Question referred

1. Where a Member State has exercised its right to derogate in Article 61(1) from the provisions of Article 60(2) of Council Regulation (EC) No. 1224/2009 of 20 November 2009⁽¹⁾ (as amended) establishing a Community control system for ensuring compliance with the rules of the common fisheries policy in accordance with the terms of a control plan approved by the Commission of the European Union, are the competent authorities of that Member precluded from requiring that any quantity of fisheries products first landed in that Member State is weighed in the presence of officials of that authority before being transported elsewhere from the place of landing in accordance with the provisions of Article 60(6) of that Regulation?
