



**Action brought on 16 December 2025 – Stanciu v EUIPO – Menspire (MENSPIRE PROFESSIONAL)**

**Form of order sought**

The applicant claims that the Court should:

- annul the contested decision and remit the case to EUIPO for reexamination; or
- in the alternative, alter the contested decision by upholding the appeal, rejecting the invalidity request and, further, by maintaining the registration of the contested EUTM for all the goods and services.
