

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 3126/87
of 20 October 1987

laying down to what extent applications for issue of export licences submitted during October 1987 for beef and veal products which may benefit from special import treatment in a third country may be accepted

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,
Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2931/79 of 20 December 1979 on the granting of assistance for export of agricultural products which may benefit from a special import treatment in a third country⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 1 (2) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 805/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in beef and veal⁽²⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 467/87⁽³⁾,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2377/80 of 4 September 1980 on special detailed rules for the application of the system of import and export licences in the beef and veal sector⁽⁴⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 520/87⁽⁵⁾, lays down, in Articles 14 and 15, detailed rules for export licence applications for the products referred to in Article 1 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2973/79⁽⁶⁾; whereas Article 15 (6) (c) of Regulation (EEC) No 2377/80 requires the Commission, where the quantities in respect of which licences are

applied for exceed the quantities available, to reduce the quantities requested by a fixed percentage;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2621/87⁽⁷⁾ fixed the quantities of meat which might be exported on special terms for the fourth quarter of 1986;

Whereas the quantities for which licence applications have been lodged for the fourth quarter of 1987 are lower than those available; whereas these applications can, therefore, be met in full,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The applications for export licences lodged for the beef and veal referred to in Regulation (EEC) No 2973/79 for the fourth quarter of 1987 shall be met in full.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 21 October 1987.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
