The Institute for Health and Consumer Protection, established in 1989, is the newest of the eight scientific institutions of the Joint Research Centre. Its main task is to provide advice on the health impact of food, chemicals/chemical products and medical implants. It operates the European Chemical Bureau and the European Centre for Validation of Alternative Methods. It is composed of 160 statutory staff as well as 30 non-statutory staff (PhD students, post-doctorate fellows and visiting scientists).

Its biotechnology laboratory, together with its role in the management of its European network of GMO laboratories places it in a central position with regard to the provision of GMO related advice.

The institute generates its scientific knowledge in association with its 200 laboratory collaborative partners and has state-of-the-art laboratories and very active research staff located in Ispra, Italy, on the shores of Lago Maggiore, 30 minutes from Milan's Malpensa airport.

The IHCP, along with the other institutes of the JRC, will play a key role in the European Research Area and in the provision of training to young researchers, particularly those from candidate countries for the enlargement of the European Union.
