Amendment by France of public service obligations in respect of scheduled air services within France

(2003/C 279/02)

(Text with EEA relevance)

- 1. France has decided to alter the public service obligations in respect of scheduled air services between Paris (Orly) and Carcassonne, published in the Official Journal of the European Communities C 227 of 1 September 1995, and amended on 29 December 1995 (Official Journal of the European Communities C 349) and on 14 June 1997 (Official Journal of the European Communities C 180) pursuant to Article 4(1)(a) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2408/92 of 23 July 1992 on access for Community air carriers to intra-Community air routes.
- 2. The public service obligations are now as follows:
 - Minimum frequency

The services must be operated all year round with two outward and inward trips per day, morning and evening, from Monday to Friday inclusive, one outward and inward trip on Saturday morning and one outward and inward trip on Sunday evening.

The services must be non-stop between Paris (Orly) and Carcassonne.

Type of aircraft used and capacity provided

The service must be operated with a pressurised aircraft having a seating capacity of at least nineteen.

— Timetables

Timetables must be such as to enable passengers on business trips during the working week to make the round trip within the day and to spend at least eight hours in Paris and at least six hours in Carcassonne.

— Commercial policy

Flights must be marketed by means of at least one computerised reservation system.

— Continuity of service

Except in cases of *force majeure*, the number of flights cancelled for reasons directly attributable to the carrier must not exceed 3 % of the number of flights scheduled in any year. In addition, the carrier must give six months' notice before discontinuing these services.

Community carriers are hereby informed that the operation of air services without regard to these public service obligations may result in administrative and/or criminal penalties.

3. Slots have been reserved at Paris (Orly) airport for the scheduled Paris (Orly)–Carcassonne service pursuant to Article 9 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 95/93 on common rules for the allocation of slots at Community airports. Air carriers interested in this route can obtain information about these slots from the Paris airports coordinator.

Imposition by France of a public service obligation on scheduled air services within France

(2003/C 279/03)

(Text with EEA relevance)

- 1. France has decided to impose a public service obligation in respect of scheduled air services between Bourges and Lyon Saint-Exupéry, pursuant to Article 4(1)(a) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2408/92 of 23 July 1992 on access for Community air carriers to intra-Community air routes.
- 2. As from 1 April 2004, the public service obligation in respect of scheduled air services between Bourges and Lyon Saint-Exupéry will be as follows:
 - Minimum frequency

The minimum level of service provided must be two return trips per day, morning and evening, from Monday to Friday, excluding public holidays, 220 days a year.

The services must be non-stop between the airports of Bourges and Lyon Saint-Exupéry.

— Type of aircraft used and capacity provided

The service must be operated with a pressurised aircraft having a seating capacity of at least nineteen.

Timetables

Timetables must be such as to enable passengers on business trips during the working week to make the round trip within the day and to spend at least seven hours at their destination, whether Bourges or Lyon.

— Commercial policy

Flights must be marketed by means of at least one computerised reservation system.

— Continuity of service

Except in cases of *force majeure*, the number of flights cancelled for reasons directly attributable to the carrier must not exceed 3 % of the number of flights scheduled in any year. The carrier must give six months' notice before discontinuing these services.

Community carriers are hereby informed that the operation of air services without regard to these public service obligations may result in administrative and/or criminal penalties.

Prior notification of a concentration

(Case COMP/M.3311 — Van Oord/BHD/Bagger Holding JV)

(2003/C 279/04)

(Text with EEA relevance)

- 1. On 10 November 2003, the Commission received a notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89 (¹), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1310/97 (²), by which the Dutch undertakings Koninklijke BAM Groep NV ('BAM'), MerweOord BV and NPM Capital NV acquire within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Regulation, joint control of a newly created company, Bagger Holding, constituting a joint venture. BAM will contribute Ballast Ham Dredging BV ('BHD') to the JV, and MerweOord and NPM will contribute the jointly-owned Van Oord Groep NV ('Van Oord') to the JV.
- 2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:
- BAM: building, civil engineering, engineering consulting
- MerweOord: family-owned holding company holding the majority of the shares in Van Oord
- NPM: private equity company
- Van Oord and BHD: dredging activities
- Bagger Holding (JV): dredging activities
- 3. On preliminary examination, the Commission finds that the notified concentration could fall within the scope of Regulation (EEC) No 4064/89. However, the final decision on this point is reserved.
- 4. The Commission invites interested third parties to submit their possible observations on the proposed operation.
