INTRODUCTORY COMMENTS ON THE ESTIMATES OF REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

I. GENERAL REMARKS

Over the years, the EESC has constantly followed a rigorous approach with respect to administrative expenditure, has been extremely moderate in its budget estimates and has complied with the Commission guidelines requesting a "nominal freeze" when setting up its draft estimates. Taking into account the budgetary constraints, the EESC has continuously strived to improve its good administrative practices by carefully managing expenditure and whenever possible, redeploying existing resources to potentially bring about efficiency gains.

From 2014 to 2020, the nominal increase in the EESC's budget was EUR 13.98 million or 10.9%, representing a very small increase in real terms of 1.0%, which had a negative impact on expenditure in general but especially the expenditure related to political work.

Over the same period of time, staff numbers dropped from 720 to 668, the cumulative result of the 5% staff reduction that was agreed between the institutions in 2013, the transfer of 36 posts to the European Parliament under the cooperation agreement signed in 2014, and the creation of Croatian and, most recently, Irish translation capacity.

The EESC's 2021 draft budget estimates, adopted by the EESC Bureau on 18 February 2020, are strictly in line with the basic principles set out in Article 6 of the Financial Regulation. They are the result of thorough scrutiny of all expenditure by the EESC's Commission for Financial and Budgetary Affairs (CAF), which is the supervisory body for budgetary and financial matters, and a subgroup of three members was set up for this particular purpose.

Whilst the years 2019 and 2020 cannot be considered as representative in terms of the Committee's political work, as these are both transition years (in light of the EP elections and phasing out of the previous European Commission's work programme in 2019, the renewal of the EESC in October 2020 and the gradual phasing in of political work based on the new European Commission's work programme), it is clear that in the year 2021, the EESC's activity will reach full cruising speed once again.

Therefore, the budget request for 2021, whilst strictly respecting the technical parameters and remaining broadly within the benchmarks set by the Commission's guidelines as indicated in Commissioner Hahn's letter of 15 January 2020, duly reflects the needs arising as a result of the ambitious political priorities set by the new Commission and paving the way for the future of Europe.

II. EXCEPTIONAL "ONE-OFF REQUEST" LINKED TO THE EXCHANGE OF BUILDINGS

The need for an exceptional "one-off request" for 2021, as detailed below, is linked to the buildings strategy of the two Committees (joint occupation of buildings by the EESC and the Committee of the Regions). This "one-off" request should be considered as separate from the normal budgetary request.

In line with the main priority of the EESC/CoR joint buildings strategy on "geographical concentration", the exchange of the VMA building with the B68/TRE74 buildings was confirmed in August 2019, with the signing of an administrative agreement with the European Commission.

Prior to this exchange, which will take place in September 2022, some refurbishment work is needed in the VMA building. This work will aim to increase the lifespan of this building for at least another ten years, to ensure full technical compliance with applicable standards, to allow for a reduction in energy consumption while also creating a more modern and suitable work environment and to provide a security upgrade. In this exceptional context, a budget has to be envisaged for all costs linked to preparing this exchange, which are estimated as follows for both Committees (9.44 million in total):

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- The renovation costs of the VMA building based on a technical audit (EUR 6 million)
- Refurbishment work in other buildings in order to prepare them to accommodate some of the staff moving out from the VMA building (e.g. painting, portioning, joinery, floorings), and to allow technical studies on the refurbishment work to be carried out, as well as removal costs and the cost of purchasing new furniture (EUR 1.94 million)
- Renting additional office space, firstly, as an interim solution during the renovation to limit disturbance to staff, to reduce the time needed for the renovation and to limit the costs compared to a renovation over a longer period (EUR 1.5 million based on the assumption that the EESC and the CoR could rent the Belliard 100 building currently occupied by the EEAS). Secondly, this will ultimately enable the Committee to accommodate all of its members and staff in a single group of buildings. This new group of buildings will also allow for further rationalisation and a more efficient use of office space compared to the current situation.

An early warning on the exchange of the buildings, including the need to rent an additional building and the renovation costs for an amount of EUR 6 million, was already sent to the Budgetary Authority in May 2019, in accordance with Article 266 of the Financial Regulation.

The EESC's share of these "one-off" costs based on the current sharing key between the two committees is at EUR 5.44 million and this would need to be provided outside the normal budgetary request for 2021.

It should be noted that the building exchange will provide a high return on investment in the medium to long term, both in financial terms, once the rent of the buildings occupied by the Committees after the exchange has stopped, but also in political and operational terms, by providing a fully interconnected single group of buildings. These one-off investments therefore represent a unique opportunity for both Committees.

The total increase for the draft 2021 budget estimates compared to 2020 including this "one-off" expenditure is EUR 10 576 963 or 7.42 %.

The total increase for the draft 2021 budget estimates compared to 2020 excluding this "one-off" expenditure is EUR 5 133 441 or 3.6%.

III. MEMBERS AND OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- The EESC plans an overall increase of 3.39% in chapter 10 (members and delegates). The Committee's draft estimates for 2021 strive to maximise the resources allocated to the EESC members' political work and to ensure maximum visibility and outreach of its opinions, thereby further increasing the democratic legitimacy of the European institutions. In this respect, it is proposed that the resources requested for political work be increased by 2% (item 1004 and 1008). An increase of EUR 300 000 (200.91%) has been included to reinforce item 1000 (specific allowances and payments) after the reallocation of travel agency management fees and the "laissez-passer" (pass for the members) from item 1004 to item 1000 to align with the practice implemented by other institutions.
- The draft estimates for 2021 also envisage an overall increase of 2% in chapter 26 (communication and publication) to support the outreach of its political work by increasing communication activities. This will help to ensure that Committee opinions and positions have wider coverage with a view to bringing the European Union closer to civil society.
- The budget request also aims to ensure that the administrative support provided fully allows the institution to operate smoothly and efficiently (whilst respecting the stability of the EESC's establishment plan in terms of FTEs). In this regard, the Committee once again underlines that under the provisions of the cooperation agreement concluded with the EP, the loss of translation capacity due to the transfer of 36 posts to the EP should be compensated for by an additional amount of EUR 1 200 000 on a yearly basis for the externalisation of translation, with the possibility of using any potential surplus for further political work. An amount of EUR 1 380 000 is therefore requested for the externalisation of translation (item 1420) in the current draft budget estimates. This amount respects this agreement and should not be considered as an increase compared to last year, where it was cut during the budgetary procedure.

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— For interpretation (item 2548) an increase of EUR 226 563 (3.19%) is requested due to the increase in the number of slots and their price. The request for the year 2021 was set up to be comparable to 2017 in terms of number of slots needed as this will be a "standard" year without reduced activity linked to the renewal at the EESC or other institutions. The slot price is expected to rise from EUR 498 in 2019 to EUR 528 in 2021.

IV. OFFICIALS AND TEMPORARY STAFF

The budget requested for item 1200 (remuneration and allowances) results from legal obligations in the Staff Regulations and is based on a stable establishment plan, with the exception of one additional AD5 post in the Irish translation unit due to a legal obligation arising as a result of the end of the derogation for Irish translation.

The increase of 3.31% on item 1200 (EUR 2.4 million) mainly reflects the Commission's estimate for salary adaptations in 2019, 2020 and 2021. It has to be noted that the 2019 increase was slightly lower than expected (-0.3 percentage points).

The expected total impact of the salary increase mainly reflects the Commission's estimate for salary adaptations in 2020 and 2021 (with a total impact of 2.85%). The conversion of posts for promotions results in an increase of 0.31% and the additional Irish post results in an increase of 0.10%. The impact of step advancement is estimated to account for 1.62% of the total salary costs in 2020 and other minor modifications add up to 0.03%. It should be noted that, all other things being equal, a natural balance between retiring and newly employed officials will not be established for some time to come, as many officials were recruited in low grades in connection with the accessions in 2004, 2007 and 2013. These increases are therefore partially mitigated by the fact that retired staff are normally replaced by colleagues in a lower grade: -1.6%.

The Budgetary Authority traditionally applies an abatement rate to the theoretical staff salary budget based on the assumption that posts are not occupied at 100% throughout the year and not all posts are filled at the highest possible level. The EESC is basing the amount requested for item 1200 on an abatement rate equal to that applied in previous years (4.5%).

V. JOINT LOGISTICS AND TRANSLATION SERVICES

The EESC and the CoR have been cooperating closely on administrative matters since the CoR was established in 1994. On 1 January 2016, a new four-year cooperation agreement entered into force. It was prolonged until the end of 2020 and will be renegotiated during 2020 (¹). This agreement provides for the closest administrative cooperation between any European institutions. Under the cooperation agreement, human and financial resources in the areas of logistics (buildings, IT, security, print shop, etc.) and translation are pooled in two joint directorates. This creates major synergies and substantial savings without prejudice to the political work of each of the two bodies. Almost half of the staff of the two Committees work in the Joint Services.

Excluding the "one-off request", appropriations for the buildings rented and leased jointly with the CoR (budget items 2000 and 2001) are subject to legal obligations and indexation. The appropriations required in 2021 amount to EUR 15.04 million for the EESC, an increase of 1.6%.

The EESC's total share in the joint credits requested for 2021 (excluding the one-off) amounts to EUR 31.12 million, an increase of EUR 1.59 million on the 2020 budget. The vast majority of this share is managed by the Directorate for Logistics according to the agreed sharing key (see above). Staff are not included in these figures as each staff member in the Joint Services is employed by one of the two Committees.

⁽¹⁾ For the 2021 draft budget estimates the 2020 sharing key, 0.5764/0.4236 (EESC/CoR), is considered as indicative for 2021.

This increase is mainly explained by the need to address the backlog on buildings and IT equipment that has been building up in recent years. The draft budget for 2021 therefore includes the following duly justified exceptions to the 2% increase as indicated below:

Without prejudice to the above-mentioned exceptional one-off request, the proposed increases in the EESC budget for buildings-related expenditure (item 2007 and 2008) address the following issues:

- Mandatary projects under Belgium law linked to the conformity of installations (e.g. safety equipment), as well as the
 installation of counters to decrease energy consumption and to fulfil legal requirements;
- Projects linked to the renewal of the obsolete technical control central installations in the JDE and the upgrading of the fire detection installations in the BvS/REM buildings;
- Further projects include: the upgrading of cabling for the conference rooms, maintenance and replacement of wooden floors and other maintenance projects to help to keep the buildings in good condition.

The significant structurally low level of IT funding at the EESC compared to the other European Institutions was recognised by the European Parliament in the 2017 and 2018 discharge procedure. Due to a lack of resources, the Committee could only dedicate less than 3% of its total budget to IT-related expenses, compared, for instance, to more than 7% at the EP and the Council. One of the objectives of the Committee's digital strategy is therefore to progressively fill the gap in investment accumulated in recent years due to budgetary restrictions. The projects envisaged in this strategy for 2021, which aims both to align the EESC with the level of digitalisation already reached by other institutions and to allow for further IT synergies, in particular with the Commission, require additional funds on items 2100 and 2102. This fully takes into account the fact that the requested increase is partly linked to increases in prices related to the charge back method as envisaged in the new service level agreement with the Commission for using its software (ABAC, SYSPER, etc.).

VI. CONCLUDING REMARKS

The EESC has been in the past consistently moderate in its budget estimates and requested increases only based on some well justified exceptions. This approach resulted in a decrease in real terms over the years.

However, without departing from this approach, due to the exchange of buildings, and in order to be able to generate a return on investment in the medium to long term, the aforementioned "one-off" investments are requested in the context of the budget 2021 and represent a unique opportunity for both Committees.

The renewed Committee as of October 2020 is committed to supporting the ambitious strategic goals set by the new Commission. It also aims to perform its consultative function in the most effective way, in a context of ever-growing interest in civil society and its key players and their increasing influence in EU governmental and public affairs. The EESC therefore continues to optimise its political prioritisation and strengthen its effectiveness and role in the European decision-making process, with particular focus on cooperation with the European Parliament. This will enable the Committee to contribute in an optimal way to the joint work undertaken by all the EU institutions in shaping the European Union of tomorrow.
