COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2530/1999

of 30 November 1999

suspending the preferential customs duties and re-establishing the Common Customs Tariff duty on imports of uniflorous (bloom) carnations originating in Morocco

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

carnations and roses for the application of the import arrangements;

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 4088/87 of 21 December 1987 fixing conditions for the application of preferential customs duties on imports of certain flowers originating in Cyprus, Israel, Jordan, Morocco, the West Bank and Gaza Strip (1), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1300/97 (2), and in particular Article 5(2)(b) thereof,

- Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 4088/87 lays down the (1) conditions for applying a preferential duty on largeflowered roses, small-flowered roses, uniflorous (bloom) carnations and multiflorous (spray) carnations within the limit of tariff quotas opened annually for imports into the Community of fresh cut flowers;
- Whereas Council Regulation (EC) No 1981/94 (3), as last (2) amended by Commission Regulation (EC) No 650/98 (4), opens and provides for the administration of Community tariff quotas for cut flowers and flower buds, fresh, originating in Algeria, Cyprus, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Malta, Morocco, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, Tunisia and Turkey;
- Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 700/88 (5), (3) as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 2062/97 (6), lays down the detailed rules for the application of the arrangements;
- Whereas Commission Regulation (EC) No 2528/1999 (7) fixes the Community producer and import prices for

- Whereas, on the basis of prices recorded pursuant to (5) Regulations (EEC) No 4088/87 and (EEC) No 700/88, it must be concluded that the conditions laid down in Article 2(3) of Regulation (EEC) No 4088/87 for suspension of the preferential customs duty are met for uniflorous (bloom) carnations originating in Morocco; whereas the Common Customs Tariff duty should be re-established:
- Whereas the quota for the products in question covers the period 1 November 1999 to 31 May 2000; whereas, as a result, the suspension of the preferential duty and the reintroduction of the Common Customs Tariff duty apply up to the end of that period at the latest;
- Whereas, in between meetings of the Management Committees, the Commission must adopt such meas-

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

For imports of uniflorous (bloom) carnations (CN codes ex 0603 10 13 and ex 0603 10 53) originating in Morocco, the preferential customs duty fixed by Regulation (EC) No 1981/94 is hereby suspended and the Common Customs Tariff duty is hereby re-established.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 2 December 1999.
