Proceedings of the sitting

IN THE CHAIR: Mr HÄNSCH, President

(The sitting opened at 5 p.m.)

1. Resumption of session

The session, adjourned on 2 March 1995, was resumed.

2. In Memoriam

On behalf of Parliament, the President paid tribute to the memory of Sir James Scott-Hopkins, former Vice-President of Parliament, who had died the previous weekend after a long illness.

Parliament observed a minute's silence.

Mr Santini had informed the Chair that he had been present at the sitting of 28 February 1995 but that he had not signed the attendance register.

The Minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

The President announced that, the previous week, the Canadian navy had flagrantly violated international law by detaining in international waters a vessel belonging to a Member State. He announced that Parliament would have to discuss this matter during the current partsession. He would propose during the adoption of the order of business adding to the agenda a Commission statement on this question, followed by a debate.

item being taken off the agenda, Mr Puerta, on Mrs Green's remarks, Mrs Oomen-Ruijten, who agreed with Mr von Wogau, Mr Wolf, Mrs Oomen-Ruijten, who repeated her previous remarks (the President repeated that this was a Commission statement), Mrs Green who pointed out that this item could, if the House wished, be postponed to the April part-session so that the Council could also make a statement, and Mr Martens, on behalf of the PPE Group, who asked for the agenda not to be changed.

Parliament approved the PSE Group's request by EV (155 for, 113 against, 8 abstentions).

- the PSE Group had asked for the Commission statement on the Mochovce nuclear power station (Item 6) to be followed by a debate and not questions, and for the tabling of motions for resolutions to be allowed.

The following spoke on this request: Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group, Mrs Plooij-van Gorsel, on behalf of the ELDR Group, and Mrs Oomen-Ruijten, on behalf of the PPE Group.

Parliament approved the request.

Deadlines for tabling:

- motions for resolutions: 4 p.m. on Tuesday 14 March.
- amendments and joint motions: 5 p.m. on Wednesday 15 March.

Mr Langer, on behalf of the V Group, while acknowledging that his request was not in accordance with the provisions of Rule 96, asked for a Commission statement that same week on the summit on social development which had just ended in Copenhagen.

The following supported this request: Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group, and Mrs Oomen-Ruijten, on behalf of the PPE Group.

The President announced he would contact the Commission that same afternoon and would inform the House the following morning of the time the statement could be made.

Mr Elles pointed out that his group had asked for his report and the Miranda report on 1996 budgetary policy (Items 985 and 986) to be brought forward to Thursday so that they could be included in voting time at 12 noon (the President replied that this request could not be considered as it had not been tabled at least one hour before the opening of the part-session as laid down in Rule 96.

Friday 17 March:

- the PSE Group had asked for the Commission statement on the G7 meeting (Item 7) to be taken off the agenda.

The following spoke on this request: Mr Alan J. Donnelly, Mr von Wogau, chairman of the Committee on Economic Affairs, and Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group. Parliament approved the request by EV (146 for, 127 against, 1 abstention).

- the PSE Group had requested a Commission statement followed by questions on the bilateral 'open skies' agreements between some Member States and the US.

The President pointed out that Mr Kinnock, Member of the Commission responsible, could not be present on Friday.

The following spoke on the request: Mr Simpson and Mr Cornelissen, chairman of the Committee on Transport.

Proceedings of the sitting

IN THE CHAIR: Mrs PERY Vice-President

(The sitting opened at 9 a.m.)

1. Opening of session

The President opened the 1995/96 session.

2. Approval of Minutes

Mrs Pery had informed the Chair that she had been present the previous day even though her name was not on the attendance register.

The following spoke:

- Mr Janssen van Raay, who referred to his remarks of 16 February 1995 (Minutes of that Sitting, Part I, Item 1) concerning the presence in the Chamber of a parliamentary delegation from Taiwan which had been greeted by the Chair and expressed satisfaction that the visit was now on record in both the Minutes and in the verbatim report of proceedings as a result of his remarks; he regretted, however, the fact that the problems he had raised on that occasion had not yet been resolved;

- Mr Pex, who referred to Item 9 'Petitions' and pointed out that, at the sitting of 14 February 1995, he had asked for the date of receipt of petitions to be recorded in the Minutes (Minutes of that Sitting, Part I, Item 2); he protested at the failure to do so which made it impossible to check how long it took for petitions to be considered (the President replied that steps were being taken to resolve this problem);

- Mr Samland, chairman of the Committee on Budgets, who first pointed out that he had been present the previous day even though his name was not on the attendance register and then announced that at its meeting the previous evening the committee had not adopted the draft reports by Mr Elles and Mr Miranda on budgetary policy guidelines for 1996 which were due to be debated on Thursday (Items 985 and 986); - Mr Imbeni, who pointed out that he had been present the previous day even though his name was not on the attendance register: he explained that this was because the previous day he had met a delegation representing the Turkish Alawite community with which he expressed solidarity in the wake of an attack on the community by fundamentalists and the Turkish police in Istanbul;

- Mr Cassidy, who stated that he had been present the previous day even though his name was not on the attendance register;

- Mr Fabre-Aubrespy, who protested at the unavailability of the annex to the Minutes containing details of the roll-call votes taken at the previous day's sitting.

The Minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

3. Agenda

In confirmation of Mr Samland's remarks, the President announced that the reports by Mr Elles and Mr Miranda on budgetary policy guidelines for 1996 had not been adopted by the Committee on Budgets and had therefore been taken off the agenda for Thursday 16 March.

In connection with the undertaking given the previous day by the President of Parliament to contact the Commission and inform the House that morning if the Commission would be able to make a statement on the social development summit of Copenhagen (Minutes of 13.3.1995, Item 10, under 'Thursday 16 March'), the President announced that Mr Flynn, the commissioner responsible, would only be in Strasbourg that day and Wednesday and could not make an additional statement; she added that the request for a Commission statement on this subject had not been tabled before the deadlines specified in the Rules of Procedure.

The allocation body to which the application has been submitted shall be informed.

5c. The allocation of a train path or paths shall be dependent upon the issue of a safety certificate by the authority responsible for safety. This certificate shall affirm that the railway undertaking has the means to comply with the safety conditions laid down by that authority. In particular, the railway undertaking must demonstrate that it can provide rolling stock, traction, personnel and equipment appropriate to the service and route operated.

5d. The railway undertaking to which railway infrastructure capacity has been allocated shall conclude the necessary administrative, technical and financial agreements with the managers of the railway infrastructure.

IN THE CHAIR: Mrs PERY

(The sitting opened at 9 a.m.)

1. Approval of Minutes

The following Members had informed the Chair that, in the vote on am. 7 to the McIntosh report (A4-0027/95) (Part I, Item 14(b)), they had intended to vote against, not for: Bébéar, Bernard-Reymond, Decourrière and Raffarin.

The following spoke:

- Mr Fayot, chairman of the Committee on the Rules of Procedure and rapporteur on the amendment of Rule 159 of the Rules of Procedure of the European Parliament on the appointment of the Ombudsman, who expressed his disappointment that the amendments adopted by the House with the necessary majority before the referral back to committee of the report concerned (A4-0024/95) (Part I, Item 12) had not subsequently been published in Part II of the Minutes; their publication would in his view make the Rules Committee's subsequent work easier and he therefore formally requested their publication;

- Mr Brendan P. Donnelly, who noted that, even though the amendments had been adopted, they did not constitute amendments to the Rules themselves as the whole matter had been referred back to committee;

- Mr Dell'Alba, who thought it absurd to regard amendments as having been adopted when the report had been referred back to committee;

- Mr Ford, who noted that Mr Fayot had not actually requested that the Rules be considered amended but had asked for the amendments to be published solely so that there was a record in the Minutes, in order to facilitate the Rules Committee's subsequent work; he then noted that he had attended the previous day's sitting but that his name was not on the attendance register;

- Mr Friedrich, who pointed out that the referral back to committee covered the whole matter and that publishing the amendments would be a way of claiming it had not happened;

- Mr Gutiérrez Díaz, who noted that during the vote Mr Brendan P. Donnelly had declared his intention to request referral back to committee and had asked the President when he should make this request; the President had replied that the correct time to make the request was before the final vote; it should therefore be clear that referral back to committee had concerned the whole matter;

- Mr Martens, who pointed out that it was not necessary to publish the amendments simply to facilitate the work of the Rules Committee as Part I of the Minutes specified which amendments had been adopted, which had been rejected and which had fallen;

- Mr Fayot, who said that, by requesting publication of the amendments adopted, his aim had simply been to facilitate the search for a compromise in the Rules Committee; in view of the opposition to his request, he withdrew it;

- Mrs Pollack and Mrs Elisabeth Rehn.

The Minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

- Mr Bonde, who noted that the motion for a resolution on the Code of Conduct had only just been distributed and Members had not yet had time to study it; he therefore asked, in view of the subject's importance, for the vote scheduled for 12 noon that day to be postponed (the President pointed out that such requests should be made when the vote itself was taken);

1. Commission's annual programme

(a) B4-0391, 0396, 0397, 0400, 0403, 0404, 0408 and 0409/95

Resolution on the Commission's work programme and legislative programme for 1995

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 49 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the Interinstitutional Declaration of 25 October 1993 on democracy, transparency and subsidiarity (¹),
- having regard to the Commission's programme for 1995 (COM(95)0026) and the indicative calendar for legislative proposals and priority international agreements (SEC(95)0244),
- having regard to the debate of 17 and 18 January 1995 on the political guidelines of the nominated Commission and its decision of 18 January 1995 approving the nominated Commission (²),
- having regard to the statement of 15 February 1995 by the President of the Commission on the latter's programme and the debate on that subject,
- having regard to the priorities for the first half of 1995 announced by the Council Presidency at the January 1995 part-session,
- A. whereas the Commission's programme is a useful instrument for planning the legislative activities of the Union's institutions,
- B. whereas the legislative programme is an interinstitutional programme which can be implemented effectively only if it is accepted by the Union institutions,

Procedure

1. Welcomes the form and structure of the programme and the prospects opened up by it; in particular, welcomes the inclusion in the programme of a large number of White and Green Papers which will enable the European Parliament to express its views on new measures and intervene in the decision-making process at an early stage; hopes that these strategic documents will serve as the basis for future legislative proposals;

2. Welcomes the announcement by Mr Santer, President of the Commission, that the legislative programme will be assessed each autumn, and calls for the findings of that assessment to be forwarded to it so that the Commission, the European Parliament and the Council can reach a joint decision on the action to be taken on the various proposals;

3. Notes that the Commission failed to complete the 1994 legislative programme and that Parliament has not been informed of the reasons which prompted it to abandon, transform or postpone a number of proposals; takes the view that explanations for each individual case are

vital to the credibility of the whole legislative programme exercise; takes the view that an interinstitutional assessment should be carried out, each autumn, of proposals which have been held up in the Council for more than a year; calls for a procedure similar to the present budget procedure involving the Council, Parliament and the Commission to be instituted as a means of settling disputes and monitoring the implementation of the legislative programme;

4. Points out that during the last parliamentary term 23% of the legislative proposals had to be dealt with by Parliament under the urgent procedure, as requested by the Council or the Commission; this figure would have been even higher if, in more than 200 cases, Parliament had not been forced to reject the request for the urgent procedure owing to the excessively short time limits or the lack of the requisite documents; hopes that this figure will be considerably reduced in the future, by means of improved joint legislative planning, in order to avoid the disputes inherent in such urgent procedures which prevent the European Parliament from giving the proposals concerned proper attention;

5. Takes the view that any decision-making procedure concerning the legislative programme must seek to secure an agreement between the Commission, Parliament and the Council; in this connection, calls on the Council to take part in the efforts to draw up a transparent, effective legislative programme and to decide upon and communicate each autumn its legislative priorities for the following year as part of a responsible interinstitutional cooperation procedure;

6. Hopes that the effectiveness of the legislative programme as a working instrument can be increased by expanding the indicative calendar to include information concerning:

- the legal bases for proposals
- the likely date on which proposals will be submitted;

7. Reminds the Commission of its undertaking in principle to submit the annual programme in October; is aware of the exceptional circumstances which prevented observance of this timetable for 1995; calls, however, on the Commission to give a firm undertaking to draw up future legislative programmes in the autumn of the previous year, in close cooperation with the relevant committees of the European Parliament; hopes that the priorities outlined by the European Parliament during that procedure will be incorporated into the legislative programme;

The programme

8. Notes shortcomings in the Commission's programme for 1995, in particular in the following areas: measures to combat unemployment, citizens' rights, social policy, consumer protection, environmental protection, equal opportunities and anti-fraud measures; lays down its priorities for the 1995 legislative programme, calling for:

- the European Union's first priority to be the fight against unemployment, which is rife in Europe, bringing with it social exclusion and an increase in the number of poor people;
- the measures needed to modernize the economy not to jeopardize the fundamental principle of economic and social cohesion, equal opportunities and equal access to public services (health, education, transport, energy and telecommunications);
- the Commission to launch an internal debate with the objective of achieving better coordination of all the Union's policies and instruments to strengthen economic development, economic and social cohesion, environmental objectives and regional solidarity;
- 9. Calls in particular:
- (a) with regard to employment and economic and social cohesion
- (aa) on the Commission to propose economic guidelines designed to transform growth into jobs and prepare an overall plan for the creation of 15 million jobs between now and the year 2000. This plan should incorporate a new development model based on the ideas set out in Chapter 10 of the 'Delors White Paper', taking into account the principles of ecologically sustainable economic growth which should be outlined in a 'White Paper on the environment and employment'. This whole matter should be discussed at an employment conference to be organized by the European Parliament and the Commission in autumn 1995;

- (ab) for a genuine industrial policy to be drawn up with the aim of making all sectors of European industry competitive and for that policy to take into account the views of the two sides of industry; a Bangemann II working party should be set up so that all those affected by information superhighways can take part in the discussions; for the activities of cooperatives, mutuals and associations to be strongly encouraged, since the social economy has an important part to play in job creation; for the Commission to urge the Council to establish its common position on the proposals concerning the status of the social economy as soon as possible;

- (ba) on the Commission to initiate a common approach to closer international monetary cooperation with the ultimate aim of price stability, thereby leading to stable exchange rates;
- (bb) on the Commission to draw up a proposal to improve participation by Parliament, which must be consulted on the draft texts before they are submitted to the Council, the broad guidelines of economic policies (Article 103(2) of the EC Treaty), reports on multilateral surveillance (Article 103(3)) and the reports and recommendations concerning the existence of an excessive government deficit (Article 104(c)) and receive the final texts at the same time as the Council;
- (bc) on the Union to take part in a global harmonization of regulation and surveillance of the financial system to preserve its stability and avoid negative effects on the real economy;
- (bd) for European Monetary Union to be carefully prepared and for national economic policies to be conducted towards fulfilment of the convergence criteria, thereby enabling the greatest possible number of Member States to participate;
- (be) for the legislative measures needed to move to the final stage of EMU to be prepared and presented without delay so that EMU can be launched as soon as the conditions for it are met; calls for the details not to suffer when the work is speeded up;
- (bf) for the Green Paper on the introduction of a single currency to be presented well before the European Council in June 1995 and to be accompanied by an explanatory document summarizing the advantages of EMU;

- (ci) for a Directive on the reduction of the proportion of benzene in petrol, stipulating that the proportion of benzene, which is regarded as carcinogenic, should be cut to less than 1%;

- (d) with regard to consumer protection policy
- (da) for the Commission, in the Green Paper on legal provisions relating to foodstuffs, to give a clear commitment to harmonization of consumer-friendly systems for the labelling of the quality of foodstuffs and to amplify the law on labelling in force in the Community in order to ensure that consumers receive clear, readily understandable information, not least as regards advertising claims;
- (db) for a Directive on protection against unfair advertising;

- (md) on the Commission to take positive initiatives to budgetize Lomé funding, which would give Parliament much needed democratic control;
- (me) for the unilateral suspension of the payments to be made in all spheres of Community policy where Member States, in breach of Article 209a of the EC Treaty, fail to protect the financial interests of the Union;
- (mf) on the Commission to give priority to following up the reports to be prepared in response to the Essen Council showing the action which Member States themselves are taking to protect the financial interests of the Community in the same way as their own;

(n) with regard to agriculture and fisheries

(na) for the legislative programme to be completed by the following elements:

- a framework regulation to be drawn up laying down the basic principles of a proper integrated rural development policy;
- support for Parliament's legislative initiative (Article 138b) aimed at establishing a global strategy on Union forestry policy;
- a simplification of the rules reforming the CAP, as requested by the European Parliament;
- stronger promotion of renewable raw materials and better coordination of research and demonstration projects to allow this sector to be exploited efficiently;
- (nb) for a Green Paper to be drawn up on working conditions and safety on board fishing vessels;
- (nc) for proposals for a specific Mediterranean policy;
- (nd) for specific proposals to deal with unemployment in the fisheries sector caused by the depletion of fish stocks as a result of environmental and economic problems;
- (ne) on the Commission to take the necessary measures to integrate the fisheries agreements with developing countries into the development policy of the EU;
- (o) with regard to foreign affairs and development policy
- (oa) on the Commission to draw up a White Paper on the common foreign and security policy; to put forward, in preparation for the 1996 IGC, proposals to remove the democratic deficit in foreign policy; to work, in the meantime, towards the conclusion of an interinstitutional agreement allowing Parliament to be involved as closely as possible in formulating and implementing the CFSP;
- (ob) for the establishment of a proper common security policy. Ensuring that there is peace in Europe is primarily the responsibility of Europeans themselves. NATO, the WEU, the North Atlantic Cooperation Council and the OSCE are important components in this common security system for the whole of Europe;
- (oc) for the continuation of the pre-accession strategy for the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, Malta and Cyprus, and asks to be involved fully in this work;
- (od) for the establishment of peace through cooperation. The Commission is therefore urged to take the initiative in persuading the Union to cancel the multilateral and bilateral debt of the developing countries, particularly the ACP States. With regard to the trade aspects, a meaningful system of trade preferences for the ACP countries must be retained. As far as the countries of Central and South America and Asia are concerned, efforts must be made to bring about the conclusion of the cooperation agreement with Mercosur, and the partnership agreement with Mexico, and vigorously to pursue the implementation of the new strategy for Asia. Education, health, job-creation and rural and urban development measures taken by the developing countries must be encouraged via the European reconstruction and development programme;
- (oe) on the Commission to propose legal bases allowing Parliament to participate fully in the conclusion of the agreements with South Africa and the signatory states of the Lomé Convention;
- (of) on the Commission to make its contribution to establish a new framework for relations between the EU and non-member countries in the Mediterranean; this framework, based on the experience of the Helsinki process, should give rise to a Euro-Mediterranean conference on security, cooperation and development;

- (p) with regard to internal affairs
- (pa) on the Commission to make more active use of the means granted to it under Title VI of the EU Treaty and to provide for proposals under Article K.3(2); for Parliament to be properly informed and consulted in accordance with Article K.6 and for a full overview to be made available to it;
- (pb) on the Commission to use the potential of the third pillar to the full, including application of the Article K.9 procedure;
- (q) with regard to the Community civil service

on the Commission to submit a proposal for a regulation introducing special measures to terminate the service of officials and temporary staff of the European Parliament following the enlargement of the European Union on 1 January 1995;

- (r) with regard to the 1996 IGC
- (ra) on the Commission to take into account the fact that the two European Parliament representatives in the Reflection Group are full members with the same status as the representatives of the Member States and the Commission;
- (rb) on the Commission, in its report, and through its representatives on the Reflection Group, to demonstrate its solidarity with Parliament concerning the important institutional reforms which must be carried out at the Intergovernmental Conference in 1996 in order to strengthen Parliament, in particular by extending the co-decision procedure;

10. Calls on the Council to express its views and play a full part in the negotiations which will be required to implement the 1995 legislative programme;

11. Instructs its President to reach agreement, on this basis, with the President of the Commission on the annual legislative programme for 1995;

12. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the parliaments of the Member States, the Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions.

Resolution on the Commission's annual programme of work

The European Parliament,

Approves the annexed Code of Conduct negotiated with the Commission.

ANNEX

CODE OF CONDUCT

The European Parliament and the Commission,

Having regard to the Treaty on European Union,

Whereas the Treaty on European Union seeks in particular to strengthen the democratic legitimacy of the Union's decision-making process,

Whereas the European Parliament's approval of the Commission exemplifies the relationship of trust which should bind the two institutions throughout the parliamentary term,

Noting the progress achieved in the dialogue between the institutions thanks to the Code of Conduct agreed in 1990, and considering that the latter needs to be adapted to the new institutional context,

Whereas this Code of Conduct does not affect the powers and prerogatives of the European Parliament or of the Commission but seeks to ensure that they are exercised as effectively as possible within the single institutional framework established under Article C of the Treaty on European Union,

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

General principle

1. The Commission undertakes to forward to the European Parliament all its legislative proposals, proposals made in the course of the budgetary procedure and any other Commission document relating to such proposals, which are forwarded to the Council at any time during the decision-making procedures.

The Commission shall ensure that Parliament is kept informed on an absolutely equal footing with the Council, due regard being had to the Treaty.

In addition, the Commission shall endeavour not to make public any important initiatives before informing Parliament thereof in the appropriate manner.

Choice of legal basis

2. The European Parliament and the Commission note that, in accordance with the Community's structure of powers and pursuant to the case-law of the Court of Justice, the choice of legal basis must be founded on objective factors which admit of judicial review, including, in particular, the objective and content of the act.

Parliament and the Commission agree to maintain any appropriate contacts, in particular between their legal services, to facilitate discussion of the choice of legal basis.

The Commission shall take the utmost account of all changes to the legal bases of its proposals contained in Parliament amendments. The Commission undertakes to set out in detail the reasons for its position.

Where, in the course of decision-making procedures, the Council amends the legal bases proposed by the Commission, the Commission shall remind the Council of the need to adhere to the rules evolved by the Court of Justice requiring Parliament to be reconsulted. The Commission shall inform Parliament that it has so reminded the Council.

The Commission undertakes to submit to Parliament, at the same time as to the Council, any proposals amending legal bases in the course of decision-making procedures.

Legislative process

3.1. The Commission shall forward to the European Parliament and the Council on an absolutely equal footing all its strategic initiatives, such as Green or White Papers, in areas in which the Community could be required to act. If the above-mentioned strategic initiatives are accompanied by a draft resolution, it shall be submitted by the Commission to Parliament and the Council.

3.2. The legislative proposals envisaged in the annual legislative programme shall be presented by the Commission in sufficient time for Parliament and the Council to examine them thoroughly, except in cases where, for objective reasons, the urgency procedure must be applied.

3.3. Where, pursuant to Article 138b, Parliament requests the Commission to submit legislative proposals, the Commission shall take the utmost account thereof.

The Commission decisions on such requests shall be duly reasoned on a case-by-case basis, if necessary even in a sitting of Parliament.

3.4. The Commission shall ensure that the Council bodies are reminded in good time not to reach a political agreement on its proposals before Parliament has given its opinion. It shall ask for discussion to be concluded at ministerial level after a reasonable period has been given to the members of the Council to examine Parliament's opinion.

3.5. The Commission shall keep the competent parliamentary committee regularly informed of the principal positions emerging from discussions within Council bodies, particularly where they depart from the original proposal, and shall also forward any Commission amendments to the original proposal on the basis of which the Council would continue its discussions. The Commission shall inform Parliament as soon as possible if it adopts a favourable opinion on amendments by the Council to its proposals.

3.6. The Commission shall ensure that the Council adheres to the rules evolved by the Court of Justice requiring Parliament to be reconsulted if the Council substantially amends a Commission proposal. The Commission shall inform Parliament of any reminder to the Council of the need for reconsultation.

3.7. Pursuant to the provisions of the Treaty, the Commission shall take the utmost account of amendments adopted by Parliament at second reading under the cooperation and codecision procedures. If, for important reasons, and after consideration at the level of the College, the Commission decides not to include or support an amendment adopted by Parliament, it shall explain those reasons before Parliament or at the next meeting of the competent committee.

3.8. With a view to contributing to the harmonious functioning of the institutions, and having regard to the democratic legitimacy of the elected Parliament, the Commission undertakes to withdraw, where appropriate, a legislative proposal which Parliament has rejected. If, for important reasons and after consideration by the College, the Commission decides to maintain its proposal, it shall explain the reasons for that decision in a statement to Parliament (¹).

3.9. The Commission undertakes to give Parliament and the Council prior notification before withdrawing its proposals.

3.10. In relation to international agreements, including trade agreements, the Commission shall inform the competent parliamentary committee, in confidence where necessary, of the draft recommendations relating to the negotiating Directives.

The Commission shall keep Parliament, through the Parliament committee, regularly and fully informed of the progress of negotiations.

The Commission is prepared to facilitate the inclusion of Members of the European Parliament as observers in Community delegations negotiating multilateral agreements, on the understanding that the Members may not take part directly in the negotiating sessions themselves, wherever the Commission alone represents the Community.

Monitoring the application of Community law

4. In addition to specific reports and the annual report on the application of Community law, the Commission shall, at the request of the competent parliamentary committee, keep Parliament informed orally of the stage reached in the procedure as from the stage when the reasoned opinion is sent and, in cases where procedures have been initiated for failure to communicate the measures implementing a Directive, or for failure to comply with a judgment of the Court of Justice, as from the stage of formal notice.

Specific legislative powers of the Commission

5. The Commission undertakes to inform the European Parliament of acts it adopts which fall within the scope of its own legislative powers.

Implementing powers

6. The Commission and the European Parliament agree that pending the revision of the Treaties:

- The 'Modus vivendi', initialled on 20 December 1994, shall apply to implementing acts in respect of measures adopted under the codecision procedure,
- The Plumb-Delors agreement shall continue to apply to other implementing acts of a general nature,
- The Klepsch-Millan agreement on the Code of Conduct on the implementation of structural policies by the Commission, signed on 13 July 1993, shall continue to apply to implementing acts covering the Structural Funds.

Commission proposals for recommendations

7. The Commission shall forward to the European Parliament, at the same time as to the Council, any proposals for recommendations. The explanatory memorandum for every proposal shall contain an explanation of the reasons which led the Commission to choose a recommendation as the form of act.

Legislative planning and interinstitutional coordination

8. The European Parliament and the Commission also agree that dialogue should be stepped up by the following means:

- periodic contacts between the Presidents of the two institutions, with the participation of the President of the Council, should he so wish;
- the attendance of Members of the Commission at Parliament's sittings as far as possible (in particular, the appropriate Commission members when oral questions are discussed), the appropriate meetings of the Conference of Presidents and meetings of parliamentary committees. The two institutions shall agree on the timetable for such attendance, except in urgent cases;
- the continuation and enlargement of the work of the Interinstitutional Coordination Working Party to improve legislative planning;
- following the initial progress achieved, measures in the context of the synergy between Commission and EP documentary databases to speed up the introduction of computerized systems, in order to provide access to data on the state of progress of legislative procedures and to the texts of acts being considered by the various institutions.

In order to implement these principles,

 the Commission for its part shall ensure that the competent Member of the Commission is present, except on Fridays, for each part of the agenda, including Question Time. A Member of the Commission shall be present on Fridays;

as regards debates on topical and urgent subjects of major importance, the Commission shall ensure that one of the Members responsible for external relations is present;

- subject to any amendments adopted in plenary, Parliament undertakes for its part to establish its final draft agenda at the meeting of the Conference of Presidents preceding the part-session. Amendments to the final draft agenda established by the Conference of Presidents could jeopardize the presence of the competent Member of the Commission.
- Parliament undertakes to group together as far as possible the various items on the agenda falling within the remit of any one Member of the Commission;
- in order to facilitate a reply by the competent Member of the Commission, Parliament shall examine the conduct of Question Time with a view to grouping oral questions together and fixing an appropriate time-slot;

Parliament and the Commission shall contact the Council to ensure that Parliament's partsessions and Council meetings are better coordinated.

- 9. In order to improve legislative planning, the European Parliament undertakes:
- as far as possible to appoint rapporteurs on future proposals as soon as the legislative programme is adopted;

PART I

Proceedings of the sitting

IN THE CHAIR: Mr GUTIÉRREZ DÍAZ Vice-President

(The sitting opened at 10 a.m.)

1. Approval of Minutes

The following spoke:

- Mr Kellett-Bowman, on the debate on the protection of financial interests (Part I, Item 6);

- Mr Ford, who referred to the request he had made at the resumption of the sitting (Part I, before Item 10) to delete from the verbatim report of proceedings Mr Vanhecke's accusations against Commissioner Van Miert and asked if the remarks had indeed been deleted (the President announced that he would be reading out a statement on this subject in due course);

- Mr Kerr, who referred to the vote on the Cabrol report on public health, particularly amendment 46 which requested the creation of an environment free from smoke pollution in the buildings of the EU institutions, and pointed out that he had written to the President on the subject but had not yet received a reply; he asked that, as a first step, a no-smoking zone should be created around the Chamber (the President replied that he would refer his request to the Bureau);

- Mrs McIntosh, who pointed out that she had been present the previous day even though her name was not on the attendance register;

- Mrs Fontaine, who recalled that when she was in the Chair the previous day she had undertaken to ensure that the Gasòliba i Böhm report (A4-0119/94), which had not been debated due to lack of time, would be in a favourable position on that day's agenda (Part I, Item 13) (the President replied that he would make a statement on this subject after the Minutes had been approved);

- Mrs Banotti, who noted that the verbatim report of Tuesday 13 March had the wrong date on the cover;

- Mr Vanhecke, who referred to Mr Ford's remarks above and first expressed regret that the Minutes did not record the fact that Mr Ford had called Mrs Stirbois 'a merry widow', and then expressed the hope that the President would make the statement in question before the Minutes were approved; he finally noted that not only was Mr Van Miert implicated in a scandal but that the Belgian press had reported that very day that he was also implicated in the falsification of his party's accounts (the President asked that the House not get involved in a debate on this matter, noting that he would be making a statement);

- Mr Provan, who referred to the debate on the Commission statement on the attack against an EU fishing vessel (Part I, Item 10) and reiterated that Mrs Fraga Estévez had not spoken on behalf of the PPE Group but as author of a motion for a resolution, and also that Mrs Langenhagen was the group's spokesman; he asked for the Minutes to be amended to make this clear (the President replied that the matter would be examined);

- Mrs Stirbois, who made a personal statement following Mr Ford's remarks (the President cut her off).

The Minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

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The President read out the following statement by the President of the European Parliament:

'During yesterday's sitting a Member accused current and former Members of the Commission and Members of the European Parliament of fraud, and even hinted that they might be guilty of corruption.

No evidence was produced in support of these accusations.

I will therefore be referring this incident this afternoon to the Conference of Presidents and will inform you tomorrow of the measures which will be taken.'

2. Agenda

The President proposed taking the Gasòliba i Böhm report (A4-0119/94) as part of that day's agenda, following the Ephremidis report (A4-0020/95).

Parliament approved this proposal.

The President also proposed, at the request of the FE and V Groups, who wished the vote on the Mochovce nuclear power station to be taken the same day, to hold this vote at voting time at 6 p.m., on condition that texts were available in all languages.

The following spoke on this proposal: Mrs Estevan Bolea, on the availability of texts, Mr Scapagnini, who

asked for the vote to be taken at voting time at 12 noon, and Mrs Reding, who supported this request (the President pointed out that texts would not be available by 12 noon but that if they did happen to be, the matter could be reconsidered).

The House approved this decision.

The following spoke:

- Mr Gollnisch, who referred to Rule 108 and pointed out that Mrs Stirbois had asked to make a personal statement following certain remarks the previous day and that the President should have given her the floor; he also asked that, in order to back up her accusations, and with a view to ensuring the right to put up a defence, she should be allowed to appear before the Conference of Presidents, but that she should at least be given a minimum period of notice to do so (the President noted that Mrs Stirbois had had the opportunity to comment on the remarks in question the previous day (Part I, Item 6) and that she had in no way been accused that morning; he added that the Presidency would be informed that Mrs Stirbois was willing to appear before the Conference of Presidents);

- Mr Soulier, who supported the request by Mr Scapagnini concerning the inclusion of vote on the Mochovce nuclear power station at voting time at 12 noon (the President drew attention to his previous reply).

3. Monetary turbulence (statement with questions)

Mr de Silguy, Member of the Commission, made a statement on monetary turbulence.

2. Calls on the Commission to alter its proposal accordingly, pursuant to Article 189a(2) of the EC Treaty;

3. Calls on the Council to incorporate Parliament's amendments in the common position that it adopts in accordance with Article 189b(2) of the EC Treaty;

4. Calls on the Council to notify Parliament and open the conciliation procedure should it intend to depart from the text approved by Parliament;

5. Points out that the Commission is required to submit to Parliament any modification it may intend to make to its proposal as amended by Parliament;

Instructs its President to forward this opinion to the Council and Commission. 6.

- having regard to its resolution of 15 February 1995 on the European Economic Area (1),

Decides that its delegation to the European Economic Area Joint Parliamentary Committee shall be composed of 12 members.

4. Euratom-US nuclear cooperation agreement

B4-0118, 0119 and 0120/95

Resolution on the nuclear cooperation agreement between Euratom and the US

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its opinion of 20 May 1988 on the proposal for a recommendation to the Member States on developing the exploitation of renewable energy sources in the Community (1),
- having regard to its resolutions of 13 June 1991 on energy and the environment (2),
- having regard to its resolution of 29 September 1994 on illegal trafficking in nuclear materials $(^3)$,
- A. whereas the 1960 Additional Cooperation Agreement between Euratom and the US expires at the end of 1995,
- B. whereas the US authorities have for a long time tried to negotiate a new agreement adapted to their Nuclear Non-Proliferation Act of 1978 (NNPA),
- C. whereas the negotiations have not yet been concluded,
- D. noting the disagreement between the EU and the US concerning the desirability of using a permanent waiver of certain rules laid down in the 1978 NNPA,

- E. whereas the Council at its meeting on 19 December 1994 confirmed the negotiating mandate given to the Commission in December 1991,
- F. whereas this mandate has not been published,
- G. noting that the Treaty on European Union intends to 'enhance further the democratic and efficient functioning of the institutions so as to enable them better to carry out, within a single institutional framework, the tasks entrusted to them'; noting further that, whereas the Treaty establishing the European Community includes provisions that strengthen the participation of Parliament in most policies, the Euratom Treaty is still characterised by a considerable democratic deficit, making it partially obsolete,
- H. whereas in this case, as in other cases concerning the Euratom Treaty, Parliament should be fully informed, including the definition of the mandate if necessary on a confidential basis at each stage of the negotiations; whereas its opinion must be taken into account before the end of the negotiations and it must be consulted before the signing of a new EU-US agreement according to the optional procedure, pending the forthcoming integration of the Euratom Treaty into the EC Treaty,
- I. whereas fruitful cooperation between the EU and the US in nuclear affairs has to take into account both general energy policies and the legislation of both parties, as well as multilateral agreements in this sector,
- J. having regard to the arrangements based on the most rigorous control criteria of the fuel cycle and in particular taking into account the increased proliferation risks linked to the new international political context,
- K. whereas the end of the cold war and negotiations aimed at reducing strategic nuclear reserves have altered the world nuclear balance,
- L. whereas new challenges have emerged regarding the monitoring of nuclear safety for the fissile material thus made available,
- M. whereas the role of the European Union in the world has thus become more important because of the contribution it can make towards resolving the new problems of nuclear proliferation;
- N. taking into consideration the stated EU aims of non-proliferation and environmental risks caused by plutonium production and trafficking (cf. the paper by the German Presidency of September 1994 on the forthcoming NPT review conference),
- O. pointing out that in 1994 the US Department of Energy published a study concluding that nuclear weapons can be produced using plutonium of any grade (i.e. reactor grade, fuel grade or super grade),
- P. concerned that worldwide developments are endangering the purposes of non-proliferation, and that policy developments regarding nuclear weapons threats have consequences for the proliferation of civil nuclear material and technology in one part of the world and are disputed in other parts,
- Q. whereas current negotiations between the European Union and the US on the renewal of the US-Euratom agreement on nuclear cooperation have important implications both in the fields of energy policy and nuclear cooperation and in other spheres, in particular economic viability and employment, environment and health, transport, foreign and security policy (including nuclear non-proliferation),

1. Requests the Council and the Commission, as a follow-up to the initial exchanges of views with Parliament and its relevant committee, to inform Parliament thoroughly on the negotiating mandate for the new agreement on nuclear cooperation between the US and Euratom, especially regarding US conditions on and control over the processing of nuclear material of US origin, as well as on the progress of the negotiations, and to take its views duly into account before the conclusion of the negotiations; calls on the Council to consult it before the signature of the new agreement;

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2. Instructs its relevant committee, in the context of Parliament's involvement and in order to prepare Parliament's positions as formulated above, to remain actively involved in this process including:

- further exchanges of views with the Commission and the Council, to be based on timely and full information on aims, developments and prospects of the current negotiations,
- research by and consultations with experts, internal and external to Parliament, including the consequences if no new agreement on nuclear cooperation with the US comes into force on 1 January 1996;
- 3. Demands that the new agreement:
- enhance rigorous and effective control mechanisms, restricting the production, isolation, stockpiling, trade and trafficking of plutonium and weapons-grade uranium and other nuclear material in excess of the needs of a cost-effective and environmentally responsible energy policy, and guarantee transparency in this respect,
- take into account, besides policy considerations in the field of nuclear cooperation itself, consequences in the spheres of economic viability and employment, environment and health, as well as foreign and security policy,
- in the context of the above points, give the highest priority to nuclear non-proliferation;

4. Considers it essential to develop a general political debate within Parliament and among all institutions of the Union on the Union's role in the nuclear field on the world stage, not least in the context of the Union's future energy policies;

5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

5. Situation in Burundi

B4-0392, 0398, 0399, 0401, 0402, 0410 and 0425/95

Resolution on the situation in Burundi

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Council statement of 28 February 1995 on the situation in Burundi (¹),
- having regard to the report tabled by the ACP-EU Joint Assembly on a mission to Burundi, Zaire and Rwanda,
- mindful of its earlier resolutions on Burundi,
- A. concerned at the prolonged unrest in Burundi and the critical situation which exists in certain parts of the country,
- B. deeply concerned by the steadily worsening security conditions characterized by the fact that throughout the country acts of terrorism, murder, massacres and the destruction of property are on the increase,
- C. recognizing the legitimacy of the country's democratic political institutions and procedures defined according to the 'Convention of Government' by 12 of the nation's 13 established political parties,

- D. whereas following the resignation of Prime Minister Anatole Kanyenkkiko, who has been disowned by his former colleagues in the opposition movement, and his replacement by Mr Antoine Nduwayo, political and ethnic tensions have increased,
- E. particularly concerned at the assassination of the Minister for Energy and Mining, Mr Ernest Kabushemege, in a fresh escalation of violence aimed at destabilization,
- F. alarmed by the very large numbers of displaced and dispersed persons within Burundi, forced to flee their homes as a result of the conflict, in particular since the attempted coup of October 1993, and bearing in mind the strong destabilizing influence resulting from the genocide in Rwanda and the presence in Burundi of several thousands of Rwandan refugees,
- G. having regard to the threat posed by soldiers of the former Rwandan government army, which is still active in the border areas around Burundi and which has provided arms and ammunition to extremist forces operating within Burundi,
- H. aware of the significant contribution made by the European Union in terms of humanitarian aid, but regretting the fact that the international community, and in particular the European Union, has confined itself to recommending the implementation of measures to prevent the outbreak of a renewed internal conflict in Burundi,

1. Notes the abovementioned Council statement to Parliament of 28 February 1995 and urges the Council to pursue its efforts more actively in order to encourage support for the democratic institutions of Burundi and for national reconciliation;

2. Reaffirms its support for the legitimate institutions and democratic forces which, in spite of provocation from extremists, continue their work towards national reconciliation and rebuilding of the country's economy;

3. Calls on the Council to launch an emergency action plan to isolate both Tutsi and Hutu extremists, to consolidate the democratic institutions and to enable the machinery of justice to function and calls on the European Union to provide the necessary technical support should this be requested by the Burundi authorities;

4. Calls on the United Nations Security Council to act on the request by the Burundian Government for an international judicial committee of inquiry to be set up as a matter of urgency to help the country identify and prosecute those responsible for the attempted *coup* in October 1993 and for the subsequent acts of violence;

5. Calls on the Commission to accelerate the disbursement of funds for the programmes which provide for the repatriation and rehabilitation of displaced persons, it being understood that the political conditions for their repatriation must be assured and their security guaranteed;

6. Condemns the provocative acts of violence undertaken by extremist groups, the leaders of which have frequently been identified, and calls on the international community to refuse visas to those who are known to be linked with extremist activities;

7. Calls on the government and the military authorities in Burundi, in the context of a national debate, to reform the structures of the armed forces so as to allow the military command to respond better to the Directives of the civil authority and to pressures resulting from the extremist terrorist activity within the country, including arms smuggling;

8. Reiterates its full confidence in the work of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations and fully supports the efforts of the OAU observer mission in Burundi, which is acting in order to prevent conflict, and calls on the Council to help set up a UN radio station;

9. Reiterates its call for the European Union Member States represented on the UN Security Council to bring before the latter the question of the need for an international embargo on arms and munitions exports to Burundi and Rwanda and for the Member States to end all arms and munitions exports to those countries;

10. Congratulates the International Committee of the Red Cross for its efforts, alongside other NGOs, in operating locally based conflict prevention programmes;

11. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity, the President of the Republic of Burundi and the International Committee of the Red Cross.

6. Equal opportunities

B4-0406/95

Resolution on equal treatment and equal opportunities for women and men

The European Parliament,

1. Pays tribute to all women in the world on International Women's Day (8 March 1995) and recognizes their contribution to the development and well-being of humanity;

2. Encourages the Commission to pursue actively its efforts to promote equal opportunities for women and men, in particular by implementing measures to ensure that measures to ensure compliance with the principle of equal treatment and equal opportunities are incorporated in all European Union policies;

3. Regrets that women are still under-represented in decision-making bodies, in the public service, in European, national, regional and local political bodies and in economic, social and cultural activities;

4. Calls on the European institutions and the Member States, in their capacity as employers, to set target figures for the recruitment of women to positions of responsibility; calls likewise on the Member States to urge the two sides of industry and the political parties also to apply these target figures;

5. Calls on the Commission to ensure that in its officially appointed bodies and representations at least 30% are women;

6. Regrets that its own Bureau did not appoint any women to seven recent A1 and A2 vacancies;

7. Urges the Commission to present the fourth action programme as soon as possible: this should give prominence to policies and measures specifically for women in the fields of employment, decision-making and training and receive adequate funding, with particular attention being given to the NOW programme and the IRIS network;

8. Calls on the Council and Commission to take the necessary steps for the rapid improvement and adoption of the Directives on atypical work, equal treatment for men and women in statutory and supplementary social security schemes, reversal of the burden of proof and parental leave, in order to eliminate the discrimination suffered by numerous women on the labour market;

9. Calls on the Commission to keep a tighter control on the implementation and enforcement of Directives on equal treatment and equal opportunities for women and men and regularly publish a comprehensive report on the subject for the European Parliament and the national parliaments;

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10. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the Member States to ensure implementation of measures for the organization of working time, developing child-care facilities, the reintegration into working life of women who have taken time off to bring up children, and social security and tax policies that take account of family responsibilities, in order to achieve a real sharing of responsibilities between men and women, thus reconciling family and occupational responsibilities;

11. Calls on the Commission to take into consideration the report on equal pay that will shortly be adopted by the European Parliament and to enforce the measures recommended in that report without delay;

12. Calls on the Commission to make an early commitment to the work on the individualization of rights to social security and taxation, as presented in the White Paper on social policy; considers that there is a need in the meantime for a Community Directive on the sharing of pension rights in the event of divorce;

13. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the Member States to ensure equal opportunities for women and men in education and training (continuing education, distance learning, continuing training, etc.), especially with regard to the information society and new technology;

14. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the Member States to give particular attention to the policy of informing women on the provisions, measures and programmes that concern them, especially those pertaining to the fourth action programme;

15. Urges that the Commission should gather more extensive data and statistics on the situation of women on the labour market and their involvement in the Union's programmes, especially the Structural Fund programmes;

16. Calls on the group of Commissioners responsible for equal opportunities for men and women to present their work programme as soon as possible and for an 'equal opportunities' Council to discuss these matters in the near future;

17. Calls on the European Union to show greater solidarity towards women, who throughout the world suffer from poverty, armed conflicts, violence, fanaticism and fundamentalism, which encroach on their freedom and violate the principle of equal opportunities for men and women;

18. Greatly appreciates the importance attached to women's reproductive rights in the final resolutions of the UN conferences in Cairo (Population and Development) and in Copenhagen (Social Policy); takes the view that even in some Union Member States improvement is needed regarding women's reproductive rights; draws attention in this context to the 'Information Bill' passed in Ireland on 8 March 1995, dealing with the information on access to abortion in a restrictive way;

19. Calls for the European Union to make a major contribution to the fourth World Conference on Women (Beijing, China, in September 1995), in which the European Parliament will play an active preparatory and participatory role;

20. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission and the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

7. Multilateral surveillance

B4-0395/95

Resolution on information and consultation of the European Parliament in relation to Articles 103, 103a, 104, 104a, 104b and 104c EC

The European Parliament,

having regard to the Council and Commission answers to Oral Questions B4-0024 and 0025/95,

- A. having regard to the proposals put forward by Commissioner de Silguy and the French Presidency that all possible measures be taken to facilitate the transition to the third stage of EMU in 1997,
- B. whereas a preliminary study is about to be drawn up on the economic and social consequences for the populations of the Member States (purchasing power, poverty, unemployment and social security) of the application of the convergence criteria established under the Treaty on European Union,

1. Requests the Council and the Commission to report in writing on the results of multilateral surveillance;

- 2. Suggests the following calendar for the procedures and information of Parliament:
- late spring (before the Member States adopt their budgets for the following year): broad guidelines of the economic policies and recommendations on excessive deficits
- end of the year: annual economic report and the report on the results of multilateral surveillance;

3. Invites the Commission to consult it on draft texts before submitting to the Council recommendations for the broad economic guidelines (Article 103(2)), multilateral surveillance reports (Article 103(3)) and reports and recommendations on whether excessive deficits exist (Article 104c), and to send the final texts to Parliament at the same time as it sends them to the Council;

4. Reminds the Commission and the Council that the Member States are required by Article 102a of the Treaty to conduct their economic policies with a view to advancing the EU's objectives, as defined in Article 2;

5. Therefore insists that the broad economic guidelines should indicate a policy framework that will contribute to the full range of objectives in Article 2, and that both the Council's report on the implementation of the guidelines and the multilateral surveillance reports should measure progress against these objectives, giving appropriate weight to each;

6. Emphasizes that the convergence of the economies of the Member States must be based on quantitative and real criteria relating to the upward harmonization of the living standards and purchasing power of citizens of the Union, the elimination of poverty, unemployment and regional and structural disparities and economic and social cohesion;

7. Requests the Spanish Presidency to prepare an Ecofin meeting before 10 July 1995 with a view to adopting its recommendation on the broad guidelines (Article 103(2)) and to inform Parliament at its July part-session;

8. Instructs its President to insist with the Commission and the Council that an interinstitutional agreement should be reached whereby the European Parliament is involved in an appropriate way in the procedures for coordinating the economic policies of the Community and the Member States;

9. Requests the Council to adopt detailed rules for multilateral surveillance procedure in accordance with Article 103(5), taking the outcome of these negotiations into account;

10. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council and the parliaments and governments of the Member States.

8. XXIIIrd Competition Report

A4-0022/95

Resolution on the XXIIIrd Competition Report from the Commission

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the XXIIIrd Competition Report from the Commission (COM(94)0161),
- having regard to the Commission's response to its resolution of 8 February 1994 (¹) on the XXIInd report,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy and the opinions of the Committee on Legal Affairs and Citizens' Rights and of the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (A4-0022/95),
- A. whereas the recognition of the specific suitability of market economy conciliation processes is a cornerstone of economic rationality and attempts to replace market prices with prices fixed by policy or with monopoly prices have repeatedly proved inefficient in the development of European integration,
- B. whereas the prohibition of state aid pursuant to Article 92 of the EC Treaty is to be seen as one of the conditions for the creation, pursuant to Article 130 of the EC Treaty, of fair competition without social, ecological or subsidy-based dumping,

The interplay between competition policy and industrial policy

1. Considers that competition policy and industrial policy are instruments in the service of the ultimate goals of the European Union, namely the harmonious and balanced development of economic activities throughout the Community, sustainable and non-inflationary growth respecting the environment, a high degree of convergence of economic performance, a high level of employment and social protection, the raising of the standard of living and quality of life, and economic and social cohesion among Member States (Article 2 of the EC Treaty);

2. Underlines that the industrial policy has to pursue its objectives in a way that does not distort competition and reiterates the instrumental value of both competition policy and industrial policy with regard to the Community economy's requirements;

3. Considers that, if competition policy is to be both rigorous and equitable, it is essential to modify the main rules concerning transparency, the duration of procedures, legal certainty and monitoring, while retaining the existing system as set out in the Treaty;

4. Is concerned at the trend towards increasingly overt interference by governments, especially with regard to state aid, aimed at qualifying or reducing the Commission's powers under the Treaty on European Union; considers that the 1996 Intergovernmental Conference should be used to protect the Commission's political role in the definition of competition policy, since it is the sole institution directly under the democratic control of the European Parliament;

Structure of the report

5. Welcomes the new structure of the report, including the use of the Amdata database; appeals, however, for an analysis in the comments on the trend in concentration and competition in Europe to be included in future reports;

6. Requests the incorporation in future annual competition reports of a substantial report on the operation of the cooperation agreement with the United States of America regarding the application of competition rules;

European competition policy in 1993

7. Welcomes the fact that in 1993 the Commission attempted to ensure more competition in several sectors without encouraging the spread of private monopolies, an example being telecommunications, a very important sector for the competitiveness of the whole of European industry;

8. Notes with approval that the Commission also took action at international level in 1993 by negotiating with two of the EU's major trading partners, Japan and the United States, preparing for the establishment of the EEA, concluding agreements with the Central and Eastern European countries and helping to shape the international framework that has taken the place of the traditional GATT trade agreements; sees a need for the removal of barriers to international trade no longer to consist solely in the abolition of state obstacles but also to be attributable to the competitive behaviour of undertakings;

9. Recognizes that the Commission's DG IV has a growing workload and encourages the Commission to consider ways of decentralizing the application of the rules on competition with the aim of achieving a reasonable division of labour between the Commission and the Member States;

10. Is concerned, however, that DG IV's powers over certain aspects of the monitoring of competition – especially state aid – are evidently passing to other Directorates-General, and considers that improved cooperation between DG IV and other Directorates-General is necessary in order to achieve greater consistency and coordination;

The new demands on competition policy

11. Refers to the major contribution that competition policy is making to the completion of the internal market by monitoring concerted business practices, mergers and state aid; but considers it vital that the Commission should be enabled to act as rapidly as possible on the basis of Regulation 4064/89 (EEC) (¹) on the control of concentrations between undertakings, revised so as to take greater account of the new situations arising from the opening up of frontiers;

12. Calls on the Commission to strengthen its concern for pluralism and to make use of all means of competition policy and merger control to prevent distortions of competition in sectors as important as the mass media and the new communication technologies;

13. Welcomes the conclusion of the GATT Uruguay Round and the progress it will bring in the liberalization of international trade, and expects the WTO soon to be in a position to deal with the still outstanding problems;

14. Welcomes, therefore, the idea of developing an international system of competition based on reciprocity, and calls on the Commission to encourage the negotiation of bilateral and multilateral agreements on the application of the competition rules, for example with NAFTA; calls on the Commission to seek within the World Trade Organization (WTO) to ensure the introduction of international competition rules in order to curb and monitor restrictions of competition, mergers of market-dominating enterprises, the emergence of oligopolistic structures and the dominant position of multinational enterprises in global markets;

15. Calls on the Commission to remove as soon as possible the remaining obstacles to the smooth functioning of the internal market and to commit itself to ensuring the free movement of persons, goods, services and capital;

16. Points out that there would be less concern about the future of the competition policy if it had been possible for all the provisions relating to the European internal market to be implemented on 1 January 1993;

17. Welcomes the regional policy being pursued by the Commission in that general investment aid may now be granted only to underdeveloped regions and undertakings in difficulty due to economic circumstances, with exemptions permitted only for the promotion of small- and medium-sized enterprises;

Widening the scope of the competition policy

18. Points out that widening the scope of the competition policy also includes measures for the protection of the environment; emphasizes the need, however, for environmental standards in the Member States to be harmonized upwards (for example, ecotax on energy) in order to prevent distortions of competition;

19. Considers that, in order to guarantee a strict system of competition, social legislation should also be harmonized; the opt-out clause in the social sphere is a distortion of competition and, as such, is unacceptable;

20. Welcomes the signing of association agreements with another two Central and Eastern European countries, Romania and Bulgaria (such agreements having previously been concluded with Poland, Hungary, Slovakia and the Czech Republic); notes that these agreements cover important aspects of competition policy and provide for the legislation of these countries to be progressively approximated to the EU rules on competition; and proposes that the Commission should insist that programmes be adopted for restructuring and the reduction of capacities in industrial sectors producing a surplus and the gradual reduction of public aid in accordance with time-limits which may vary according to the situation in each country;

Sectoral problems

21. Regrets that the programme to reduce capacities in the steel market in 1993 failed, except in the case of firms which required public aid for restructuring programmes; is surprised that some other steel firms are announcing increases in capacity and wonders which Community industrial policy governs this sector;

22. Agrees with the view expressed by Commissioner Van Miert at the hearing before the European Parliament that competition policy is not a monolithic structure but is constantly changing in accordance with developments in economic, social or environmental conditions and therefore requests that for shipping policy the Commission should acknowledge the increasingly global nature of sea transport, including the integrated procedures used before and after the transport of containers, and not jeopardize the existence of European shipping companies by a narrow competition policy, since they face stiff competition, especially from East Asia;

23. Requests that the establishment of an internal market in energy be based on a common energy policy and stresses that the creation of an internal energy market must not jeopardize security of supply and the fulfilment of public service obligations by firms in the sector;

24. Notes the problem of the banking interchange fees that will have to be entered into between banks for the settlement of cross-border payments and that will have to be compatible with the competition provisions; calls on the Commission to clarify how it intends to interpret competition rules in this area;

Competition policy and the European citizen

25. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to act in accordance with the greatest possible transparency and maximum publicity to enable the citizens of Europe to understand the advantages of the single market and the proper and fair application of competition policy;

26. Calls on the Commission to strike a balance between the objective of introducing competition in sectors which traditionally offer public services and the need to offer such services while respecting such principles as equality, universality, continuity and transparency;

State aid

27. Endorses the Commission's view that it should continue to be the only body authorized to take decisions on state aid in the Union; applauds the fact that the Heads of State or Government have likewise referred to the importance of enforcing the Community's competition policy in the area of state aid, a strategy advocated in the White Paper;

28. Calls on the Commission to submit to the European Parliament each year comprehensive, country-by-country reports on the public aid granted;

29. Expresses its concern at the application of the principle of authorizing public aid 'for the last time' to certain industrial sectors and undertakings in the European Union in view of the possible emergence of a number of exceptional international factors which may affect the Community's industrial competitiveness;

30. Calls on the Commission to apply strictly the new guidelines in the sphere of state aid to air transport, particularly the principle that restructuring aid is to be granted a second time only in exceptional, unforeseeable circumstances beyond the firm's control (*force majeure*);

31. Recognizes that the relationship between public undertakings and their state shareholders can pose problems; welcomes, therefore, the Commission's adoption in 1993 of a Directive amending an earlier Directive on the transparency of financial relations between the Member States and public undertakings;

Procedures

32. Welcomes the measures taken by the Commission in 1993 to simplify and speed up certain procedures; welcomes the Commission's proposal for the amendment of the abovementioned Regulation on the control of concentrations between undertakings, which would substantially reduce the level of turnover at which the Commission was required to act;

33. Endorses the greater flexibility this amendment would bring, enabling the Commission to leave it to the national authorities to investigate concentrations that reached this level but were entirely national in scope;

34. Calls on the Commission to study the future development of the European merger control policy, its procedures and institutional aspects, by exchanges of experience and views with the associations and interest groups involved in business and to report back to Parliament;

35. Calls on the Commission to report on conflicts of objectives between the competition policy in the narrower sense, the monitoring of state aid and the anti-dumping procedures and to submit proposals for solutions in its next report;

36. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the appropriate authorities in the Member States and EFTA countries and the governments and parliaments of the Member States and EFTA countries.

9. 'Hormone mafia'

Resolution on combating the 'hormone mafia'

The European Parliament,

- A. having regard to the murder of the veterinary inspector Karel van Noppen on 20 February 1995.
- B. whereas this murder is one more in a series of attacks carried out over many years in Europe against individuals who denounce the hormone mafia and against those involved in combating such illegal practices,
- C. having regard to the communication from the Commission to the Council and the European Parliament concerning the identification of residues in meat (hormones, beta-agonists and other substances),
- D. having regard to the proposals for Council Regulations (EC) concerning the prohibition on the use in stockfarming of certain substances having a hormonal or thyrostatic action and beta-agonists (COM(94)0441) (1) and (COM(94)0293) (2),
- E. having regard to its resolution of 26 May 1993 on residues in meat (3) and its opinion of 19 April 1994 on a proposal for a Regulation on measures to monitor certain substances and residues thereof in live animals and animal products (4),
- F. having regard to the conclusions and recommendations drawn up in 1989 by its committee of inquiry into the use of growth substances in stockfarming,
- G. having regard to the legitimate concerns expressed by butchers, veterinarians, pharmacists, agricultural producers and consumers with regard to the continued illegal use of hormones and other growth substances in stockfarming (antibiotics, beta-agonists, etc.),
- H. having regard to the increasing number of obstacles, threats and technical problems which veterinarians face when inspecting animals for slaughter whose meat is intended for human consumption, and deeply concerned at the scale of trafficking in hormones within the European Union, the spread of which is facilitated by networks involving the complicity of certain sections of national administrations;
- I. having regard to the vital importance of maintaining in the European Union a beef and veal sector which enjoys full consumer confidence and to the imperative need to guarantee public health,
- J. whereas the increase in factory farming in the EU is an inducement to the illicit use of hormone products,
- K. having regard to the practice of constantly changing the chemical composition and the combinations of substances used to promote growth in animals and the resulting difficulties faced by the monitoring authorities in producing proof, and having regard to the problems in drawing a distinction between the use of approved veterinary medicinal products and their illegal use as growth promoters,

- L. having regard to the inquiry into 'growth substance residues in meat' carried out by Test-Achat (report drawn up for the Commission), which has revealed problems in almost all the Member States,
- M. whereas it is vital to ensure that all meat produced in the European Union should be free of illegal substances,

1. Extends its sincere condolences to the family of the veterinary inspector Karel van Noppen and condemns the foul crime perpetrated by the hormone mafia;

2. Condemns the Council's failure to act and calls on the Council to adopt, as a matter of urgency, the aforementioned proposals for Council Regulations (EC) concerning the prohibition on the use in stockfarming of certain substances having a hormonal or thyrostatic action and of bega-agonists;

3. Calls on the Commission to propose a legal basis for strict import controls and compulsory registration for the comprehensive monitoring of production volumes and marketing channels of veterinary medicinal products;

4. Calls on the Council to introduce, as a matter of urgency, Community legislation concerning beta-agonists (redistributors, clenbuterol, angel dust) explicitly prohibiting their use in stockfarming, and calls on the Council to retain the current rules which prohibit any use of substances having a hormonal or thyrostatic action;

5. Calls for veterinary medicinal products to be available only on prescription and for them to be administered only by approved veterinarians, and calls for the introduction of a compulsory system of labels for all animals treated with medicinal products which could be misused as growth promoters;

6. Supports respect for working animals as living beings and calls for rules on keeping animals which are appropriate to individual species, breeding methods which respect the animals and monitoring of these rules by the competent authorities;

7. Takes the view that the European Union urgently needs an effective, uniform system of checks (uniform application of Directives governing checks, checks on national laboratories carried out by certified Community laboratories, use of uniform analytical techniques, annual publication of the findings) and calls on the Member States to step up monitoring and checks regarding the use of illegal substances in meat;

8. Takes the view that the problem is not confined to individual countries and that the 'hormone mafia' must be combated at international level; takes the view that in order to break up the networks, the Commission's task force should be given more resources to coordinate more effectively action taken by national authorities and that a specialist international unit must be set up with responsibility for coordinating information available on the existing international networks and collating it in a European data base which can be consulted by national detection services; calls specifically for the duties of Europol, once it has been set up, to include the fight against trafficking in anabolic substances;

9. Calls on the Commission and Council to introduce stringent penalties for the misuse of medicinal products in stockfarming, up to and including a ban on farming or pursuing their profession for meat producers or veterinarians who use or administer illegal growth promoters;

10. Calls on the Commission to promote, in the light of the resolutions previously adopted by Parliament, a system guaranteeing checks on the quality of meat production from the farm to the consumer, and therefore takes the view that it is vital to introduce a quality label recognized throughout the European Union;

11. Calls on the Commission to fund an annual independent inquiry into the presence of residues in meat and to publish annually the official findings of the monitoring plan concerning the detection of residues in animals and meat as specified in Article 4 of Council Directive 86/469/EEC (¹);

12. Calls on the Commission to organize seminars, workshops and informal meetings of experts from national detection services and laboratories in order to maximize exchanges of information between national officials;

13. Takes the view that the Commission must, as far as possible, incorporate into an overall legislative text all the provisions concerning the use of pharmaceutical products in animal husbandry and the monitoring and checks on such use in order to simplify the legal situation and thus help the authorities responsible for enforcing legislation, producers, butchers, consumers and veterinarians;

14. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the governments of the Member States.

10. Equatorial Guinea

B4-0416, 0436, 0444, 0451, 0465 and 0476/95

Resolution on the situation in Equatorial Guinea

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its earlier resolutions on the situation in Equatorial Guinea, in particular its resolution of 27 October 1994 (¹) and the resolution adopted at the most recent ACP-EU Joint Parliamentary Session in Dakar in February 1995,
- A. seriously concerned at the developments in the process of democratization in Equatorial Guinea,
- B. whereas Equatorial Guinea is a signatory to the Fourth Lomé Convention and, therefore, to Article 5 of the Convention concerning human rights and democracy,
- C. concerned at the continuing obstruction of the process of democratization by the Government in Malabo,
- D. concerned at the detention, trial and conviction of the Chairman of the Party of Progress (PP), Mr Severo Moto, and of the Secretary of Finance of the same party, Mr Tomás Elo Aka,
- E. whereas, even if the judgment against Mr Moto and Mr Elo Aka is reversed on appeal, their conviction will paralyze political dialogue with the opposition and, therefore, the process of democratization,

1. Strongly condemns the suspension of the active and passive civil rights of Mr Moto and Mr Elo Aka;

2. Strongly condemns their disqualification from holding public office;

3. Calls on the authorities in Equatorial Guinea rigorously to respect human rights and to speed up the establishment of democratic and legal institutions;

4. Demands an end to repression against party leaders and activists of the democratic opposition;

5. Demands that the recommendations of the United Nations Special Rapporteur are complied with;

6. Demands the fulfilment of the commitments entered into at the meeting of the Group of Donors held in June 1994 with the opposition and the countries concerned;

7. Calls on the Council and the Commission to spur the Government of Equatorial Guinea to adopt measures to that effect and for all the necessary precautions to be adopted with regard to cooperation with Equatorial Guinea as long as the respect of human rights and political democratization are not guaranteed;

8. Calls for its previous resolutions on Equatorial Guinea to be implemented;

9. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the United Nations Commission on Human Rights, the Joint Opposition Platform of Equatorial Guinea, the Government of Equatorial Guinea and to the signatory countries of the Lomé Convention.

11. Human rights

(a) B4-0418, 0421, 0433, 0445, 0473 and 0477/95

Resolution on human rights in Chechnya

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolutions of 15 December 1994 (¹) and 19 January 1995 (²) on the situation in Chechnya, and 16 February 1995 on the humanitarian situation in Chechnya and the neighbouring republics of Ingushetia, Dagestan and Northern Ossetia (³),
- A. whereas the fighting in Chechnya is continuing and several ceasefire attempts have failed,
- B. having regard to the conclusions of the Helsinki Watch field investigations carried out in Chechnya from 8 to 20 February 1995, which found that Russian forces continue to commit 'flagrant violations' of human rights,
- C. considering that, whilst respecting the internationally recognized borders of the Russian Federation, the authorities of the Russian Federation have the obligation to restore respect for human rights and democracy in this region,
- D. saluting the declared opposition of many Russians to these military operations and the violations of human rights accompanying them,
- E. whereas over the past three years, as a consequence of several conflicts in the northern Caucasus region and the war in Chechnya, there have constantly been around 400 000 people fleeing their homes, living under precarious conditions which are a threat to their survival,
- F. deploring the fact that the State Duma has decided to dismiss Mr Sergei Kovalev from his duties as Commissioner for Human Rights,

EN

1. Reiterates its strong condemnation of the serious violations of human rights committed by parts of the Russian army in Chechnya, and asks the Russian authorities to take action against those responsible;

2. Reiterates its call on the Russian and Chechen sides to call an immediate humanitarian ceasefire in the conflict – in order to allow for the retrieval of the dead and wounded, and the establishment of corridors and safety zones to facilitate aid measures – and to start negotiations and create the conditions for the restoration of human rights and democracy in Chechnya;

3. Demands that the people living in the combat zone be treated by the Russian army with full respect for human rights and the rights of minorities as defined in the conventions to which Russia has subscribed, and reminds the latter that Parliament will make this a precondition for future closer relations with the European Union;

4. Insists that humanitarian aid dispatched to relieve the people concerned must be allowed to reach them as fast as possible without being diverted, which will involve tight control over the supply routes for such aid, and that there should be no obstacle to distribution by non-governmental organizations;

5. Calls on the central Russian Government to take seriously the problem of displaced persons from Chechnya, to guarantee them essential infrastructures and the supply mechanisms necessary for their survival and to initiate a reconstruction plan to enable families to return to their former home areas;

6. Insists that permanent observer missions from the OSCE and international delegations, including the delegation from the European Parliament, must be allowed access to the conflict zone forthwith, so as to be able to assess on the spot the actual situation facing the people concerned and the most urgent measures that should be taken for their relief;

7. Hopes that the State Duma will reconsider its decision to dismiss the Human Rights Commissioner, Mr Kovalev, from his duties;

8. Urges its Delegation for relations with the Russian Federation to discuss these matters with the Russian authorities and to report to Parliament as soon as possible after their return;

9. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the President of the Russian Federation, the President of the State Duma, the Chechen authorities and the Secretary-General of the OSCE.

(b) **B4-0469/95**

Resolution on the reintroduction of the death penalty in the state of New York

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the death penalty and, in particular, its resolution of 12 March 1992 ⁽¹⁾,
- A. whereas, 19 years after abolishing it, the state of New York reintroduced the death penalty on 7 March 1995,
- B. whereas New York has therefore become the 38th state to restore the death penalty after the Supreme Court's decision in 1976 to allow the states to reintroduce capital punishment,

1. Reiterates its total opposition to the death penalty;

2. Condemns the restoration of the death penalty in the state of New York and calls for any death sentences that may be passed in that state to be automatically commuted to terms of imprisonment;

3. Calls on the state of New York and the United States in general to renounce, once and for all, capital punishment;

4. Calls on American politicians to have the courage to work towards the definitive abolition of the death penalty and to conduct a large-scale public awareness campaign on the fact that the death penalty is both ineffective and immoral;

5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the American federal authorities and the competent authorities of the state of New York.

(c) **B4-0427**, 0446 and 0452/95

Resolution on the rape of women in Rwanda

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas, according to information received from independent organizations, thousands of Rwandan women and young girls were victims of systematic mass rape during the genocide between April and July 1994,
- B. whereas the rapes have disastrous consequences for the victims: the risk of contracting AIDS, precarious medical conditions, the rejection of children and psychological traumas,
- C. whereas in UN Resolution 808 of May 1993, the United Nations Security Council called systematic rape a crime against humanity,

1. Strongly condemns the sexual violence perpetrated against Rwandan women and girls;

2. Insists that the international community provide sufficient human and material resources for, and cooperate fully with, the UN Security Council ad hoc tribunal for Rwanda, set up on 8 November 1994, which is responsible for bringing to justice perpetrators of genocide, crimes against humanity and violations of humanitarian law committed since 1994;

3. Calls on the NGOs and humanitarian associations operating in the area to take whatever measures are necessary to assist the women who are victims of violence;

4. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments of the Member States, the Rwandan Government and the UN Secretary-General.

(d) **B4-0426/95**

Resolution on the worsening situation in Iraq

The European Parliament,

- A. shocked by the explosion of a bomb in a crowded market at Zakho in Iraqi Kurdistan on 28 February 1995 which killed over 70 people and injured many others,
- B. deploring the fighting between supporters of the Kurdish Democratic Party (KDP) and of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan (PUK) which has been going on since December 1994,
- C. deploring the grave violations of human rights by both the KDP and the PUK and also by the Islamic Movement in Iraqi Kurdistan which, according to Amnesty International, have been numerous,
- D. appalled by the report of the Special Rapporteur of the UN Human Rights Commission in Iraq published on 15 February 1995,
- E. pointing out that, although UN observers have denied that fighting between Iraqi and PUK forces has taken place, both the PUK and Baghdad claim that the other started an offensive which led to serious fighting,

1. Calls on the KDP and the PUK to stop fighting, since that can only increase the danger of all Kurds living in Northern Iraq being subjected to Saddam Hussein;

2. Calls on the KDP and the PUK to abandon forthwith the use of terror tactics, assassinations, torture of prisoners, detention or other punishment without trial and warns that the continuation of such practices is bound to make opinion in the EU and other democracies less sympathetic to the cause of the Iraqi Kurds;

3. Condemns the Iraqi regime for establishing a system in which the Revolutionary Command Council, which is controlled by Saddam Hussein, gives sweeping powers of prosecution, trial and punishment to local sections of the Arab Baath Socialist Party and 'people's councils';

4. Expresses its horror that, according to the UN's Special Rapporteur, there were, on 31 January 1995, 15 781 cases of people who have disappeared waiting to be resolved, including over 600 Kuwaitis and other foreigners who vanished at the time of the invasion of Kuwait, while hundreds more people who have disappeared are waiting to be listed;

5. Expresses its horror that, among the many decrees of the Revolutionary Command Council ordering capital punishment or mutilation, such provisions occur as one postponing an amputation for a pregnant woman until four months after the birth of her baby;

6. Expresses its horror at the evidence of people tortured to death – their bodies sometimes returned to their families with their eyes pulled out – and at numerous executions and the continued attacks on the Marsh Arabs of Southern Iraq and the destruction of their habitat;

7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the Members of the Security Council, the leadership of the KDP and the PUK, the UN Human Rights Commission and President Saddam Hussein.

(e) B4-0435/95

Resolution on the dangerous situation in Algeria

The European Parliament,

- recalling its previous resolutions on the situation in Algeria,
- A. appalled by the atrocities committed in Algeria in the struggle between an oppressive government and religious fanatics,
- B. pointing out that, according to the Algerian Government, 6 388 people were killed in 1991, among them 61 foreigners,
- C. pointing out that in the three years of violence 59 children have been killed,
- D. shocked by the prison mutiny at Serkadji on 21 February 1995 in which about 100 prisoners and four guards were killed,
- E. recalling the 100 deaths in the prison mutiny of Berrouaghia in November 1994,
- F. drawing attention to the arrest of eight Algerian religious fanatics in Belgium on 2 March 1995 following the discovery of arms, explosives and false papers by the Belgian police,
- G. drawing attention to the threats of the Groupe Islamique Armé (GIA) on 4 March 1995 if the Belgian authorities do not release those arrested,

1. Condemns all those responsible for murders, often accompanied by atrocious torture and mutilation, and deplores that religion is being used as a pretext to commit terrible crimes;

2. Urges the Algerian Government to establish independent inquiries into the prison mutinies and their repression;

3. Stresses that the threat to public order in Belgium is typical of the dangers with which Europe is confronted by terrorism inspired by religious fanaticism;

4. Insists that this threat makes cooperation between EU police forces all the more important and urgent;

5. Insists that the situation in Algeria and its position as a major trading partner of the EU clearly show the pressing need for a common foreign and security policy of the European Union;

6. Insists on the need for a negotiated settlement in Algeria and notes that one of the few hopeful signs is that the Foreign Minister of Algeria, Mr Mohamed Salah Dembri, has recently said that there are positive elements in the declaration made in Rome in January 1995 by some leaders of the opposition;

7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council and the Government of Algeria.

(f) B4-0455 and 0462/95

Resolution on acts of racist violence in France and Italy

The European Parliament,

- A. horrified by the attack on two gypsy children in Pisa on 14 March 1995,
- B. deeply shocked by the death of Ibrahim Ali, a 17-year-old French schoolboy of Comoro origin, who died during the night of 21/22 February 1995 in Marseilles after being shot in the back by National Front billposters, and by the attack on Mrs Joussef Hohalin Nurta, a 22-year-old, seven-months pregnant Somalian woman who was viciously kicked by four teenagers at Ostia,
- C. disgusted by the attempts to explain and justify the killing of Ibrahim Ali by National Front leaders who have dared to invoke self-defence despite the fact that their billposters were armed and are reported to have fired shots from a car on a group of young people carrying musical instruments;
- D. whereas the public prosecutor has found no evidence to support the self-defence argument;
- E. extremely concerned about acts of racist violence on members of communities of foreign origin in numerous European countries,
- F. outraged by the racist and xenophobic utterances of certain political leaders and by the spread of propaganda encouraging xenophobia for electoral purposes,
- G. anxious about the machinations of certain extreme right-wing groups and the increasingly frequent acts of violence and attacks perpetrated by their members;
- H. whereas racist acts are an offence against human rights and extremist ideas kill just as much as weapons;

1. Expresses its sympathy to the family of Ibrahim Ali, to all families of victims of racist acts and to Mrs Joussef Hohalin Nurta;

2. Strongly condemns these acts of racist violence and racist utterances or propaganda which may lead to crime;

3. Calls for those responsible for the death of Ibrahim Ali and the attack on Mrs Joussef Hohalin Nurta to be punished;

4. Calls also for the National Front leaders who attempted to explain and justify the murder of Ibrahim Ali to be prosecuted;

5. Urges the governments of the Member States to ensure the protection of foreign communities against racist and fascist violence and to contribute to an improvement in their living, housing and working conditions;

6. Calls on the governments of the Member States and the authorities of the European Union to tighten up measures to combat racism and xenophobia by implementing the proposals it has put forward on numerous occasions, and in particular by adopting and tightening up legislation against racism and xenophobia in all the Member States;

7. Calls on all political leaders to refrain from any utterances encouraging xenophobia, even indirectly;

8. Calls on the Member States to use all the legal means available to combat racist attacks, and to consider how the organizations and parties concerned can be made accountable for creating the moral climate in which killings like that in Marseilles are possible;

9. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, and the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

12. Western Sahara

B4-0424, 0429, 0450 and 0472/95

Resolution on Western Sahara

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the UN resolution on a referendum on self-determination in Western Sahara,
- having regard to the interim report by the United Nations Secretary-General of 14 December 1994 on the implementation of the peace plan in Western Sahara,
- recalling its earlier resolutions on the situation in Western Sahara,
- A. having regard to its support for UNMIRWS, the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara, created in September 1991 to monitor a cease-fire in the war between the Polisario Front and the Moroccan forces and to conduct a referendum on the future of the area;
- B. having regard to the insufficient numbers of UNMIRWS personnel and concerned about its role as an independent mission and especially in preparing the referendum,
- C. deeply concerned about the fact that the referendum, originally scheduled to take place in 1992, is now planned for November 1995 after having been postponed on several occasions,
- D. concerned about the alleged irregularities in procedures relating to voter application, registration and identification,

1. Calls on the Moroccan authorities to comply with their undertakings and put an end to their stalling tactics which are designed to hold up the implementation of the peace plan;

2. Warns that failure to resolve the conflict could jeopardise the security of the entire region;

3. Appeals to the UN Secretary-General, as a matter of urgency, to step up his efforts to ensure that UNMIRWS takes effective measures to promote a free and fair referendum on Western Sahara;

4. Calls once again on the Polisario Front, and in particular the Kingdom of Morocco, to enter into direct negotiations with a view to the proper implementation of the peace plan until a fair and free referendum is held;

5. Calls upon the Conference of Presidents to consider the desirability of designating an appropriate delegation of members to carry out a fact-finding mission to Western Sahara in the immediate future for the purpose of investigating the preparation of a referendum and calls on the Moroccan Government to facilitate access to Western Sahara for this delegation;

6. Also calls on the Moroccan Government to drop its ban on access to Western Sahara for foreign observers, in particular parliamentary observers, legal experts and journalists;

7. Calls on the Union's authorities and the governments of the Member States to do everything in their power in the context of their political, economic and commercial relations with Morocco to ensure that the Moroccan Government complies with its undertakings and implements the UN peace plan in its entirety;

8. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments of the Member States, the Moroccan Government, UNMIRWS, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the Secretary-General of the OAU and the Polisario.

13. Drought in southern Europe

B4-0414, 0457 and 0474/95

Resolution on the drought in southern Europe

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas the serious cyclical drought of a structural nature from which Spain, Greece, Italy and Portugal have been suffering for several years is seriously jeopardizing the survival of agriculture, stockfarming and the processing industries for these sectors,
- B. whereas the huge losses caused by the drought are resulting in a substantial fall in the level of farm incomes,
- C. whereas in Spain, Italy, Greece and Portugal millions of hectares of crops on irrigated and unirrigated land have been affected by the rainfall shortage,
- D. whereas the drought is causing irreparable and unavoidable damage to Spanish agriculture and stockfarming and whereas the processing industry is in difficulties with regard to supplies of specific raw materials at competitive prices,
- E. whereas contacts between the Commission and the competent authorities have allowed a preliminary assessment of the problems arising from the drought and its effects on the application of the CAP to be made in situ,
- whereas in the past (in the case of Portugal, Council Regulations (EEC) No 3311/92 (1) and F. (EC) No 787/94 on special measures to assist farmers affected by the drought $(^2)$) Community measures have been adopted to deal with this problem,

Calls for the drought in Spain, Greece, Italy and Portugal to be declared 'structural' in order to enable amendments to Community legislation with a view to maintaining the incomes of farmers and stockbreeders:

Calls for the base area for the purposes of Community compensatory payments to be 2. reviewed, both for irrigated and unirrigated land, with a view to an increase in total payments;

Proposes adoption by the Commission and the Council of urgent measures with a view to 3. remedying as far as possible the near-disaster affecting the agricultural sector;

4. Proposes the drafting of a joint plan by the Commission and the Member States affected with a view to the rational exploitation of water resources and the modernization of supply networks and irrigation systems in order to optimize the utilization of those resources including measures of an environmental nature aimed at saving the water used in irrigation;

Calls on the Commission and the Member States to reach joint agreement to endow the 5. exceptional measures with adequate funding to guarantee their effectiveness;

Calls on the Community institutions to consider drought as a special situation which can 6. have extremely adverse repercussions on the development of certain areas of the European Union, and that it is ceasing to be a transitory, cyclical situation and is well on the way to becoming structural;

Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, Commission and Committee of the Regions and the governments of the Member States.

14. Situation in Croatia

B4-0415, 0430, 0464, 0486 and 0489/95

Resolution on Croatia

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on the situation in the former Yugoslavia,
- A. having regard to the announcement by the President of Croatia, Mr Franjo Tudjman, on 12 March 1995 during the Social Summit in Copenhagen, that he will allow the renewal of the mandate of UN troops in Croatia beyond 31 March 1995, but noting that he wants their numbers to be reduced by more than half,
- B. whereas the departure of UN forces before a political solution has been accepted by all the parties to the conflict could result in resumption of the fighting and the war, thereby reducing to nought all the efforts made hitherto by the international community,
- C. noting with abhorrence that fighting in Bosnia-Herzegovina has recently reintensified, especially in and around Bihac and Sarajevo,
- D. subscribing to the position of the Council and the Commission that the UN's mandate in Croatia must be maintained, and possibly renewed, and that relations between the European Union and Croatia should be made dependent on the adoption of this position,
- E. insisting that there must be no recognition of territorial gains and that a new UN mandate must not in any way prejudice this matter,
- F. convinced that any political solution must recognize the legitimate rights of Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina to territorial integrity and full sovereignty;

1. Welcomes the decision by the Croatian President to permit the continued presence of UN forces on the territory of Croatia but insists that efforts must be continued to find a peaceful overall solution to the conflict in the former Yugoslavia;

2. Urges the Croatian government to cooperate in ensuring that a sufficient number of UN troops remain on the territory of Croatia as their presence helps to reduce tension in the region;

3. Insists that the United Nations must continue to carry out its duties in the area but emphasizes that the substance and duration of the renewed mandate for UN forces, and the composition of these forces, must be adequate to achieve the aims defined by the UN Security Council;

4. Gives its full support to all efforts which can contribute to finding a peaceful solution in the former Yugoslavia on the basis of respect for human and minority rights, giving equal treatment to members of all ethnic and religious communities; urges all parties concerned to refrain from any action that may lead to a resurgence of the conflict in the former Yugoslavia;

5. Calls on the Council to seek, in particular, the recognition by Serbia of Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina within their international borders;

6. Supports the decision by the General Affairs Council to give the Commission a negotiating brief for an economic and trade cooperation agreement with Croatia while UN troops remain on Croatian territory;

7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission, the President, Government and Parliament of Croatia and the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

15. Attack on an EU fishing vessel

B4-0422, 0481, 0482, 0483, 0490 and 0491/95

Resolution on the illegal arrest of the Spanish vessel 'Estai'

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolution of 18 November 1994 on the recent agreement on NAFO fisheries quotas for 1995 (¹) and its resolution of 16 February 1995 on the allocation of the TAC for black halibut for 1995 in NAFO waters (²),
- A. concerned about the illegal seizure by force of the Spanish fishing vessel 'Estai' on 9 March 1995 by the Canadian authorities, when the vessel was legally fishing Greenland halibut in the international waters of the North Atlantic Fishing Organization (NAFO), which represents an act of aggression against the Community fleet and a violation of the international law of the sea and of the NAFO Convention,
- B. having regard to the fact that the Council and the Commission suspended all negotiations with Canada until the boat and its crew were freed,
- C. recalling that the Common Fisheries Policy has a founding mission of conservation, and having regard to the need to develop ever-more sophisticated methods of securing international cooperation in the protection of endangered fish species at global level;

1. Condemns the Canadian Government for this incident, which constitutes an illegal act in international waters;

2. Affirms its solidarity with the crew of the impounded boat and deeply regrets the unacceptable conditions under which the crew members were taken to the port of St John's;

3. Urges the Commission and the Council to maintain the positions they have been taking to defend firmly the principles of law of the sea and the rights of the Community fishing fleet operating in the NAFO zone, in the confidence that a negotiated settlement to the conflict can be worked out in full respect of the international law of the sea;

4. Calls on the Council and Commission to engage in urgent diplomatic efforts to prevent the escalation of this latest EU-Canada fisheries incident into a major confrontation;

5. Urges the Community bodies and the Member States to support with great firmness all legal actions vis à vis Canada, particularly in the diplomatic, commercial and cooperation spheres;

6. Affirms its full agreement with the Commission to ask for an extraordinary meeting of the NAFO Fishing Committee in order to solve the fishing dispute which has arisen between the two contracting parties;

7. Recognizes that any damage to the 'Estai' must be compensated by the offending party;

8. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments of the Member States, and the Government and Parliament of Canada.

16. Mochovce nuclear power plant

B4-0420, 0484, 0485, 0492, 0496 and 0499/95

Resolution on the Mochovce nuclear power plant

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolution of 16 February 1995 on the Mochovce project (1),
- having regard to its resolutions of 15 December 1993 on nuclear safety in the countries of eastern Europe and the Commonwealth of Independent States (2) as well as on nuclear safety (3),
- having regard to Council Decision 94/179/Euratom amending Decision 77/270/Euratom, to authorize the Commission to contract Euratom borrowings in order to contribute to the financing required for improving the degree of safety and efficiency of nuclear power stations in certain non-member countries (4), and Parliament's opinion of 20 January 1994 on this subject (5),
- having regard to the hearing held by its Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy on 1 March 1995, which was attended also by members of other committees concerned (Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection, Committee on Budgets and Committee on Budgetary Control),
- having regard to the contributions from the invited representatives and experts at this hearing,
- A. whereas the European Union has a major role to play in the decision-making process regarding the construction of the Mochovce nuclear power plant,
- B. whereas, in accordance with its prior positions on nuclear safety, Parliament attaches great importance to a coherent strategy which provides the highest degree of safety possible for its citizens; whereas it is therefore vital that no doubts whatsoever remain about the safety of a nuclear power plant under construction, in particular if such a project is co-funded by the European Union,
- C. whereas the granting of a credit for the completion of the Mochovce power station by the EBRD and the European Union could possibly be considered to be a precedent for similar projects in Eastern Europe,
- D. whereas, in particular, the scenarios completely failed to take account of the question of disposal of the nuclear waste accruing during operation of the nuclear power station,
- E. whereas the question of full responsibility in the event of an accident has not been resolved,
- F. whereas, in particular, the planned safety concept for the Mochovce reactor no containment and use of a bubble condenser – would fail to receive a licence in any EU Member State,
- G. aware of the deep concern of large sections of the populations of the Slovak Republic and neighbouring countries, in particular Austria, where 1,2 million signatures against this project have been collected,
- H. whereas on 2 March 1995 the President of the Commission stated before the European Parliament that the loan for improving the Mochovce power station would be subject to very strict and very formal conditions and would be dependent on the shutdown of the Bohunice plant,

- I. acknowledging that the European Union has an important role to play in helping the countries of Central and Eastern Europe in their efforts to improve the safety and efficiency of their nuclear power plants currently in operation; concerned in this context about the best use of the Euratom borrowings,
- J. whereas Parliament has always insisted that short-term measures must be accompanied by a coherent strategy providing in particular for the replacement and dismantling of the least safe nuclear power stations; concerned in this context about the contradictory information by the Slovak authorities regarding the possibility of a shut-down of the Bohunice power plant,
- K. whereas nuclear power generation must be considered in the context of competition with other sources of electricity and account must be taken of the likely trends in demand, particularly in the light of the potential and the efforts to rationalize energy use,

1. Considers that every country, both inside and outside the European Union, has the right to decide whether or not to choose the nuclear option, as long as safety rules are strictly respected and the country concerned is a signatory of the Non-Proliferation Treaty;

2. Considers that financial aid from the EBRD and the European Union should be granted only under the following conditions:

- verification by Euratom that EU safety standards are strictly applied;
- establishment of a contractually binding timetable ensuring the closure of blocs 1 and 2 of the Bohunice nuclear power plant and an evaluation of the safety situation in the other blocs of this plant;
- holding of a public hearing in Austria according to the rules laid down in the ESPOO Convention;
- clarification of which long-term arrangements are foreseen for the disposal of nuclear waste;

3. Is furthermore of the opinion, after hearing the experts on 1 March 1995, that there still remain serious doubts about the future safety of the Mochovce nuclear power station; is in particular not convinced that the required Western safety standards will be achieved;

4. Calls for the decision on granting the credit to be deferred pending an examination of the economic viability of a gas-steam power plant compared with the Mochovce nuclear power station option, as provided for in the agreement between Prime Minister Meciar and Chancellor Vranitzky;

5. Is further not convinced that the completion of the Mochovce nuclear power station represents the least-cost option; points out that there is evidence that alternative solutions exist which are economically equally viable; notes in this context especially the option of gas turbines;

6. Calls on the Commission to state how and when the individual recommendations of the risk audit study are to be complied with and carried out;

7. Asks the EBRD, the EIB and the Commission therefore not to grant any funding to this project as long as doubts remain about the fulfilment of the safety conditions stipulated in paragraph 2; calls for a Commission statement and a report from Euratom, within the next six months, on the achievement of these conditions and asks that this report be forwarded to the European Parliament as soon as possible;

8. Calls on the Commission to give the Slovak Republic all possible support in implementing sound alternative solutions to their energy needs, if they so wish;

9. Calls further on the Commission to submit to it as soon as possible, after having spoken to the countries concerned, an energy development plan in Central Europe as requested by this Parliament in its abovementioned opinion of 20 January 1994, the objective of which should be the diversification of electricity production sources, the efficient use of energy and the reduction of dependence on nuclear energy;

10. Demands that this plan, which should be primarily based on renewable and non-polluting energies (such as hydro-electricity or gas) be treated as a financial priority;

11. Instructs its Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy to draw up at the same time, in the form of an own-initiative report, the political guidelines for cooperation with Eastern Europe and the CIS in the field of energy policy;

12. Asks the Commission to take the initiative to call a high-level regional conference on the subject of energy development and environmental protection in Central Europe;

13. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the EBRD, the EIB and the Slovak Government.

Proceedings of the sitting

IN THE CHAIR: Mr HÄNSCH

President

(The sitting opened at 9 a.m.)

1. Approval of Minutes

Mr Avgerinos had informed the Chair that he had been present the previous day although his name did not appear on the attendance register.

The following spoke:

- Mrs Oomen-Ruijten, who referred to Mr Provan's remarks (Part I, Item 1) and pointed out that a group's first speaker in a debate should be considered to be its spokesman; she added that Mrs Fraga Estévez was therefore the PPE Group's spokesman in the debate on the Commission statement on the attack against an EU fishing vessel;

- Mr Varela Suanzes-Carpegna, who pointed out that he had intended to vote for the first part of para. 5 and for, not against, para. 8 in the vote on the same statement;

- Mr Kerr, who reminded the President that he had sent him a letter asking him to make Parliament's buildings a smoke-free environment and asked him what action he intended to take (the President replied that one week had not been enough time for him to establish a smoke-free environment).

The Minutes of the previous sitting were approved.

2. Statement by the President

The President made the following statement:

[•]During the sitting of 15 March a Member accused current and former Members of the Commission and Members of the European Parliament of fraud, and even hinted that they might be guilty of corruption.

No evidence has been produced in support of these accusations.

On behalf of the Conference of Presidents I reject the accusations made against the current and former Members of the Commission and the Members of Parliament.'

Mr Le Gallou read out the provisions of Rule 9, second paragraph, of the Rules of Procedure (the President cut him off).

3. Agenda

Mr De Vries, on behalf of the ELDR Group, asked, pursuant to Rule 131, for the oral question on prospects for the shipbuilding sector (B4-0154/95) to be postponed to the next part-session so that it could be taken in the presence of the Council.

Mr Pex spoke on this request, on behalf of the PPE Group, the Committee on External Economic Relations and as co-author of the question.

Parliament approved the request.

2. This Directive shall not apply to any variety that enjoys plant breeders' rights.

IMPLEMENTING PROVISIONS

1. The grant of Community aid under this Regulation shall be subject to approval by the Commission of a strategy of adaptation for the textile and clothing industry for the period 1994 to 1999, to be submitted by the Portuguese authorities. The strategy will be accompanied by rules governing aid for undertakings.

Eligible measures

2. The measures shall cover undertakings in the textile and clothing sector at present established on Portuguese territory. The programme submitted by the Portuguese authorities shall comprise a balanced set of measures

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consistent with the general framework of regional development in Portugal and the overall strategy for the adaptation of the textile and clothing sector, centering on the preparation and implementation of individual modernization plans for the undertakings in the sector, the development of cooperation between undertakings and an increase in available services.

Eligible measures may have the following purposes:

- (a) Aid for the financing of external expert assessments intended to assist undertakings in preparing their modernization and conversion plans and improving their specialist know-how, e.g. in the fields of design, quality policy, computer-assisted design and production, marketing, internal business organization, employee health and safety and environmental protection;
- (b) Retraining of personnel threatened by unemployment or already unemployed, through vocational training measures linked to the preparation and implementation of modernization plans.
- (c) In the case of SMEs which already have a modernization or conversion plan drawn up with the aid of external experts, a temporary contribution towards the financing of the salaries of engineers, technicians or management personnel employed to assist in the implementation of those plans;
- (d) The financing of business modernization plans to cover non-material investment, improvements in technical know-how or material investment including equipment intended directly for production.

Investment in production equipment will be promoted only by providing access for undertakings to risk capital and to loans from the EIB with interest subsidies and guarantee funds;

- (e) The setting-up of supervisory and advisory teams for the textile and clothing sector responsible for making businesses more aware of the need to improve their know-how and helping them to develop cooperation amongst themselves and with their suppliers and clients;
- (f) Aid for the adaptation of textile and clothing undertakings to comply with Community environmental law intended to reduce pollution by the industry through the treatment and recycling of liquid effluents and industrial waste and technical assistance for the development of less polluting production or maintenance processes.

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Conditions for granting Community assistance

3. When each decision on the financing of business modernization plans is taken, the Portuguese authorities responsible for regulating the aid shall verify that the plans are consistent with the overall adaptation strategy agreed with the Commission. They shall make the grant conditional upon subsequent compliance with the agreed plan. The provisions governing the examination of aid applications, monitoring the implementation of the adaptation plans and the penalties to be applied in the event of failure to comply with the conditions for aid shall be determined by joint agreement between the Portuguese authorities and the Commission of the European Communities.

Investment projects financed under this initiative shall form part of the existing horizontal aid schemes in Portugal. Thus the projects must meet the eligibility criteria laid down for those schemes. For this reason no specific aid scheme shall be established for the textile and clothing sector.

Undertakings receiving aid must prove that they comply with national law on working conditions.

The Community's contribution to financing the programme

4. The Portuguese textile operational programme shall be co-financed by the Member State and the Community. The total Community contribution to this programme for the period 1994 to 1999 shall be ECU 400 million. There may also be loans from the European Investment Bank. In order to facilitate this type of financing, Portuguese undertakings shall qualify for interest subsidies to be financed up to ECU 100 million from the allocation earmarked for this programme.

Implementation

5. Portugal shall submit a detailed proposal for the operational programme within four months of the date of publication of this Regulation in the Official Journal of the European Communities. Proposals for operational programmes received after this date need not be taken into consideration by the Commission.

Every six months, the Commission and the Portuguese authorities shall check for compliance with the overall strategy agreed with the Commission within the appropriate monitoring committee on the basis of reports on the progress of programme implementation and, where appropriate, independent assessments.

The regional and local authorities and the social partners shall be involved in the preparation and implementation of the operational programme, notably by including representatives in the monitoring committee. EN

- C. whereas zoos can play an important role in the conservation of species, in scientific research and in public education;
- D. whereas it is therefore necessary to lay down uniform minimum standards for the keeping of animals, the safety and training of staff and the safety and education of the visiting public,
