ARTICLE 2

Article 14, paragraph 1, subparagraph 2 (Regulation (EEC) No 2777/75)

These measures shall be taken at the request of the Member State(s) concerned.

These measures shall be taken at the request of the Member State(s) concerned and may also concern, when the conditions are right, information campaigns on public health or animal health risks designed to re-establish consumer confidence.

The committee set up pursuant to Article 17 shall ensure in considering the request that exceptional measures are restricted to circumstances that pose a threat to livelihoods, and that, in any event, any unnecessary suffering of animals is avoided.

Amendment 6 ARTICLE 2

Article 14, paragraph 1, subparagraph 3 (Regulation (EEC) No 2777/75)

In the case of the restrictions on free circulation referred to under (a) above, exceptional measures may be taken only if the Member State(s) concerned have taken the health and veterinary measures, in conformity with Community law, needed to stamp the disease out quickly and only to the extent and for the duration strictly necessary to support this market.
