

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2231/93
of 6 August 1993

abolishing the countervailing charge on fresh lemons originating in Uruguay

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,
Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 of 18 May 1972 on the common organization of the market in fruit and vegetables⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 638/93⁽²⁾, and in particular the second subparagraph of Article 27 (2) thereof,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2051/93⁽³⁾, introduced a countervailing charge on fresh lemons originating in Uruguay;

Whereas for this product originating in Uruguay there were no prices for six consecutive working days; whereas

the conditions specified in Article 26 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 are therefore fulfilled and the countervailing charge on imports of fresh lemons originating in Uruguay can be abolished,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 2051/93 is hereby repealed.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 7 August 1993.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
