

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1399/77

of 28 June 1977

on the delivery of various consignments of skimmed-milk powder as food aid

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 559/76⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 7(5) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1298/76 of 1 June 1976 laying down general rules for the supply of skimmed-milk powder as food aid to certain developing countries and international organizations under the 1976 programme⁽³⁾, as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2017/76⁽⁴⁾, and in particular Article 6 thereof,

Whereas, under the food-aid programmes adopted by the Council Regulation specified in the Annex, Bangladesh has requested the delivery of 4 500 tonnes of skimmed-milk powder;

Whereas, therefore, delivery should be effected in accordance with the rules laid down in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 303/77 of 14 February 1977

laying down general rules for the supply of skimmed-milk powder and butteroil as food aid⁽⁵⁾; whereas in particular the periods and terms for delivery and the procedure to be followed by the intervention agencies to establish the costs arising therefrom should be laid down;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

In accordance with the provisions of Regulation (EEC) No 303/77, the German intervention agency shall deliver 4 500 tonnes of skimmed-milk powder as food aid to Bangladesh, on the special terms set out in the Annex.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
