The Commission has installed a telex with an automatic answering device which gives the conversion rates in a number of currencies. This service is available every day from 3.30 p.m. until 1 p.m. the following day. Users of the service should do as follows:

- type the code 'cccc' which puts the automatic system into operation resulting in the transmission of the conversion rates of the ecu;

- the transmission should not be interrupted until the end of the message, which is marked by the code 'ffff'.

Note: The Commission also has an automatic telex answering service (No 21791) providing daily data on calculation of monetary compensatory amounts for the purposes of the common agricultural policy.

Commission communication amending the basic prices for certain steel products

(93/C 98/02)

In its statement of 31 December 1977 (¹), the Commission of the European Communities published basic prices for certain steel products. The latter was last amended with regard to the level of the basic prices by the communication of 11 December 1987 (²). The Commission communication of 22 January 1988 (³) replaced the nomenclature for the classification of steel products of the Convention of 15 December 1950 by the international Convention on the Harmonized Description and Coding System. The exchange rates for the equivalent of ECU 1 for the basic prices were last amended by the communication of 8 December 1988 (⁴).

The basic prices were revised for ordinary steel, pig iron and ferromanganese pursuant to Article 2 (6) (b) of Commission Decision No 2424/88/ECSC of 29 July 1988 on protection against dumped or subsidized imports from countries which are not members of the European Coal and Steel Community (⁵).

Revision of the calculations of normal value for the most efficient producers in the supplier country or countries with normal conditions of competition for steel products indicates a slight change compared with the previous normal value. The Commission has therefore decided to make certain changes to the basic prices for ordinary steel, pig iron and ferromanganese published in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

The Commission is monitoring the development of the main production cost factors for these products and will update the published price levels if the situation so requires.

Given the diversity of grades, the frequent variations in the price of alloys and the specific nature of the market for fine-steel and special-steel products, the Commission will not publish basic prices for those products for the time being.

The basic prices indicated below are published in ecus. The Commission no longer regards it as appropriate to set exchange rates for the equivalent of ECU 1 in the various currencies of the European Community countries. The exchange rates to be used are those regularly published in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

There may be a presumption of force majeure within the meaning of Article 22 (4) of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 262/79 of 12 February 1979 on the sale of butter at reduced prices for use in the manufacture of pastry products, ice cream and other foodstuffs where the failure to respect the time limit for the production of proof that butter has been processed in another Member State is attributable to delay on the part of the administrative authorities of that other State in verifying that the butter has been processed and in returning the control copy to the State of origin, provided that the trader in question has demonstrated

The Court of Justice of the European Communities has received a reference for a preliminary ruling made by order of the Value Added Tax Tribunal Manchester, dated 14 January 1993, in the proceedings between Empire Stores Limited and the Commissioners of Customs and Excise, which was lodged at the Court Registry on 4 February 1993, on the following questions:

For the purposes of Article 11A(1)(a) of the Sixth Council Directive on the harmonization of the laws of the Member States relating to turnover taxes (Directive 77/388/EEC of 17 May 1977), where a supplier of goods ordered by mail order from a catalogue ('catalogue goods') operates schemes, full details of which appear in the decision annexed, under which, in summary:

- (i) when a potential customer supplies satisfactory information about herself (in particular as to credit-worthiness), the supplier undertakes to supply to that person without extra charge, if and when she is approved and either orders catalogue goods or, as the case may be, orders catalogue goods and duly makes a payment for them, an article chosen by her from a range of goods offered by the supplier which may or may not also be available from his catalogue; and
- (ii) when an existing customer finds and introduces to the supplier a new potential customer who supplies satisfactory information about herself (in particular as to credit-worthiness), the supplier undertakes to supply to that existing customer without extra charge, if and when the person introduced is approved and either orders catalogue goods or, as the case may be, orders catalogue goods and duly

makes a payment for them, an article chosen by the existing customer from a range of goods offered by the supplier which may or may not also be available from his catalogue,

and the articles not so available ('non-catalogue goods') supplied as aforesaid are not otherwise the subject of supplies by the supplier and do not have a normal sale price attached to them, in relation to each scheme:

- 1. Is the supply of non-catalogue goods made for a consideration separate from the sum of money payable to the supplier for the catalogue goods ordered from him?
- 2. If the answer to 1. is 'yes', how is the taxable amount to be determined?

Is the taxable amount:

(i) the purchase price paid by the supplier for the goods;

or

 (ii) the price at which the supplier would sell the goods if the goods were also offered in his catalogue (calculated consistently with the supplier's pricing procedures);

or

(iii) some other and if so what amount?

Reference has been made to the Court of Justice of the European Communities by a judgment of the Hoge Raad der Nederlanden (Netherlands Supreme Court) of 16 February 1993 which was received at the Court registry on 1 March 1993, for a preliminary ruling in the criminal proceedings against Johannes Gerrit Cornelis van Schaik on the following questions:

1. (a) Must Article 30 of the EEC Treaty be interpreted as meaning that national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations outlined above can be regarded as a measure having equivalent effect within the meaning of that article?

- (b) Or must Article 30, on the other hand, be interpreted as meaning that national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations does not constitute an infringement thereof, because it seeks to protect a general interest justified under Community law, is not concerned with trade in spare parts for cars, and its restrictive effect on trade goes no further than is necessary?
- 2. If Question 1 (a) is answered in the affirmative: must Article 36 of the EEC Treaty be interpreted as meaning that national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations is nevertheless compatible with Article 30 of the EEC Treaty because it is justified on the ground of the protection of public security and the health and life of humans?
- 3. (a) Must Article 62 of the EEC Treaty be interpreted as meaning that national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations is incompatible with it since the conditions laid down for the grant of authorization pursuant to Article 9 (g) of the Wegenverkeerswet may, in the sector of the provision of maintenance services, result in a loss of custom for foreign garage undertakings since in the case of Dutch cars they are unable to grant test certificates?
 - (b) Or must Article 62 be interpreted, in the light of Article 55 of the EEC Treaty, as meaning that national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations does not constitute an infringement of that article because the conduct of tests by the authorized garages for the issue of the test certificate is to be regarded as being carried out in the exercise of the State's public powers?
- 4. (a) Must Articles 5, 85 and 86 of the EEC Treaty be interpreted as precluding national legislation such as the vehicle testing regulations which enables garage owners established and authorized in the Netherlands to exempt customers who entrust their cars to them for servicing from the payment of the costs arising in connection with the test and

the issue of the test certificate, with the result that owners of motor vehicles are encouraged to give their custom to those garage owners?

- (b) Or are authorized garage businesses to be regarded pursuant to Article 90 (2) of the EEC Treaty as undertakings entrusted with the operation of services of general economic interest whose fulfilment would be impeded if they were unable to grant the abovementioned cost exemption?
- 5. To what extent does it make any difference to the reply to the abovementioned questions that the adverse effect of the national legislation on intra-Community trade in goods and services and on intra-Community competition is more or less confined to border areas and manifests itself on a limited scale?
- 6. To what extent does it make any difference to the reply to the abovementioned questions if the national legislation concerns solely vehicles of categories mentioned in the Annex to Council Regulation 77/143/EEC of 29 September 1976 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to roadworthiness tests for motor vehicles and their trailers (¹), or if it also concerns other vehicles such as passenger vehicles (except taxis) and other light vehicles?

Amended proposal for a Council Regulation (EEC) establishing a control system applicable to the common fisheries policy (1)

COM(93) 107 final

(Submitted by the Commission pursuant to Article 149 (3) of the EEC Treaty on 17 March 1993)

Fifth recital

Whereas, whilst control is first and foremost the responsibility of the Member States, only the Commission can seek to ensure that the Member States monitor and prevent infringements in an equitable manner; whereas, therefore, the Commission should be provided with the financial, legal and legislative means to carry out this task as effectively as possible;

Tenth recital (new)

Whereas it is vital that Member States cooperate at the operational level during inspections at sea of fishing activities in order to allow effective and financially justifiable inspections, particularly of operations carried out outside the waters under the jurisdiction or sovereignty of a Member State;

Article 1 (3)

3. This system shall apply to all fishing activities and to all associated activities carried out within the territory and within the maritime waters subject to the sovereignty and jurisdiction of the Member States; it shall also apply to the activities of fishing vessels flying the flag of Member States which operate in third-country waters and on the high seas, without prejudice to the special provisions contained in fisheries agreements concluded between the Community and third countries or in international conventions. Such agreements and conventions may not, however, have the effect of imposing on Community vessels obligations which are less stringent than those laid down in this Regulation.

Article 2 (1)

1. In order to ensure compliance with all the regulations in force concerning conservation and control measures, each Member State shall, within its territory and within maritime waters subject to its sovereignty or jurisdiction, monitor fishing activity and related activities. It shall inspect fishing vessels and all activities whose inspection would enable verification of the implementation of this Regulation, including the activities of landing, selling and distributing, transporting and storing fish and recording landings and sales.

The previous Article 3 (5) is deleted

Article 3 (5) (new)

5. Acting in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 39 of this Regulation, the Commission may exempt from the obligations laid down in paragraph 1, for a limited, renewable period, certain types of vessel flying the flag of, or registered in, a Member State which are making a trip not exceeding 24 hours, measured from the time of departure from port to the time of return to port.

The previous Article 6 (1), (2), (3) and (5) is deleted

Article 6 (1) (new)

1. Skippers of fishing vessels flying the flag of, or registered in, a Member State shall keep a logbook of their operations indicating the quantities of each species caught and held on board, the date and location of such catches and the type of gear used. The location of the catch shall be given as a grid reference rounded down to the nearest degree.

Article 6 (2) (new)

2. The names of species which have to be recorded in the logbook in accordance with paragraph 1 shall be included in lists drawn up in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 39 and which must contain any stock or group of stocks subject to a TAC (total admissible catch) or quota.

4. Acting in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 39 of this Regulation, the Commission may exempt from the obligations laid down in paragraph 1, for a limited, renewable period, certain types of vessel flying the flag of, or registered in, a Member State, particularly those whose length overall does not exceed 10 metres.

Article 6 (6) becomes Article 6 (5)

5. Skippers of fishing vessels must record the data referred to in paragraph 1 on paper or in computer-readable form.

The second subparagraph of Article 7 (3) is deleted

Second subparagraph of Article 7 (3) (new)

Acting in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 39 of this Regulation, the Commission may exempt from this obligation, for a limited, renewable period, skippers of certain types of vessel, in particular those flying the flag of, or registered in, a Member State, and whose length overall does not exceed 10 metres;

First subparagraph of Article 19 (3)

3. Information acquired pursuant to this Article may only be used for the purpose for which it was requested and shall be available on request to the owners of the fishing vessels concerned.

Second subparagraph of Article 21 (4)

If the prejudice suffered by the Member State for which fishing has been prohibited before its quota was fished has not been removed by action in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 6 (3) of Regulation (EEC) No .../.., measures shall be adopted with the aim of remedying in an appropriate manner the prejudice caused, in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 39. These measures may involve making deductions from the quota, allocation or share of the Member State which has overfished, the quantities so deducted to be allocated appropriately to the Member States whose fishing activities were halted before their quotas were exhausted. These deductions and the consequent allocations shall be made taking into account as a matter of priority the species and zones for which the annual quotas, allocations or shares were fixed. These deductions or allocations may be made during the year in which the prejudice occurred or in the succeeding year or years and shall be calculated in

absolute terms or as a percentage in accordance with the formula most advantageous to the Member State which has suffered the prejudice;

The method used to calculate the penalty coefficients shall be laid down by the Council, on a proposal from the Commission, at the same time as the corresponding restrictions on fishing activities.

Article 30 (3a) (new)

3a. The Commission, the competent authorities in the Member States and officials and other agents are obliged not to divulge information acquired pursuant to this Article which is, by its nature, covered by professional secrecy.

Point (a) in Article 31 (6)

(a) Without prejudice to Article 169 of the EEC Treaty, in the event that officials authorized by the Commission discover possible infringements of the Community rules referred to in Article 1, or failures on the part of national departments to fulfil the obligations imposed on them pursuant to paragraph 4 of this Article, the Commission shall inform the Member State thereof without delay by means of a report. The Member State shall take all action called for by the report. The Commission may make the report public.

Article 32 (3) first subparagraph (new)

Member States shall ensure that comparable penalties are imposed for comparable offences throughout the Community.

Article 38

Before 31 March each year Member States shall transmit to the Commission a report on the application of this Regulation over the previous 12 months, containing an assessment of the technical and human resources used and measures which may help to alleviate the shortcomings discovered. On the basis of the reports submitted by the Member States and its own observations, the Commission shall draw up an annual report and shall communicate to each Member State the information which concerns it. Having taken due note of the replies from the Member States, the Commission shall publish this report along with those replies and, where appropriate, proposals for measures to alleviate the shortcomings discovered.


