IN THE CHAIR: Mrs FONTAINE
President

1. Resumption of session

The sitting opened at 15.00.

2. Approval of Minutes of previous sittings

Mr Caudron had informed the Chair that he had been present at the sitting of 12 September but that his name was not on the attendance register.

The following spoke:

- Swoboda, who referred to his remarks made on 6 September 2001, at the beginning of the sitting and before the midday votes, concerning the adjustments made by the services to the text of the legislative resolution to bring it in line with the vote on the Commission proposal concerning a system of ecopoints for heavy goods vehicles transiting Austria (*Item 2 and before Item 10 of Minutes of 6.9.2001*) and pointed out that he had still not received a reply from the President concerning his remarks disputing the Minutes on this subject and his request for the matter to be referred to the AFCE Committee; he asked whether a Member was entitled to a reply from the President and, if so, when he would receive a reply (the President assured him he would receive a reply);
- Jarzembowski, who proposed the President instruct the services to base the reply also on the debate which had taken place at midday on this point; he also asked for a copy of the reply (the President gave an assurance that the matter would be studied very closely).

The Minutes of the sitting of 6 September and of the extraordinary formal sitting of 12 September 2001 were approved.

3. In Memoriam

On behalf of Parliament, the President paid tribute to the memory of Commander Masood who had visited Parliament on 4 April 2001 and had recently been assassinated in Afghanistan.

The President called for Parliament to observe a minute's silence.

4. Communication by the President

The President made a communication on the security measures implemented by Parliament following the terrorist attacks in the United States.

She noted the news which had appeared in the Sunday Telegraph referring to threats made against Parliament. She stated that Parliament had never known of these threats, that the prefect of the Bas-Rhin department in France had denied such threats had been made, as confirmed by an official communiqué and that the British authorities had also stated that they had no knowledge of these threats.

Wednesday 19 September 2001

She added that she had decided to write to the editor of the Sunday Telegraph protesting at the dissemination of false information of such a serious nature.

She also announced that the Bureau, which constantly took a close interest in security matters, had already instructed that checks on persons and luggage at Parliament's entrances be reinforced and that it would be meeting that evening to study further measures proposed by the Secretary-General to extend the security measures.

The President added that she trusted everyone would cooperate in the implementation of the new measures.

5. Official welcome

On behalf of Parliament, the President welcomed Mr Moussa Touré, President of the West African Economic and Monetary Union, who had taken his seat in the official gallery.

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission's Annual Report 1999 (COM(2000) 822 – C5-0109/2001),
- having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 1164/1994 of 16 May 1994 establishing the Cohesion Fund ⁽¹⁾,

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- having regard to the Court of Auditors' Annual Report covering the financial year 1999⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to its resolutions of 29 June 1995⁽²⁾, 19 April 1996⁽³⁾, 26 June 1997⁽⁴⁾, 28 May 1998⁽⁵⁾, 13 April 1999⁽⁶⁾ and 16 June 2000⁽⁷⁾ on the annual reports of the Commission on the Cohesion Fund and the cohesion financial instrument,
 - having regard to its resolution of 18 January 2000 on the Sixth Periodic Report on the social and economic situation and the development of the regions of the European Union (SEC(1999) 66 — C5-0120/1999)⁽⁸⁾,
 - having regard to Rule 47(1) of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Regional Policy, Transport and Tourism and the opinion of the Committee on Budgets (A5-0248/2001),
- A. whereas excessive regional imbalances constitute both a political and an economic threat to the European Union,
- B. whereas, according to Article 2 of the EC Treaty, the strengthening of economic and social cohesion remains to be one of the main objectives of the European Union,
- C. whereas in the interests of pursuing this central objective of the EU more effectively, the Maastricht Treaty created a Cohesion Fund, referred to in Article 161 of the Treaty,
- D. whereas the main aim of the Cohesion Fund was to help the countries with the greatest structural disadvantages — currently Greece, Portugal, Spain and Ireland — to address the challenges of the introduction and use of the single currency,
- E. whereas, therefore, under the terms of the Maastricht Treaty (the annexed Protocol on economic and social cohesion) the only conditions for access to the Cohesion Fund for a country are:
- per capita GDP less than 90 % of the Community average;
 - compliance with the economic stability and convergence programmes agreed with the EU,
- F. having regard to the increased importance of the Cohesion Fund owing to the fact that the Maastricht Treaty did not provide for any economic support and adjustment mechanism in the context of economic and monetary union,
- G. whereas, in line with Article 158 of the EC Treaty, the Community shall develop and pursue its actions leading to the strengthening of its economic and social cohesion in order to promote its overall harmonious development,
- H. whereas, according to Article 158(2) of the EC Treaty, the Community shall aim at reducing disparities between the levels of development of the various regions and the backwardness of the least favoured regions or islands, including rural areas,
- I. whereas, according to Article 161 of the EC Treaty, the Cohesion Fund provides a financial contribution in the field of the environment and trans-European networks in the area of transport infrastructure,
- J. whereas the year 1999 marks the last year of the Cohesion Fund operations in the period 1993-1999,

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- K. whereas the effects of the Growth and Stability Pact adopted by the Council in 1998, which have effectively restricted government investment so as to enable public accounts to be put in order, justify the retention of the Cohesion Fund as a compensatory mechanism in order to reduce the deficits which have developed in most of the lower-income Member States,
- L. whereas this Annual Report covers the activities of the Cohesion Fund in 1999 and provides an overview of developments since 1993,
- M. having regard to the importance of assessing projects when drawing up suitable recommendations so that, in addition to gauging the degree of compliance at national level, the progress made towards achieving the EU's cohesion-policy objectives can also be accurately measured,
- N. whereas by the end of 1999 the Commission had committed all the financial appropriations of the Cohesion Fund for 1999 and 91,6 % of payment appropriations had been implemented,
- O. whereas the Cohesion Fund continues to play a key role in the development of the TENs within the four beneficiary Member States (Spain, Greece, Ireland and Portugal) of the Cohesion Fund,
- P. whereas Article 154(2) of the EC Treaty on trans-European networks calls for particular attention to be given to the need to link island, landlocked and peripheral regions with the central regions of the Community,
- Q. whereas the environmental projects under the Cohesion Fund aim at helping the beneficiary countries to advance towards the objectives of Community environment policy,
- R. whereas in 1999 the Commission tightened environmental protection requirements under two directives which affect Cohesion Fund projects ('EIA' and 'Habitats'),
- S. whereas the outermost regions deserve particular attention, because of their special conditions, in the case of both the environment and transport,
- T. whereas, as evidenced by the results it has achieved, the Cohesion Fund has proved to be an effective means of cohesion,
- U. whereas Parliament's repeated calls in earlier resolutions for a balance to be achieved between funding for infrastructure and funding for the environment have been acted upon,

Activities of the Cohesion Fund in 1999

1. Welcomes the Annual Report as an essential tool in assessing the activities of the Cohesion Fund; congratulates the Commission on the efforts made to provide an overview of results for the whole 1993-1999 period;
2. Regrets that the Commission does not provide more extensive analysis of the budgetary performance over the period, but limits itself to a description of the actual outturn;
3. Congratulates the beneficiary Member States on complying with the goals of reducing expected budget deficits through the convergence programmes, while sustaining a substantial level of public investment in the areas of the environment and transport;

Projects and measures adopted

4. Is aware that, in 1999, the emphasis was on the conclusion of projects rather than launching new ones;
5. Welcomes the compliance with the aim of allocating financial resources among the beneficiary countries and notes that a balance has been struck between investment in transport infrastructure and investment in the environment over 1993-1999 as a whole, despite the unevenness in the breakdown of that balance early in the period;

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6. Notes with satisfaction the increase in investment in rail in Greece, Spain and Portugal and likewise the increase in investment in the area of solid waste in Portugal and in Greece;
7. Notes that indirect reference is made to the backlog in outstanding commitments remaining to be paid at the end of period (*reste à liquider*) without either a complete quantitative description or detailed explanations being given; this is despite the fact that reducing that backlog and speeding up implementation have been a constant concern of the Budgetary Authority;
8. Confirms for the record, a backlog of some € 4 918 million at the end of 1999, of which some € 3 383 million remained at the end of 2000 according to the accounts;
9. Proposes to improve the process introduced for the purpose of simplifying the Cohesion Fund, in order to prevent any further delays to the implementation of the appropriations;
10. Calls for investment in transport infrastructure to be used to help certain regions overcome the handicaps stemming from their remoteness;
11. Calls on the Commission to carry out a study into the causes of the varying effectiveness of, and the differing results achieved by, the Cohesion Fund in the eligible Member States;

Managing the financial assistance

12. Expresses its satisfaction at the fact that no cases of fraud were detected in 1999;
13. Welcomes the fact that no cases of double financing between the Cohesion Fund and any other Community source were detected;
14. Confirms the importance of observing the additionality principle as a key principle in the implementation of the Structural Funds;
15. Underlines the key role which Parliament should play in that process, a role which has been neglected over the period covered by the Annual Report; believes that Parliament should not just rubber-stamp the annual allocations when it comes to adopt the budget, but should be actively involved in the evaluation process, as a guarantor of the European interest alongside the Commission;
16. Notes that the failure to use all payments appropriations available in 1999 was due to a large number of applications for payments reaching the Commission in December 1999 and to the work-load of the Commission services concerned at the end of the year 1999;

Monitoring, evaluation and control

17. Calls on the Commission to devote more resources to on-the-spot checks in order to detect weaknesses in management systems;
18. Advises the Commission to concentrate its management on a medium-term planning perspective which would offer more guidance and continuity;
19. Calls on the Commission to apply the utmost rigour when assessing the environmental impact of projects financed by means of the Cohesion Fund;
20. Suggests that a review and strengthening of Parliament's role is necessary, in particular to hold the Commission and the Member States to their obligations as regards transparency in this sector, in particular as expressed in the Code of Conduct on implementation of structural policies⁽¹⁾, agreed with the Commission in 1999;
21. Calls on the Commission to make significant improvements to information relating to project assessment: instead of just checking the accounts and ensuring compliance with the immediate short-term objective, it should supply more detailed data on the contribution which projects actually make to achieving the ultimate aim of cohesion policy, which is to reduce the development gap and the backwardness of certain regions, in which connection the Commission should take into account the recommendations made by Parliament in its abovementioned resolution of 18 January 2000;

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Information and publicity

22. Is surprised by the fact that the Annual Report of the Cohesion Fund 1999 was published only in January 2001; understands the efforts of the Commission to provide as complete information as possible, but nevertheless considers that a delay of over a year is not acceptable;

23. Insists on the need for a more interactive relationship to be maintained with the social partners in connection with information tasks, so that they can be more actively involved in the search both for solutions and for the resources which are needed if such solutions are to be put into practice;

Continued solidarity towards the cohesion countries

24. Believes that, overall, the Cohesion Fund has been effective over the period 1993-1999, and that its creation by the Maastricht Treaty has been fully justified as a fundamental support instrument for countries with the greatest structural problems, with a view to preparing them for the introduction and use of the single currency; recalls, however, that the Cohesion Fund has not yet brought about real convergence among all the Member States; stresses the need for continued solidarity with the cohesion countries;

25. Emphasises the political and economic importance of diminishing economic disparities between the current Member States and their regions, even after enlargement, since they may even worsen as a result of the impact and dynamics of enlargement;

26. Considers that the forthcoming enlargement is a huge challenge for solidarity in the European Union; reminds the Commission of the crucial importance of efficient preparations for the forthcoming enlargement; considers that the Structural Instrument for Pre-Accession (ISPA) is an excellent tool for preparing the administration at all levels for the requirements of enlargement in the structural policy field;

27. Considers that, in view of the enormous development needs of the candidate countries, proper account needs to be taken of the absorption capacity of these countries in economic, financial and administrative terms;

28. Suggests that, in the perspective of enlargement, and in light of the political choices facing the EU as outlined in the second Report on economic and social cohesion, the quality of expenditure, the value-for-money of the different instruments, as well as the performance of the different beneficiaries, will become key issues in determining the future shape of the Union's cohesion strategy and the redistributive function of its budget;

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29. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.

- having regard to the Court of Auditors' annual report for 1999⁽³⁾ submitted pursuant to Article 248 of the EC Treaty,
 - having regard to the Treaty of Amsterdam and the employment conclusions of the Luxembourg European Council,
 - having regard to Agenda 2000 and to Regulation (EC) No 1260/1999 of 21 June 1999 laying down general provisions on the Structural Funds⁽⁴⁾ and to the specific regulations governing each of the Structural Funds,
 - having regard to the conclusions of the Lisbon and Stockholm European Councils on the new economy, employment and sustainable development,
 - having regard to the Commission's second report on economic and social cohesion (COM(2001) 24) submitted pursuant to Article 159 of the EC Treaty,
 - having regard to the Commission's sixth periodic report on the socio-economic situation and development of the regions of the European Union (SEC(1999) 66 — C5-0120/1999), submitted pursuant to Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 2083/93 of 20 July 1993 amending Regulation (EEC) No 4254/88 laying down provisions for implementing Regulation (EEC) No 2052/88 as regards the European Regional Development Fund⁽⁵⁾,
 - having regard to Article 11 of Regulation (EC) No 1260/1999 on additionality,
 - having regard to Article 299(2) of the EC Treaty,
 - having regard to the Commission report on measures to implement Article 299(2) — the outermost regions of the European Union (COM(2000) 147),
 - having regard to Rule 47(1) of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Regional Policy, Transport and Tourism, and the opinions of the Committee on Budgets, Committee on Employment and Social Affairs, Committee on Fisheries and Committee on Women's Rights and Equal Opportunities (A5-0247/2001),
- A. whereas 1999 was the final year of the application of the Structural Funds to seven different objectives, and whereas Regulation (EC) No 1260/1999 reduces the number of objectives to three, on the understanding that each objective will be financed by a single structural fund, while the Community initiatives are to be reduced to four,
- B. whereas in 1999 an extensive period for applying the cohesion policies and, specifically, the Structural Funds, came to an end,
- C. whereas in the 11th Annual Report on the Structural Funds (1999) the main horizontal theme is that of measures to promote gender equality in employment,
- D. whereas the contributions from the Structural Funds have been substantial for the development of the regions, not only from the infrastructural and productive point of view but also that of social integration,

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- E. whereas 1999 was the last year of the 1994-1999 programming period and saw the conclusion of the package of measures adopted in 1992 in Edinburgh and the preparation of the framework conditions for the new 2000-2006 programming period,
- F. whereas the reports should address the qualitative analysis and productive efficiency of the Structural Funds, and not confine themselves to measurement of their consumption, their quantitative distribution and the transparency of their application,
- G. whereas, despite the budgetary effort represented by the Edinburgh package and the progress achieved, the EU still exhibits major regional asymmetries in economic and social development, and whereas there are still disparities in the European Union between the periphery (including the outermost regions) and the centre,
- H. whereas the average per capita income of the 10 % of the population living in the Union's most prosperous regions is still 2,6 times higher than that of the 10 % living in the least-favoured regions, while the gap between the single richest and the single poorest region shows a ratio of 4:4,
- I. whereas, despite the aims underlying the creation and application of the Structural Funds, the correction of economic and social inequalities is having more impact at Member State than at regional level; whereas regional asymmetries have actually increased within some Member States,
- J. whereas there are signs of variations in income per inhabitant, particularly in the area of employment,
- K. whereas, following the two most recent programming periods, unemployment rates in the Member States which are the main beneficiaries of the Structural Funds have, with the notable exceptions of Ireland and Portugal, kept to the levels of 1988,
- L. whereas women are especially adversely affected by unemployment and low employment rates,
- M. whereas the Lisbon Council adopted full employment as a major objective of the Union, and set targets for 2010 of 70 % in the employment rate as a whole (as against the current 62 %) and 60 % for the employment rate for women (as against 52,5 %); whereas the horizontal objective of gender equality has been taken into account only partially, and policies still tend to be presented as gender-neutral,
- N. whereas the average wage differential between women and men in the EU is still extremely high (28 %),
- O. having regard to the existing global relationship between lower income per inhabitant, overall unemployment and female unemployment,
- P. whereas the persistence of inequality as regards the male and female employment rates is also related to problems in the family and labour spheres: the domestic division of labour, the availability of crèches, children's and maternity allowances and occupational promotion factors; whereas, however, circumstances vary greatly from one Member State to another,
- Q. whereas, while education and training in new technology constitutes a factor of development, social and economic equality in the regional context remains a necessary condition for the operation of horizontal programmes for job creation, technical and vocational training and gender equality in employment,
- R. whereas the fact that the freedom of movement of workers constitutes a right inherent in European citizenship cannot be used to justify the validity or fairness of labour mobility as a strategy to balance supply and demand in employment in the EU, a strategy whose paradoxical result is that the most highly qualified people in the less prosperous regions and countries migrate to the more prosperous countries,

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- S. whereas it is essential to pursue socio-economic policies to reverse the trend towards the concentration of economic activity, employment and population in the most central and urbanised regions of the Union,
- T. whereas the factors of remoteness and insularity that are features of the remote, outermost and insular regions can be compensated by the development of activities financed by the Structural Funds, to increase the competitiveness of the value-added sector, facilitate access to information and define the role of these regions in the context of an enlarged European Union,
- U. whereas the entire territory of Europe, including the outermost regions, must be included in the trans-European networks,
- V. whereas the budget for cohesion policy, the Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund for the EU of 15, as a percentage of total GDP, will be reduced for the period 2000-2006, from 0,46 % in 1999 to a proposed level of 0,31 % in 2006, i.e. to no higher than the 1994 level,
- W. whereas with the enlargement to take in new member states internal regional inequality could reach an unprecedented level; whereas particularly acute problems could arise concerning unemployment, as has already occurred with the integration of the two German economies,
- X. whereas Regulation (EC) No 1260/1999 states that the Member States are obliged to respect the principle of additionality when implementing projects cofinanced from the Structural Funds and that EU funding cannot replace structural expenditure or its equivalent by the Member States themselves; whereas over the 1994-1999 programming period not all the Member States provided the obligatory information on compliance with the principle of additionality,
- Y. whereas the risk exists that economic and budgetary stability programmes could result in cutbacks in public investment, notably in transport infrastructure and R & D in the less-favoured regions; whereas it would be most unfortunate if such practices were followed by Member States which are beneficiaries of the Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund, since they are precisely the ones that most need such investment; whereas particular care must be taken to ensure that Member States' zero budget deficit policies do not jeopardise the principle of additionality,
- Z. whereas the sound and efficient implementation of the Structural Funds, guaranteed by suitable assessment and monitoring systems, is absolutely crucial for the credibility and effectiveness of the Community institutions,

Execution of the budget

1. Notes that, over the period 1994-1999, 99 % of commitment appropriations under the Structural Funds were utilised, and that ultimately only the considerable sums transferred in 2000 and the use of transversal financing permitted a satisfactory conclusion for the package of measures adopted in Edinburgh;
2. Acknowledges the efforts of the Commission, in the Annual Report for 1999, also to provide an overview of results for the whole 1994-1999 period; regrets that the Commission does not provide more extensive analysis of the budgetary performance over the period, but limits itself to a description of the actual out-turn;
3. Notes that indirect reference is made to the backlog of outstanding commitments remaining to be paid at the end of the period (*reste à liquider*) (RAL) without either a complete quantitative description or detailed explanations being given; this is despite the fact that reducing that backlog and speeding up implementation have been recurrent objectives of each successive revision of the Structural Funds regulations, and a constant concern of the Budgetary Authority;

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4. Confirms for the record a backlog of some € 41 600 million at the end of 1999, of which some € 21 860 million remained at the end of 2000 according to the accounts; recalls that payments can be made on outstanding commitments from the 1994-1999 period until the end of 2001;
5. Criticises the fact that the RAL grew further in the period 1994-1999 and calls on the Commission to reverse this trend at once;
6. Considers that the appropriations of € 160 million allocated by the Commission at the end of 1999 which were not covered in the budget should have been treated as a transfer of appropriations, and that appropriations for innovative activities should not have been cut to cover the shortfall; urges the Commission to ensure that the appropriations for innovative activities are restored to their agreed level at Berlin;
7. Welcomes the fact that outstanding appropriations from previous programming periods were substantially reduced in 1999; regrets, however, the fact that there are still outstanding appropriations from the period prior to 1989, i.e. some 11 years after the end of the programming period; welcomes the fact that the rules on decommitment of appropriations for the programming period 2000-2006 will prevent such backlogs from occurring in future;
8. Notes the absence of clear guidelines concerning utilisation in respect of the Community initiatives, with an excessive dispersal of measures;
9. Notes that, during the last programming period (1994-1999) projects were delayed and accumulated at the end of the period, which in turn slowed down the launching of projects for the following programming period (2000-2006); considers that it would be to everyone's advantage for the implementation of projects to be spread as evenly as possible over the programming period;
10. Points out that the level of commitments does not properly reflect actual implementation of measures, especially as a significant proportion of commitments were not entered into until directly before the end of the programming period; expresses its concern, in particular, at the slow implementation of Community Initiatives, given that only just over half of appropriations available for the 1994-1999 programming period have been paid, making the programmes more difficult and costly to implement by those responsible for them, namely local authorities, NGOs, and the like;
11. Calls for the Funds to have as a policy priority and effect the incorporation of small businesses (creation, expansion, technological equipment, development and innovation, internationalisation of markets etc.) by their inclusion in all priority projects of the Community Support Frameworks and their substantial participation in the take-up of such funds;
12. Takes the view that the recent reform of the Structural Funds is likely to significantly improve programming, implementation and financial implementation of operations; calls on the Commission to assist the national authorities in adjusting to the new regulations by means of an active information policy;
13. Welcomes the Commission's approach involving linking programming and evaluation more closely together; regrets, however, the fact that, when programming is being carried out, the final evaluation of previous programmes is generally not yet available;
14. Proposes that there be an improvement in the process introduced to simplify the Structural Funds, objectives and Community initiatives, in order to increasingly concentrate assistance in areas whose development is lagging behind and prevent further delays, of the kind observed to date, in the implementation of appropriations;

Employment

15. Calls on the Member States to continue with the employment policy process launched in Amsterdam;
16. Stresses the need to move towards a joint regional development and employment policy;

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17. Calls on the Commission to orientate the joint implementation of the Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund in the interests of internal regional equality in the beneficiary states, and to carry out a full analysis of their effectiveness;

18. Takes the view that coordination between Structural Fund operations and national action plans for employment needs to be improved;

Gender equality

19. Welcomes the Commission's initiative to present measures to promote equal opportunities for men and women as the special theme for its annual report for 1999; takes the view, however, that the report in question fails to provide specific details either on access for women to the Structural Funds or on the impact of assistance under the Community Initiatives, including the NOW Programme, on the situation of women on the labour market and the promotion of equal opportunities, details which, supported by figures, ought to make it possible to weigh up the effectiveness of the measures pursued in this regard;

20. Calls for an integrated policy to promote women's interests, considering that the horizontal objective of gender equality has only partly been taken into account so far, linking the target of 60 % female employment by 2010 to the implementation of the Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund;

21. Calls for special measures to deal with the large problem of insecure employment, and particularly women's employment;

22. Calls for the implementation of general measures in support of women in order to encourage solutions to the problems related to work and family life;

23. Welcomes the Commission's decision to take steps in future to foster the principle of equal opportunities laid down in Articles 2 and 141 of the EC Treaty as amended by the Treaty of Amsterdam, incorporate the gender aspect into policy as a whole, and work at Community level for the adoption of horizontal affirmative action measures;

24. Notes that, in accordance with the new regulations on the Structural Funds for 2000-2006, which establish the mainstreaming of equal opportunities for women and men in the Funds as a priority aim, Member States are obliged to conduct an *ex ante* evaluation of the plans to be drawn up, establish selection criteria for projects and use indicators in monitoring assistance from the point of view of gender equality; notes accordingly that the monitoring indicators and statistics ought to be broken down by gender;

25. Calls on the Commission to ensure that henceforth its annual reports on the Structural Funds provide a breakdown by gender of data regarding the impact of assistance on the integration of women and men into the labour market, on education and vocational training, on the establishment of women in business and on the reconciliation of family and working life;

Enlargement

26. Calls for an immediate start to be made on the determination, on the basis of consultation which should be as wide as possible, of cohesion policy for the period after 2006, with a view to ensuring both continued support for the sectors and regions of the current Member States which will continue to be eligible in an enlarged Union, and specific supplementary cohesion arrangements for the new Member States;

27. Suggests that, in the perspective of enlargement, and in light of the political choices facing the EU as outlined in the Second Report on economic and social cohesion (COM(2001) 24), the quality of expenditure, the value-for-money of the different objectives and funds, the need for new Member States to develop their economies and societies, as well as the performance of the different beneficiaries, will become key issues in determining the future shape of the Union's cohesion strategy and the redistributive function of its budget;

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Agriculture and fisheries

28. Insists that the CAP and the CFP must be redefined as fundamental elements of the Union's policy for regional equality, social cohesion and sustainable development;

29. Calls on the Commission to submit a detailed report to Parliament and the Council in 2002 on the operations financed under the Structural Funds implemented in the Union's fisheries sector in the period from 1994 to 1999, together with a study on the socio-economic situation in the Union's fishing regions;

Other policies

30. Calls on the Commission and the Council, with a view to the period 2007-2010, to give priority in the context of TEN to linking the peripheral, insular and underdeveloped regions to the whole territory of the Union, without facing cutbacks in public investment in the Member States concerned; urges moreover that for the new period priority be given to the development of intermodal and sustainable transport;

31. Calls on the Commission to take account, in the interest of economic and social cohesion, of the ultraperipheral nature of the overseas countries and territories, Madeira, the Azores and Canaries when safeguarding access to the Structural Funds after 2006;

32. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to act over the coming years in accordance with the philosophy of the Structural Fund regulations as regards environmental mainstreaming in respect of all of the Funds' objectives;

33. Calls on the Member States to honour their undertakings under the Natura 2000 directive;

34. Notes the adoption of the specific programmes under the fifth framework programme for RTD, as well as the preparation in 1999 of the communication 'Towards a European research area', in which it is proposed to strengthen the role of the regions in the European research effort and, in particular, in the construction of the European research area;

Additionality

35. Is dismayed that the principle of additionality, one of the four basic principles underlying the Structural Funds, is evidently not being fully complied with by the Member States and the Commission; regrets the fact that no penalty can be imposed when Member States infringe the additionality principle; calls on the Commission, when carrying out ex-ante reviews in connection with programming, to place particular emphasis on compliance with the additionality principle; agrees, furthermore, with the recommendation of the Court of Auditors that, for the new programming period, procedures for verifying additionality should be drawn up that are more workable, that are integrated into the programming, monitoring and evaluation frameworks and that are suitable for use with the budgetary and statistical information available;

36. Calls on the Member States to comply strictly with the principle of additionality and asks the Commission to act to create instruments and rules ensuring that additionality is applied;

37. Calls on the Commission to supply Parliament as soon as possible with a list of the measures it intends to apply to ensure compliance with this principle, in particular where Member States which are beneficiaries of the Structural Funds and the Cohesion Fund operate a zero budget deficit rule;

38. Calls for the regions, and not the Member States, to administer the Structural Fund projects implemented within their territorial ambit;

Partnership

39. Urges the Commission and the Member States, in their management of the Structural Funds, to apply the principle of partnership with economic and social agents and the principle of subsidiarity, and to recognise the competences of the Member States' internal political units;

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Evaluation and control

40. Welcomes the Commission's inclusion, for the first time in an annual report, of a chapter on the means of assessment and verification applied, in response to the criticisms made by Parliament in previous years;

41. Notes that the irregularities and cases of fraud reported by the Member States in 1999 involved an amount of € 120,6 million, in other words 0,39 % of the total Structural Fund appropriations (€ 30,6 billion); calls on the Commission to strengthen on-the-spot checks by the appropriate inspection bodies; requests the Commission to provide regular information on the steps taken to combat irregularities in European Structural Fund operations in the Member States;

42. Notes the detailed rules laid down in Regulations (EC) Nos 438/2001 ⁽¹⁾ and 448/2001 ⁽²⁾ for the purposes of implementing Regulation (EC) No 1260/1999; welcomes the improvements brought about in financial control regarding the Structural Funds; calls for the above Regulations to be applied comprehensively by the Member States and the Commission; calls on the Member States to improve the management and control systems designed to prevent, uncover, and remedy weak spots and systematic irregularities; calls on Member States which have not yet done so to give full powers to their national audit institutions to check the use made of EU resources at every level up to the final recipients;

43. Underlines the key role which the European Parliament should play in the process of evaluation and control, a role which has been neglected over the period covered by the Annual Report; believes that the Parliament should not just rubber-stamp the annual allocations when it comes to adopt the budget, but should be actively involved in the evaluation process, as a guarantor of the European interest alongside the Commission;

44. Suggests that a review and strengthening of the role of Parliament's role is necessary, in particular to hold the Commission and the Member States to their obligations as regards transparency in this sector, notably as expressed in the Code of Conduct on implementation of structural policies agreed with the Commission in 1999;

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45. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the Parliaments of the Member States.

European Parliament resolution on female genital mutilation (2001/2035(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the motion for a resolution of 26 February 2001 by Maurizio Turco and others on female genital mutilation (B5-0686/2000/rev.), signed by 317 Members of the European Parliament,
- having regard to Articles 2, 3 and 5 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted in 1948,
- having regard to Articles 2, 3 and 26 of the United Nations International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, adopted in 1966,
- having regard to Articles 2, 3 and 12 of the United Nations International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, adopted in 1966,

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- having regard to the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms, adopted on 4 November 1950,
- having regard in particular to Article 5(a) of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), adopted in 1979,
- having regard to Articles 2(1), 19(1), 24(3), 34 and 39 of the Convention on the Rights of the Child, adopted on 20 November 1989 by the United Nations General Assembly,
- having regard to Articles 1, 2(f), 5, 10(c), 12 and 16 of Recommendation No 19 of the United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women, adopted in 1992,
- having regard to the Vienna Declaration and Action Programme adopted at the World Conference on Human Rights held in June 1993,
- having regard to the Declaration by the United Nations General Assembly on the Elimination of Violence against Women, the first international instrument on human rights dealing exclusively with violence against women, adopted in December 1993,
- having regard to the reports of the United Nations special rapporteur, Mrs Coomaraswamy, on violence against women,
- having regard to the Declaration and Action Programme of the United Nations Conference on Population and Development (Cairo, 13 September 1994),
- having regard to the Declaration and Action Programme of the World Conference on Women (Beijing, 15 September 1995),
- having regard to its resolution of 15 June 1995⁽¹⁾ on the Fourth World Conference on Women,
- having regard to its resolution of 15 June 2000⁽²⁾ on the special United Nations meeting 'Women 2000' of 5-9 June 2000,
- having regard to the ACP-EU Partnership Agreement (Cotonou Agreement) signed on 23 June 2000, and the Financial Protocol attached thereto,
- having regard to its resolution of 18 May 2000⁽³⁾ on the follow-up to the Beijing Platform for Action (2000/2020(INI)),
- having regard to its resolution of 13 March 1997⁽⁴⁾ on the violation of women's rights,
- having regard to its resolution of 16 September 1997⁽⁵⁾ on violence against women,
- having regard to the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, adopted on 12 March 1999 by the UN Commission on the Status of Women,
- having regard to the Council of Europe's resolution of 12 April 1999 on female genital mutilation,
- having regard to its position of 16 April 1999 on an amended proposal adopting a programme of Community action (Daphne) (2000-2004) on measures aimed to prevent violence against children, young persons and women (COM(1999) 82 — C4-0099/1999 — 1998/0192(COD))⁽⁶⁾,

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- having regard to its position of 15 November 2000 on the Community framework strategy on gender equality (COM(2000) 335 — C5-0386/2000 — 2000/0143(CNS)) ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to its decision of 14 December 2000 to include female genital mutilation in budget line B5-802 of the 2001 budget (Daphne programme) ⁽²⁾,
 - having regard to the recommendations made by the group of experts on female genital mutilation in the context of the DAPHNE/FGM programme in November 1998 ⁽³⁾,
 - having regard to the report adopted on 3 May 2001 ⁽⁴⁾ by the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe on female sexual mutilation,
 - having regard to the joint declaration made by the Council, the European Parliament and the Commission on the Charter of Fundamental Rights, at the European Council meeting in Nice on 8 December 2000,
 - having regard to the positions repeatedly adopted by the European Parliament on the subject of international human rights,
 - having regard to Articles 6 and 7 of the EU Treaty on respect for human rights — general principles — and Articles 12 and 13 of the EC Treaty — non-discrimination,
 - having regard to Rule 48 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Women's Rights and Equal Opportunities and the opinions of the Committee on Citizens' Freedoms and Rights, Justice and Home Affairs and the Committee on Development and Cooperation (A5-0285/2001),
- A. whereas, according to WHO data, 130 million women in the world have suffered genital mutilation and each year 2 million women are subjected to these practices,
- B. whereas, despite the difficulty of making precise estimates owing to the lack of official data, according to the WHO, various NGOs and a number of investigations, these practices are carried out in at least 25 African countries, some Asian countries (Indonesia and Malaysia) and in the Middle East (Yemen, United Arab Emirates and Egypt); whereas it has been ascertained that in the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and Europe (according to some sources, the number of victims stands at around 60 000 and 20 000 women are at risk) female genital mutilation is also carried out in immigrant communities of these countries,
- C. whereas approximately half of the 25-30 African countries practising FGM have adopted various laws which totally or partially condemn the practice, but which are not enforced,
- D. whereas the genital mutilation of women takes various forms, ranging from clitoridectomy (partial or total removal of the clitoris) and excision (removal of the clitoris and the labia minora), which account for approximately 85 % of the total, to its most extreme form, namely infibulation (total removal of the clitoris and the labia minora as well as the internal surface of the labia majora and stitching up of the vulva, leaving only a narrow vaginal opening),
- E. whereas female genital mutilation causes irreparable damage to the health of women and children subjected to it, and can even lead to death; the use of rudimentary instruments and the absence of antiseptic precautions have further harmful effects so that sexual intercourse and childbirth may become painful, the organs are irreparably damaged or and there may be complications such as haemorrhaging, shock, infection, transmission of the AIDS virus, tetanus, benign tumours and serious complications affecting pregnancy and childbirth,

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- F. whereas any form of female genital mutilation, of whatever degree, is an act of violence against women, which constitutes a violation of their fundamental rights, particularly the right to personal integrity and physical and mental health, and of their sexual and reproductive rights; whereas such violations can under no circumstances be justified by respect for cultural traditions of various kinds or initiation ceremonies,
- G. whereas the universal and indivisible nature of human rights, recognised and affirmed in all the international treaties on the subject and, in particular, the rights of women, are under attack from radical cultural relativism which, in its most extreme form, considers culture as the only source of moral legitimacy; thus, the rights of women and girls are threatened in the name of culture, traditional practices, customs, or even religious extremism, most of which grant women a social position and status inferior to that of men,
- H. whereas sexual mutilation imposed on young girls calls for the most emphatic condemnation and constitutes an obvious violation of international and national legislation protecting children and their rights,
- I. whereas female genital mutilation is an assault on the rights of women and children as enshrined in several international conventions, prohibited in the criminal legislation of Member States and in breach of the principles of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights,
- J. whereas violence against women arises from social structures based on inequality between the sexes and imbalanced relationships of power, domination and control in which social and family pressure is the source of the violation of a fundamental right, namely respect for personal integrity,
- K. whereas FGM adds to discrimination already suffered by women and girls in the communities where it is practised,
- L. stressing the crucial role of education and information in discouraging the practice, and particularly recognising the importance of convincing people that they can give up a specific practice without giving up, as they see it, meaningful aspects of their own cultures,
- M. whereas Article 2(f) of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women calls on the States Parties to take all appropriate measures to modify or abolish existing laws, customs and practices which constitute discrimination against women,
- N. whereas according to Article 5(a) of the United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women 'States Parties shall take all appropriate measures to modify the social and cultural patterns of conduct of men and women, with a view to achieving the elimination of prejudices and customary and all other practices which are based on the idea of the inferiority or the superiority of either of the sexes or on stereotyped roles for men and women',
- O. whereas the Vienna Declaration and Action Programme adopted in June 1993 considers, for the first time, that the fundamental rights of women 'are an inalienable, integral and indivisible part of universal human rights' and that all forms of violence, including those which are the consequence of cultural prejudice 'are incompatible with the dignity and worth of the human person',
- P. whereas the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in December 1993 offers, for the first time, the United Nations' official interpretation of gender-based violence: all acts of violence directed against women that result in or are likely to result in physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life,

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- Q. whereas Article 2 of the Declaration clearly states that violence against women shall be understood to encompass, but not be limited to, physical, sexual and psychological violence occurring in the family and, in particular, genital mutilation and other traditional practices harmful to women,
- R. whereas Article 4 of the Declaration declares 'States should condemn violence against women and should not invoke any custom, tradition or religious consideration to avoid their obligations with respect to its elimination',
- S. having regard to Article 2(1) of the Convention on the Rights of the Child adopted in 1989, which states that 'States Parties shall respect and ensure the rights set forth in the Convention to each child within their jurisdiction without discrimination of any kind, irrespective of the child's ... sex'; whereas Article 24(3) stipulates 'States Parties shall take all effective and appropriate measures with a view to abolishing traditional practices prejudicial to the health of children',
- T. whereas the Programme for Action of the International Conference on Population and Development held in Cairo in 1994 includes recommendations to the States aimed at eliminating female genital mutilation and protecting women and girls from these practices,
- U. whereas the Conference on the follow-up to Cairo and in particular Article 42 of the key actions for the further implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development stipulates that governments should promote and protect the human rights of the girl child and young women, which include economic and social rights as well as freedom from coercion, discrimination and violence, including harmful practices and sexual exploitation; governments should review all legislation and amend and revoke that which discriminates against the girl child and young women,
- V. whereas the Beijing Declaration and Platform adopted in 1995 make strong recommendations to the Governments, calling on them to adopt and implement laws sanctioning the perpetrators of violent practices and acts of violence against women, such as genital mutilation, and to support vigorously the efforts made by non-governmental organisations and Community organisations with a view to eliminating these practices,
- W. whereas the Beijing Platform calls on the Governments to take all appropriate measures, especially in the field of education, to modify the social and cultural behaviour of men and women and to eliminate prejudice and customary practices and all practices based on the idea that one of the sexes is superior or inferior to the other and on stereotyped ideas of male and female roles,
- X. whereas the ACP-EU Partnership Agreement (Cotonou Agreement) is founded on such universal principles and contains provisions against FGM (Article 9 on essential elements of the agreement, including the respect for all human rights, and Articles 25 and 31 on social development and gender issues respectively),
- Y. whereas the report adopted on 3 May 2001 by the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe calls for a ban on the practice of female genital mutilation and considers it as inhuman and degrading treatment within the meaning of Article 3 of the European Convention on Human Rights; pointing out that the protection of cultures and traditions has its limits, consisting in respect for fundamental rights and the prohibition of customs which resemble torture,
- Z. whereas in the context of a common European immigration and asylum policy, the Commission and Council should consider the aspect that those whose asylum application fails may face a threat of genital mutilation,
- AA. whereas the Member States now have a Community legal framework allowing them to adopt an effective policy to combat discrimination and put in place a common asylum policy and a new immigration policy (Article 13 and Title IV of the EC Treaty),

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1. Strongly condemns FGM as a violation of fundamental human rights;
2. Urges that the European Union and the Member States should work together for the sake of human rights, the integrity of the person, freedom of conscience and the right to health on the harmonisation of existing legislation and, should existing legislation not prove appropriate, the drawing up of specific legislation on the subject;
3. Opposes any medicalisation in this sphere, which would merely lead to the practice of female genital mutilation being justified and accepted on the territory of the Union;
4. Confirms that FGM by its nature and consequences constitutes a serious problem for society as a whole; nevertheless, the measures adopted must involve communities and tally with their situation so that members of the communities or groups affected become convinced of the need to eradicate such practices;
5. Affirms that the reasons given by many communities for maintaining traditional practices harmful to the health of women and children have no scientific or religious basis or justification;
6. Calls on the Council, Commission and Member States to carry out an in-depth enquiry to ascertain the extent of this phenomenon in the Member States;
7. Calls on the Commission to draw up a complete strategy in order to eliminate the practice of female genital mutilation in the European Union, which should go beyond merely denouncing these acts and establish both legal and administrative and also preventive, educational and social mechanisms to enable women who are or are likely to be victims to obtain real protection;
8. Requests that this complete strategy should be accompanied by educational programmes and the organisation of national and international publicity campaigns;
9. Asks the Commission to carry out an awareness campaign directed at legislators/parliaments in the countries concerned with a view to maximising the impact of existing legislation and, where this does not exist, to assist in the formulation and adoption of such legislation;
10. Calls on the European Union and the Member States to pursue, condemn and punish the carrying out of these practices, by applying an integrated strategy which takes into account the legislative, health and social dimensions and the integration of the immigrant population;
11. Calls on the Member States, to this end, to:
 - regard any form of female genital mutilation as a specific crime, irrespective of whether or not the woman concerned has given any form of consent, and to punish anybody who helps, encourages, advises or procures support for anybody to carry out any of these acts on the body of a woman or girl,
 - pursue, prosecute and punish any resident who has committed the crime of female genital mutilation, even if the offence was committed outside its frontiers (extraterritoriality),
 - approve legislative measures to allow judges or public prosecutors to adopt precautionary and preventive measures if they are aware of cases of women or girls at risk of being mutilated,
 - adopt administrative provisions concerning health centres and the medical profession, educational centres and social workers, as well as codes of conduct, decrees and ethical codes, to ensure that health professionals, social workers, teachers and educators report cases of which they are aware or instances of people at risk who need protection and, furthermore, carry out simultaneously the task of education and awareness-raising among families. This would not constitute a violation of professional secrecy,
 - consider that, from the point of view of legislation to protect children, the threat and/or risk of being subjected to FGM may justify intervention by the authorities,

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- implement a preventive strategy of social action aimed at protecting minors without stigmatising immigrant communities, via public programmes and social services aimed both at preventing these practices (training, education and awareness-raising among the communities at risk and actual cases) and assisting the victims who have been subjected to them (psychological and medical support including, where possible, free medical treatment to repair the damage),
- disseminate accurate information which can be understood by an illiterate population, in particular at the consulates of European countries when visas are being issued; information on the reasons for the legal ban must also be communicated by the immigrant services when people arrive in the host country, so that families understand that the ban on a traditional act is in no way to be seen as cultural aggression, but as legal protection for women and girls; families should be informed of the consequences under criminal law, which may entail imprisonment, if mutilation is ascertained,
- draw up guidelines for health professionals, teachers and social workers aimed at informing and educating parents, in a respectful manner and with the assistance of interpreters if necessary, about the enormous risks of FGM and the fact that such practices are considered as a crime in the countries of the European Union,
- organise sex education courses for schools and the relevant groups, in order to inform them of the consequences of FGM,
- cooperate with and fund the activities of the networks and NGOs which are working to educate, raise awareness and mediate in the sphere of FGM, in close contact with families and communities;

12. Calls on the Council, after consulting the European Parliament, to adopt measures to combat this phenomenon in accordance with Article 13 of the EC Treaty, in the context of discrimination based on sex and violence against women and young girls;

13. Requests that the measures taken should be aimed at supporting and rehabilitating the women who are victims of violence, by providing them with specialised assistance, and requests that the judiciary and the police should be informed and made aware of the problems relating to violence against women;

14. Expresses the hope that, in their work on the Community immigration and asylum policy provided for under Title IV of the Amsterdam Treaty, the Commission and the Council will, together with the Member States, take measures as regards the issuing of residence permits and protection for the victims of this practice and will recognise the right to asylum of women and girls at risk of being subjected to FGM;

15. Calls on the Council, Commission and Member States to take all necessary steps to ensure that the topic 'access to asylum procedures for women at risk of female genital mutilation' is included as a priority item on the agenda for the UN General Assembly in 2002;

16. Appreciates the important contributions made by many international and national non-governmental organisations (NGOs), research institutions, the European Network for the Prevention of FGM in Europe and committed individuals who, thanks to financing from United Nations agencies and the Daphne programme, etc., are carrying out various projects to raise awareness and prevent and eliminate FGM. There is no doubt that networking among NGOs and community-based organisations (CBOs) at national, regional and international level is fundamental to success in eradicating female genital mutilation and in the exchange of information and experience, as well as for joint efforts;

17. Requests that female genital mutilation should be fully integrated in the list of serious violations of fundamental rights in the Union's development policy, in view of the adoption of Council Regulation (EC) No 2836/98 of 22 December 1998 in response to the Final Declaration of the Fourth World Conference on Women held in Beijing in 1995 and its Platform for Action. Prevention of FGM must become a priority in the cooperation programmes for sexual and reproductive health and rights;

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18. Calls on the Commission and Council to take full account of a strategy against FGM in the Country Strategy Papers drawn up for cooperation with third countries;
19. Calls on the Commission and Council to raise the question of a strategy against FGM in their discussions with the ACP countries concerned on their development cooperation programmes (National Indicative Programmes) under the Cotonou Agreement;
20. Calls on the countries where FGM exists, and particularly on the ACP countries concerned under the Cotonou Agreement, to urgently adopt laws, if not already existent, which condemn the practice and, equally, to approve legislation and procedures ensuring their enforcement;
21. Recalls Articles 9, 25 and 31 of the Cotonou Agreement and calls on the Commission and Council to step up their efforts to implement programmes that address FGM;
22. Recommends that the currently dispersed budgetary resources devoted to FGM in third countries be consolidated under a special budget line, or as a clearly identifiable and separate part of an existing line, and that a minimum annual provision of EUR 10 million be agreed, starting with the 2002 budget;
23. Believes that, in the context of the human rights provisions of the EU's development programmes, FGM constitutes such a grave assault on the rights of women that the Commission should be prepared to invoke these provisions, should the governments concerned not be willing to include the fight against FGM as a sector of cooperation;
24. Calls for promotion of foreign aid to those countries which have adopted legislative and administrative measures prohibiting and punishing the practice of FGM and to promote, in places where mutilation is habitual, educational, social and health programmes in order to prevent and combat this practice; urges the governments concerned to prohibit female genital mutilation and calls on the Commission to cooperate closely with those NGOs, local initiatives and religious leaders working to eradicate such practices;
25. Emphasises that medium- and long-term change must come from within the countries concerned and that there is a crucial complementary role to be played by international development assistance such as the development programmes of the EC;
26. Calls on the Council, Commission and Member States to use the human rights clause to make combating female genital mutilation a priority issue in relations with non-Member States, particularly with those States which have preferential relations with the EU under the Cotonou Agreement, and to put pressure on them to adopt the necessary legislative, administrative, judicial and preventive measures to put an end to these practices;
27. Insists that the European Union should make its voice heard within the United Nations, to ensure that the many countries which have expressed reservations regarding the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, to the effect that they would comply with the obligations deriving therefrom provided that they do not clash with certain customs, practices or national laws, withdraw those reservations, given that they are totally incompatible with the spirit and purpose of the Convention, and are therefore unacceptable;
28. Calls on the European Union and hence all the institutions and Member States vigorously and firmly to uphold European values based on human rights, the rule of law and democracy; no cultural or religious practice can be allowed to oppose these principles which underlie our democracy;
29. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the governments of the Member States, and to the governments of the ACP countries.
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9. Equal pay for work of equal value

European Parliament resolution on equal pay for work of equal value (2000/2312(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Articles 2, 3(2) and 141(1) and (3) of the EC Treaty,
- having regard to Articles 21(1) and 23 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union,
- having regard to Articles 2 and 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights of 10 December 1948,
- having regard to the Equal Remuneration Convention 1951 (Convention No 100) and Recommendation No 90 of the ILO,
- having regard to Article 11(1d) of the UN Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) of 18 December 1979,
- having regard to Section V of the Social Policy Agenda endorsed by the European Council of Nice of 7, 8 and 9 December 2000,
- having regard to the conclusions of the Presidency in respect of the Informal Meeting of Ministers for Gender Equality and Social Security at Norrköping on 21-23 January 2001,
- having regard to Council Directive 75/117/EEC of 10 February 1975 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to the application of the principle of equal pay for men and women ⁽¹⁾,
- having regard to the Council Decision 2001/51/EC of 20 December 2000 establishing a Programme relating to the Community framework strategy on gender equality (2001-2005) ⁽²⁾,

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- having regard to Rule 163 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Women's Rights and Equal Opportunities and the opinion of the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs (A5-0275/2001),
- A. whereas the wage gap between women and men in the EU is 28 % on average and, after taking account of structural differences in relation to men and women on the labour market, including age, training, occupation and career pattern, women's pay is still 15 % lower, on average, than that of men,
- B. whereas this wage gap of 15 % on average can only be explained by value discrimination mechanisms, which is unacceptable,
- C. whereas legislation concerning equal pay for work of equal value has been laid down at both European and national level, which the two sides of industry are largely responsible for implementing; whereas, however, in many cases, the law has made only a partial contribution to equal treatment in terms of pay for female and male workers,
- D. whereas, in particular, the undervaluing of characteristics associated with women in the wage formation process leads to direct discrimination, on the one hand, in cases of unequal pay for equal work, and to value discrimination, on the other, in cases of unequal pay for work of equal value,
- E. whereas statistical data available at European level on pay differentials between men and women is incomplete and not up to date, and whereas no account is taken in this connection of recent trends in the labour market, such as the emergence of new sectors, atypical work and career breaks,
- F. whereas indicators are necessary in connection with the collection of statistics as they allow the factors determining pay differentials between men and women to be weighed up,
- G. whereas it is necessary to gain an understanding of the causes of, and possible remedies for, the wage gap in order to enable an effective policy to be developed,
- H. whereas every wage formation system is based on a scale of values according a hierarchical position to tasks following an assessment of the substantial requirements of the job; whereas, however, this process is not carried out on the basis of standard systems and procedures due, inter alia, to a lack of knowledge, experience and willingness to meet the cost thereof,
- I. whereas value-rating of jobs is a method of placing tasks within a work organisation in order of importance, and whereas, to that end, it is the job that must be assessed and not the person performing it,
- J. whereas no method of wage formation can ever be completely objective, as it involves a complex process of assigning values based on a policy process of selecting, defining and weighing the criteria used,
- K. whereas, however, it is possible to build safeguards into the system to assist transparency and gender-neutrality, and whereas an analytical job evaluation procedure provides the best guarantee in this respect,
- L. whereas the wage gap can only be narrowed by means of a twin-track policy involving, on the one hand, improving the position of women on the labour market and, on the other, eliminating discrimination in connection with wage formation,
- M. whereas synergism between actors and methods is needed in order to close the wage gap, and whereas policy measures must be further developed which take account of structural differences in relation to men and women on the labour market and which make it easier to reconcile work and family commitments,

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- N. whereas all work must be accorded the value which it merits, and whereas the employment segregation of men and women often results in lower wages in female-dominated sectors than in male-dominated sectors and in less being paid for women's jobs than for men's jobs; whereas this is completely illegitimate, and female-dominated sectors and women's jobs need to be upgraded in order to narrow pay differentials between men and women,
- O. whereas collective bargaining between management and labour is the main basis for wage formation and whereas the two sides of industry have an important role to play in closing the wage gap,
- P. whereas, regrettably, too low a priority is accorded to the problem of the wage gap by those negotiating pay, and whereas the latter are often too concerned about the cost of gender-neutral-orientated reform of the wage formation process,
- Q. whereas women are very under-represented in the decision-making bodies of the two sides of industry, creating a situation in which women are not sufficiently well-grounded in gender-neutral job evaluation and men are not sufficiently aware of the problem,
1. Acknowledges the efforts made by the Commission during the past decade to achieve equal pay for men and women, but notes that, despite all the initiatives adopted, the wage gap remains and is not shrinking significantly; concludes, therefore, that efforts need to be stepped up both at European and national level;
2. Considers that the target set at the Lisbon European Council of achieving 60 % of women active on the labour market by the year 2010 will not contribute to equal opportunities between women and men if the majority of those women are in low-paid, under-valued employment; stresses the importance of all types of training at every level as an essential instrument for achieving equality;
3. Welcomes the setting up by the Commission of a group of experts with a view to improving statistical data collection; points out, however, that these data must be broken down by gender and sector, including those sectors such as the public sector and most forms of atypical work where women predominate and on which insufficient figures are available; points out that it is not enough simply to use descriptive indicators, and calls for interpretative indicators also to be developed and applied, such as for example the impact on wages of the combination of work and family life;
4. Supports the Belgian Presidency's initiative for giving priority, on the basis of the follow-up to the Beijing action programme, to equal pay for men and women;
5. Urges that existing data and research be supplemented, particularly with regard to the causes of, and remedies for, the persistent wage gap between men and women in the EU, and desires that a study also be carried out concerning all the factors influencing wages and the role played in this connection by wage formation mechanisms;
6. Calls for the feasibility study on the setting up of a European Gender Institute to examine the role which this monitoring centre might play both in the collection of statistical data and in carrying out research into the causes of, and remedies for, pay differentials between men and women;
7. Requests the Commission to examine how far the Member States have succeeded in:
- (a) forming an accurate, complete picture of the pay differentials existing between women and men;
 - (b) incorporating gender-neutral job rating systems into their national legislation;
 - (c) developing awareness-raising campaigns on equal pay for work of equal value;

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- (d) mobilising the two sides of industry to implement gender-neutral job evaluation and to make the elimination of pay differentials between men and women one of their priorities;
- (e) themselves providing a model in the public sector and eliminating wage discrimination and differentials between men and women;

8. Calls on the Member States to further step up their efforts in all of these areas and to ensure that measures adopted are actually complied with: urges them, in this connection, to develop and exchange good practice with a view to closing the wage gap, and to draw up 'equal pay' plans under their National Action Plans for Employment and present an annual report on progress made with regard to equal pay;

9. Considers that the gender pay gap is a core priority for adjustment in response to the conclusions of the Stockholm European Council and welcomes the proposal of the Advisory Committee on Equal Opportunities to include in the Employment Guidelines for 2002 the establishment of targets with timescales to reduce the gender pay gap; calls on the Commission, within the framework of the European employment strategy, in connection with the employment guidelines, to continue to devote itself to specific measures for combating the wage gap by introducing precise quantitative and timescale objectives; requests it, in monitoring National Action Plans for Employment, to draw up actual progress reports concerning equal pay;

10. Urges the Member States to facilitate training and access to jobs under optimum conditions, in particular by non-sexist vocational guidance in schools, and to eliminate current labour market segregation as well as to develop measures to narrow structural differences relating to men and women on the labour market and to enable both men and women to combine work and family commitments and to fulfil caring duties;

11. Welcomes the Commission's plan to launch a Europe-wide campaign on equal pay in 2002 and urges the Commission to bring forward, in conjunction with this campaign, a proposal for revision and updating of Directive 75/117/EEC, paying sufficient attention to the issue of job classification and inserting a number of rules and criteria in an annex in order to ensure an objective gender-neutral evaluation system in accordance with a standard form as a means of narrowing the gender pay gap; asks the Commission in this connection to take account of the need for consistency with the provisions of the directives based on Article 13 of the Treaty, (Directives 2000/43/EC and 2000/78/EC) and of the draft amending Directive 76/207/EEC; urges the Commission to consider also what other type of measures or schemes might be introduced and by what methods for this purpose, including encouragement of the involvement of the social partners;

12. Calls on the two sides of industry finally to place the problem of unequal pay for men and women on their agenda and, on their own initiative, to take steps to help narrow the wage gap and the pay inequalities inherent in atypical work and career breaks; urges the social partners to draw specific attention in this strategy to the existence of female ghettos in certain low-paid jobs and to the obstacles which women encounter to entering top positions, known as 'the glass ceiling';

13. Calls on Member States to encourage individual employers to draw up annual equality reports containing statistics on proportions of women and men at different levels of the organisation, on time differentials in relation to promotion and on pay differentials for work of equal value, and on any measures undertaken to improve equal treatment at the workplace;

14. Calls on the two sides of industry to provide clear information concerning pay differentials between men and women and to ensure transparency with regard to the value scales used in the wage formation process, in order to enable such information to be used to develop a policy based on a gradual approach in which the emphasis is on specific targets; calls on the two sides of industry to implement analytical job rating systems;

15. Calls on the Commission and the two sides of industry to formulate an overall strategy for bridging the gender pay gap; considers that, in addition to the review of job evaluation and classification systems, measures are also necessary regarding labour market organisation in general, new forms of employment

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including the increase in atypical forms of employment, the definition of 'pay' and the impact of the organisation of work on women's pay structures; asks the Commission to investigate best practices in the Member States and on this basis propose supporting strategies to bridge the pay gap;

16. Calls on the two sides of industry to include more women in wage negotiations as well as in their decision-making bodies, and requests that they provide all employees with training, including instruction and practice, relating to gender-neutral job evaluation systems and wage formation mechanisms;

17. Calls on the Member States cited in point 5 of the Explanatory Statement of the report of its competent committee as being at or near the bottom of the list of European Union countries in terms of equal pay for men and women for work of equal value to take particular note of this resolution and take urgent measures to improve their respective positions;

18. Urges the candidate countries to develop measures to narrow pay differentials between men and women;

19. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the governments and parliaments of the Member States, the governments of the candidate countries and the two sides of industry.

10. Harassment at the workplace

A5-0283/2001

European Parliament resolution on harassment at the workplace (2001/2339(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Articles 2, 3, 13, 125-129, 136-140 and 143 of the EC Treaty,
 - having regard to its resolutions of 13 April 1999 on modernising the organisation of work — a positive approach to change⁽¹⁾, of 24 October 2000 on guidelines for Member States' employment policies for the year 2001 — the joint employment report 2000⁽²⁾ and of 25 October 2000 on the social policy agenda⁽³⁾,
 - having regard to the relevant sections of the conclusions of the European Councils of Nice and Stockholm,
 - having regard to Rule 163 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs and the opinion of the Committee on Women's Rights and Equal Opportunities (A5-0283/2001),
- A. whereas, according to a survey of 21 500 workers carried out by the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions (Dublin Foundation), 8 % of the workforce in the EU, which is equivalent to 12 million people, state that over the last 12 months they have been subject to bullying at work, and whereas this figure can be assumed to constitute substantial under-reporting,
- B. whereas the incidence of violence and harassment at work, under which the Dublin Foundation includes bullying, displays major disparities between the Member States; according to the Foundation this is due to under-reporting in certain countries, greater awareness in others, differing legal systems and cultural differences; whereas insecure employment is one of the main reasons for the increase in such occurrences;

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- C. whereas the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions observes that persons who suffer from bullying are significantly more susceptible to stress than workers in general; whereas the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work observes also that bullying and harassment are potential health risks that often lead to stress-related illnesses; whereas gender-specific national data on bullying at work do not, however, reveal a uniform picture according to the Agency,
- D. whereas data from one Member State show that bullying is by far most prevalent in the case of work with a high anxiety level, which is a category of work more common amongst women than amongst men, and that it expanded considerably during the 1990s,
- E. whereas studies and empirical analysis taken together point to a clear link between, on the one hand, bullying at work, and on the other, stress or work with a high level of anxiety, greater competition, less job security and precarious employment status,
- F. whereas possible causes of bullying include, for example, shortcomings in the organisation of work, in-house information and management; whereas unresolved and longstanding organisational problems are a heavy strain on work teams and may lead to 'scapegoating' and bullying; whereas the consequences for individuals and work teams may be significant and likewise the costs to individuals, companies and society,
1. Believes that bullying, a phenomenon the true extent of which is not yet known, is a serious problem in the world of work, and that the problem urgently needs greater attention and more countermeasures, including consideration of new ways of combating the problem;
 2. Draws attention to the fact that the growing number of short-term contracts and insecurity of employment, especially among women, is creating conditions that encourage the practice of various forms of harassment;
 3. Points out the devastating effects of harassment on the physical and mental health of its victims and thus also their families, often necessitating medical and psychotherapeutic treatment and usually leading them to take sick-leave or resign from their jobs;
 4. Points out that, according to some research, women are more frequent victims than men of every type of harassment, whether it is 'vertical' harassment of a subordinate by a superior, or vice versa, peer-group ('horizontal') harassment or harassment of a mixed type;
 5. Points out that false accusations of harassment can themselves constitute an effective form of harassment;
 6. Emphasises that measures to combat bullying at work must be seen as an important part of the efforts to achieve higher quality and improved social relations in the workplace; believes that they will also help to counteract social exclusion; considers that this can be regarded as the reason for Community initiatives and is in line with the European social agenda and employment guidelines;
 7. Points out that the problems associated with bullying at work are still probably underestimated in many quarters within the Union and that there are a series of arguments in favour of joint action at Union level, for example, the difficulties in devising effective instruments for counteracting and preventing bullying, the fact that guidelines on measures against bullying at work may have the effect of setting standards and influencing attitudes and the fact that reasons of fairness also justify such common guidelines;
 8. Urges the Commission in the communications on a Community strategy on health and safety at work and on strengthening the quality dimension in employment and social policy and in the Green

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Paper on corporate social responsibility also to take into account mental, psycho-social or social factors in the work environment, including the organisation of work, thus emphasising long-term, systematic and preventive efforts concerning health and safety with the aim, inter alia, of counteracting bullying at work, and to consider also the need for legislative initiatives to this end;

9. Urges the Council and the Commission to include quantitative indicators relating to bullying at work in the indicators for the quality of work that are to be developed for the European Council's meeting in Laeken;

10. Calls on the Member States, with a view to counteracting bullying and sexual harassment at work, to review and, if appropriate, to supplement their existing legislation and to review and standardise the definition of bullying;

11. Emphasises in particular the responsibility of the Member States and of society as a whole with regard to bullying and violence at work, and sees this as the main focus for the strategy for combating them;

12. Recommends to the Member States that they require businesses, public-service departments and the social partners to put in place effective prevention policies, to provide a system for exchanging experience, and that they specify procedures to solve the problem of harassment for victims and prevent any recurrence; recommends, in this context, that information and training of employees, managers, the social partners and workplace doctors be developed, in both the private and public sectors, and here draws attention to the possibility of appointing a confidential mediator at the workplace to whom employees can turn if they so wish;

13. Urges the Commission to consider a clarification or extension of the scope of the framework directive on health and safety at work or, alternatively, the drafting of a new framework directive as a legal instrument to combat bullying and as a means of ensuring respect for the worker's human dignity, privacy and integrity; emphasises in this connection the importance of systematic work on health and safety and of preventive action;

14. Emphasises that the state of knowledge, including research, can be facilitated and improved through better statistical data and draws attention to the roles of Eurostat and the Dublin Foundation in this connection; urges the Commission, the Dublin Foundation and the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work to initiate in-depth studies into bullying;

15. Emphasises the importance of closer investigation of the incidence of bullying at work related both to aspects concerning the organisation of work and, for example, to sex, age, industrial sector and profession; calls for this study to include an analysis of the particular situation of women who are victims of harassment;

16. Notes that one Member State has already introduced rules to combat harassment in the workplace and that others have begun the process of adopting legislation to combat harassment, often along the lines of the legislation to combat sexual harassment; urges the Member States to pay heed to the problems of bullying at work and to take this issue into account in national legislation or through other measures;

17. Urges the European institutions to set an example as regards efforts to prevent and counteract bullying within their own structures and where help and support for individuals and work teams are concerned; considers that, if necessary, they should provide also for amendment of their civil service regulations, including an appropriate sanctions policy;

18. Notes that victims of harassment in the European Institutions currently receive too little help, and congratulates the administrative services for having set up, several years ago, a training course specifically directed at female administrators entitled 'The female style of management' and, more recently, an Advisory Committee on Psychological Harassment (Mobbing);

19. Urges that thought be given to the extent to which consultation at Community level between the social partners can help counteract bullying at work and that employees' organisations be involved in this process;

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20. Calls on the social partners within the Member States and at Community level to develop their own approaches to combating bullying and violence at work, and to exchange experience about these in accordance with the principle of best practice;
21. Recalls that harassment also has negative consequences from the point of view of employers, adversely affecting the profitability and economic performance of firms as a result of the absenteeism it causes, the reduced productivity of employees arising from their sense of confusion and loss of concentration, and the need to pay compensation to dismissed employees;
22. Underlines the importance of broadening and clarifying the employer's responsibility for systematic action on health and safety at work that results in the achievement of a satisfactory working environment;
23. Calls for a debate on how voluntary networks or organisations against bullying can be supported;
24. Asks the Commission to publish no later than March 2002 a Green Paper providing a detailed analysis of the situation regarding the issue of bullying at work in the various Member States and, on the basis of this analysis, to present no later than October 2002, an action programme of measures at Community level against bullying at work; considers that the action programme should include a timetable;
25. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions and the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work.

European Parliament resolution on crossing external borders and the development of Schengen cooperation (10846/1999 – C5-0042/2000) + (11329/3/1999 – C5-0043/2000) + (SCHAC 2533/1/2000 – C5-0729/2000) + (SEC(2000) 1439 – C5-0730/2000 – 2000/2015(COS))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Council 1998 Annual Report on the implementation of the Schengen Convention (10846/1999 – C5-0042/2000),
- having regard to the Council Annual Report on the situation at the external borders of the states in which the Schengen Convention has been brought into force – 1 January 1998 to 31 December 1998 (11329/3/1999 – C5-0043/2000),
- having regard to Schengen Joint Supervisory Authority Fourth Annual Report (SCHAC 2533/1/2000 – C5-0729/2000),
- having regard to the Commission opinion on the request by Ireland to take part in some of the provisions of the Schengen *acquis* (SEC(2000) 1439 – C5-0730/2000),
- having regard to Title IV of the EC Treaty on visas, asylum, immigration and other policies related to free movement of persons,
- having regard to Title VI on the Treaty of European Union on police and judicial cooperation in criminal matters,
- having regard to the protocols and declarations on integrating the Schengen *acquis* into the framework of the European Union, on the application of certain aspects of Article 14 of the Treaty establishing the European Community to the United Kingdom and to Ireland, on the position of the United Kingdom and Ireland and on the position of Denmark,

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- having regard to Article 255 of the EC Treaty and Article 41 of the Treaty on European Union,
- having regard to the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union proclaimed on 7 December 2000 at the European Council meeting in Nice and, in particular, to Article 6 (right of liberty and security), Article 8 (protection of personal data), Article 20 (equality before the law), Article 42 (right of access to documents) and Article 45 (right to free movement and residence),
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/435/EC of 20 May 1999 concerning the definition of the Schengen *acquis* for the purpose of determining, in conformity with the relevant provisions of the Treaty establishing the European Community and the Treaty on European Union, the legal basis for each of the provisions or decisions which constitute the *acquis* ⁽¹⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/436/EC of 20 May 1999 determining, in conformity with the relevant provisions of the Treaty establishing the European Community and the Treaty on European Union, the legal basis for each of the provisions or decisions which constitute the Schengen *acquis* and Statements ⁽²⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/438/EC of 20 May 1999 concerning the Joint Supervisory Authority set up under Article 115 of the Convention applying the Schengen Agreement of 14 June 1985, on the gradual abolition of checks at common borders, signed on 19 June 1990 ⁽³⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/439/EC of 17 May 1999 on the conclusion of the Agreement with the Republic of Iceland and the Kingdom of Norway concerning the latter's association with the implementation, application and development of the Schengen *acquis* ⁽⁴⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/307/EC of 1 May 1999 laying down the detailed arrangements for the integration of the Schengen Secretariat into the General Secretariat of the Council ⁽⁵⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 1999/848/EC of 13 December 1999 on the full application of the Schengen *acquis* in Greece ⁽⁶⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision 2000/365/EC of 29 May 2000 concerning the request of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to take part in some of the provisions of the Schengen *acquis* ⁽⁷⁾,
- having regard to Council Decision of 17 October 2000 establishing a secretariat for the joint supervisory data-protection bodies set up by the Convention on the Establishment of a European Police Office (Europol Convention), the Convention on the Use of Information Technology for Customs Purposes and the Convention implementing the Schengen Agreement on the gradual abolition of checks at the common borders (Schengen Convention) ⁽⁸⁾,
- having regard to the Decision of the Schengen Executive Committee of 20 December 1995 on the procedure for applying Article 2(2) of the Convention implementing the Schengen Agreement (SCH/Com-ex (95) 20, rev. 2) ⁽⁹⁾,
- having regard to Decision of the Schengen Executive Committee of 14 December 1993 concerning the confidential nature of certain documents (SCH/Com-ex (93) 22 rev.) ⁽¹⁰⁾,
- having regard to Rule 47(1) of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Citizens' Freedoms and Rights, Justice and Home Affairs (and the opinion of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, Human Rights, Common Security and Defence Policy) (A5-0233/2001),

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- A. whereas one of the objectives laid down in Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union is to maintain and develop the Union as an area of freedom, security and justice, in which the free movement of persons is assured in conjunction with appropriate measures with respect to external border controls, immigration, asylum and the prevention and combating of crime,

Respect for fundamental rights

- B. whereas an area of freedom, security and justice implies an area where rights of citizens are respected,
- C. whereas the Charter of Fundamental Rights was proclaimed by the European institutions on 7 December 2000 and the Commission and Parliament have made a commitment to base their future actions on the Charter,
- D. whereas the Charter of Fundamental Rights should now provide a reference framework for all the activities of the institutions,

Extension of the Schengen area

- E. whereas the Schengen Convention is now fully in force in ten Member States, and came fully into force on 25 March 2001 in the five countries of the Nordic Passport Union (Denmark, Finland, Sweden, Norway and Iceland),
- F. whereas, following the partial participation of the United Kingdom in the Schengen *acquis*, the request from Ireland for similar partial participation in the Schengen *acquis* is to be welcomed, despite the fact that the participation of both the United Kingdom and Ireland is limited to the law enforcement aspects and that neither will participate in the Schengen *acquis* relating to the free movement of persons and the abolition of internal borders,
- G. whereas the lack of consultation and information to Parliament, in particular, on the extension of the Schengen Convention to the countries of the Nordic Passport Union and to the United Kingdom and Ireland is contrary to Article 39 of the Treaty on European Union,

Results of the integration of the Schengen 'acquis' into the Treaties

- H. whereas the process for the examination of the legal basis of the Schengen *acquis* lacked consultation and transparency,
- I. whereas the strict interpretation of the Protocol on the integration of the Schengen *acquis* has limited the information considered as the Schengen *acquis* and therefore published in the Official Journal,
- J. whereas documents considered by the Council to be confidential on the basis of the Schengen rules on confidentiality are not available to the European Parliament or to the public,
- K. whereas since the entry into force of the Amsterdam Treaty and the subsequent incorporation of the Schengen *acquis* into the Treaty, major and serious shortcomings have existed with regard to transparency and democratic control by the European Parliament,

Enhanced cooperation on the free movement of persons

- L. whereas a large number of initiatives have been submitted by the Member States which aim to supplement or replace measures which formed part of the Schengen *acquis*; whereas although the aim of most of the initiatives can be supported, the initiatives are fragmentary, lacking consistency and often lacking explanatory statements, so that it is unclear whether and the extent to which the initiatives replace the Schengen *acquis*,
- M. whereas it will now be less clear for citizens to understand which measures in this field apply to which Member States,

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- N. whereas there is no assessment of any negative effects of this enhanced cooperation on the development of the Union as an area of freedom, security and justice or on citizens,
- O. whereas the maintenance of Article 2(2) of the Schengen Convention permits the Schengen states to unilaterally re-impose internal border controls with only prior notification of other states and whereas, in particular, France, due to its opposition to the Dutch policy on drugs, maintains its right to control the border with Belgium,
- P. whereas the Commission intends to adopt in the first quarter of 2001 a proposal on the integration of Article 2 of the Schengen Convention into Community legislation,

Schengen measures concerning law enforcement and security

- Q. whereas, although progress has been made in relation to police cooperation under the framework of Schengen, legal problems arise from the differing powers of the police services of the Schengen states, including the lack of uniform rules concerning the grounds of an offence, the absence of a right of arrest for pursuing officers in some states, inadequate rules on the use of special rights of way and a lack of radio compatibility,
- R. whereas the separate development of police cooperation under Europol and the absence of public information result in the role of the police in the area of freedom, security and justice becoming less transparent and more confusing for citizens,
- S. whereas the Parliament has not been informed of any developments in the field of police cooperation under Schengen since the integration of the Schengen *acquis* in the Treaties and, in particular, of any proposals, strategic or otherwise, for measures to remedy the shortcomings identified,
- T. whereas citizens' rights in criminal proceedings have recently been confirmed in the chapter on 'Justice' in the Charter of Fundamental Rights and greater transparency is essential to ensure the protection and respect of citizens' rights in the field of cooperation,

Schengen Information System (SIS)

- U. whereas no agreement was reached in the Council on the legal basis of the Schengen Information System (SIS) and therefore, pursuant to the Schengen protocol, the SIS is dealt with under the third pillar; whereas, however, 89 % of the data on persons⁽¹⁾ held in the SIS is on 'unwanted' persons pursuant to Article 96 of the Convention implementing the Schengen Agreement, i.e. the first pillar, which is consistent with the view expressed by the Netherlands and Belgium that at least part of the SIS falls within the first pillar,
- V. whereas the Joint Supervisory Authority in its Third Annual report (March 1998 to February 1999) and in its Fourth Annual Report (March 1999 to February 2000) identified shortcomings in the treatment of personal data in the operation of the SIS, including: failures of the approved authorities to give reasons for their enquiries in the SIS; failure to destroy documents relating to alerts after the alerts had been deleted and use of these documents to supplement police records; maintenance on the SIS of data on persons whose identity has been usurped with no attempt to inform or obtain the consent of the legitimate holder of the identity that his/her data is contained on the SIS system; the abusive use of data; and slow or inadequate procedures for checking and correcting data,

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- W. whereas concerns have also been raised by the Joint Supervisory Authority about the complexity of the system and shortcomings in the physical security of the SIS, including inadequate controls on access, inadequate authorisation procedures for operational access to the system and for the regular verification of user's rights, problems with the telecommunications encryption equipment, and improvements could be made in the audit trail functions and to ensure protection against hacking,
- X. whereas there is no legal base for the operation of the Sirene system and therefore the Sirene offices operate without a strictly defined role,
- Y. whereas there is a lack of clear criteria for entering data on the system, in particular, in relation to unwanted aliens and therefore the Schengen States can interpret the rules as they wish and, furthermore, decisions on the entry of data into the system can be taken at a relatively low level; whereas, given the many shortcomings identified by the Joint Supervisory Authority in relation to the protection of data and the inadequate remedies available to persons whose data is on the SIS, the current situation fails to meet the level of protection required by the Charter of Fundamental Rights, with potentially serious consequences for citizens,
- Z. whereas the establishment of a separate joint secretariat for the Schengen Joint Supervisory Authority has been agreed by the Council; whereas this is a welcome step towards the fair and equal treatment of personal data under not only the Schengen Convention, but also the Convention on the establishment of a European Police Force (Europol Convention) and the Convention on the Use of Information technology for Customs Purposes; however, to be truly independent the joint secretariat requires an independent budget separate from the budget of the Council,

External borders and enlargement

- AA. whereas the abovementioned report on the situation at the external borders notes that progress has been made on improving the external borders; whereas Parliament has received no further information on the situation at the external borders since that report and any measures taken to improve the situation,
 - BB. whereas the candidate countries include communities which cross borders and therefore the establishment of strict border controls would divide communities,
 - CC. whereas the countries of the Nordic Passport Union were not required to establish border controls between themselves in order to participate in the Schengen area but joined as a group once the controls had been established by all of them.
1. Calls on Council to formally declare that its future actions, including the operation of the Schengen Information System, will be in accordance with the European Charter of Fundamental Rights;
 2. Calls on the United Kingdom and Ireland to make a commitment to fully participate in the Schengen *acquis* (and therefore abolish border controls) and to indicate the calendar for the legal and technical modifications required, on which they should start work as soon as possible;
 3. Calls on the signatory States to interpret Article 2(2) of the Schengen Convention in a way that is genuinely consistent with its meaning and rationale, and in particular (in cases where it is strictly necessary to apply that provision on public policy or national security grounds) calls on the signatory States to confine themselves to carrying out 'national border controls' and not to indiscriminately prevent people from crossing their national borders;
 4. Calls for the Schengen rules on confidentiality of documents to be replaced with rules on public access to documents adopted under Article 255 of the EC Treaty, and for Parliament to be fully informed of documents excluded from public access;

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5. Calls for the annexes to the joint manual and joint consular instructions to be published, particularly the list of visa applications which require prior consultation by national central authorities or for reasons to be provided for refusing public access in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001⁽¹⁾;
6. Urges the Council and Commission to submit an annual report to the Parliament on the measures adopted in the area of freedom security and justice with an evaluation of the development or replacement of the Schengen *acquis*, the enhanced cooperation between some Member States and the partial participation in the Schengen *acquis* of some Member States, with an evaluation of any problems for the consistency and coherence of Union law; notes that, pursuant to Articles 39 and 45 of the Treaty on European Union, the Council and Commission are required to inform the European Parliament regularly of the development of closer cooperation regarding fields covered by the third pillar;
7. Recommends the creation of a working group within the framework of COSAC with responsibility for activities relating to the area of freedom, security and justice, whose meetings should also be attended by representatives of parliaments of non-EU countries participating in Schengen;
8. States its intention of organising an annual joint meeting with delegations from the parliaments of the Member States which are involved in Schengen cooperation (including those of the Nordic Passport Union) with the aim of exchanging experience of the practical operation and the implementation by the Member States of the policy adopted in this field;
9. Calls on the Commission to prepare a timetable for the review and, where necessary, replacement of the Schengen *acquis* and for remedying the shortcomings established in the recitals and to include this timetable in the revised Scoreboard;
10. Urges the Member States, prior to submitting a formal initiative pursuant to Article 67(1) of the EC Treaty, to make a formal request to the Commission for it to submit a proposal on the matter and calls on the Commission to take account of Article 67(2) and the need for consistency and coherence, and to, as far as possible, submit proposals that cover the issues raised by the Member States;
11. Calls for proper respect to be shown for the right to demonstrate and the freedom of movement of persons;
12. Calls on the Commission to include, in its proposal on the integration of Article 2(2) of the Schengen Convention into Community legislation, rules on the prior consultation of the Council, approval of temporary border controls only for a limited period (possibly 30 days) and a review of the proportionality of the controls and conditions for the extension of that period;
13. Calls on the Council to ensure that the Parliament is able to fully participate in the debate on measures to remedy the shortcomings in the field of police cooperation and requests the Council to ensure consistency in the practical rules to be applied under the Schengen Convention;
14. Calls on the Council to fully respect Article 39 of the Treaty on European Union by submitting to the Parliament for its opinion all framework decisions, decisions and Conventions in sufficient time and with a reasonable deadline, and for the Council to provide regular reports on cooperation under the third pillar in accordance with Article 39(2) of the Treaty on European Union;
15. Calls for the strengthening of the judicial control over intergovernmental cooperation under the third pillar provided for in Article 35 of the Treaty on European Union, in particular, by giving the ECJ full jurisdiction to give preliminary rulings on references from the Member States and by removing the limitation on the review by the ECJ in cases concerning the maintenance of law and order and the safeguarding of internal security, at least in so far as fundamental rights are concerned;

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16. Calls on the Council to adopt a legally binding instrument on the data protection standards to be applied in the third pillar which affords guarantees equivalent to the provisions of Directive 95/46/EC⁽¹⁾;
17. Calls on the Council to adopt uniform standards, procedures, powers and a separate budget for the operation of the single supervisory body, under the supervision of the European Parliament, in respect of its activities pursuant to the three conventions (Schengen, Europol and Customs Use) and to ensure the respect of the data protection standards laid down in Article 8 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights;
18. Calls in the meantime for the strengthening of the competences of the Schengen Joint Supervisory Authority in order to enable it to monitor the Schengen Information System in a more effective and efficient way;
19. Calls for the Schengen Information System to be managed within the EU framework by a separate agency, financed from the EU budget, and for the establishment of a Community (Union) information system under the responsibility of the Commission, which would be a single computer network system for the data received under the three conventions (Schengen, Europol and Customs Use), taking into account the need to keep the respective data separate and the need to ensure the functional separation (access levels, security system, etc.) required by end-user services, both within the Community framework and under the third pillar;
20. Calls for the membership of the candidate countries to be subject only to the political acceptance of the Schengen *acquis* and the development of the necessary policy instruments to implement that *acquis* and, as was the case on the occasion of the previous accessions, for the actual lifting of internal borders for the free movement of persons to be the subject of a separate and subsequent decision of the Council, acting on a proposal from the Commission and after consultation of the Parliament;

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21. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and Schengen Joint Supervisory Authority.
