



Action brought on 23 January 2026 – Decora v EUIPO (CUTTING LINES)

(Case T-48/26)

Language of the case: Polish

Parties

Defendant: European Union Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO)

Details of the proceedings before EUIPO

Trade mark at issue: Application for EU figurative mark (CUTTING LINES) – Application No 19044555

Contested decision: Decision of the Second Board of Appeal of EUIPO of 24 November 2025 in Case R 208/2025-2

Form of order sought

The applicant claims that the Court should:

- annul the contested decision (or, in the alternative, declare the contested decision invalid) and refer the case back to the EUIPO Board of Appeal for reconsideration;
- order EUIPO to pay the costs.

Pleas in law

- Infringement of Article 7(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2017/1001 of the European Parliament and of the Council;
- Infringement of Article 7(1)(b) of Regulation (EU) 2017/1001 of the European Parliament and of the Council;
- Infringement of Article 7 TFEU;
- Infringement of Article 298(1) TFEU and Article 41 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union;
- Failure to observe the principle of equal treatment and the principle of legal certainty in the European Union, and infringement of Article 20 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union.
