## COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1929/93

of 16 July 1993

## introducing a countervailing charge on tomatoes originating in Finland

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 of 18 May 1972 on the common organization of the market in fruit and vegetables (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 638/93 (2), and in particular the first subparagraph of Article 27 (2) thereof,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1819/93 (3) introduced a countervailing charge on tomatoes originating in Finland;

Whereas for tomatoes originating in Finland there were no prices for six consecutive working days; whereas the conditions specified in Article 26 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 are therefore fulfilled and the countervailing charge on imports of tomatoes originating in Finland can be abolished:

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Fruit and Vegetables,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1819/93 is hereby repealed.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 17 July 1993.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
