Operative part of the judgment

The Court:

- 1. Annuls Article 1 of Commission Decision 2006/621/EC of 2 August 2004 on the State Aid implemented by France for France Télécom;
- 2. Declares that it is no longer necessary to adjudicate on the claims for annulment of Article 2 of Decision 2006/621;
- 3. Orders the European Commission to bear its own costs as well as eight-tenths of the costs incurred by the French Republic and Orange, formerly France Télécom;
- 4. Orders the French Republic and Orange, formerly France Télécom, each to bear two-tenths of their own costs;
- 5. Orders the Federal Republic of Germany to bear its own costs.
