Subject: Draft Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council  
establishing the Justice Programme and repealing Regulation (EU) No  
1382/2013 **(first reading)**  
- Decision to use the written procedure for the adoption of the Council's  
position at first reading and of the statement of the Council's reasons

---

1. On 30 May 2018 the Commission sent its proposal<sup>1</sup>, based on Articles 81(1), 81(2) and 82(1) TFEU, to the Council.
2. The European Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on 18 October 2018<sup>2</sup>.
3. The Committee of the Regions was consulted and decided not to issue an opinion.
4. The European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on 17 April 2019<sup>3</sup>.

5. On 17 February 2021, the Permanent Representatives Committee reached a political agreement on the Council's position at first reading on the above draft Regulation<sup>4</sup>.
  6. Due to the special circumstances, the Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to decide, in accordance with the first subparagraph of Article 12(1) of the Council's Rules of Procedure and Article 1 of Council Decision (EU) 2021/454<sup>5</sup>, that the Council uses the written procedure for the adoption of its position at first reading on the draft Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing the Justice Programme and repealing Regulation (EU) No 1382/2013 as set out in document 6834/20, and the statement of reasons as set out in document 6834/20 ADD 1.
