The Commission is seeking to recruit a Director for Translation in the Translation Service.

The Director for Translation will be responsible for managing demand and output by coordinating the work of the multilingual subject groups in Brussels and Luxembourg; he/she will ensure that the SdT's translation output is in line with the priorities and objectives of the Directorates-General which are its customers; he/she will be responsible for employing the methods and resources which will enable the SdT to optimise the quality/cost ratio of its products. Experience of the specific features of large linguistic units is required. Proven management ability is essential.

The post is at Director level (A 2).

Applicants must be nationals of a European Union Member State and hold a university degree or equivalent national qualification entitling them to undertake postgraduate studies (any equivalent professional experience will be taken into account).

Applicants must have at least 15 years' professional experience at a level to which these qualifications give admission. At least five years of that professional experience must have been gained at senior level in the same field as this vacancy.

Applicants must have a good knowledge of English, French and one other Community language.

The successful applicant will be chosen in accordance with the Commission's selection procedure.

Pay and conditions of employment will be those laid down for A2 officials of the European Communities.
