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#### **INTRODUCTION**

Finland joined the European Union on 1 January 1995 alongside Austria and Sweden in the fourth round of EU enlargement, bringing the number of Member States at the time to 15. These three countries were the first new countries to join the EU since the end of the Cold War.

This survey was commissioned to understand how people in these three countries view the EU and the impact of EU membership, twenty years after accession.

This report looks specifically at the results from Finland. There is an accompanying report covering all three countries combined, as well as individual reports for Austria and Sweden. The questionnaire covered people's associations with Europe, their sense of European identity, the nature of the impact of EU membership on national life, people's views on the priorities for the new European Commission and one country-specific question for each of the three Member States.

This survey was carried out by TNS Political & Social network in Austria, Finland and Sweden between the 24<sup>th</sup> of November and the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December 2014. Some 3.000 respondents from different social and demographic groups were interviewed online<sup>1</sup> in their mother tongue on behalf of the European Commission, Directorate-General for Communication. The methodology used is that of Eurobarometer surveys as carried out by the Directorate-General for Communication ("Strategy, Corporate Communication Actions and Eurobarometer" Unit)<sup>2.</sup>. A technical note on the manner in which interviews were conducted by the Institutes within the TNS Political & Social network is appended as an annex to this report. Also included are the interview methods and confidence intervals<sup>3</sup>.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- When asked what most comes to mind when thinking about Europe, respondents
  in Finland are most likely to say "EU". Other common answers include "euro",
  "unity", "continent", "culture", "freedom" and "travel". As well as "Finland", many
  respondents also mention "France" and "Germany".
- People in Finland have a strong sense of European identity, with almost nine in ten respondents (87%) agreeing that they feel close to other Europeans, and that they feel European themselves (85%). Three-fourths of respondents (75%) agree that "there is a lot in common between people in Europe".
- Around two-thirds of respondents (67%) have positive feelings about the EU.
- Nearly half of the respondents (45%) think the current level of cooperation between EU Member States is sufficient, with around a third saying they would like to see closer cooperation (36%).
- A majority of respondents believe that EU membership has had a positive impact on mobility (83%), consumer choice (76%), the role Finland plays in the world (70%), the environment (65%), the security and protection of citizens (60%), Finland's infrastructure (54%), and social welfare (52%).
- However, a majority of people think that EU membership has had a negative impact on their national economy: 65% take this view, while only 34% think EU membership has brought economic benefits.
- Employment (63%) is seen as the most important priority for the new European Commission, followed by economic growth (44%).
- Only around a third of respondents (34%) believe that Finland has a say in EU policy making.

#### I. GENERAL PERCEPTION OF EUROPE

#### 1. What citizens associate when thinking of "Europe"

#### - Europe is spontaneously associated primarily with the "EU" and the "Euro" -

At the beginning of the survey, the respondents were asked to give the **two words that spontaneously came to mind when thinking about Europe**<sup>4</sup>. The question was deliberately left open-ended in order to capture the first answers that occurred to the respondents.

The top results are presented below in the form of "word clouds", in which the font size of the word is proportional to the number of respondents who spontaneously associated it with Europe.

The most common spontaneous associations made by respondents in Finland include the European Union ("EU") and the euro. It is interesting to mention that according to the results of the Standard Eurobarometer of autumn 2014<sup>5</sup>, Finns are more likely to say they feel as citizens of the EU compared to the proportion of people who feel this way across the EU as a whole (76% compared to 63%).

Also, it is worthwhile to mention that the Euro was introduced in 2002 and Finland was one of founding members of the euro area. Moreover, the results of the Standard Eurobarometer of autumn 2014 show that 75% of Finnish respondent said that they are 'for' a European economic and monetary union comparted to 56% of respondents at the EU level.

Additionally Europe is frequently associated with "unity", "continent", "freedom", "travel" and "culture". Besides Finland itself, it is interesting to note that Germany and France also stand out as important features of Europe in the minds of respondents in Finland.

Since 2001, Finland has been an active member of the Schengen union after signing the treaty in 1996. Finland shares a land border with Sweden and Norway, countries that are also part of the Schengen union, which makes travelling a lot easier. Other EU Member States are among the most desired destinations for travelling for Finns. Among the first seven countries, six are EU Member States and part of the Schengen treaty: Estonia, Sweden, Spain, Germany, Italy, and France. Russia comes in 4<sup>th</sup> place on this list.<sup>6</sup>.

#### 2. Sentiments towards Europe and the European Union


### 2.1. Attitudes towards the European identity

#### - People in Finland have a strong sense of European identity -

Respondents were asked to what extent they agree or disagree with a series of three statements related to European identity: feeling close to other Europeans, perceiving commonalities between Europeans, and personally feeling European<sup>7</sup>.

Nearly nine out of ten respondents (87%) say that they feel closer to other Europeans than people from other parts of the world; of these, 51% strongly feel this way. Respondents give similar answers for the statement "you feel European yourself" (85%), with 45% of them answering "strongly agree". Finally, three-fourths of respondents agree that "there is a lot in common between people in Europe"; however, unlike the other statements, fewer respondents "strongly agree" (17%).

The level of agreement with the statement "You feel closer to other Europeans than people from other parts of the world" is slightly higher amongst women (88% vs. 84% of men), older respondents (91% of people aged 55 and over vs. 78% of 15-24 year-olds), and those who left education aged 20 or above (89% vs. 82%).

People who say that they "feel European" are also understandably much more likely to say that they feel closer to other Europeans than respondents who do not feel European (93% vs. 48%). People expressing positive feelings about the EU are also more likely to agree than those with negative feelings (93% vs. 73%).

Women are somewhat more likely than men to agree that there is a lot in common between people in Europe (77% vs. 71%). Similarly, the proportion of respondents who agree with this statement progressively increases with the age of the respondents (81% of people aged 55 and over agree compared with 65% of 15-24 year-olds), as well as with the level of education (77% of people who finished education aged 20 or above vs. 70-72% who finished at a younger age).

Respondents who feel European (81% vs. 33%) and those who express positive feelings about the EU (83% vs. 56%) are also more likely to agree that there is a lot in common between people in Europe.

Older respondents are more likely to agree that they feel European themselves: 89% of people aged 55 and over say this, as opposed to 74% of 15-24 year-olds. Not surprisingly, respondents expressing positive feelings about the EU (93%) are more likely to feel European than those with negative feelings about the EU (69%).


#### 2.2. Feelings toward the European Union

#### - Two-thirds of people in Finland express positive feelings about the EU -

Respondents were then asked whether they had **positive or negative feelings about** the EU<sup>8</sup>.

Around two-thirds of respondents in Finland (67%) say they have positive feelings about the EU, although most (58%) say they have "fairly positive" feelings. One third of respondents (33%) have negative feelings, though most of the people in this group (26%) have "fairly negative" feelings.

The overall positive feelings about the EU can be analysed in the context of the above average trust in the EU according to the results of the Standard Eurobarometer of autumn 2014. Higher proportions of people in Finland tend to trust the EU compared to the EU average (54% vs. 37%). Furthermore, 66% of the Finnish residents said they are optimistic about the future of the EU. This is ten percentage points more than the EU average  $(56\%)^9$ .

Women are slightly more likely than men (69% vs. 64%) to express positive feelings about the EU. Older respondents are the most likely to feel positively about the EU: 73% of people aged 55 and over have positive feelings, compared with 60-66% of the younger age groups. In terms of the respondents' occupation, employees (75%) and respondents who are not working (67%) are more likely than manual workers (58%) and self-employed respondents (61%) to have positive feelings towards the EU.

People who say that they "feel European" are much more likely to have positive feelings about the EU than respondents who do not feel European (73% vs. 31%).





#### 3. Cooperation between Member States

# - More people in Finland think that the current cooperation between EU states is close enough than think there should be closer cooperation -

Respondents were asked what they think about the level of cooperation between EU Member States<sup>10</sup>.

Over a third (36%) of respondents in Finland believe this cooperation should be closer, but more respondents (45%) think that the current level of cooperation is close enough. A fifth of respondents (20%) think cooperation should be less close.

The proportion of respondents who believe that "the level of cooperation between EU member states should be closer" is higher among men than women (41% vs. 31%). It is also higher among older people: 44% of people aged 55 and over think there should be closer cooperation, as opposed to 25% of 15-24 year-olds.

People with positive feelings about the EU are more likely than those with negative feelings to think there should be closer cooperation (41% vs. 25%) or that the current cooperation is close enough (51% vs. 32%).


#### II. THE IMPACT OF THE EU MEMBERSHIP ON FINLAND

 People in Finland think that EU membership has had a positive impact on many areas of national life, with the notable exception of the economy -

With the exception of the economic situation, respondents in Finland are positive about the impact of membership of the EU<sup>11</sup>.

More than eight in ten respondents say that membership has had a positive impact on mobility (83%, with 28% describing the impact as very positive). In a survey from 2011, 34% of respondents in Finland (respondents were aged between 15 and 35 years), have studied abroad in the framework of an EU funded mobility programme compared to only 15% of respondents at the EU level. Furthermore, 71% of respondents said they were willing to work abroad <sup>12</sup>.

Another interesting fact is that according to the Social Insurance Institution, (excluding students who cover the costs of studying, independently), in 2011-2012 there were 5.848 students studying outside of Finland, of which 5.248 in Europe<sup>13</sup>.

At least seven in ten respondents said that EU membership has had a positive impact on consumer choice (76%) and enhancing Finland's role in the world (70%). A majority also say the impact has been positive on the environment (65%), security (60%), Finland's infrastructure (54%), and social welfare (52%).

The exception is Finland's economic situation. In this case, a majority of respondents say that EU membership has had a negative impact than say it has had a positive impact (65% vs. 34%). Over a fifth of respondents (21%) say the impact on the economic situation has been very negative. It is interesting to mention that Finland's contribution to the EU budget is twenty nine percentage points higher compared to the total EU spending ( $\in$  1.862 billion Finnish contribution, compared to  $\in$  1.324 billion of EU spending)<sup>14</sup>.

Women are more likely than men to view the impact of membership as positive in all areas with the exception of the economic situation, where men were slightly more likely to think that the impact has been positive (36% for men vs. 33% for women).

Respondents aged 55 and over are more likely to view the impact of EU membership as positive when it comes to mobility (88% vs. 78-80% for other age groups), consumer choice (82% vs. 69-76%), Finland's role in the world (78% vs. 64-68%), and the economic situation (41% vs. 29-36%).

People with a higher level of education also tend to be slightly more positive about the impact of EU membership.

Respondents who feel positive about the EU are more likely to agree that EU membership has had a positive impact. For example, 50% of people with positive feelings about the EU think EU membership has had a positive impact on the economic situation, as opposed to just 5% of people with negative feelings about the EU.


#### III. THE PRIORITIES FOR THE NEW EUROPEAN COMMISSION

# Employment and economic growth are seen as the top priorities for the new European Commission -

Over six out of ten respondents (63%) think that employment is the most important priority for the new Commission<sup>15</sup>. In the recent Standard Eurobarometer of autumn 2014, almost half of Finnish interviewees (49%) said that unemployment is the most important issue facing their country, making it also the most important national issue<sup>16</sup>.

Over four in ten respondents (44%) believe that economic growth should be a priority for the new commission. The economic situation was also ranked second in the aforementioned Eurobarometer among Finns, being cited by 36%.

Around a third mentioned security, euro stability and foreign policy (all 32%), compared to around one in five who feel that the environment (24%) or climate change (20%) is the most important priority. Around one in ten prioritise immigration (16%), energy (12%) or social dialogue (8%) while only a tiny minority believe that the digital economy should be a priority.

Men are more likely than women to feel that economic growth (48% vs. 41%), immigration (19% vs. 13%), and energy (15% vs. 9%) are important priorities, whereas women are more likely to think that the environment (28% vs. 19%), climate change (24% vs. 16%) and the security and protection of citizens (38% vs. 27%) should be the focus for the new Commission.

Older respondents are more likely to prioritise foreign and security policy (46% of people aged 55 and over vs. 17% of 15-24 year-olds) and economic growth (49% vs. 35%), but the least likely to mention employment (59% vs. 74%), the environment (18% vs. 26%) or climate change (18% vs. 24%). It is interesting to note that in the second quarter of 2014, 9.4% of people being 25 years old or younger were unemployed, while the rate for people above 25 was 7.1% (overall rate: 8.6%)<sup>17</sup>.



#### IV. FINLAND'S SAY IN EU POLICY MAKING

# - Most Finnish respondents do not feel that Finland has a say in EU policy making -

When asked whether they believe that Finland has a say in EU policy making, only a third (34%) agree, of which only a tiny proportion (4%) "strongly agree". This compares with two thirds (66%) who disagree, with 15% strongly disagreeing<sup>18</sup>.

This result may be linked to the relative size of the country. Compared to other European countries Finland is a smaller country in terms of territory and number on inhabitants and therefore, people might feel it has less power to influence policy making.

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
There are few socio-demographic differences, although women (36% vs. 31% of men) and respondents aged 55 and over (40% vs. 26-35% of younger respondents) are the most likely to agree that Finland has a say on EU policy making.

People who say they feel European (38% vs. 12%) or with positive feelings about the EU (47% vs. 7%) are more likely to say that Finland has a say on EU policy making.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Between the  $24^{th}$  of November and  $3^{rd}$  of December 2014, TNS political & social, a consortium created between TNS UK and TNS opinion, carried out the survey FLASH EUROBAROMETER 407 about 'Austria, Finland and Sweden: 20 Years in the EU'.

This survey has been requested by the EUROPEAN COMMISSION, Directorate-General for Communication. It is an online survey co-ordinated by the Directorate-General for Communication ('Strategy, Corporate Communication Actions and Eurobarometer' Unit). The FLASH EUROBAROMETER 407 covers the online population (aged 15 years or more) of the respective nationalities of the European Union Member States, resident in Austria, Finland and Sweden. The survey covers the national online population of citizens as well as the population of citizens of all the European Union Member States that are residents in these countries and who have a sufficient command of the national languages to answer the questionnaire. All interviews were carried out online and thus self-completed by the respondent. Quotas based on age, gender and region were set at the online stage in order to monitor the sample distribution of those who agreed to take part in the survey. In every country respondents were pre-recruited both on fixed lines and mobile phones using the TNS e-Call center (our centralized CATI system). The basic sample design used at the recruitment stage applied in all countries is multi-stage random (probability). In each household, the respondent was drawn at random following the "last birthday rule".

Sampling for EB Flash General Population Surveys: TNS have developed their own RDD sample generation capabilities based on using contact telephone numbers from responders to random probability or random location face to face surveys, such as Eurobarometer, as seed numbers. The approach works because the seed number identifies a working block of telephone numbers and reduces the volume of numbers generated that will be ineffective. The seed numbers are stratified by NUTS2 region and urbanisation to approximate a geographically representative sample. From each seed number the required sample of numbers are generated by randomly replacing the last two digits. The sample is then screened against business databases in order to exclude as many of these numbers as possible before going into field. This approach provides a consistent approach across all countries.


