

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1937/76
of 4 August 1976
abolishing the countervailing charge on lemons originating in Spain

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 of 18 May 1972 on the common organization of the market in fruit and vegetables⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 795/76⁽²⁾, and in particular the first subparagraph of Article 27 (2) thereof,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1841/76 of 28 July 1976⁽³⁾ introduced a countervailing charge on lemons originating in Spain ;

Whereas the first indent of the first subparagraph of Article 26 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 lays down that once introduced, the charge is to be altered where the variation of the factors in its calculation leads, during a certain period, to an alteration of its

amount by more than one unit of account ; whereas the application of this condition would lead to the charge being fixed at zero ; whereas, therefore, under the second subparagraph of Article 26 (1) the charge should be withdrawn ;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Fruit and Vegetables,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1841/76 is hereby repealed.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 5 August 1976.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
