## [Your document transposed into national law – transcript]

In this video we will look at the main features of the 'National transposition' tab of the document page.

National transposition measures are acts adopted by the EU Member States to transpose EU acts — mainly directives — into national law. EUR-Lex publishes information on national transposition measures such as the title, the date of publication and the transposed directives. If Member States agree, the texts of their transposition measures (or links to the national website where you can find the text) are also published on EUR-Lex.

On this page, you can see at a glance the transposition of a directive by all the Member States. The column on the right shows how many acts were adopted to transpose the directive.

Click on the number or on the name of the Member State to get more information on the transposition measures.

In this example, the Member State has adopted four acts to transpose the directive and there is a PDF version of each of these acts.

Some Member States may also provide a link to their national websites.

If you click on a national transposition measure, you access a dedicated page with text view and document information view showing all the available information related to that measure in one place.

If you need a quick translation of the title of the transposition measure or, if it is available, of the transposition measure itself, click on 'Machine translation' and choose your language. Then press 'Translate'. The translation is displayed underneath the translation tool.
