IN THE CHAIR: Mr VON HABSBURG

Oldest Member

(The sitting opened at 6 p.m.)

1. Resumption of session

Mr von Habsburg, oldest Member, acting as President pursuant to Rule 12(1), resumed the session adjourned on 13 December 1996.

He made a short statement in his capacity as oldest Member.

2. Membership of Parliament

The oldest Member announced that the British authorities had informed him that Mr Richard Corbett had been appointed Member of Parliament, to replace the late Mr Stewart, with effect from 23 December 1996.

He welcomed the new Member and drew attention to the provisions of Rule 7(4).

He then announced that Mr Vieira had informed him in writing of his resignation as Member of Parliament, with effect from 18 January 1997.

Pursuant to Rule 8 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure and to the second subparagraph of Article 12(2) of the Act on the election of representatives to the European Parliament, Parliament established that there was a vacancy; the Member State concerned would be informed.

3. Membership of political groups

The oldest Member announced that the following Members had informed him that they had joined the following groups:

- Mr Mamère (formerly ARE): V Group with effect from 31 December 1996

IN THE CHAIR: Mr VON HABSBURG

Oldest Member

(The sitting opened at 10 a.m.)

1. Election of the President

The next item was the election of the President of Parliament.

The oldest Member reminded Members that he had received the nominations of Mr Gil-Robles Gil-Delgado and Mrs Lalumière, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules.

He explained the voting procedure to the House.

The vote was taken.

The sitting was suspended for the count.

(The sitting was suspended at 10.30 a.m. and resumed at 11.45 a.m.)

The oldest Member announced the results:

Mr Gil-Robles Gil-Delgado had obtained an absolute majority of the votes cast. The oldest Member therefore proclaimed him President of the European Parliament and invited him to take the Chair.

IN THE CHAIR: Mr GIL-ROBLES GIL-DELGADO President

After condemning ETA's criminal violence and speaking out in support of the oppressed and those who were unjustly deprived of their liberty in the Union, the President thanked Members for the trust they had placed in him.

The following spoke: Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group, Mr Martens, on behalf of the PPE Group, Mr Pasty, on behalf of the UPE Group, Mr De Vries, on behalf of the ELDR Group, Mr Puerta, on behalf of the GUE/NGL Group, Mrs Roth, on behalf of the V Group, Mrs Lalumière, on behalf of the ARE Group, Mr Bonde, on behalf of the I-EDN Group, Mr Le Pen, Non-attached Member, and Mr Santer, President of the Commission.

The following spoke:

- Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group, who rejected the criticism voiced by some of the speakers, particularly Mr Pasty, on the practice followed for electing the President of the European Parliament;
- Mr Martens, on behalf of the PPE Group, who supported Mrs Green and argued that the current system was fair and correct.

The President refused to allow a debate to start on the matter and decided to move on to the election of the Vice-Presidents.

2. Election of the Vice-Presidents

The next item was the election of the Vice-Presidents.

Martin, Mrs Pery, Mr Podestà, Mrs Schleicher and Mr Verde i Aldea.

He stated that the candidates had agreed to their nomination and that the tellers chosen by lot for the election of the President would serve as tellers for the election of the Vice-Presidents.

He read out the applicable provisions of Rule 15(1).

The number of candidates did not exceed the number of seats to be filled. Nevertheless, the President said that a vote was needed, in particular to establish the Vice-Presidents' order of precedence.

The vote was taken.

The President announced that if a second ballot was needed, the candidates remaining from the first ballot would be maintained, unless there were any objections. A deadline for submitting new nominations was set at 2.45 p.m.

The sitting was suspended for the count.

Mrs Hoff, Mr Verde i Aldea, Mr Avgerinos and Mr Marinho had obtained an absolute majority of the votes cast and were therefore proclaimed Vice-Presidents of the European Parliament.

As the number of candidates elected was less than the number of seats to be filled, a third ballot was needed pursuant to Rule 15(1).

The President pointed out that, for the third ballot, a majority of votes cast was no longer required and the three remaining candidates would in any case be elected, leaving only their order of precedence to be decided. He therefore proposed holding a secret ballot by electronic vote.

Mrs Ewing expressed concern that the provision of Rule 13(3) concerning overall fair representation of Member States might not be complied with in the case of the election of the Vice-Presidents.

The President established that there was no opposition to the voting procedure he had proposed.

He said that only votes in favour would be counted and asked the tellers to come up to the Presidency bench to supervise the vote.

The following spoke:

- Mr Miller on the voting procedure;
- Mr Wolf, who expressed surprise that a candidate with more votes against than in favour could still get elected (the President replied that only votes in favour would count, in order to determine the three candidates' order of preference);
- Mr Elliott who agreed with Mr Wolf and called for the system to be looked into (the President said that he would refer the matter to the Rules Committee);
- Mr Falconer, who said that as far as he knew, an electronic vote had never been held for the election of Vice-Presidents (the President replied that, firstly, there was a precedent, in the case of the appointment of the Ombudsman and, secondly, Rule 13(1) even provided for election by acclamation where the number of nominations did not exceed the number of seats to be filled, but the question now was to determine the order of precedence).

The President said that he had already established that there was no opposition to his proposal for a secret ballot by electronic vote. He therefore decided to take the vote as proposed.

Third ballot

- Mr Fabre-Aubrespy, who objected to the fact that voting papers for the election of the President and those for the election of the Vice-Presidents had not been identical and asked for the matter to be referred to the Rules Committee (the President asked him to send evidence to back up his claim to the appropriate department, adding that, if this were done, an inquiry would be carried out).

3. Election of Quaestors

The next item was the election of the Quaestors.

Under Rule 16, 2nd paragraph, the five Quaestors would be elected by the same procedure as the Vice-Presidents.

The President announced that he had received the nominations of Mr Balfe, Mr Bardong, Mr Killilea, Mr Paasio, Mr Ribeiro and Mr Viola.

As the number of candidates was greater than the number of seats to be filled, a secret ballot was necessary, in accordance with Rule 13(1).

The tellers for the elections of the President and Vice-Presidents were confirmed for this election.

The vote was taken.

1. Inaugural speech

The President made his inaugural speech.

2. Approval of Minutes

The next item was the approval of the Minutes of the sittings of 13 December 1996 and 13 and 14 January 1997.

Mr Dary had informed the Chair that he had been present at the sitting of 13 January but that he had not signed the attendance register.

Mrs Lindeperg had informed the Chair that she had voted in the first ballot for the election of Vice-Presidents but that her name was not included in the Annex.

The following spoke:

- Mr Colom i Naval, who said that he had been present at the sitting of 13 January but that his name was not in the attendance register;
- Mr Corbett who, referring to item 2 of the Minutes of 13 January, said that he had not been appointed Member of Parliament, he had been elected;

- Mr Herman, who said that he had been present at the sitting of 13 January but that his name was not in the attendance register;
- Mrs Green, on behalf of the PSE Group, who referred to the incident during the vote on the Zimmermann report on the protection of minors (A4-0393/96, Minutes of 12.12.1996, Part I, Item 30(a)) in which she said that Mr Pasty had voted twice and had used a voting card belonging to another Member; she asked what action had been taken by the Bureau, to which the matter had been referred:

the President read out the last two paragraphs of the Minutes of the Bureau meeting of 8 January 1997:

- '— heard a statement by the President indicating that, pursuant to Rule 22(3), the Bureau was responsible for matters relating to the conduct of sittings, that the decision taken in plenary by Mrs Fontaine precluded the retroactive imposition of sanctions on Mr Pasty, pursuant to Rule 110, and that he would forward a letter to Mr Pasty, drawing attention to the seriousness of the matter and deploring this breach of the basic principles of parliamentary democracy, which undermined the image and dignity of Parliament; the decision as to whether a statement should be made in plenary would be taken by the President of the sitting;
- noted the President's decision, after having heard Mrs Fontaine, who had been in the chair when the incident occurred, and having noted the opinions of the Bureau members, to forward a letter to Mr Pasty, pointing to the imperative need to comply with and enforce the provisions of Rules 117 and 110 of the Rules of Procedure.'

Mrs Green felt that the Bureau's decision called for two comments: firstly, with regard to the passage which stated that the decision by the President of the sitting ruled out any retroactive sanction under Rule 110, she noted that Mrs Fontaine, President of the sitting at the time, had incorrectly interpreted the Rules and, in view of the serious case of disorder, should have excluded Mr Pasty from the Chamber immediately; secondly, she sought confirmation from the President that the letter referred to in these Bureau minutes had in fact been sent to Mr Pasty and asked him to read the letter out to the House;

- Mr Martens, on behalf of the PPE Group, who noted that the Bureau was obviously the body responsible for this matter and felt that the announcement of the Bureau's conclusions gave them sufficient publicity and amounted to disciplinary action;
- Mr Anastassopoulos, who felt that Mrs Fontaine had interpreted Rule 110 correctly, since there was no obligation to exclude anybody and the President of the sitting had in this matter a certain room for manoeuvre;
- Mrs Malone, who queried the validity of the vote on the Zimmermann report since it was possible that Mr Pasty had not voted in the way in which the owner of the card, Mrs Baldi, would have intended and may have cast a double vote on more than one occasion (the President replied that the result of the vote could not be modified once it was announced by the

President and that the vote stood; he added that the sittings service had checked whether a double vote on the amendment in question could have changed the result and that this apparently was not the case);

- Mrs Van Dijk, on behalf of the V Group, who asked the President to announce the result of the vote as in her opinion only one vote separated the votes for and against (the President referred to his previous reply, noting that no objections had been made concerning this vote when the Minutes were submitted for approval);
- Mr De Vries, on behalf of the ELDR Group, who stressed that the reputation of Parliament was at stake and pointed out that neither Rule 117 nor Rule 110 made any mention of the Bureau and that references to the Bureau in discussions on this matter were not in accordance with the Rules of Procedure which only mentioned the President; he read out Rule 110(1) and asked whether the President's comments constituted 'formal notice' as defined in this Rule (the President, also with reference to this Rule, said that the President could be flexible ('the President may ...') and pointed out that no motion of censure had been tabled within the deadline stipulated in the Rules. As this deadline had passed, the disciplinary action provided for could no longer be applied. He added that the Minutes of the current sitting would be sent to the Rules Committee to assist them in their deliberations).

The President said that he was prepared to read out former President Hänsch's letter to Mr Pasty and the latter's reply.

Mr McGowan said that the main point was the interpretation given by the Bureau to the words 'the next sitting' in Rule 110(1). He added that Parliament sent observers to many countries throughout the world to check that elections were properly conducted (he mentioned Chad as an example) and that it should be capable of following its own Rules. Otherwise the international community, including the ACP-EU Joint Assembly, would have to be asked to look into the democratic practices prevailing in Parliament.

The President put to the House his proposal to read out Mr Hänsch's letter to Mr Pasty and Mr Pasty's reply.

The House approved the proposal.

Mrs Green insisted that the House was mainly interested in the letter sent to Mr Pasty.

The President nevertheless decided to read out both letters.

The President read out the letter from his predecessor, Mr Hänsch, to Mr Pasty:

'I have been informed by Mrs Fontaine, who presided over the sitting in question, that on Thursday 12 December 1996, during the vote on the report by Mrs Zimmermann on the protection of minors, you cast, to use your own words, a double vote. This is clearly a serious act, for Rule 117 states that 'The right to vote is a personal right. Members shall cast their votes individually and in person.'

After consulting the members of the Bureau, having regard to the provisions of Rules 117 and 110, and pursuant to the duties and responsibilities conferred on the President, notably by Rule 19, I regret to inform you that your conduct during the sitting of Thursday 12 December 1996 constitutes an infringement of Rule 117 and must be considered as a serious case of disorder.

I should furthermore formally remind you that abusing the right to vote in our Parliament imperils the basic principles of parliamentary democracy and thus can only seriously damage our Parliament's image and the dignity of its Members.'

He then read out the reply Mr Pasty had sent him:

'On 9 January 1997 your predecessor, Mr Hänsch, sent me a letter with reference number 00090 concerning the vote on the Zimmermann report on the protection of minors on Thursday 12 December 1996. I cannot accept the terms of this letter.

The letter as it is worded raises a very serious ethical issue as it gives the impression that I intentionally cast a double vote, an extremely serious act, when actually I merely committed a simple technical error for which, as I stated in plenary, I am entirely responsible.

The letter, signed by Mr Hänsch, because of the assumptions it makes and the way it is slanted, is in my view a very serious slander by the President of the Institution.

I am therefore entitled to wonder what the real reasons behind this letter are and what its purpose is.

I call on you to consider withdrawing the letter and replacing it with a letter which accords with the facts.'

The President added that no letter could be cancelled and the only decision that remained to be taken was to refer the matter to the Rules Committee to establish what legal position the House should adopt when such an act was committed.

The following spoke:

— Mrs Fontaine, President of the sitting at the time, who referred to the flexibility which the President enjoyed under Rule 110 and explained that she had decided that no purpose would be served in excluding Mr Pasty immediately and that she had referred the matter to the Bureau on the basis of Rule 22(3), a course of action suggested by Mr Tomlinson at the time. She also pointed out in reply to Mrs Van Dijk that the double vote in question had not affected the outcome of the vote;

- Mrs Green, who expressed disgust at Mr Pasty's letter and his use of the term 'technical error' when in fact he had been seen to vote once at his own seat and once at the seat of another Member; in her opinion, had Mr Pasty made a genuine apology, the incident could have been regarded as closed. She asked what action the President envisaged taking against a Member who had attacked the Presidency of Parliament after being caught 'cheating' during a vote (the President said that he had merely done what he had proposed doing, i.e. read out Mr Pasty's reply, an action which did not imply that he endorsed it. He said that he supported the Bureau's decision, adding once again that he would refer the matter to the Rules Committee which was responsible for this kind of problem, so that it could refine the relevant provisions of the Rules);
- Mr Martens, who agreed with the decision to refer the matter to the Rules Committee.

The President said that the discussion on this matter was now closed

Mrs Muscardini asked for the floor and called for Members sitting on the Right to be given the floor on the same basis as other Members (the President decided not to give anyone else the floor on the matter and to move on to the next item on the agenda).

The Minutes of the sittings of 13 December 1996, 13 and 14 January 1997 were approved.

3. Membership of Committee of Inquiry into BSE

The President informed the House that Mr Mamère had informed him that he was giving up his seat on the Committee of Inquiry into BSE.

As a result, Parliament ratified the appointment of Mrs Barthet-Mayer, proposed by the ARE Group, as member of this committee to replace Mr Mamère.

1. Dublin European Council

(a) B4-0021, 0024, 0026, 0027 and 0033/97

Resolution on the Dublin European Council of 13 and 14 December 1996

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolution of 11 December 1996 on the preparations for the European Council meeting of 13 and 14 December 1996 (¹),
- having regard to the conclusions of the Dublin European Council of 13 and 14 December 1996,
- having regard to the statement of the President of the European Council,
- A. having regard to the citizens' legitimate desire that the European Union should take measures in the areas of employment, security and the fight against crime, economic and social growth and external relations,
- B. whereas the Ministerial Conference in Singapore offered the first opportunity since the founding of the World Trade Organization (WTO) to draw up, at the highest level, an assessment of the WTO's work and to set a course towards more environmentally sound and more socially equitable world trade,
- C. having regard, in connection with the IGC, to its resolution of 16 January 1997 on the general outline for a draft revision of the Treaties (2),
- 1. Welcomes the overall results achieved by the Irish Presidency of the Council and salutes the progress made;

Intergovernmental Conference

- 2. Welcomes the draft revision of the Treaties proposed by the Irish Presidency of the Council; regrets however that, notably in the fields of democratization and efficiency of the institutions, strengthening the role of the European Parliament, transparency of Council proceedings and the common foreign and security policy, not enough progress has been made; calls therefore on the Dutch Presidency of the Council to develop further the positive proposals by the Irish Presidency, including those on employment, non-discrimination and environment protection;
- 3. Insists that the Intergovernmental Conference ensure that in the new title on employment, guidelines for employment policy and economic policy be mutually consistent in order to promote growth and employment along with stability;
- 4. Welcomes the proposal in the draft revision of the Treaties to remove from the third pillar asylum and immigration policy questions, policy regarding third-country nationals, external borders, visa and customs cooperation, and urges Member States and the Council to agree on a role providing for democratic control by the European Parliament and the European Court of Justice, to be laid down in the new Article G;

Economic and Monetary Union

- 5. Welcomes the threefold agreement secured as part of the preparations for the third stage of European monetary union on the legal status of the Euro, the new European Monetary System (EMS) and the stability and growth pact; all the guarantees which should enable the Euro to become one of the world's strongest currencies are thus now in place and will ultimately favour growth and employment;
- (a) on the pact for stability and growth, believes that the agreement reached by the European Council provides mechanisms to ensure budgetary discipline while preserving albeit insufficiently the role of economic policy to act effectively against economic downturns; regrets, however, that many concerns of the European Parliament regarding this pact, as expressed by its amendments to the two proposals for Council Regulations concerning the pact voted on 28 November 1996 (¹) by a very large majority of members, have so far been largely ignored both by the Council and the European Council; therefore, urges the Council to take these into account when finalizing the proposals for regulations concerned;
- (b) on the legal framework of the euro, believes that the two proposals for regulations, although providing adequate certainty for the continuity of contracts, should be complemented by additional measures in order to improve information and protection for consumers;
- (c) welcomes the Council's commitment to the Commission's EMS 2000 initiative and urges the Council and Commission to make further progress in 1997; welcomes the linkages which it will be possible to establish between future 'in' and 'pre-in' countries; is, however, concerned that the institutional setting envisaged for the operation and monitoring of the new Exchange Rate Mechanism (ERM) will give great influence to those parts of the structure not subject to democratic control, particularly the Economic and Financial Committee; is concerned that this may reinforce the trend towards a gradual de-politicization of economic policy decision-making at European level;
- 6. Recalls the recommendation it made in its resolution of 28 November 1996 embodying the opinion of the European Parliament, pursuant to Article 109j, paragraph 2, of the EC Treaty, on the 1996 convergence decision by the Council, meeting in the composition of the Heads of State or of Government (²) that full use should be made of the assessment margin laid down in Article 104c(2) of the EC Treaty so that the third stage of EMU starts with a sufficient number of participants, and reiterates its view that the imbalance between the European Central Bank and the other European institutions, particularly the European Parliament, has to be overcome by extending consultation procedures;
- 7. Calls for greater cooperation in the fiscal and economic policy fields between the Member States after 1 January 1999 and stresses in this connection the importance of defining and implementing a genuine common economic policy;

Growth and employment

- 8. Welcomes the Dublin Declaration on employment and notes particularly the declared intention to 'exploit new sources of employment', but warns the European Council not to reiterate declarations of principles unless they are followed by real commitments, backed by instruments, targets and a timetable, in order to re-establish public confidence in the European Union;
- 9. Therefore invites the Council and the Commission to translate the declaration into action without delay, through reinforced integration of employment policies and a growth-oriented macroeconomic policy, and a strengthening of structural policies backed by a set of common indicators to measure the performances of the Member States in the employment field, and by implementation of the 'Essen programme' to establish a framework of transnational cooperation and spread of best practices between Member States; endorses the guidelines incorporated in the global report on employment, but looks to the Member States finally to put these guidelines into practice, so that the report does not remain a mere reminder of the need to promote employment;

10. Welcomes the European Council conclusions on a fiscal policy which is more favourable for employment and the Commission's initiatives in this field; recalls however that the unanimity requirement in fiscal policy has so far hindered all effective action in this area;

World Trade Organization

- 11. Welcomes the successful consolidation of the World Trade Organization (WTO) by the Singapore Conference, its decisions in favour of the poorest countries, the additional reductions in tariffs and the further opening-up of markets, and the results in the issue of trade in information technology products;
- 12. Asks the Council and the Commission, in their preparatory work before the next ministerial conference, to propose a revision to the WTO rules in favour of greater respect for internationally agreed environmental and social standards in accordance with the aim of an internationally agreed competition policy which would seek to ensure that world trade is not only free but also fair;
- 13. Reiterates in this connection its call that the Council and the Commission should submit to it for approval, pursuant to the second subparagraph of Article 228(3) of the EC Treaty, all agreements negotiated in the WTO;

Home affairs

- 14. Points out, along with the European Council, its attachment to the maintenance and development of the European Union as an area of freedom, security and justice, respecting the rule of law and the protection of privacy;
- 15. Deplores once again the fact that a rising number of activities and developments in the framework of European justice and home affairs take place without any involvement of Parliament, and calls again for more democratic procedures in this field;
- 16. Insists that it be properly informed and consulted, in accordance with Article K.6 of the TEU, on current activities in the priority areas of drugs, organized crime, terrorism and sexual exploitation of children; such matters cannot solely be left to a plethora of Council and Commission bodies and requests that joint actions and resolutions in the field of drug abuse agreed by the Council be submitted to Parliament;

Enlargement

- 17. Welcomes the European Council's confirmation of the timetable proposed at Madrid for future enlargement of the Union, including the Commission's intention to strengthen further the pre-accession strategy, while stressing the vital importance of strict respect for the rule of law, democracy and human rights in each of the acceding states;
- 18. Recalls its resolution of 12 December 1996 on the financing of the enlargement of the European Union (¹) and reiterates its point of view that enlargement should go hand in hand with the deepening of the Union;

Foreign affairs

- 19. Expresses its agreement with the European Council declaration on the peace process in the Middle East and reaffirms the importance of a political initiative by the European Union seeking to relaunch the peace process on the basis of the agreements reached by the Israeli and Palestinian representatives; considers that the development of a Euro-Mediterranean partnership and the provision for a Union-Mediterranean charter constitute positive undertakings in following up the Barcelona Conference;
- 20. Reaffirms the importance of respect for human rights as regards relations between the European Union and Turkey and considers that, in the absence of any progress in this area, the Council and Commission should respect Parliament's position in this matter; hopes that the countries involved will resolutely commit themselves to achieving a positive solution in Cyprus in the framework of UN Security Council resolutions;

- Considers that the European Union action plan for Russia and Ukraine is a useful instrument to maintain good relations with these countries and to maintain the process of economic and democratic transition; expresses it agreement with the position adopted concerning Belarus;
- Welcomes the European Council declaration expressing concern at the situation in the Great Lakes Region; regrets, however, that the lack of unity within the Council and the position adopted by the United States have effectively prevented the deployment of the multinational force while the lives of hundreds of thousands of refugees and displaced persons are still at risk in Eastern Zaire and there remains a concrete threat of a generalized conflict in the region; therefore supports the Commission proposal for an overall European Union action plan for the region, but reaffirms the importance of active participation in conflict prevention and requests that a European Union analysis centre become a reality as soon as possible;
- Takes note of the European Council's position on different subjects, in particular relations between 23. the European Union and the United States, Canada and East Timor, but notes with concern the European Council's failure to adopt a position on the situation in Burma;

Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the European Council, the Council and the other institutions.

Resolution on the general outline for a draft revision of the Treaties

- having regard to its previous resolutions of 17 May 1995 (1), 13 March 1996 (2), 14 November 1996 (3) and 11 December 1996 (4),
- A. whereas the Florence European Council asked for a general outline for a draft revision of the Treaties to be prepared for the European Council meeting in Dublin, addressing three main objectives:
 - bringing the Union closer to its citizens,
 - strengthening and broadening the CFSP, with the aim of achieving greater consistency and efficiency,
 - ensuring, with an eye to enlargement, the proper functioning of the institutions and the efficiency of the decision-making process,
- B. whereas the Irish Presidency's draft must be assessed in the light of these objectives; whereas it only reflects the current state of negotiations, but whereas, pursuant to Article B of the TEU, any revision of the Treaty must not only maintain in full the acquis communautaire, but actually build on it,
- C. noting that the Irish Presidency's text pays tribute to the contribution made by the European Parliament to the work of the Intergovernmental Conference through its two observers, but stressing nevertheless that it in no way considers itself bound as an institution by the interim results and that it remains free to make a political assessment during the course of and at the end of the Conference,

D. noting that the European Council of 13 and 14 December 1996 considered that the draft Treaty tabled by the Presidency provided a good basis for continuing negotiations; considering, on the contrary, that the draft is evidence of the lack of ambition on the part of certain Member States to carry out genuine far-reaching reforms; whereas, in these circumstances, it is important to consolidate the provisions which fulfil those objectives in that text, as otherwise the European Parliament could not approve the final amendments to the Treaty,

SECTION I - AN AREA OF FREEDOM, SECURITY AND JUSTICE

Chapter 1 - Fundamental rights and non-discrimination

- 1. Notes the provisions concerning fundamental rights, but regrets the fact that no proposal has been made concerning citizens' direct contact with the Community and their participation in its institutions;
- 2. Welcomes the insertion of the clause on non-discrimination, but considers that it should be directly applicable and that the role of the European Parliament must be strengthened by means of the codecision procedure in what is an important area of citizens' rights;
- 3. Reiterates its position regarding the European Union's accession to the European Convention on Human Rights and calls for Article L of the TEU to be amended in such a way as to bring the matters covered by the three pillars within the jurisdiction of the Court of Justice, where protection of those rights is concerned, and for the provision of a clear legal basis permitting direct access by individuals to the Court of Justice in the event of fundamental rights being violated by an act of a Union institution;
- 4. Regrets the lack of provisions concerning the rights of nationals of third countries who are legally resident in the Union and states once again that the Treaty must guarantee them respect for human rights, equal treatment and non-discrimination as regards social, economic and cultural rights;
- 5. Declares that the right of association in political parties operating at European level necessitates a modification of the Treaty in accordance with the proposals of the Greek, Italian and Austrian Governments; recalls in this connection the proposals contained in its resolution of 10 December 1996 on the constitutional status of European political parties (1);
- 6. Regrets that the right to information and the right to express views on Community policies are not recognized as a general principle:
- 7. Calls for the introduction of a uniform electoral procedure in accordance with the German proposal and, at the very least, the inclusion in the Treaty of a binding timetable;

Chapter 2 - Free movement of persons, asylum and immigration

- 8. Condemns the risk of sham communitization and therefore calls for application in full of Community procedures and full involvement of Community institutions, including the European Parliament and the European Court of Justice, in those areas of home affairs and justice policy that are to be transferred from the intergovernmental to the Community sphere, particularly in so far as the general outline for a draft Treaty:
- (a) envisages the framing of procedures for exceptions where judicial control is concerned (Article G(4));
- (b) does not come out clearly in favour of the use of qualified majority voting within the Council or of the codecision procedure (Article G(2) and (3));
- 9. Calls, however, for the following areas to be transferred to the EC Treaty:
- (a) the fight against drug-trafficking;
- (b) the fight against international crime, including trafficking in human beings;
- (c) judicial and administrative cooperation in civil and commercial matters;
- 10. Notes with interest the Presidency's suggestion of using the method of 'target deadlines' for achieving the objectives identified in the sphere of justice and home affairs and, in particular, of an overall target date for the matters concerned (Article B of the Treaty on European Union); calls in particular for the free movement of persons to be finally guaranteed throughout the Union by a fixed and definite date;

Chapter 3 - Security and safety of persons

- 11. Calls for the use of qualified majority voting in the Council and for the European Parliament to have the power of codecision also in respect of normal legislative acts in the sphere of home affairs and justice;
- 12. Endorses the proposals made by the Irish Presidency for provisions on police cooperation and the operational capacity of Europol (Article K.1(b)), provided that a binding timetable is adopted; considers, however, such a detailed list of measures and tasks not to be appropriate in the context of a Treaty of such fundamental nature;
- 13. Considers that the provisions envisaged both for the new title of the Treaty establishing the European Community and for Title VI of the Treaty on European Union should be further strengthened and augmented to a considerable extent; considers that, to that end, the following aspects should now be examined in detail with a view to their approval by the Intergovernmental Conference:
- (a) the question of a more substantial transfer to the Community 'pillar', along the lines proposed by the Belgian Government (retention of Title VI solely for judicial and police cooperation);
- (b) the benefits of a phased approach to communitization, as suggested in the joint memorandum from the Benelux countries, the German and French Governments and, specifically in connection with the incorporation of the Schengen Agreement, the Netherlands delegation;
- (c) the extension of qualified majority voting in the Council, in connection with Title VI of the Treaty on European Union, as proposed by the German and French Governments and, concerning police cooperation, the Spanish and Belgian Governments;
- (d) the prospects that a formula for enhanced cooperation, as put forward by the German and French Governments, might offer;
- (e) the development of provisions directed towards the introduction of a minimum common base for describing offences and punishments and towards facilitating the recognition and enforcement of judicial decisions and civil and criminal judicial assistance;

SECTION II - THE UNION AND THE CITIZEN

Chapter 4 - Employment

- 14. Alerts the IGC to the danger of confining itself to an agreement on a title or chapter on employment which has no substance; considers that the IGC must therefore examine in more detail the proposal submitted by Parliament's two representatives, in particular as regards the coordination of macroeconomic policies with a view to promoting employment;
- 15. Endorses the proposal of the Irish Presidency regarding employment, particularly the implementation of incentive measures (Article 5);
- 16. Considers, however, that the provisions envisaged should be strengthened:
- (a) by guaranteeing that the broad lines of employment policy and of economic policy are consistent with each other;
- (b) by making the objective of promoting employment as binding as that covered by the guiding principles laid down in Article 3a of the Treaty, and by making Community action in this sphere a common policy (new point before Article 3(i));
- (c) by setting out the principles likely to underpin the formulation of employment policy;
- (d) by specifying that the common economic institutions and the broad lines of economic policy must be conceived so as to give appropriate priority to the achievement or maintenance of a high level of employment;
- (e) by increasing the involvement of the European Parliament and cooperation with the social partners in the drafting of the annual economic report and the report on the employment situation submitted to the European Council (Article 4(1));
- (f) by clarifying the proposed procedure (Article 4(1) and (5));
- (g) by clearly requiring the Council to react and make use of the instruments provided for by the Treaty in the event of rising or persistent unemployment;
- 17. Warns of the dangers which could arise if progress towards economic union were to lag too far behind the introduction of monetary union and an independent central bank;

Chapter 5 - Social provisions

- 18. Calls for the incorporation, in its entirety, of the Agreement on Social Policy annexed to Protocol No 14, and considers that there should be a detailed debate within the IGC on the substantive improvements to be made thereto;
- 19. Endorses the proposal by the Irish Government to introduce into the Treaty a provision enabling the Community to take direct steps to combat social exclusion;
- 20. Calls for the inclusion in the Treaty of an explicit reference to public services as one of the elements of the rights of citizens of the Union, with a view to strengthening economic and social cohesion and the protection of users; calls for such rights and objectives to be accompanied, with a view to their effective implementation, by a redefinition of the resources and powers of the Union's institutions;

Chapter 6 - Environment

21. Welcomes the proposed new references to sustainable development and to the fuller integration of environmental protection requirements into the definition and implementation of a wide range of Community policies and activities;

Chapter 7 - Consumer policy

22. Welcomes the proposed new Article 129a as a further step towards the definition of a genuine consumer policy within the Treaty and believes that, as a last resort, this policy should become a common policy of the Union;

Chapter 7a - Tourism

23. Regrets the failure to include a specific reference to tourism and reiterates its view that tourism, in its European dimension, should form an independent and well-differentiated common policy with a legal basis and a chapter of its own in the revised Treaty;

Chapter 8 - Transparency

- 24. Considers that the Irish Presidency's draft text on transparency, while providing for certain improvements in this area, is still much too cautious and limited in scope:
- (a) the proposed statement of the principle of openness in Article A of the TEU, while better than nothing, is much too weakly worded;
- (b) the proposed right of access to documents is a positive development, as is the suggestion that general principles and limits governing the exercise of that right should be decided in accordance with the codecision procedure; such general principles should include the notion that access to documents is the normal rule, subject only to a few carefully defined exceptions, decided upon by a two-thirds qualified majority;
- (c) the idea of the Council meeting in public in its legislative capacity needs to be properly established, so that at least the first discussion and the final decision are made in public;
- (d) implementing rules should not be left to institutions' internal rules of procedure;

Chapter 9 - Subsidiarity

25. Reiterates its position that the principles of subsidiarity and proportionality, as set out in Article 3b of the Treaty, should be properly upheld and applied;

SECTION III - AN EFFECTIVE AND COHERENT FOREIGN POLICY

Chapter 10 - The common foreign and security policy: objectives, means and structures

- 26. Welcomes the inclusion of an article on political solidarity, which should also include a clause on financial solidarity, and the specification of the objectives of the CFSP, particularly in respect of safeguarding the integrity of the Union;
- 27. Notes a declaration, to be included in the Final Act, concerning a new policy planning and early warning capability entailing, for the first time, the involvement of the WEU through the presence in the unit of some of its personnel and reiterates its request that this unit should be managed by the Commission in close cooperation with the Secretary-General of the Council;

- 28. Notes that the Irish Presidency's text is not such as to give the Union effective instruments for establishing a genuine CFSP and in particular has the serious weaknesses indicated below on which genuinely more detailed negotiations are needed:
- (a) the member of the Commission responsible for the CFSP should represent the EU in the CFSP, in close cooperation with the Council Presidency;
- (b) rejects the introduction of a new veto procedure in areas where qualified majority voting is already provided for; appropriate mechanisms should be set up to ensure that a Member State cannot unilaterally block any decision-making; recalls in this context the Italian document of 25 October 1996 and its general approach in favour of increased use of qualified majority voting in the decision-making process;
- (c) the unilateral strengthening of the role of the Secretary-General of the Council is unacceptable; believes, however, that serious thought will need to be given to the idea of appointing an individual with a political background to be responsible for the CFSP but without any kind of responsibility within the general secretariat of the Council (the possibility of a Commissioner appointed according to special procedures and responsible to the Council could be envisaged);
- (d) the proposal in the German non-paper of 6 June 1996 and the Italian document of 25 October 1996 that Article J.8 should be amended so as to introduce qualified majority voting as the basic rule and that when a Member State requests unanimity for a decision, the request may be rejected by a qualified majority, is a positive step; the possibility of constructive abstention is appropriate in view of the fact that the other Member States will benefit from political and financial solidarity in the application of the decisions taken:
- (e) the conflict prevention capabilities of the EU should be better defined and strengthened; a policy of conflict prevention and peaceful resolution of conflicts should become a pillar of a common defence and security policy;
- (f) it is unacceptable for operational expenditure to be deemed to be expenditure necessarily resulting from the Treaty within the meaning of Article 203 of the EC Treaty;

Chapter 11 - External economic relations

- 29. Considers that the measures proposed in the draft Treaty as regards external economic relations are far too limited in scope, in view of the weaknesses of the existing Treaty articles, and of the current entirely inadequate role of the European Parliament in this area;
- 30. Expresses its serious concern that the Presidency proposal to restrict the assent procedure to enlargements and to association agreements would actually lead to a reduction in the existing powers of the European Parliament pursuant to Article 228;
- 31. Reiterates its demand that Article 113 be split into an article providing a legal basis for acts of a legislative nature, on which the European Parliament would be involved in codecision, and an article providing a legal basis for international agreements, on which the European Parliament would be involved by means of assent;
- 32. Welcomes the Irish Presidency proposal to make the Commission the sole negotiator for multilateral agreements in the fields of services, intellectual property and direct foreign investment; insists, however, that the Council act by a qualified majority in this field and that the proposed declaration be modified to provide that the Commission would conduct negotiations with maximum transparency *vis-à-vis* the European Parliament as well as *vis-à-vis* Member States; considers, furthermore, that these principles must also be applied in respect of bilateral agreements in the aforementioned sectors;

Chapter 12 - Security and defence

- 33. Notes with satisfaction the demonstration of the political will to make practical progress in the area of defence; wonders, nevertheless, about the implications of any rapid moves towards integration on military and defence matters without simultaneous progress being made regarding the CFSP; notes that the Presidency document has the following positive aspects:
- (a) it reformulates the objectives of the CFSP in the field of security and defence;
- (b) it incorporates the objectives of the Petersberg tasks into the Treaty;

- 34. Calls for more detailed consideration of the following questions:
- (a) the authority of the Union over the WEU should be clearly established and, as proposed in the Franco-German document, considers that the IGC should lay down definite target dates for certain stages in the ultimate integration of the WEU into the EU;
- (b) a protocol, accession to which would be optional, setting out the current mutual defence commitments of full members of the WEU should be annexed to the Treaty;
- (c) calls for a decision-making mechanism to be agreed on for issues with military implications that prevents decisions from being blocked without requiring every Member State to provide troops or equipment of its own;
- (d) a common arms policy, including the control of manufacture and exports, as put forward by the Italian proposal, should be included as an objective of the CFSP, in connection with the strengthening of the security of the Union and its Member States;

Chapter 13 - Legal personality of the Union

- 35. Welcomes the incorporation of a new article into the TEU giving the Union legal personality; finds, nonetheless, that the procedure whereby the Council is to act unanimously to conclude agreements on behalf of the Union, after consulting the EP, is not acceptable;
- 36. Reiterates its position that all international agreements binding on the Community should be subject to assent;

SECTION IV - THE UNION'S INSTITUTIONS

General institutional issues

37. Again expresses its strong regret that the Presidency has not put forward formal Treaty texts, and in some cases not even possible options, as regards most of the key institutional issues facing the Conference; considers that, without satisfactory solutions to these problems, the IGC will have failed completely in its central tasks of increasing democracy and efficiency within the existing EU, and the whole process of further EU enlargement will have been endangered;

Chapter 14 - European Parliament

- 38. Considers, in this context, that the Irish Presidency text has made a few positive proposals in this regard but, nevertheless, has not adequately taken account of the need to reinforce democratic control at EU level:
- (i) the text proposes extension of the codecision procedure on the basis of objective criteria rather than on a case-by-case basis, but does not draw the conclusion that the proposal to extend codecision to the entire area of standard secondary legislation as put forward by the Commission and Parliament is the only proposal on the table and should therefore be followed up;
- (ii) the Presidency's text completely fails to tackle the issues of:
 - the extension of the assent procedure to all constitutional issues such as reform of the Treaties,
 Article 235 and own resources, and also to all international agreements;
 - the full attainment of budgetary codecision;
 - an enhanced European Parliament role in the appointment of the President and Members of the Commission;
 - a reinforced European Parliament role in nominations, with assent as regards appointment to the Court of Justice and the Court of Auditors;
 - the reform of the existing complex and insufficiently democratic and transparent system of commitology;
 - the responsibilities of the European Parliament in deliberating on and evaluating policies;
- 39. Welcomes the Presidency's proposal to simplify the codecision procedure, which goes in the direction suggested by the European Parliament; considers, however, that it should be made clearer that, if the Council makes any changes to a text examined by the EP, the latter should always be given a second

reading; believes, moreover, that the suggested time limits and the other issues such as the possible reduction in the size of delegations to the Conciliation Committee or an increase in the proportion of permanent members should be discussed jointly by the Council and Parliament with the aim of improving the efficiency of the conciliation procedure;

Chapter 15 - Council

- 40. Strongly regrets the fact that the Presidency, in spite of noting that a case-by-case approach is hardly likely to lead to satisfactory results, has failed to put forward specific proposals on extending qualified majority voting in the Council, such as for example its extension in principle to all standard secondary legislation;
- 41. Notes that the Presidency has strongly hinted that a dual majority voting system in the Council, whether of votes and population or of population and number of Member States, might be preferable to a simple reweighting of Council votes as the best solution to the problem of voting balance between larger and smaller Member States; calls for the concept of dual majorities to be clarified as soon as possible (i.e. which thresholds are applied to which issues);

Chapter 16 - Commission

- 42. Reiterates its position that at the present stage the number of members of the Commission must be at least equal to the number of Member States; notes that there is a consensus on strengthening the powers of the President of the Commission; insists that the role and independence of the Commission, and its right of initiative, must be maintained;
- 43. Warns against a certain tendency to strengthen the powers of the Council at the expense of the other institutions; reiterates, in this connection, its commitment to balance between the institutions and, more particularly, to the maintenance of the Commission's monopoly of the right of initiative in legislative matters; underlines, moreover, the need for the Commission to represent the Community within its terms of reference;

Chapter 17 - Court of Justice

44. Considers that the terms for referrals to the Court of Justice should be widened to enable the European Parliament to bring actions before the Court on the same terms as the Commission and the Council, and that the Court of Auditors, the ECB, the Committee of the Regions and the ESC should be able to bring actions before the Court when one of their rights is infringed; reiterates its request that judges of the Court of Justice should have a single non-renewable term of nine years as of their first appointment;

Chapter 18 — Other institutional issues — Budgetary procedures and control of fraud — Committee of the Regions

- 45. Strongly regrets that the EP's repeated requests for the unification of the budget and the simplification of budgetary procedures, as well as for the abolition of the distinction between compulsory and non-compulsory expenditure and for the granting of assent by the EP on own resources decisions, have been completely ignored in the Presidency text, and that the European Parliament has been explicitly excluded from any meaningful role in the financing of the second and third pillars;
- 46. Calls for a strengthening of the Presidency proposal, which takes up a Danish Government proposal on the fight against fraud, particularly the prevention of irregularities in the management of Community funds and the punishment of offences which affect the financial interests of the Community;
- 47. Welcomes the proposal to delete Protocol No 16 on the Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions, so allowing the latter greater administrative autonomy; supports the proposal from the German delegation seeking to extend the areas in which the Committee of the Regions is consulted;

Chapter 19 - National parliaments

48. Affirms its support for the conclusions of the Dublin COSAC (Conference of bodies concerned with Community affairs in the parliaments of the European Community) meeting in October 1996;

- 49. Welcomes the inclusion of a new protocol on the role of national parliaments and the idea of more timely information being provided to national parliaments on Commission consultation documents and all proposals for legislation, including the introduction of a new four-week minimum period for national parliamentary examination of such texts;
- 50. Notes with concern that the Presidency's draft proposal goes much further than the COSAC's own conclusions in including a specific reference to COSAC in the declaration or a protocol, and fears that this could lead to the institutionalization of COSAC's role, a highly undesirable trend towards duplication of the role of the European Parliament and an undesirable institutionalization of such duplication; calls on the governments not to allow the national parliaments to be overridden on this issue, for example, in respect of restrictions on the subjects to be considered or of the form in which opinions are expressed and, instead, primarily to have regard to the ideas of the national parliaments themselves;

SECTION V - ENHANCED COOPERATION - 'FLEXIBILITY'

- 51. Declares that any decision on 'enhanced cooperation' has become a central issue at the IGC where it should be tackled clearly and without ambiguity and considers that this issue must be examined in detail, involving consideration of the role of the Commission, the decision-making process, the minimum number of participating Member States, the role of the EP and financial arrangements;
- 52. Is convinced that the procedure involving enhanced cooperation, which is currently under discussion and which would enable some Member States to go further than others (institutional flexibility), is highly problematic and requires more detailed discussion; takes the view that, if the institutional unity and the objectives of the European Union are not to be jeopardized, such a procedure must in any case always remain an exception and that the relevant arrangements for this procedure must be consistent with the decision-making procedures of the Community and the Union and transitional in nature and should, whatever happens, be accompanied by the requisite support measures for those Member States not taking part, so that all those states wishing to participate can do so within an acceptable period; any enhanced cooperation that may transpire, apart from respecting the principles already set out by the Florence European Council, must in no way jeopardize either the prerogatives of the Commission or the role and unique character of the EP;

SIMPLIFICATION OF THE TREATIES

- 53. Deems it essential for the work on simplifying the Treaties, taking into account the bestowal of legal personality on the Union, to result in a merger of the four Treaties (EU, EC, ECSC and Euratom), without jeopardizing the *acquis communautaire*;
- 54. Calls on the Netherlands Presidency to conduct the negotiations with the aim of providing, in the future Treaty, a satisfactory response to the objectives set out, and points out that enlargement should necessarily be preceded by an ambitious and far-reaching institutional reform;

55. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the governments and parliaments of the Member States, the Commission and the other Community institutions.

- D. whereas the security forces of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia have so far shown restraint in the face of massive peaceful resistance by the people,
- E. noting that the full implementation of the recommendations included in the OSCE report, combined with concrete steps to improve the electoral system, freedom of the press and independence of the judicial system, constitute the precondition for an improvement in relations between the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia on the one hand and the European Union on the other,
- F. emphasizing that the Commission and the Council, as well as the European Union's Member States, should give their full support to democratization of the institutions of, and reinforcement of civic society in, the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, whatever authorities are in place in the future,
- 1. Pays tribute and gives its warm support to the great determination of the people of Belgrade and other Serbian cities in their peaceful actions to achieve a process of democratic transition in their country;
- 2. Gives its full and unequivocal support to the report of the special OSCE mission on the local elections in Serbia of 17 November 1996, and urges the Serbian authorities to implement fully the recommendations included in this report as a matter of extreme urgency;
- 3. Urges the Council to emphasize the importance it attaches to implementation of the conclusions of the OSCE report by the Serbian regime, by sending a special Troika mission to Belgrade expressing its position and making contact with the opposition;

11. EU-Latin America partnership

Resolution on the Communication from the Commission to the Council and the European Parliament on 'The European Union and Latin America: the present situation and prospects for closer partnership 1996-2000' (COM(95)0495 — C4-0489/95)

- having regard to the Communication from the Commission to the Council and the European Parliament (COM(95)0495 - C4-0489/95),
- having regard to its resolution of 22 April 1994 on economic and trade relations between the EU and Latin America (1),
- having regard to the conclusions of the European Council of Madrid (15-16 December 1995) on the general guidelines for the cooperation between the EU and Latin America, which explicitly state that economic development should be linked to social progress;
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, Security and Defence Policy and the opinions of the Committee on External Economic Relations, the Committee on Development and Cooperation, the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy and the Committee on Transport and Tourism (A4-0416/96),
- A. considering that the EU should develop a global and coherent approach towards Latin America, leaving however ample opportunity for deepening relations with specific countries and sub-regions, reflecting the degree of diversity within the continent, and that Latin America offers the European Union's common foreign and security policy an opportunity which has not yet been adequately exploited,
- B. having regard to the important contribution made by the European Union to achieving and maintaining peace and strengthening international security in its relations with Latin America, in particular with regard to the crisis in Central America (the San José dialogue process),

- C. considering that democratic clauses in international agreements should be extended with a view to placing emphasis on the issue of impunity, should actually be implemented and should apply equally to all different geographic regions, including all the Latin American countries,
- D. considering that the progress towards consolidation of democracy, respect for human rights and economic reform in Latin America facilitates the cooperation between the EU and Latin America, and promotes political and economic stability and social equality in the whole continent,
- E. concerned however that despite these opportunities and the major role the EU plays as partner in development cooperation to Latin America, the EU risks being outflanked by the United States of America with respect to economic investment-related and political activities,
- F. considering the EU has made insufficient use of the instruments provided for by the common foreign and security policy in its relations with Latin America,
- G. considering that the present imbalance between the ministerial and the inter-parliamentary side of the political dialogue between the EU and Latin America needs to be corrected and that more possibilities should be offered for participation of the civil society in the cooperation between the EU and Latin America in general and the political dialogue in particular,
- H. whereas the growing interdependence of the world economy and the emergence of political, social and environmental problems mean that the EU should be more involved in the developments on the Latin American continent,
- I. considering that a number of problems and challenges in relation to developments in Latin America require adequate attention of the EU, such as:
 - the ongoing integration efforts on the continent,
 - the high social costs which are involved with the economic reform process, with broad sections of the population reduced to poverty, and the uneven distribution of income and wealth greatly aggravated,
 - the threats to the democracies in Latin America, because of narcotics economics, corruption, increased crime and poverty,
 - the protection of the environment,
 - the problem concerning the foreign debt of the Latin American countries;
 - the prevailing exemption from punishment and the continued existence of military courts with far-reaching powers,
- J. whereas the economic growth model in Latin America must be accompanied by the highest possible levels of social equity and balance; whereas the consolidation of democracy requires the elimination of poverty and social exclusion, effective systems for participation and a fair balance in the distribution of wealth; aware that an improvement of the tax collection system in Latin America would enable the Latin American states to make a bigger effort with regard to social measures themselves.
- K. aware that the interests of EU and the United States of America (US) should be more closely coordinated; considering also that Latin America should be given greater attention in the transatlantic dialogue between the EU and the US,
- whereas the positive effects of the adjustment policies carried out in Latin America should help to
 eliminate the social inequalities and enormous pockets of poverty which still exist and threaten to
 cause serious social unrest,
- M. considering that since the EU Treaty the defence and security aspects of the relationship between the EU and Latin America should no longer be ignored,
- N. considering that the EU needs to play an active role in Latin America to help that continent to meet these challenges and to secure its own interests,
- 1. Welcomes the communication of the Commission, which gives a new incentive to the relationship between the EU and Latin America, seeking a closer political, trading and cooperation partnership;
- 2. Supports the analysis made by the Commission; considers the proposals of the Commission to be vague and little innovative; therefore calls on the Commission to draft an action programme containing more concrete proposals;

On the Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) and the political dialogue

- 3. Believes that the communication lacks the ambition to develop a global, coherent and individual approach on the basis of the CFSP; recalls that the EU Treaty requires the EU to affirm its identity on the international level; requests that relations between the European Union and Latin America should be specific and exclusive and not be linked to any other geographical area;
- 4. Calls on the Commission and the Council to submit a global action programme for the CFSP with regard to Latin America, which should be well defined and precise and be given sufficient budgetary resources:
- 5. Calls on the Commission and the Council to identify Latin America as a geographic area of great importance for the EU and to make more use of the instruments available under the CFSP in its relations with Latin America;
- 6. Recommends to the Council that joint and common actions, in conformity with the provisions of Article J.7 of the EU Treaty, be considered to promote peace, democracy and respect for human rights in Latin America, in which case Parliament must always be consulted beforehand;
- 7. Calls on the Member States of the European Union to continue to develop public or private investment policies in the Latin American region in order to continue to promote vital industrial cooperation and the transfer of technology via small and medium-sized undertakings or joint ventures;
- 8. Calls for greater autonomy for the CFSP in relation to Latin America and advocates that its relations with that area should result in a proper 'transatlantic dialogue' between both areas, including all the activities developed by the Union, in order to ensure that the interests and the role of Latin America in the new international (economic) order are taken into consideration and reinforced;
- 9. Calls on the Latin American countries and the EU institutions to consider establishing a new transatlantic dialogue between Latin America and the EU, modelled on, but not necessarily identical to, the existing transatlantic dialogues between the EU and the US and the EU and Canada;
- 10. Proposes, as mechanisms for dialogue, a specific ministerial framework for each regional integration process similar to the arrangements for the renewed San José dialogue process, as well as an interparliamentary framework with each of the regional parliaments, in accordance with the same principles;
- 11. Proposes that the European Parliament and the relevant Latin American regional parliament should take part in the twice-yearly plenary ministerial meetings, as well as in intermediate meetings between the Latin American ministers and the European Union Troika;
- 12. Intends to monitor the use of the funds assigned to regional cooperation and calls on the national or regional parliaments of Latin America to do likewise;
- 13. Calls for the establishment of fora for consultation with civil society and proposes the latter's participation in the various regional dialogue processes by holding regular conferences, by granting its representatives observer status in the various inter-ministerial meetings and by their active participation in the fora, committees and subcommittees in the various sectors;

On trade and integration

- 14. Calls on the Commission to include in the action programme requested by the European Parliament a global vision on the future development of the contractual relations between the EU on one side and Latin America as a whole, its sub-regions and the individual countries on the other;
- 15. Considers it vital for the EU to support integration between the emerging countries of Latin America through the flexible application of advantages conferred by the GSP on a regional basis and, in this sense, supports the notion that where an emerging country no longer benefits from the GSP, the system of regional accumulation might continue to be applied to components from that country used by the remaining countries belonging to the same regional grouping;
- 16. Welcomes the progress made in the process of economic and commercial integration by the countries belonging to Mercosur (Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Paraguay and Uruguay) who managed to set up a customs union which should be complete by the year 2000;

- 17. Calls on the Council and the Commission to bring into play all possible mechanisms to implement the agreements recently signed with Mercosur and Chile, in order to achieve, rapidly and efficiently, the objectives contained in those agreements;
- 18. Calls on the Member States to complete, as soon as possible, the internal formalities for ratifying the agreements signed with Mercosur and Chile; in this context, calls on the Commission in particular, and the European Union in general, to invest more effort in coming to an agreement with Brazil in the economic field, bearing in mind the importance of this country which represents almost two thirds of Mercosur and with which cooperation is concentrated mainly on social and environmental projects;
- 19. Welcomes, likewise, the recent agreement signed on 21 June 1996 in the presence of the 15 Heads of State or Government and the President of the Republic of Chile at the European Council meeting in Florence, which will help to strengthen the new contractual relations between the European Union and Latin America;
- 20. Supports the progress made in the sectors of free trade and integration; requests that future economic cooperation agreements with the countries and blocs in the region devote particular attention to environmental and social sustainability and be accompanied by financial protocols incorporating a substantial increase in the resources assigned to cooperation with the Latin American countries; requests that these agreements should include a negotiated and reciprocal opening up of markets, that they should not exclude 'sensitive areas' and should include a calendar for reciprocal liberalization of trade;
- 21. Calls on the Commission before the start of the procedure for the adoption of the Union's new financial perspectives, which are to enter into force by the year 2000, to submit a report assessing the financial allocation which would be necessary (budget allocation and EIB loans) to ensure adequate support for the partnership agreements between the EU and the Latin American countries or regional grouping in the first years of the next century;
- 22. Insists that trade protectionist measures which discriminate against Latin American products, e.g. agricultural subsidies, need to be addressed within the EU to support and encourage growing trade links between these two regions;
- 23. Calls on the Commission and the Council to use all possible instruments to promote investment by EU-firms in particular small and medium size enterprises in Latin America, for example through the increase of funds for LA-INVEST, ECIP and the European Investment Bank;
- 24. Asks the Commission to submit to it a yearly report on the progress made in removing the obstacles which hinder EU-Latin American reciprocal trade and the progress achieved in preparing the future trade liberalization with Mercosur and Chile;

On cooperation between the EU and Latin America

- 25. Believes that the increase in funds for the new period (1996-2000) is insufficient to meet the ambitions as described by the Commission in its Communication and wishes to see a further increase in these funds and hopes this increase will take into account the Commission's staffing needs;
- 26. Reasserts the importance of the principles of development underpinning all the EU's foreign relations with the countries of Latin America, whilst over 200 million of the region's inhabitants are impoverished, suffering malnutrition, hunger, lack of clean water and sewage disposal and inadequate information and education;
- 27. Calls on the Commission to give priority to the less developed countries in Latin America when using these funds; also calls on the Commission to work out a suitable way of co-financing between the EU and the richer Latin American countries, when the latter are recipients of funds in the framework of EU/Latin America cooperation;
- 28. Supports the priorities and themes chosen by the Commission, as well as the attention given to the improvement of the management structures of the cooperation;

- 29. Calls on the Council to coordinate the position of the Member States in the Paris and London Clubs and to look into the possibility of applying innovative formulae to reduce the weight of the debt (conversion into environmental and vocational training projects, revision of the system of tax relief for bank reserves to cover bad debt);
- 30. Repeats its request for part of the foreign debt to be cancelled in the negotiations with each Latin American country, in accordance with its restricted capacity for payment, and for priority to be given to combating poverty;
- 31. Notes that assessment is an essential aspect of improving the efficiency, impact and quality of European cooperation; calls on the Commission, on the basis of the objectives outlined, to adopt the necessary measures to allow serious action to be taken in this field, so that assessments may be carried out with greater regularity and be more far-reaching;
- 32. Declares itself in favour of tax reform being considered a priority sector of Union technical assistance for Latin American public administration and calls on the Commission, in this context, to set up a task force of tax experts to work in close cooperation with those Latin American governments reforming their tax structures:
- 33. Insists that the Member States of the EU and the countries of Latin America coordinate their efforts in their fight against drug trafficking and underlines the need for these countries to contribute to the activities of the UN and its specialized agencies; to this end calls for greater collaboration between the Commission and the Member States so that the pilot programme of operational coordination which is being carried out in some Latin American countries may soon be extended to other areas of cooperation and other countries in the region;
- 34. Considers that the lack of clarity and information concerning the scope of relations between the EU and Latin America must be remedied by means of measures for promotion and dissemination, involving the Commission's delegations and members of society on both sides;

On security and defence cooperation

- 35. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the EU Member States to increase cooperation with the relevant organizations and countries of Latin America in the area of security and defence; believes that this dialogue should centre around confidence-building measures amongst the Latin American states, (control of) arms trade, arms reduction, international conflict prevention and peace keeping;
- 36. Urges the Member States of the EU and the countries of Latin America to continue to play an active part in humanitarian and peace-keeping activities;
- 37. Believes that the new relations in the field of security and defence must respect the principles of environmental safety and sustainable development, the control of nuclear, chemical and conventional arms and the resolution of conflict by peaceful means, and should not harm the development of their peoples;
- 38. Encourages the conclusion of cooperation agreements on security and defence matters between the different security organizations of which the Member States of the EU and the countries and bodies of Latin America are members;

39. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and the Commission.

12. San José dialogue

Resolution on the Communication from the Commission to the Council on the renewal of the San José dialogue between the European Union and Central America (COM(95)0600 — C4-0102/96)

- having regard to the Communication from the Commission to the Council, COM(95)0600 -C4-0102/96,
- having regard to its resolutions of 17 September 1987 on the Esquipulas II Conference and the peace plan for Central America (1) and 30 October 1987 on the Anas Guatemala peace plan (Esquipulas II) $(^2)$,
- having regard to its resolution of 11 March 1988 on the situation in Central America (3),
- having regard to its opinion of 15 July 1993 on the proposal for a Council Decision concerning the conclusion of a Framework Cooperation Agreement between the European Economic Community and the republics of Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama (4),
- having regard to its resolution of 22 April 1994 on the economic and commercial implications for the Community of the situation in Central America (5),
- having regard to its resolution of 15 December 1994 on support for the peace process in Guatemala (6),
- having regard to its resolution of 18 July 1996 on progress in implementing the common foreign and security policy (January-December 1995) (7),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, Security and Defence Policy and the opinions of the Committee on External Economic Relations and the Committee on Development and Cooperation (A4-0418/96),
- A. whereas the success achieved in connection with the San José ministerial dialogue between the European Union and Central America, which began in September 1994, is one of the greatest achievements to date of the EU's common foreign policy,
- B. whereas, of the successes to which the European Union has contributed, special mention should be made of the achievement of a secure, lasting peace in the region on the basis of the Esquipulas II agreements, the establishment of peace and stability in Nicaragua and El Salvador, the peace agreement in Guatemala, the continuation of the regional integration process, the existence of democratic governments and orderly transitions, the progressive demilitarization of society and the overall improvement in the human rights situation,
- C. whereas, despite the progress made (macro-economic stability, renewed growth, the spread of democratic government), there continue to be threats to peace and democracy in certain countries; whereas the pockets of poverty in many of those countries have reached an intolerable size, and whereas there is a greater need than ever to offer the people hope and expectations for the future,
- D. whereas the European Union should help to satisfy the expectations of peace and justice which have been aroused in the countries and peoples of the area and to guarantee the ultimate success of the measures which have already been adopted, and whereas the Union's responsibility cannot under any circumstances be regarded as being restricted merely to involvement in the various electoral processes,

- E. whereas there is a need to establish balanced, consistent relations between the European Union and Central America which exclude any kind of unfair law and double standards and which are based on the legitimate interests (of any kind) of both parties,
- F. whereas, in the trade and economic field, the cooperation framework agreement between the European Community and the signatory countries to the General Treaty on Central American Economic Integration (Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua), together with Panama, which was initialled on 22 January 1993 and signed on 22 February 1993, represents a new chapter in relations between the EU and Central America,
- G. whereas development cooperation with Central America should continue to be directed towards the most vulnerable social groups and whereas cooperation methods need to be improved so as to increase the involvement of local groups in programme management, speed up payments and ensure uniform impact in the various geographical areas,
- H. whereas the Joint Committee must be made to operate effectively so as to ensure that concerted action is taken in respect of the various projects submitted by the governments in the region, that priorities are established from a regional point of view and that the involvement of social organizations, trade unions and NGOs operating in the region is secured,
- whereas, in Central America, the phenomenon of impunity is particularly apparent in the difficulties
 faced by judicial bodies in their attempts to guarantee the rights of those detained by the police and the
 military and to bring members of those forces to trial,
- J. whereas it must once again be ensured that budgetary resources are sufficient to match ambitions and whereas, despite the significant amount of aid received, the list of needs and objectives to be covered is so challenging in financial terms that greater resources are essential,
- K. whereas the new cooperation framework agreement of 22 February 1993 does not guarantee any political debate whatsoever at parliamentary level or provide for any form of participation by the general public,
- L. whereas the above agreement has recently been ratified by Costa Rica and Guatemala is to do the same in the near future, which means that the agreement can then be brought into force quickly, and whereas, if it is not revised, use could at least be made of the evolutionary clause contained therein for the purpose of adapting the agreement to the new requirements of the renewed dialogue process,
- M. whereas the general public needs to be involved in the dialogue process through the holding of periodic conferences with the representatives thereof, both in the EU and in Central America, by granting those representatives observer status at inter-ministerial meetings and by facilitating the active participation of such people in the appropriate sectoral forums, committees and subcommittees at all discussion, negotiation and monitoring stages of the process,
- N. whereas, in addition to allowing the involvement of other civilian, people's and trade-union organizations, the San José process should also accommodate the various integration and cooperation structures involving European and Central American NGOs which are already in operation (in the fields of the environment, youth, women's rights, etc.),
- 1. Expresses its satisfaction at the success achieved since the San José dialogue process was institutionalized in November 1985 and calls for the strengthening and realignment thereof;
- 2. Considers that the strengthening of the above dialogue process is a prime objective for a comprehensive, consistent and independent common foreign and security policy which requires the European Union to act responsibly and consistently and, at the same time, represents a moral commitment on the part of the Union;
- 3. Is in favour of extending the political dialogue to other topics such as social issues, the rules for applying the democracy clause, human rights, decentralization, trade policy and macro-economic policies and calls on the Member States to take steps towards debt cancellation for Central America;
- 4. Calls for a comprehensive, highly specific, well-defined and adequately funded CFSP action programme for Central America to be drawn up and calls on the Commission to submit to Parliament a detailed plan of its multi-annual programme for Central America and of the associated measures which will ensure better use of the available resources and effective financial and technical monitoring;

- 5. Reiterates its view that support for democratization in Central America entails democracy and respect for human rights, with an avoidance of double standards, and includes monitoring of and support for electoral processes, support for bodies and organizations which promote and defend human rights, support for refugees and returnees, respect for workers' rights, the signing, implementation and full application of ILO Convention 169 of 1989 on Indigenous and Tribal Peoples in Independent Countries, control of the armed forces by civil society and reductions in military expenditure in order to fund human development;
- 6. Welcomes the signing of the global agreement for a firm and lasting peace in Guatemala between the government of Guatemala and the URNG guerilla movement; calls on both parties to comply strictly with the agreements; calls on the Commission and Council to grant Guatemala, subject to full respect for human rights, financial assistance which is sufficient to ensure the success of the peace process, the satisfactory reintegration of the returnees and the reintegration of the combatants;
- 7. Calls on the European Union to contribute to the regional integration process in Central America by means of:
- exchanges of experience to create the institutional framework of the process;
- support for policy coordination and for devising regional policies in the areas of agriculture and stock farming, industry, trade, energy, services and customs, which will help the region to integrate into the world economy;
- support for regional compensatory funds to rectify social imbalances arising from the integration process;
- measures to promote and support cross-border cooperation in the region in matters of common interest;
- 8. Urges all the Central American states to continue their efforts to achieve regional integration, and to this end supports the implementation of the Social Charter for Central American Integration and the operation of the Sub-system for Social Integration set up at the presidential summit in San Salvador in 1995;
- 9. Considers it essential for the Commission's human and material resources, both in the region itself and in the central offices, to be significantly increased in terms of both quality and quantity and in this connection welcomes the opening of the Commission delegation office in Guatemala and the imminent opening of a delegation office in Nicaragua;
- 10. Attaches priority to measures designed to consolidate the rule of law through the creation of an independent judiciary which will be free from pressure and be able to judge and mete out punishments in case of impunity for crimes committed for political reasons, together with the modernization of the state, decentralization and municipal development, the promotion of concerted action between governments and the general public, the promotion of full and equal participation by women and the abolition of legal and economic discrimination against women, the protection of indigenous women and the environment and the carrying out of proper fiscal reform, which will enable the state to meet its basic obligations in terms of education and health care:
- 11. Reaffirms its full support for action against impunity; urges all state bodies in Central America to cooperate with the judicial bodies investigating this issue; supports the efforts of the United Nations 'Truth Commission' to curb the tendency to grant general amnesties for political crimes committed in the recent past; resolutely opposes any impunity for human rights abuses;
- 12. Welcomes the extension of the multi-annual programme for the promotion of human rights in Central America; supports the implementation thereof, especially among the security bodies and forces of the state, the armed forces, public institutions and judicial bodies; is in favour of setting up a permanent international criminal court to deal with the abhorrent phenomenon of impunity;
- 13. Calls on the Commission to devote particular attention to impunity as a serious infringement of the human rights clause in EU Agreements with third countries and urges it in this connection to draw up a proposal for an international convention against impunity and to forward it to the competent bodies;

- 14. Suggests that support should be provided for land distribution and registration processes for the benefit of cooperative members and small-scale peasant farmers as part of an agricultural reform process, and that there should be an increase in the resources allocated to social policy and to improving care and quality in health, basic services and education;
- 15. Fully supports the additional regional structures introduced in Central America to combat drug trafficking and calls for special funds to be allocated to anti-personnel mine defusion programmes;
- 16. Considers that the cooperation framework agreement (and future agreements of the same type) should in future be accompanied by a financial protocol which includes a substantial increase in the resources allocated to cooperation with the countries of Central America;
- 17. Proposes the extension to Central America of the new Generalized System of Preferences of which the Andean Pact countries are beneficiaries in the case of industrial products as well, and the involvement of the European Investment Bank and the EU Member States in the Central American Bank for Economic Integration; calls emphatically, however, for such measures to promote export-oriented agriculture and industry not to be allowed to result in further concentration of land and property ownership, which jeopardizes food security in the countries concerned;
- 18. Calls for at least partial remission of the external debt of the Central American countries and for the adjustment thereof to their respective limited payment capacities and for priority to be given to combating poverty;
- 19. Emphasizes the importance of granting support to economic operators in the region, in particular small and medium-sized enterprises, in order to promote and diversify exports and stimulate European investment in Central America;
- 20. Proposes that the European Parliament and the Central American Parliament should be involved in the twice-yearly plenary ministerial meetings and in the intermediate meetings between the Central American ministers and the EU Troika;
- 21. Calls on the Central American states which have not yet done so to ratify the Parlacen Constituent Treaty and to play an effective role within that institution;
- 22. Stresses the importance of regional integration as a means of achieving the development and integration of the region at international level; calls for technical assistance and institutional aid to the Central American regional integration bodies to be maintained;
- 23. Calls for a forum to be set up for consultation with the general public, for the proposals put forward by the Civilian Initiative for Central American Integration (ICIC) to be taken into account, and for the bodies which have taken part in cooperation projects in the region for many years (in particular the CIFCA Copenhagen Initiative for Central America) to be allowed to take part in the above-mentioned consultative forum on an appropriate basis;
- 24. Recommends that participation by civil society (civil, grassroots and trade union organizations, NGOs, etc.) in the dialogue process should find practical expression in the holding of periodic conferences, the granting to its representatives of observer status at interministerial meetings and the active involvement of such representatives in relevant sectoral forums, committees and subcommittees;
- 25. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the Presidents of the Central American and Latin American parliaments, the governments of the Member States and the governments of the Central American states.

Article -1b

In Article 9 paragraphs 2 and 3 are replaced by the following text:

'2. The representative of the Commission shall submit to the Committee a draft of the measures to be taken. The Committee shall deliver its opinion on this draft within a time limit to be determined by the Chairman according to the urgency of the matter and, where necessary, by taking a vote.

The opinion shall be recorded in the minutes. Furthermore, each Member State shall have the right to request that its position be included in the minutes.

The Commission shall take the utmost account of the opinion delivered by the Committee and shall inform the Committee of the manner in which its opinion has been taken into account.

The committee shall meet as a rule in public, unless a specific duly motivated decision is taken to the contrary and published in good time. It shall publish agendas two weeks before its meetings. It shall publish minutes of its proceedings. It shall establish a public register of declarations of interest by its members.'

ARTICLE 1, AFTER INTRODUCTION, SOLE PARAGRAPH

Article 10(1) and (2) of Regulation (EEC) 2158/92 are replaced by the following:

- '1. The scheme shall run for five years from 1 January
- 2. The amount of Community financial resources deemed necessary for the implementation of the scheme is ECU 70 million for the period 1997 to 2001.'

Article 10 is replaced by the following:

- 1. The scheme shall run for five years from 1 January
- 2. The financial reference illustrating the will of the legislative authority for the implementation of the scheme is ECU 70 million for the period 1997 to 2001. This reference shall not affect the powers of the budgetary authority as defined by the Treaty.

The budgetary authority shall determine the annual funding, in relation to the appropriations available for each financial year, taking into account the principles of sound management referred to in Article 2 of the Financial Regulation of 21 December 1977, applicable to the General Budget of the European Communities.

3. Before the end of 1999, the Commission shall submit for information a report on the impact of the measures planned in implementation of the programme, in particular ecological, economic and social aspects (qualitative assessment) and the results of a cost-benefit analysis of their implementation (quantitative assessment).'

Resolution on the Commission's White Paper on Air Traffic Management — Freeing Europe's airspace (COM(96)0057 — C4-0191/96)

The European Parliament

- having regard to the Commission's White Paper (COM(96)0057 C4-0191/96),
- having regard to the European Civil Aviation Conference (ECAC) Instar Working Group report of 31 May 1996,
- having regard to the public hearing on this subject on 30 September 1996 (PE 218.713),
- having regard to its resolutions of 18 September 1992 on saturation of airspace and air traffic control (¹), 27 September 1994 on air traffic control in Europe (²), 14 February 1995 on the way forward for civil aviation in Europe (³), and 16 November 1995 on congestion and crisis in air traffic (⁴),
- having regard to the motion for a resolution on the air disaster in the Caribbean, B4-0305/96,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Transport and Tourism and the opinions of the Committees on Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection and the Committee on External Economic Relations (A4-0381/96),

- A. whereas the provision of efficient air transport services is a fundamental element to support the single market in the civil aviation sector and is necessary to improve the competitiveness of the European economy and the mobility of persons and goods,
- B. whereas air traffic management (ATM) is of vital importance for the development of European air transport, and whereas the lack of capacity and efficiency of the present ATM system is one of the obstacles to a well-balanced development of the air transport system,
- C. whereas the present fragmentation of the European ATM system has drastic effects on passengers' convenience, airlines' costs and the environment,
- D. whereas the ATM network is considered to be an integral part of the trans-European transport network (cf. European Parliament and Council Decision No 1692/96/EC of 23 July 1996 on Community guidelines for the development of the trans-European transport network (1)),
- E. whereas Community involvement for the improvement of the present ATM system is fully consistent with the principle of subsidiarity and should be considered an integral part of the common air transport policy,
- F. whereas the number of routes and airlines is constantly increasing,
- G. whereas air traffic demand will continue to grow in the coming decades and is expected to double by 2010.
- H. whereas any solution to the problems connected with air traffic control (ATC) must also involve the European countries which are not members of the Union,
- 1. Takes note of the White Paper on ATM which describes in detail the present situation of ATM in Europe and identifies the shortcomings of this situation;
- 2. Notes that the White Paper indicates that the cost of ATC delays to airlines has steadied at around ECU 2 billion annually;
- 3. Points out that the overall purpose of ATM is to provide the best level of service to the travelling citizen at the lowest cost compatible with the required level of service;
- 4. Stresses that all the necessary developments in the area of ATM must ensure the maintenance of the highest possible level of safety and increase this safety level whenever possible;
- 5. Expresses great concern for the increase in the number of air accidents and incidents (in particular near misses) that took place during 1996;
- 6. Points out that air transport is international, not to say global, in scope, which means that procedures, standards, regulations and technical resources must cover the widest possible geographical area;
- 7. Considers it vital, therefore, for the European Union to guarantee harmonization and establish cooperation schemes for ATM with the central and eastern European countries and with the Mediterranean countries in the context of the common policy on external relations in civil aviation and also under the PHARE, TACIS and MEDA programmes;
- 8. Takes the view that European airspace must be considered a common resource, regardless of national borders, and that Member States should exercise their sovereignty collectively in the field of air navigation to optimise the use of airspace and satisfy all users on the basis of clear policies on access to it;
- 9. Considers that access to European airspace can no longer be subject to bilateral agreements between the EU Member States and third countries but must be negotiated by the European Union on behalf of all fifteen Member States;

- 10. Recognises the efforts made by ECAC and Eurocontrol to manage the existing airspace more effectively and to try to make more capacity available; considers in this regard that the EU should try to avoid costly duplication of work and activities;
- 11. Recognises that the existing programmes and arrangements go some way towards soloving European ATM problems in the short- and medium-term; is persuaded, however, that only a single European ATM regulatory system will reduce fragmentation and ensure a consistent and uniform ATM system throughout Europe;
- 12. Identifies as basic goals for the single European regulatory system:
- (a) defining high safety standards;
- (b) providing sufficient capacity in accordance with the foreseeable traffic growth;
- (c) being flexible enough to cope with unforeseen short-term changes in demand;
- (d) promoting the most efficient routing of flights through a rational use of airspace;
- (e) promoting optimum cost efficiency by establishing cost and quality control systems, whilst taking into account the constraints associated with the maintenance of the public air traffic control service;
- (f) using the most advanced and proven technologies;
- (g) applying common rules on standardisation and procurement for ATM systems, facilities and procedures, and controlling their implementation;
- (h) ensuring compatibility between the various systems used by the air traffic controllers of the Member States;
- (i) promoting, in the interests of greater safety, the harmonization of the working methods of air traffic controllers and, in particular, the terminology used;
- 13. Agrees with the Commission's approach that there should be a separation between the 'regulatory' and 'operational' tasks of ATM; considers nevertheless that the three options discussed by the Commission for the single ATM system are by no means comprehensive and asks the Commission to assess the institutional model currently under consideration by ECAC States, in order to determine to what extent this model could fulfil the requirements of high safety levels, economic efficiency, social dialogue and freedom of movement in the single market;
- 14. Considers that an ATM authority should be responsible for the major policy and regulatory/legislative aspects required to attain the basic goals of the single ATM system; this would imply responsibility *inter alia* for establishing:
- (a) common ATM safety rules;
- (b) ATM policies, procedures and standards, including airspace design and route structure, and performance and productivity standards to be achieved by the providers of services;
- (c) research, development, trials and evaluation policies, including the introduction of new technologies, in particular satellites and digital data networks with European common specifications;
- (d) policies for financing ATM and common rules for the allocation of costs and charges to the users in a transparent manner;
- (e) common standards of training for air traffic controllers;
- 15. Points out that such an authority must be democratically accountable at European Union level and include mechanisms to guarantee transparent decision-making and funding both internally and externally, including in particular consultation with the airspace users and all parties involved, including ATM personnel representatives, to respond to their needs;
- 16. Notes that satellite-based technologies and digital data networks offer enormous potential for increased efficiency in the field of ATM and for an 'open airspace concept'; stresses that this implies an European Union industrial policy to ensure an effective process for technology selection and should lead to the establishment of common rules on standardisation and procurement that will enable the European industries to develop their competitive capacity to satisfy demand and achieve economies of scale while maintaining high safety levels;

- 17. Considers that the revision of the Eurocontrol International Convention relating to Cooperation for the Safety of Air Navigation should serve as a vehicle for the setting up of a new European regulatory central ATM organisation which would allow the Community to achieve its policy objectives and asks all Member States to ensure that such revision will improve the democratic decision-making procedure and efficiency of the future central ATM organization;
- 18. Reiterates its previous resolutions calling on all European Union Member States to join Eurocontrol without discrimination of any kind and under the same terms which have generally characterized successive incorporations;
- 19. Considers that the Eurocontrol International Convention relating to Cooperation for the Safety of Air Navigation should be revised to allow a new coordinating body to be set up to replace Eurocontrol;
- 20. Believes that increased investment is urgently needed to improve airspace and airport infrastructures, especially in view of the expected growth in air traffic demand and the increase in the Union's internal and external economic relations and trade;
- 21. Welcomes the recent initiative by the Benelux countries and Germany to implement an 'integrated ATC centre concept' that will allow a free route airspace in the upper airspace (above 30 000 feet) of these countries, improving the capacity and efficiency of air traffic flow for the users, and hopes that other Member States will join this initiative;
- 22. Believes that passengers have the right to receive factual information on the length and causes of delays and therefore calls on Member States to establish the regular publication of statistics on air transport delays;
- 23. Stresses the need for central regulation of the European airspace for the benefit of all its users, civil and military, regardless of borders; calls therefore for the new central ATM authority to be empowered with the design of the route network and the airspace structure; supports the integration of military air traffic services into the single system to the maximum possible extent;
- 24. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the Governments of the Member States, the European Civil Aviation Conference and Eurocontrol.

Resolution on public transport and state aid

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its resolutions of 27 May 1993 (¹) and 18 January 1994 (²) on the future development
 of the common transport policy,
- having regard to its resolution of 6 June 1996 on the communication from the Commission to the Council, the European Parliament, the Economic and Social Committee and the Comittee of the Regions on the Common Transport Policy Action Programme 1995-2000 (3),
- having regard to the Commission's Green Paper on the Citizens' Network (COM(95)0601) (4),

- having regard to the principle of subsidiarity,
- having regard to its opinion of 29 February 1996 on the proposal for a Council Regulation amending Regulation (EEC) No 1107/70 on the granting of aids for transport by rail, road and inland waterway (1),
- having regard to Articles 77, 90, 92 and 222 of the EC Treaty,
- having regard to the communication from the Commission on services of general interest in Europe (COM(96)0443) (2),
- having regard to the Commission White Paper on a strategy for revitalizing the Community's railways (COM(96)0421),
- having heard the statement to Parliament by the Commission on 4 September 1996 on public services in Europe (3),
- having regard to its resolution of 13 March 1996 embodying (i) Parliament's opinion on the convening of the Intergovernmental Conference, and (ii) an evaluation of the work of the Reflection Group and a definition of the political priorities of the European Parliament with a view to the Intergovernmental Conference (4),
- having regard to the substance of the term 'public service' as defined in Council Regulation No 1191/69 of 26 June 1969, as amended by Council Regulation No 1893/91 of 20 June 1991 (for transport by rail, road and inland waterway), and in Council Regulations No 3577/92 of 7 December 1992 (for maritime transport) and No 2408/92 of 23 July 1992 (for air transport); whereas the concept of 'public service' is defined in these regulations as 'public service obligations' which Member States may lay down for transport enterprises,
- having regard to Rule 148 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Transport and Tourism (A4-0419/96),
- A. whereas the common transport action programme seeks to improve the standard of the European transport system by establishing an integrated, safe, accessible, effective, efficient and environmentally compatible system of transport which responds to the needs of consumers and workers in the transport sector,
- B. whereas this policy is also aimed at reducing the use of cars and improving public transport,
- C. whereas the distinguishing features of public passenger transport are free access for every citizen, regular services reflected in a timetable and fixed routes,
- D. whereas individual public transport routes are usually part of a network and as a result there are connecting interchange facilities,
- E. whereas, although public passenger transport is possible by road, rail, water or air, not all collective passenger transport can also be described as public,
- F. whereas there are major differences in the ways in which public transport is organized in the various Member States, and at regional and local level within Member States and within the various sectors,
- G. whereas even in the future public transport by road, on certain routes, and by rail, at network level, cannot be operated entirely without a loss,
- H. whereas state aid must be transparent and consistent with the objectives of the common transport policy and with the relevant provisions of the Treaty on European Union,
- having regard to the current Isotope research into the various ways in which public transport is organised in Europe which has been commissioned by the European Union (5),

Competence of the European Union

- 1. Notes that citizens of the Union are increasingly travelling across borders, both for business and for personal reasons;
- 2. Notes that the public transport market is undergoing increasing liberalization and an open European market is being created;
- 3. Takes the view that public transport services must be provided in accordance with the principles of the Treaty;
- 4. Takes the view that the consumer is entitled to efficient transport services which satisfy established criteria, and in the near future cross-border criteria, in terms of continuity, regularity, capacity, affordability and standards which are best tailored to demand;
- 5. Takes the view, with regard to the IGC, that a new article specifically concerned with public services should be included in the Treaty;

Position of public transport

- 6. Takes the view that public transport could, and should, help solve safety, congestion, economic and environmental problems resulting from increased car use;
- 7. Takes the view that an adequate system of public transport is necessary for the social functioning of all citizens, including the disabled, who do not have the use of cars;
- 8. Is of the opinion that the mobility needs of citizens should be satisfied as far as possible within the constraints of the environment, space requirements and (public and private) funding;
- 9. Is also of the opinion that the right to mobility is not an absolute right;

Organization of public transport

- 10. Is of the opinion that innovation, customer service and efficiency in public transport are enhanced by a proper division of responsibilities between government and industry, with the public sector taking the political responsibility for public services and (public or private sector) undertakings making optimum use of the market mechanism to supply top-quality services;
- 11. Notes that an entirely liberalized public transport market provides no guarantee whatsoever of the creation or preservation of an integrated network and therefore believes that the public transport network and the way it is integrated with other forms of transport is a government responsibility;
- 12. Points out that liberalization of the transport market must not entail selective privatization of highly profitable branches of the transport sector with the public authorities being left to fund only loss-making sectors;
- 13. Believes that contracting out local and regional public transport, either at network level where the tendering authority sets qualitative criteria or at route level where the contracting authority determines the network is the best way of encouraging efficiency and effectiveness (and hence competitiveness compared with cars);
- 14. Is of the opinion that the interests of workers in public transport should also be one of the key features in the choice of contracting out;
- 15. Calls for public transport users to be effectively involved, via consumer organizations and under participation arrangements, in creating public transport networks;
- 16. Takes the view that if making public transport more efficient results in the need to rationalise enterprises (particularly in the public sector), state financial aid to the enterprises in question, for a limited period and covering restructuring costs only, may be desirable to offset the social consequences;

17. Calls on the Commission to investigate whether any additional rules are needed for the adequate functioning of the public transport market, both now and in the future, with particular attention to the quality of public transport in frontier regions;

Financing and state aid

- 18. Calls for the Community financial aid of studies, infrastructure and pilot projects to be focused to a greater extent on public transport;
- 19. Is of the opinion than in many instances the cost-effectiveness of public transport is too low;
- 20. Takes the view that the aim should be public transport which is more effective (i.e. better tailored to passengers' wishes) and more efficient (i.e. more cost-effective);
- 21. Considers that the most efficient and effective way of encouraging greater use of public transport is to improve its quality-price ratio;
- 22. Is of the opinion that public transport infrastructure and the operation of public transport should be separate, in that the construction and management costs of infrastructure may be borne by the state;
- 23. Is of the opinion that the transport undertakings should pay for use of this infrastructure, but that the amount in question may be subsidized in full provided the subsidy is transparent and non-discriminatory and the need for it is examined at regular intervals;
- 24. Takes the view that as far as possible the running costs of public transport should be financed by fares, that any additional funding that is required from national, local and/or regional authorities should not detract from the goals of efficiency and effectiveness and that such funding should therefore be concerned only with public service obligations;
- 25. Is also of the opinion that public service obligations may cover not just routes or services but also relatively extensive networks, particularly in peripheral or rural areas;
- 26. Considers that state aid for public transport should be connected with the question of internalization of external costs for all modes of transport, that it should be performance-related, that it may contain obligations to be further specified, that it may not be geared towards covering enterprises' deficits, that it must not discriminate between different tenderers and that it should have maximum transparency;
- 27. Calls on the Commission to conduct an inquiry into state aid for different modes of transport in the Member States, with a view to assessing their impact;

6. Worker consultation

Resolution on the communication from the Commission on worker information and consultation (COM(95)0547 - C4-0538/95)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the communication from the Commission (COM(95)0547 C4-0538/95),
- having regard to the proposal contained therein for a general European legislative framework on worker information and consultation at national level (minimum standards),

- having regard to the report of the Committee on Social Affairs and Employment and the opinions of the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy and the Committee on Legal Affairs and Citizens' Rights (A4-0411/96),
- A. whereas efforts must be made to unblock a number of European legislative procedures relating to worker information, consultation, participation and codetermination,
- B. whereas the adoption of the European company statute is important, for example for the competitiveness of the economy of the European Union, and whereas it should be designed in such a way as to make it attractive to SMEs, too,
- C. whereas there should be no European form of company without rules on the economic participatory rights for workers and without transposition of the 'European Works Council' (EWC) Directive 94/45/EC (1).
- D. whereas a decision should be taken at the IGC to adopt the use of majority voting in the areas relating to codetermination (worker participation) referred to in the Agreement on Social Policy (Protocol No 14 to the EC Treaty),
- E. whereas the communication from the Commission has made an important contribution to the discussion of workers' participatory rights, even if none of the options identified by the Commission is entirely acceptable,
- F. whereas the option 2 referred to in the Commission communication is still too general to satisfy the aspirations of national traditions, worker involvement and economic progress;
- G. whereas neither the EWC Directive, which is confined to questions of worker information and consultation, nor a general set of Community rules on worker information and consultation at national level is a substitute for economic participation at company or corporate level or in the company bodies provided for in company law,
- Regards it as a precondition for a Community initiative for the existing participatory schemes in the individual Member States to be known — the communication contains no analysis of them;
- Regrets that the Commission did not consult the social partners at European level before adopting this communication;
- Supports, therefore, the work of the group of high-level experts set up by the Commission with representatives of both sides of industry to clarify, through a comparative study, the statutory and actual situation in the EU Member States in respect of worker information, consultation, participation and codetermination;
- Expects the group of experts to clarify what role the EWC can play in an overall concept of codetermination and whether, after a few years' consolidation, it can participate in negotiations on the codetermination model of the European company;
- Recommends that the group of high-level experts examines whether the statute on European companies could provide for negotiations between the management of a company and its worker representatives and their trade unions, with a fixed list of matters for negotiation and the obligation to reach an agreement;
- Agrees with the Economic and Social Committee (2) that before a new European initiative is launched the comparative study should be submitted to the social partners in the European Union, who would then have to decide whether European framework rules on the basis of an agreement between the two sides of industry in accordance with the social protocol would be possible and appropriate, and whether they could be complemented at national level;

- Is of the opinion that the following procedural principles set out in the EWC Directive could play an important role in drawing up a model of participation for European companies: flexibility, negotiated solutions and minimum standards:
- Expects the Commission to submit, on the basis of the results of the expert group's deliberations, and following the possible breakdown of negotiations between the two sides of industry, framework conditions for worker participation which will take account of Parliament's wishes in this respect and which will permit sufficient flexibility to enable the procedures and rules on participation and codetermination to be defined at branch and possibly corporate level, with the possibility of being defined at company level; expects that the rules and procedures defined will take account of the various models of worker information and consultation in each Member State and, where appropriate, the specific situation of small enterprises;
- Looks to the Commission to propose provisions making cooperation between management and workers (information, consultation and participation) compulsory in multinational European companies;
- Points out that defining rights of participation in the economic activities of companies cannot involve transferring a specific model of codetermination existing in only one, or only a few, Member States to the other Member States of the Community (no 'exporting of a national model');
- Stresses, however, that the adoption of a European statute must not, under any circumstances, result in companies being able to use a European legal instrument to avoid codetermination (no 'flight from codetermination');
- Proposes, as a minimum standard, in the dualist system a seat for workers on the supervisory board and, in the monist system, an institution which will agree, with the management of the firm, on opportunities for participation in economic matters and on the obligation of employers to negotiate in respect of decisions concerning the workers;
- Regards cooperative societies as a part of the social movement and therefore sees the prospect of first establishing rules for participation in the statute for European cooperatives;
- Advises prescribing the more stringent rules of participation for European cooperative societies only above a specific number of workers (e.g. 500);
- Considers that a clear distinction must be drawn between: the right to information and consultation set out in the EWC Directive, the right to information, consultation and negotiation, set out in Directive 75/129/EEC (1) on collective redundancies and Directive 77/187/EEC (2) on the transfer of undertakings, and worker participation and codetermination as provided for in the proposals on the European company (3), the European cooperative society (4), the European mutual society (5) and the European association (6);
- Considers that the creation of European forms of company must be inseparably bound up with the rules on worker codetermination and with the transposition of the EWC Directive;
- Calls on the Commission also to draw up without delay a draft Directive on minimum standards for the information and consultation of workers in their firms in the Member States of the European Union and to pursue its measures aimed at evaluating, and improving, the implementation of the EWC Directive, in consultation with the social partners;
- Makes it clear that participation and codetermination by workers and their trade unions, as part of the European social model, is a positive factor for our companies;

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission proposals to the Council, COM(93)0350 (1) and COM(94)0034 (2) 00/0450(COD),
- having regard to its opinion at first reading delivered on 15 December 1993 (3),
- having been consulted by the Council on the appropriateness of Article 235 of the EC Treaty as the legal basis (C4-0212/95),
- having regard to the Council's policy stance on the proposal for a Regulation (4324/95),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Budgetary Control and the opinion of the Committee on Legal Affairs and Citizens' Rights (A4-0303/96),
- Disputes the appropriateness of the legal basis proposed by the Council; 1.
- Considers that the proposal for a Regulation should be based on Articles 43 and 100a of the EC Treaty;
- Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.

8. Relations with Transcaucasian republics

A4-0279/96

Resolution on the communication from the Commission 'Towards a European Union strategy for relations with the Transcaucasian Republics' (COM(95)0205 - C4-0242/96)

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the communication from the Commission (COM(95)0205 C4-0242/96),
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, Security and Defence Policy and the opinions of the Committee on Research, Technological Development and Energy and the Committee on External Economic Relations (A4-0279/96),
- A. whereas Transcaucasia has since the days of classical antiquity enjoyed close cultural and historical links with a certain number of European countries, which means that the European Union is bound to take a close interest in them, particularly since Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia regained their independence in 1991,
- B. whereas Transcaucasia, a strategic area lying between Russia, Turkey and Iran, is vital to the security of Europe as a whole,
- C. whereas this region contains a number of potential trouble spots, and also abuts on politically unstable

- D. whereas the Transcaucasian States, which are members of the CIS, wish to become part of Europe's political and security structures,
- E. whereas the European Union must take account of Transcaucasia when establishing its foreign policy and develop a strategy which will benefit all the parties involved,
- 1. Urges the European Union to develop an active presence in Transcaucasia, a region of strategic importance;
- 2. Calls on the Commission and Council to pursue implementation of the CSFP more actively by setting up Community embassies so that the 'legitimate' economic interests of the Member States of the Union do not frustrate the development of a genuine European policy for Transcaucasia;
- 3. States that the goals of a European Union strategy on Transcaucasia should be to:
- (a) consolidate the independence of the three states concerned;
- (b) work towards finding a negotiated solution to the political crises which affect the Caucasus as a whole and Transcaucasia in particular, applying the same general criteria and taking account of possible interaction between various potential trouble spots;
- (c) promote democracy, the rule of law, human rights and civil society in the three states;
- (d) encourage the economic development of Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia within the framework of a social market economy and respect for the environment;
- 4. Calls on the European Union, on the basis of these factors, to adopt a common position on relations between the European Union and the Transcaucasian States, pursuant to Article J.2 of the TEU;
- 5. Stresses that the partnership and cooperation agreements initialled on 15 December 1995 and signed on 22 April 1996 with Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia are above all political instruments, one of whose goals is to consolidate the independence of these newly independent states, by allowing them to hold a close political and parliamentary dialogue with the European Union and to diversify their economic relations:
- 6. Welcomes the possibility provided for in all three partnership agreements of closer economic cooperation between Armenia, Georgia and Azerbaijan and the other CIS member states, which should make it possible to restore the traditional trade links both in the areas of energy and raw materials and in the sale of agricultural products;
- 7. Will deliver its opinion on these partnership agreements at the appropriate time, in terms of the progress achieved by each state with regard to democratization, respect for human rights and for minorities and in the field of economic reform;
- 8. Expresses its support for Armenia's application to join the WTO and hopes that Georgia and Azerbaijan will follow suit once the process of transformation on market lines in the two countries is sufficiently advanced;
- 9. While noting the urgent need for continued humanitarian assistance, considers that more attention should be given by the EU and other donors to promoting investment and growth in the region and to making the transition from humanitarian to long-term development aid;
- 10. Stresses that the Transcaucasian states are participants in the Partnership for Peace and that they therefore have a useful contribution to make to the dialogue which NATO is seeking to establish with the states which have emerged from the former Soviet Union, beginning with Russia, as part of the establishment of a pan-European security structure, of which the OSCE is a key element;
- 11. Calls on the European Union and its Member States, using the framework of the CFSP, within international bodies (UN, OSCE and Council of Europe) to find a political solution to the crises affecting Transcaucasia;
- 12. Points out that the European Union has at its disposal the necessary economic and political instruments to use its influence to encourage the region's Russian and Turkish neighbours to make a positive contribution to resolving the current conflicts in Transcaucasia;
- 13. Calls on the Commission and Council, in cooperation with specialist bodies, such as the Council of Europe and the OSCE, to work towards a solution of the problem of minorities in the region;

- 14. Stresses the importance it attaches to re-establishing Georgian sovereignty over the whole of Georgian territory, and to maintaining Georgia's territorial integrity; reaffirms in general its support for the independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity of all states in the region;
- 15. Draws attention to the dramatic plight of refugees in Azerbaijan, Armenia and Georgia; while noting the effectiveness of ECHO's activities in the area, insists that the Union does its utmost to find a solution to the refugee problem;
- 16. Stresses the outstanding importance of the long-term OSCE mission in the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict and calls on the Member States to support this mission with all the financial and political resources at their disposal; stresses that the ceasefire which has been in force since May 1994 between Azerbaijan and Nagorno-Karabakh provides a favourable climate for finding a just and viable solution to the conflict based on the principles of the OCSE; calls on the regional powers most directly affected by the conflict to refrain from interfering in any way; regrets that there was no progress in the negotiations on this conflict at the OCSE summit in Lisbon on 2-3 December 1996;
- 17. Calls for the immediate lifting of the blockade imposed on Armenia by Turkey and Azerbaijan and the reopening of all traditional lines of communication, to end the isolation of Nakhichevan in particular; points out that the obstacles to the freedom of movement of people and goods are not consistent either with the spirit of cooperation that the European Union is trying to create in the region through its policy of partnership and association agreements or with the provisions of the Paris Charter;
- 18. Notes that the Transcaucasian states are not all advancing towards democracy at the same speed, as the legislative elections which took place in all three in 1995 made clear;
- 19. Notes that Armenia, Georgia, and Azerbaijan obtained special guest status at the Council of Europe on 26 January 1996, 28 May 1996, and 28 June 1996 respectively;
- 20. Stresses, however, that Azerbaijan must still agree to make major efforts to democratize its political life, and that the current situation could have negative implications for its relations with European organizations, and calls therefore on the Commission to make non-humanitarian aid conditional upon progress on the human rights front;
- 21. Hopes that, in Armenia, the majority and the opposition will commit themseleves in earnest to dialogue so that a political solution can be found to the crisis which followed the presidential elections on 22 September 1996, thus allowing democratization and reforms to continue and the country's internal cohesion to be strengthened;
- 22. Urges the Commission to improve the targeting of the implementation of the TACIS programme for democracy in each of the three Transcaucasian states, and to allow greater scope for direct relations with the regions within the framework of a decentralized policy, on the basis of the needs identified in these countries;
- 23. Calls on the Commission to promote regional cooperation in all fields through ad hoc cross-regional projects within the framework of the TACIS programme with a view to supporting coexistence and mutual understanding between the peoples of the Transcaucasian states;
- 24. Points out, in relation to implementation of the TACIS programme, the need for continuity, particularly in the restructuring of social and health services;
- 25. Advocates consideration of exceptional financial aid for the three Transcaucasian republics in addition to that provided for under the TACIS programme, in the context of agreements with the IMF, with a view to facilitating reimbursement of the loans granted by the EU in 1991;
- 26. Considers that loans tied to specific investment projects for trans-European networks, in connection with the EBRD or the EIB, represent an effective means of providing financial aid for sustainable development in the Transcaucasian region;
- 27. Calls on the Commission to use all the instruments at its disposal to encourage the economic development of Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia, to step up trade with the European Union, to develop a modern banking system and to promote economic cooperation within the Transcaucasian region, for instance in the form of a large market, on a bilateral basis if need be to speed up the process, and likewise with neighbouring states; stresses that this makes it more imperative than ever that the blockade of Armenia be lifted;

- 28. Stresses that particular attention needs to be paid to developing transport, energy and telecommunications networks in Transcaucasia;
- 29. Calls on the Commission to examine what infrastructure projects of importance for the European Union's relations with the Transcaucasian states could be financed by the Union under existing or new instruments:
- 30. Considers that infrastructure renewal in the energy and transport sectors is a key priority and that increased regional cooperation in transport and communications would help reduce tensions in the region and contribute to further growth;
- 31. Recalls its concerns about nuclear power-stations of Soviet design which are not suitable for long-term operation; hopes therefore that the European Union will provide aid under the TACIS programme in the area of nuclear safety for the Medzamor power-station in Armenia and that it will develop, in agreement with the Armenian authorities, a global long-term energy strategy allowing the use of alternative energy sources;
- 32. Believes that the European Union should pay closer attention to the role which the Black Sea could play in developing its relations with the Transcaucasian States, given that it links the region with the industrial heartland of Europe thanks to the Rhine-Danube river link, which, with the end of the conflict in Yugoslavia, can at last be fully exploited;
- 33. Notes the establishment in June 1992 of the Black Sea Economic Cooperation Area with the objectives of creating a zone of peace and prosperity and promoting economic cooperation, and welcomes the decision by the participants to establish a Bank for Black Sea Development and Trade which will be based in Thessaloníki and the agreement which is now in the final stages of ratification;
- 34. Calls on the European Union to take advantage of the fact that one Member State (Greece) is a participant and two others (Austria and Italy) have observer status in the Black Sea Economic Cooperation Area in order to become more involved in this initiative, in which the Transcaucasian states take part, particularly in view of EU enlargement to include the countries of Central and Eastern Europe; stresses that the Union's participation would be all the more justified by the fact that it has signed agreements with all the states bordering the Black Sea;
- 35. Recalls the importance of the agreements concluded between Russia, Georgia and Azerbaijan for the extraction of oil from the Caspian Sea;
- 36. Considers that the transportation of oil from the Black Sea ports across the straits may represent a considerable ecological risk, and therefore believes that the EU should give full support to the construction of the oil pipeline between Burgas (Bulgaria) and Alexandropolis (Greece), as this would constitute a fruitful example of trans-European cooperation;
- 37. Calls on the Commission, which currently has a presence in Tbilisi, to set up delegations in Yerevan and Baku; hopes that the Member States, within the framework of the CFSP, will further coordinate the activities of their diplomatic representatives in Transcaucasia;
- 38. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission and Council, the Secretariat of the OSCE, and to the governments and parliaments of Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia.
