## Order of the Vice-President of the Court of 11 October 2017 — Hungary v Commission

(Case C-204/17 P(R))

(Appeal — Order for interim measures — State aid — Hungarian tax on advertisement turnover — Progressive nature of the tax rate — Limitation of the possibility to deduct losses carried forward to companies which did not make a profit in 2013 — Decision of the European Commission declaring the aid incompatible with the internal market and ordering its recovery — Application to suspend the operation of that decision — Urgency — No need to adjudicate)

1. Application for interim measures — Suspension of operation of a measure — Request which has become devoid of purpose — No need to adjudicate

2. Appeal — Interest in bringing proceedings — Condition — Appeal capable of procuring an advantage for the party bringing it
