COUNCIL RESOLUTION

of 22 June 1994

on the promotion of equal opportunities for men and women through action by the European Structural Funds

(94/C 231/01)

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

- 1. RECALLS that the principle of equal opportunities for men and women on the labour market is an objective of the European Union and that structural action must contribute to the achievement of that objective, within the meaning of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2052/88 of 24 June 1988 on the tasks of the Structural Funds and their effectiveness and on coordination of their activities between themselves and with the operations of the European Investment Bank and the other existing financial instruments (¹);
- 2. RECALLS that the adoption of measures intended to support the promotion of equal opportunities for men and women on the labour market shall be undertaken in accordance with the responsibility of Member States arising from the rules in force concerning the Structural Funds;
- 3. RECALLS that the promotion of equal opportunities for men and women on the labour market is one of the four measures under Objective 3 throughout the European Union, as provided for in Article 1 (1) (d) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 4255/88 of 19 December 1988 laying down provisions for implementing Regulation (EEC) No 2052/88 as regards the European Social Fund (²);
- 4. RECALLS that women experience serious and particular difficulties in the labour market;
- 5. CONFIRMS its wish that the declared principle of equal opportunities for men and women should be promoted, in particular through all the structural measures taken in the Member States;

- 6. INVITES the Member States:
 - (a) to contribute towards ensuring that due account is taken of promoting the principle of equal opportunities for men and women on the labour market in measures co-financed by the European Structural Funds, in particular the European Social Fund;
 - (b) to contribute to the adoption of appropriate measures to support the promotion of equal opportunities for men and women on the labour market in the measures financed by the European Structural Funds so as to enable women to take advantage of the prospective benefits on an equal footing with men;
 - (c) to help to ensure that specific measures targeted at women are laid down with appropriate financial appropriations with the aim of improving the position of women, and to promote at local, regional, national and transnational level, equal opportunities for men and women in every sector of economic activity and in all areas linked directly or indirectly to the labour market, by making use, in particular, of the achievements of the Community initiative NOW;
 - (d) to use every appropriate means to inform, mobilize and encourage competent bodies and social and economic partners, within the meaning of Article 4 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 2052/88, so that full account is taken of the dimension of equal opportunities for men and women in measures co-financed by the European Structural Funds;
 - (e) to use every appropriate means to define and promulgate the policy of promoting equal opportunities for men and women through the action of the European Structural Funds;

- (f) to help to ensure that the present point is implemented, within the existing national monitoring and assessment structures.
- 7. INVITES the Commission:
 - (a) to continue its efforts to put into effect the policy of promoting equal opportunities for men and women through action by the European Structural Funds, in particular by the European Social Fund and Community initiatives;
- (b) to facilitate implementation of this policy by means of technical assistance, in particular within the framework of the principle of partnership;
- (c) to take all appropriate measures to further this policy;
- (d) to take account of the objectives mentioned in point 6 when implementing Community initiatives.

Notice pursuant to Article 19 (3) of Council Regulation No 17 concerning Case IV/33.856 — Nederlandse Vereniging voor Liftnijverheid (NVL)

(94/C 231/04)

(Text with EEA relevance)

I. The notification

1. On 5 December 1990 the Nederlandse Vereniging voor Liftnijverheid (hereinafter NVL) notified four sets of rules to the Commission with a view to obtaining negative clearance, or, alternatively, an exemption. The application was submitted on the basis of Council Regulation No 17 (¹).

II. The parties

2. The NVL was founded in 1929, for an unlimited period of time. Any natural or legal person producing, supplying, maintaining or repairing lift installations, escalators, etc. on a regular basis may apply for membership. At present the NVL has eight members, all of them established in the Netherlands, but most of them being part of a foreign group or otherwise connected with undertakings in Germany or Belgium. The members of the NVL account for more than [...] of the market.

The objective of the NVL is to promote the interests of undertakings in the elevator industry in the broadest sense. It therefore promotes developments in this industry, establishes common standards and conditions, and carries out any action that may prove beneficial to the common interests of its members.

The market

3. The arrangements concern lift installations for the transport of persons and goods (among others under the NEN-EN 812-1 and NEN-EN 115 standards), and vertical and horizontal escalators. Different services can be identified: installation, repair and maintenance.

Lift installations and escalators are used throughout the Community. However, for individual undertakings the market is geographically limited to some degree by transport costs which may render longdistance servicing unprofitable in some circumstances. Since the undertakings participating in the NVL are all established in the Netherlands, the geographically relevant market will be primarily the territory of the Netherlands and the adjacent areas beyond the Belgian and German borders.

The notified rules

- 4. The notification concerned the following sets of rules:
 - the articles of association of the NVL, in the version that became effective on 28 March 1990,

containing *inter alia* provisions on the objective of the association, on membership, the appointment and tasks of the board, and members' meetings,

- the internal rules of the NVL, effective as from 3 May 1990, including provisions regarding applications for membership, contributions, the powers and activities of the organs of the NVL, and the dissolution of the association,
- the rules of the Central Bureau of the NVL of 3 May 1990, containing provisions on the duties of the Bureau, that is to say, the administrative arrangements, the organization of the Bureau, meetings, voting rights and a notification and contra-notification system concerning offers received by NVL members,
- the list of decisions and recommendations as adopted by the General Assembly of the NVL of '9 July 1990 concerning various obligations and recommendations for NVL members (such as notification of offers, and minimum tariffs).

III. Assessment of the notified arrangements by the Commission

5. Several restrictive provisions were found in the notified rules of the Central Bureau and the list of decisions and recommendations. The Commission objected to the most serious of these restrictions in a statement of objections of 12 June 1992 pursuant to Article 15 (6) of Regulation No 17.

The Commission's objections related to the rules governing the submission of tenders for installing and/or servicing lifts or escalators. Members were required to notify the Central Bureau of the NVL of each proposed contract, indicating the contract value. Subsequently, contra-notifications were given by the Central Bureau to all members having notified a tender. Installers and companies which had previously been in charge of the maintenance were given priority rights over new maintenance contracts, while other companies were obliged to offer prices at least 10 % higher than the ones offered by the priority holders (Articles 7 and 8 of the rules of the Central Bureau and decisions 3, 4 and 10 of the list of decisions and recommendations).

6. The Commission considered those provisions to be manifest and serious infringements of Article 85 (1) of the Treaty which did not qualify for an exemption pursuant to Article 85 (3).

IV. Subsequent amendments of the rules by the NVL

- 7. After some discussion with the Commission the NVL decided to meet the objections of the Commission by withdrawing the system of notification, contranotification and priority rights. To that end the General Assembly of 23 April 1993 approved the proposal to withdraw provisions 7 and 8 of the rules of the Central Bureau and decisions 3, 4 and 10 of the list of decisions and recommendations. In addition, procedural rules were introduced with a view to avoiding the exchange of confidential information on individual firms.
- 8. As a result, the Article 15 (6) procedure was closed. However, the Commission expressly reserved its position in the main procedure.
- 9. In the main procedure the Commission stated that the remaining restrictive clauses in the list of decisions and recommendations had also to be amended or withdrawn. These concerned the obligatory use of a calculation formula for service tariffs and corrections by the Central Bureau in the event of differences of more than 10 % (decision 6), minimum tariffs for repair and maintenance (decision 8 and 9), a reference to general terms for delivery including a formula for price increases after

the contract had been concluded (recommendation 1), and restrictions on advertising by members (recommendation 5).

10. The NVL, while maintaining that Article 85 (1) was not infringed, in the end decided to dissolve the Central Bureau and to withdraw the list of decisions and recommendations as a whole (decision of the General Assembly of 24 January 1994). Only the use of the classification of services will continue to be recommended, henceforth without any scoring on valuation system.

In view of the above, and particularly the amendments and withdrawals made by the NVL, the Commission intends to close the file by sending a letter of comfort with regard to such of the rules mentioned in point 4 as are still in force. However, before closing the file, the Commission invites interested third parties to submit any comments within one month of the date of publication of this notice, quoting reference 'IV/33.856', to the following address:
