**INTRODUCTORY COMMENTS ON THE ESTIMATES OF REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE****I. GENERAL INTRODUCTION**

The **European Economic and Social Committee (EESC)** is an advisory body of the European Union based in Brussels whose legal basis lies in Article 13(4) of the TEU and Articles 300-304 of the TFEU. Since it was set up in 1957, the EESC has provided a unique forum for consultation, dialogue and consensus among representatives of the various economic, social and civil components of the organised civil society. The EESC has a distinctive place in the EU's decision-making process as a consultative body which acts as an intermediary between the legislative (European Parliament and Council) and executive (European Commission) institutions of the EU. The EESC ensures that civil society organisations have a say in Europe's development.

The EESC and the European Committee of the Regions (CoR) have been cooperating closely on administrative matters since the CoR was established in 1994. On 1 January 2016, a new four-year cooperation agreement entered into force. It was prolonged until June 2021 and is currently being renegotiated; the new agreement should enter into force on 1 July 2021. This agreement provides for the closest administrative cooperation between any European institutions. Under the cooperation agreement, human and financial resources in the areas of logistics (buildings, IT, security, print shop, etc.) and translation are pooled in two joint directorates. This creates major synergies and substantial savings without prejudice to the political work of each of the two bodies. Almost half of the staff of the two Committees work in the Joint Services.

The EESC's total share in the joint credits requested for 2022 amounts to EUR 32.93 million, an increase of EUR 2.55 million on the 2021 budget. The vast majority of this share is managed by the Directorate for Logistics according to the agreed sharing key. Staff are not included in these figures as each staff member in the Joint Services is employed by one of the two Committees.

**II. GENERAL BUDGET-RELATED REMARKS**

Over the years, the EESC has followed a rigorous approach with respect to administrative expenditure, consistently basing its estimates of expenditure on the EU's financial and overall economic situation. The EESC has been extremely moderate in its budget estimates and complied with the Commission guidelines requesting a nominal freeze when setting up its draft estimates until the 2020 budget. During the 2021 budget preparation, the EESC followed the guidelines limiting the increase on non-salary-related expenditure to a maximum of 2%. Duly justified additional funds to finance one-off costs linked to the buildings exchange, the renovation of the VMA building and other exceptions for IT and buildings were accepted by the Commission, Parliament and Council.

During the period 2013-2019, the EESC suffered one of the highest reductions in establishment plan posts in comparison to the other institutions, with a decrease from 727 to 668 posts. In this respect, the almost total stability in its establishment plan, in terms of Full Time Equivalents (FTEs), has to be underlined. The only request for an additional administrator (AD 9) will provide room to establish an internal ombudsman at the EESC, as supported by the European Parliament in the context of the 2019 discharge procedure. The EP's draft 2019 discharge resolution "...welcomes that a related, detailed action plan is supposed to be endorsed by the end of 2020 and covers a number of measures such as the revision of the code of conduct for members, the possible creation of an independent internal ombudsman function".

The EESC's 2022 draft budget estimates specifically take into account the special situation due to the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and continuing in 2021. This meets the request of the Commissioner, indicating that the institutions have to "lead by example and avoid disproportionate increases of their respective budgets". It also respects the technical parameters set by the Commission's guidelines as indicated in Commissioner Hahn's letter of 21 December 2020. Therefore, in line with the institution's continuous commitment and efforts to establish rigorous draft estimates, the EESC agreed that major budget lines, mainly covering the members' travel costs and allowances, as well as interpretation and the organisation of events and hearings (including the catering related to these events), should exceptionally be frozen.

However, in the year 2021 and with the ongoing vaccination campaigns against COVID-19, the EESC's activity is expected to once again reach cruising speed and this should continue in 2022. Consequently, it is crucial for the Committee to have all the necessary resources available in order to be able to fulfil its role as per the treaties, as well as to maximise its political impact by efficiently supporting the delivery and implementation of the legislative programme, in particular in the current context of the ever-growing interest in and influence of civil society.

### III. MEMBERS AND OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Support for the legislative work remains the main priority in the EESC budget. Thus the EESC's agreement to adapt to the special situation given the effects of the COVID-19 health crisis and not to request increases on the lines linked with members' activities is exceptional. If the context changes in 2022, this would have to be corrected in the following year(s) or even with transfers in the year 2022.

To catch up on an acknowledged backlog compared to other institutions, investments in IT and buildings have to be continued in the future via appropriate budgetary requests, which can only partly be covered through potential transfers of unspent appropriations at the end of the year, subject to the approval of the budgetary authority. The significant need to increase the structurally low level of IT funding at the EESC compared to the other European institutions was recognised by the European Parliament in past discharge procedures as indicated in the 2018 discharge resolution: "The European Parliament (...) notes that currently only 3% of the Committee's budget is devoted to IT products; notes that the implementation of the digital strategy of the Committee will need extra resources".

Concerning buildings, the joint strategy of the EESC and the CoR aims to achieve the geographical concentration of the buildings by exchanging the B68/TRE buildings for the VMA building. In the medium term, the strategy might have to be further adapted to take account of the new constraints and opportunities created by the COVID-19 pandemic in relation to the working environment and culture.

In the current proposal, chapter 20 (Buildings and related costs) shows a nominal increase of 7.56%, which comes down to an increase of 2.99% when correcting for the special effects of 2021. These effects mainly concern:

- Budget items 2000 and 2001 (rent and lease), which show high increases compared to 2021. This is linked to the fact that the budgetary authority reduced the budget request for these two items for the year 2021 by a total of EUR 5.5 million, due to the frontloading of these lines in the year 2020.
- Budget items 2007 and 2008 (fitting out of premises and studies), which show high decreases compared to the year 2021. This is linked to the fact that the "one-off" costs for the exchange of the VMA building were included under these two items for an amount of EUR 4.2 million for the year 2021.

When the total increase in non-salary related items is corrected to account for the special effects of 2021 (frontloading rent/lease and one-off buildings-related costs), the increase for non-salary related items is reduced from 3.33% to 1.96% and the total increase in the budget is limited to 3.46% (instead of 4.12%).

For IT, the need to reinforce the digital workplace and thus allow for more digitalisation in all areas was pushed forward due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and will continue in the future. An increase of 10.64% is therefore envisaged, especially in the IT chapter 21.

The EESC 2022 draft budget also includes two new budget (sub-)items which underline our forward-looking approach in the following areas:

- Item 239: to compensate for CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, as part of the Committee's strong commitment to supporting the Green Deal.
- Sub-item "Outreach and follow-up" under item 2600 "Communication": to support the Committee's efforts to increase the impact of its activities and opinions.

#### IV. OFFICIALS AND TEMPORARY STAFF

The budget requested for item 1200 (remuneration and allowances) results from legal obligations in the Staff Regulations and is based on a stable establishment plan, with the exception of one additional administrator post to provide for an internal ombudsman position as indicated above. The total increase of 4.98% on item 1200 compared to 2021 (EUR 3.6 million) is the result of the following different factors.

The expected total impact of the salary increase mainly reflects the Commission's estimate for salary adaptations in 2021 and 2022 (with a total impact of 3.01%). The conversion of posts for career progression results in an increase of 0.39%, and the additional internal ombudsman post results in an increase of 0.18%. The impact of step advancement is estimated to account for 1.66% of the total salary costs in 2022. These increases are partially mitigated by the fact that retired staff are normally replaced by colleagues in a lower grade: -0.26%.

The Budgetary Authority traditionally applies an abatement rate to the theoretical staff salary budget based on the assumption that posts are not occupied at 100% throughout the year and not all posts are filled at the highest possible level. The EESC is basing the amount requested for item 1200 on an abatement rate equal to previous years (4.5%).

#### V. CONCLUDING REMARKS

The 2022 EESC budget is very balanced and moderate and would allow the EESC to tackle the future challenges faced by the institution in the context of the many constraints created by the pandemic, and to ensure the continuity of and support for its members' political work in a sustainable way.

The total increase for the draft 2022 budget estimates compared to 2021 is EUR 5 970 705 or 4.12 %.
