## New national side of euro coins intended for circulation

National side of the new commemorative 2-euro coin intended for circulation and issued by Slovenia
Euro coins intended for circulation have legal tender status throughout the euro area. For the purpose of informing the public and all parties who handle the coins, the Commission publishes a description of the designs of all new coins ( ${ }^{1}$ ). In accordance with the Council conclusions of 10 February $2009\left(^{(2)}\right.$, euro-area Member States and countries that have concluded a monetary agreement with the European Union providing for the issuing of euro coins are allowed to issue commemorative euro coins intended for circulation, provided that certain conditions are met, particularly that only the 2-euro denomination is used. These coins have the same technical characteristics as other 2-euro coins, but their national face features a commemorative design that is highly symbolic in national or European terms.
Issuing country: Slovenia
Subject of commemoration: Slovenia World Day of Bees
Description of the design: In the middle of the inner ring of the coin is the image of honeycomb in a form of a globe, which shows the eastern hemisphere. Around the honeycomb on the left upper side is the inscription 'SVETOVNI DAN ČEBEL', and on the lower right side the inscription 'SLOVENIJA 2018'.

The coin's outer ring depicts the 12 stars of the European flag.

Estimated date of issue: Second quarter 2018
