

[Find documents by EU institutions – transcript]

You can also browse documents by the institutions that adopted them.

On the EUR-Lex home page, click on 'Browse by EU institutions' and select an institution.

Depending on the institution, you can browse documents by year, and according to their types, for example regulations or judgments of the Court of Justice.

Wherever there is a 'plus' symbol you can click on it to narrow your search. The numbers in blue indicate how many documents are available for each category. Clicking a number brings you to a results page with all the documents matching your selection.

Since the beginning of the eighth parliamentary term (on 25 May 2014), parliamentary questions are no longer published in the *Official Journal of the European Union* or on EUR-Lex. They are published on the European Parliament's website. This is why you will only see parliamentary questions up to May 2014 in this area.

You can browse in this way for each of the EU institutions.

The European Central Bank (or 'ECB') has a specific section with customised search tools. This is why it is the only one identified with an icon. You can navigate this section by clicking on the different elements of the main page or using the left-hand menu.

'Quick search in ECB documents' is just like the main EUR-Lex quick search, but it limits your results to documents from the ECB or the European Monetary Institute and to relevant case-law.

Use the search field to find a term.

You can refine your results further using the filters in the left-hand column of the results page.

The ECB 'Advanced search' is similar to the main EUR-Lex advanced search but dedicated only to documents from this ECB section.

'Browse by topic' lets you browse documents according to the classification scheme used by the ECB. Click on the 'plus' symbol to open more categories and click on the magnifying glass to launch a search.

'Visual navigation' provides statistics on ECB documents in the form of graphs.

Clicking on this section leads you to a separate visual navigation page. You can click the bars in the graphics, which then redirect you to related results pages.

Back on the main ECB page, the 'Find an ECB document' and 'Find a court case relevant to the ECB' boxes can help you find ECB documents and case-law relevant to the ECB.

Enter the year, number and type of document you are looking for – or just one or two of these options if you don't know them all.

The ECB section also contains a page dedicated to European banking supervision.

This page has its own 'Browse by topic' and 'recently published' areas, as well as dedicated 'find a document' and 'find a court case' search areas.

Finally, the 'Recently published' box at the bottom of the main ECB page provides quick access to recent ECB documents published on EUR-Lex.

Via the left-hand menu, you can also reach a page dedicated to ECB-related primary law.
