COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1484/91

of 31 May 1991

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1310/91 introducing a countervailing charge on tomatoes originating in the Canary Islands

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 of 18 May 1972 on the common organization of the market in fruit and vegetables (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3920/90 (2), and in particular the second subparagraph of Article 27 (2) thereof,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1310/91 (3) as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1373/91 (4), introduced a countervailing charge on tomatoes originating in the Canary Islands;

Whereas Article 26 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 laid down the conditions under which a charge introduced in application of Article 25 of that Regulation is amended; whereas, if those conditions are taken into consideration, the countervailing charge on the import of tomatoes originating in the Canary Islands must be altered.

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

In Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 1310/91, ECU 32,26 is hereby replaced by ECU 58,24.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 June 1991.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member
