

## [Find documents by subjects – transcript]

In addition to the different search functions available on EUR-Lex, there are several ways you can browse the documents available.

Let's look at EuroVoc.

EuroVoc is the EU's multilingual and multidisciplinary thesaurus. It contains keywords, organised into domains and subdomains, which are used to describe the content of documents on EUR-Lex.

On the EUR-Lex home page, click on 'Browse by EuroVoc' in the main menu. On the EuroVoc page, you can see a search field followed by the 21 EuroVoc domains.

You will notice that whichever language you choose to consult the EUR-Lex website in, the EuroVoc domains will be available in your language.

If you already know which keyword you are looking for, enter it into the search field and hit 'enter' or click on 'Filter'. This will take you straight to the domain or subdomain you are looking for. Let's try it with 'Mediterranean Sea'.

Now you can click on 'search' to see a results list with all the documents on EUR-Lex that are related to the Mediterranean Sea.

If you don't already know your search term, you can browse the domains below the search field. Click on one of these domains to see the related subdomains and narrow your search.

Wherever you see a 'plus' symbol, you can click again to reach further subdomains. The acronym 'NT' before a keyword means 'narrower term'. The number after 'NT' is related to the level of subdomain. Once you have reached the domain or subdomain you are interested in, click on 'search' next to it.

On the results page, you can see further ways to refine your search in the left-hand panel. You can learn more about refining your results in our video on the results list.
