The Commission would point out that, under the terms of its communication of 1 October 1986 (OJ No C 245, 1. 10. 1986, p. 4), it considers that if a Member State adopts a technical regulation which comes under the provisions of Directive 83/189/EEC without communicating the draft to the Commission or respecting the standstill obligation, that regulation cannot be enforced against third parties under the terms of the legal system of the Member State in question. The Commission therefore considers that litigants have a right to expect national courts to refuse to implement national technical regulations that have not been notified as required by Community law.

Design, preparation and implementation of the citizens first initiative in the 15 Member States of the European Union

(Restricted accelerated procedure)

1. Awarding authority: Commission of the European Communities, DG XV, Internal Market and Financial Services, Unit A/1 and DGX, Information, Communication, Culture and Audiovisual Media, Unit X/1, rue de la Loi/Wetstraat 200, B-1049 Bruxelles/Brussel.

2. Category of service and description: Provision of professional services.

This invitation to tender is divided into parts:

part 1: to design and prepare the citizens' first initiative on citizens' rights flowing from European law, in the 15 Member States of the European Union. This will involve the design of an integrated programme, including strategy development, objective setting, the identification of target audiences and the methods of distribution of information to these target audiences in each phase of the initiative, and handling feedback.

The integrated programme should comprise all relevant aspects, including media relations, government relations, public relations and internal organization;

- part 2: implementation of phase 1 of the citizens' first initiative;
- part 3: implementation of phase 2 of the citizens' first initiative;
- part 4: implementation of phase 3 of the citizens' first initiative;
- part 5: implementation of phase 4 of the citizens' first initiative;
- part 6: implementation of phase 5 of the citizens' first initiative.

Part 1 will be awarded immediately. The timing of the award of parts 2-6 will, however, be conditional upon the financial resources being made available by the budgetary authority. Subject to satisfactory performance, the Commission intends to award all parts to a single contractor.

A more detailed description of the work to be done will be provided to those candidates invited to submit tenders, who will also have the opportunity to attend an information meeting, which will take place in the week following the transmission of invitations to tender to selected candidates.

3. Place of delivery: For part 1: the awarding authority at the address in 1.

For part 2 and subsequent parts: throughout the 15 Member States.

- 4. Provision reserving execution of the service to a particular profession: Not applicable.
- 5. Division into parts: In order to ensure that the terms of reference are met in a coherent and consistent fashion, the Commission will award all parts of the contract to a single contractor; proposals must, however, be clearly divided between each part, which must be separately costed.
- 6. Number of service providers which will be invited to tender: Provided sufficient appropriate candidates are available, the Commission intends to request 5-10 candidates to tender.
- 7. Variants: Candidates may put forward additional ideas or suggestions in accordance with the modalities laid down in the tender specifications.

8. Time limits for the completion of services: For part 1: 3 months from the signature of the contract.

For subsequent parts, see tender specifications.

- Legal form in case of group bidders: Interested
 parties may submit a joint tender. If the group is
 awarded the contract, it will be required to form an
 association for that purpose.
- 10. a) Justification for accelerated procedure: The citizens' first initiative must be prepared and phase 1 launched in the first half of 1996.
 - b) Deadline for receipt of applications: Requests to participate must be sent to the address below not later than 15 days from the date of dispatch of this notice, so as to arrive no later than 2 days thereafter.

In all cases requests must be placed inside 2 sealed envelopes. To be opened only by the committee responsible for opening the requests'.

d) Language(s): Requests to participate must be submitted in 1 of the official languages of the Community.

- 11. Final date for the dispatch of invitations to tender:
 20 days from the date of publication. It is likely that
 15 days will be allowed for the submission of offers,
 but tenderers should have regard to the actual date
 set out in the tender specification.
- 12. **Deposits and guarantees:** The Commission, prior to the conclusion of a contract, may require the proposed contractor to furnish a guarantee/performance bond or equivalent for a sum up to the value of the proposed contract.
- 13. Qualifications: Candidates invited to submit tenders will be selected on the basis of all of the following criteria:
 - experience in organizing and coordinating information actions through television, radio, newspaper, poster campaigns and direct mail or leaflet distribution in several Member States of the European Union;
 - experience in organizing and conducting large-scale multicultural and multilingual information actions aimed at the general public and dealing with issues of a politically sensitive nature;
 - experience in organizing large-scale public response mechanisms (such as, for example, telephone-answering services);
 - financial and managerial capacity.

Candidates must submit documentation establishing their conformity with these criteria, including a list of the principal services of a similar kind provided in the past 3 years, with the sums involved, dates and recipients of the services provided.

Candidates should also indicate, for the past 3 years, their average annual manpower and the number of managerial staff, as well as a description of their measures for ensuring quality.

14. Period during which the tenderer is obliged to keep the tender open: For part 1: 3 months from the closing date for submission of tenders.

Subsequent parts: 9 months from the closing date for submission of tenders.

- 15. Award criteria: The contract will be awarded on the basis of the quality of the offer in terms of creativity, practicality and cost effectiveness of the solutions and the methodology proposed, to be judged by reference to:
 - i) a summary description (not exceeding 10 pages) of the strategy for the citizens' first initiative;

- ii) a detailed media plan for each phase of the citizens' first initiative, clearly indicating the target audience and for each country concerned the rationale of the choice of the selected mix of media;
- iii) a total budget, divided into parts, in accordance with point 2, and further broken down by type of activity and country.
- 16. Other information: The following information is required of the candidate:
 - name or business name, particulars of the person to contact, address and facsimile number(s);

- documents establishing legal status.

Candidates shall bear their own costs and expenses in preparing bids and the Commission shall not be liable to indemnify them in any way, both in cases where their bid might prove unsuccessful or if the Commission decides not to accept any of the bids.
