- 1. On 3 March 1995, the Commission received a notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89 (1) by which Société American Express Daro Voyages France SA, belonging to the American Express Group, and Société Havas Tourisme SA, belonging to the Havas Group, acquire within the meaning of Article 3 (1) (b) of Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89 joint control of Havas Voyages American Express by way of acquisition of shares in a newly created company constituting a joint venture.
- 2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are.
- American Express Daro Voyages France: a French company providing travel services in France,
