COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 986/77

of 10 May 1977

on the delivery of various consignments of butteroil as food aid

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 559/76 (2), and in particular Article 6 (7) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 694/76 of 25 March 1976 laying down general rules for the supply of milk fats under the 1976 food-aid programme to certain developing countries and to certain international organizations (3), and in particular Article 7 thereof,

Whereas, under the food-aid programmes adopted by the Council Regulations specified in the Annex, the Republic of Upper Volta has requested the delivery of about 750 tonnes of butteroil;

Whereas, therefore, delivery should be effected in accordance with the rules laid down in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 303/77 of 14 February 1977 laying down general rules for the supply of skimmedmilk powder and butteroil as food aid (4), whereas in particular the periods and terms for delivery and the procedure to be followed by the intervention agency to establish the costs arising therefrom should be laid down;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3319/75 of 19 December 1975 (5) provides for invitations to tender for the manufacture and delivery of consignments of 500 tonnes of butteroil for Haiti; whereas

that country was able to take delivery of only 30 tonnes of this butteroil; whereas therefore the situation should be regularized and the remaining quantity of about 470 tonnes be supplied to Upper Volta;

Whereas the measures laid down in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

Pursuant to Regulation (EEC) No 303/77 the Belgian intervention agency shall deliver two consignments of butteroil as food aid to the destination and under the special conditions set out in the Annex.

Article 2

With regard to consignment B the delivery costs shall include :

- (a) storage costs in the warehouse at Antwerp from 24 January 1977 until 10 June 1977 at the latest, at the rate of Bfrs 1 500 per day for the total quantity of this consignment;
- (b) the costs of checking the weight of the butteroil by a sworn weigher and measurer when the tenderer takes delivery of the consignment at the Antwerp warehouse.

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
