draws attention to the importance of proper education and training of both employers and employees in SMEs and expects the SME dimension to be appropriately incorporated into all training programmes and measures;

# Conclusion

- 22. Calls on the Commission to take account of these points in the next coordination reports and where necessary in formulating its policy;
- 23. Draws attention to Article 6 of Council Decision 97/15/EC on a third multiannual programme for small and medium-sized enterprises in the European Union (1997-2000) (¹), in which the Commission is asked to submit by the end of March 1999 an external evaluation report on policy on SMEs to make it possible to assess whether the original objectives of the third multiannual programme have been attained, taking into account a cost-benefit analysis, and all proposals which the Commission considers necessary in the light of the evaluation;
