The Co-President announced that in addition to the three workshops already announced, and at the request of Members, two further excursions had been organised on Wednesday afternoon to Hiri East and Hiri West regions.

The Co-President drew the attention of Members to the case of Hon. Hans Joachim Keil, Member of Parliament, Associate Minister of Samoa and Pacific ACP Lead Ministerial Spokesperson for EPA negotiations, who had been arrested in the United States in September 2008, on immigration charges, now released on bail.
