

Renotification of a previously notified concentration**(Case COMP/M.2345 — Deutsche BP/Erdölchemie)**

(2001/C 99/03)

(Text with EEA relevance)

1. On 23 February 2001 the Commission received a notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1310/97⁽²⁾, by which the undertaking BP Deutschland GmbH, controlled by BP Amoco plc, acquires, within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Regulation, control of the whole of the undertaking Erdölchemie GmbH, by way of purchase of securities.

2. This notification has been declared incomplete on 21 March 2001. The undertakings concerned have now provided the further information required. The notification became complete within the meaning of Article 10(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89 on 22 March 2001. Accordingly, the notification became effective on 22 March 2001.

3. The Commission invites interested third parties to submit their possible observations on the proposed operation.
