Annotated presentation of regulated markets and national provisions implementing relevant requirements of the investment services directive (ISD) (Council Directive 93/22/EEC) (1)

(2004/C 72/03)

Article 16 of the Investment Services Directive 93/22/EEC authorises each Member State to confer the status of 'regulated market' on those markets constituted on its territory and which comply with its regulations.

Article 1.13 of the Directive 93/22/EEC defines a 'regulated market' as a market for the financial instruments listed in section B of the Annex to the Investment Services Directive, which;

- is recognised as such by its home Member State (where home Member State is determined in accordance with Article 1(6)(c) of ISD);
- functions regularly;
- is characterised by the fact that regulations issued or approved by the competent authorities define the conditions for the operation of the market, the conditions for the operation of the market, the conditions for access to the market and where Directive 79/279/EEC on admission to official listing is applicable, the conditions governing admission to listing imposed in that Directive and, where that Directive is not applicable, the conditions that must be satisfied by a financial instrument before it can effectively be dealt in on the market;
- complies with all the reporting and transparency requirements laid down pursuant to Articles 20 and 21 of the ISD.

Article 16 of Directive 93/22/EEC requires that each Member State maintain an updated list of regulated markets authorised by it. This information should be communicated to other Member States and the Commission. Under the same article, the Commission is required to publish a list of regulated markets notified to it on a yearly basis. The present list has been compiled pursuant to this requirement.

The attached list indicates the title of the individual markets which are recognised by national competent authorities as complying with the definition of 'regulated market'. In addition, it indicates the entity responsible for managing these markets and the competent authority responsible for issuing or approving the rules of the market.

As a result of reduced entry barriers and specialisation in trading segments, the list of 'regulated markets' is subject to greater turnover. Consequently, the European Commission will, in addition to yearly publication of a list in the Official Journal of the European Union, maintain an updated version of this list on its official website

This list will be updated regularly on the basis of information communicated by national authorities. The latter are called upon to continue to advise the Commission of any additions to or deletions from the list of regulated markets for which it is the home Member State.

1. INTRODUCTION

On 20 December 2000 the Council decided (Decision 2001/51/EC) (¹) to establish a programme relating to the Community Framework Strategy on Gender Equality for the period from 1 January 2001 until 31 December 2005.

According to Article 2 of the Council Decision:

- The Programme is one of the instruments for the implementation of the overall Community Framework Strategy on Gender Equality (2) adopted by the Commission in June 2000, which embraces all Community policies and action aimed at achieving gender equality, including gender mainstreaming policies and specific actions targeted at women.
- The Programme shall coordinate, support and finance the implementation of horizontal activities under the fields of intervention of the Community Framework Strategy on Gender Equality. These fields of intervention are: economic life, equal participation and representation, social rights, civil life, gender roles and stereotypes.

2. OBJECTIVES

According to Article 3(c) of the Council Decision, the Programme shall have as its objectives 'to develop the capacity of players to promote gender equality effectively, in particular through support for the exchange of information and good practice and networking at Community level'.

3. WHO CAN APPLY?

This call for proposals is intended to finance transnational exchanges to promote gender equality involving a range of players from at least three countries among Member States of the European Union, the 10 acceding countries (3), the European Economic Area countries (4), or the candidate countries which have decided to participate in strand 3 of

the Programme in 2004, according to the memorandum of understanding signed with the Commission (5).

A proposal is presented by a Promoter which takes the overall responsibility for it and is the contracting party with the Commission. Promoters must have legal personality (cf. Chapter 6).

Promoters generally form partnerships for the purpose of the proposal. Partners are not contractually linked to the Commission but they are associated with the promoter and may financially contribute to the proposal.

The following organisations may present a proposal as promoter:

1. NGOs at European level:

For the purpose of this call for proposals it means that the NGO must:

- be a non-profit making representative body organised at European level, i.e. with member organisations in three or more EU, EEA, acceding or candidate countries mentioned above; these should be existing structures, not set up for the purpose of the proposal. NGOs organised only at national level or below cannot apply,
- give proof of being active in promoting gender equality;
 and/or be required to do so in their statutes/articles.

2. Social partners at EU level (6):

— social partners at European level defined as those organisations currently consulted in accordance with Article 138 of the Treaty. A list of these organisations is set out in Annex I of Commission communication 'The European social dialogue, a force for innovation and change (7)',

- representative social partners at national level may also apply under this call with proposals which are transnational in scope and based on a partnership approach. The representativeness of national social partners must be confirmed in writing by a social partner at European level who accepts to disseminate the results of the proposal.
- 3. Transnational networks or partnerships or consortiums of regional or local authorities:

They should be non-profit organisations at European level, i.e. networks or partnerships or consortiums constituted by regional or local authorities from three or more EU, EEA, acceding or candidate countries mentioned above. These should be existing structures, not set up for the purpose of the proposal.

4. Transnational networks of organisations which aim to promote gender equality:

They must be a non-profit organisation, composed of organisations in three or more countries. These should be existing structures, not set up for the purpose of the proposal.

The following organisations may be a partner in a proposal:

The participating partners to a project submitted by the abovementioned eligible organisations may include: national authorities; regional and local authorities; bodies promoting gender equality, non-governmental organisations at EU and/or national level; social partners; universities and research institutes, national statistical offices, media.

Considering the prime importance given in the objectives of the call to developing Community added value, promoters are encouraged to choose networks and organisations at EU level as partners.

A balanced participation of men and women in the proposals should be sought. Promoters are also encouraged to consider ways of making their proposals fully accessible to persons with a disability.

4. BUDGET

Total expected budget is around EUR 4 750 000 under the budget line Article 04 05 02 (ex B3-4012). Funding will be depending on the availability of the funds allocated under this budget line. Grants cannot exceed EUR 500 000. Priority will be given to proposals with a requested grant of not less than EUR 250 000.

5. PRIORITIES FOR FUNDING IN 2004

For 2004, the priority theme is 'promoting change in gender roles and overcoming gender stereotypes'. This priority theme can be developed across the intervention areas of the

Programme, i.e. economic life, equal participation and representation, social rights and civil life. Other topics will be considered provided they are in the scope of the five intervention areas of the Programme.

The priority theme addresses the stereotyped images of women and men and the need to change behaviour, attitudes, norms and values which define and influence gender roles in society through for instance education, training, culture, science, sport, and the media.

Perpetuating negative or stereotyped images of women or men, in particular in the media and computer-mediated information and entertainment, in advertising, and in educational material, does not provide an accurate or realistic picture of women's and men's multiple roles in and contributions to a changing world. Without prejudice to their freedom of expression, the media and culture industries should, as opinion-formers and a means of shaping values, contribute to overcoming gender stereotypes in the public perception and to presenting a fair portrayal of women and men.

Elimination of existing cultural prejudices and societal stereotypes is essential for successfully mainstreaming gender in policies and paramount for the establishment of equality between women and men.

There is a need to support new gender roles for women and men. Therefore the Commission invites promoters/applicants from EU, EEA, acceding or candidate countries referred under chapter 3 to submit proposals on how to achieve this goal.

Possible initiatives to be developed with a strong transnational cooperation a Community added value:

- comparison of the effectiveness of processes, methods and tools related to changing gender roles and overcoming stereotypes,
- mutual transfer and application of good practice, exchanges of personnel,
- joint development of products, processes, strategy and methodology designed to overcome gender stereotypes and promote changes in gender roles,
- adaptation to different contexts of methods, tools and processes identified as good practice,
- dissemination of results, profile-raising materials and events relating gender roles which promote gender equality.

6. EXCLUSION CRITERIA

When promoters do not fulfil all the exclusion criteria their proposal will be rejected without further consideration.

The following exclusion criteria apply to all the potential promoters referred to under chapter 3 except national, regional and local authorities.

- The promoter must have legal personality. This should be demonstrated by a proof of registration or certificate issued by the competent authority of the country concerned, in which the promoter's registration number and legal status will be indicated. Individuals may neither directly submit proposals nor be a member of a transnational partnership.
- Promoters who are the subject of one of the grounds of exclusion from a public contract within the meaning of Article 93 and 94 of the EC Financial Regulation (1) shall be excluded. This applies:
 - according to Article 93, where the promoters submitting the proposal:
 - are bankrupt or being wound up, are having their affairs administered by the courts, have entered into an arrangement with creditors, have suspended business activities, are the subject of proceedings concerning those matters, or are in any analogous situation arising from a similar procedure provided for in national legislation or regulations,
 - have been convicted of an offence concerning their professional conduct by a judgement which has the force of res judicata,
 - have been guilty of grave professional misconduct proven by any means which the contracting authority can justify,
 - have not fulfilled obligations relating to the payment of social security contributions or the payment of taxes in accordance with the legal provisions of the country in which they are established or with those of the country where the contract is to be performed,
 - have been the subject of a judgment which has the force of res judicata for fraud, corruption, involvement in a criminal organisation or any other illegal activity detrimental to the Communities' financial interests,
 - have been declared to be in serious breach of contract for failure to comply with their contractual obligations, following another procurement procedure or grant award procedure financed by the Community budget;
 - according to Article 94, where the promoters submitting the proposal:
 - are subject to a conflict of interest,
 - are guilty of misrepresentation in supplying the information required as a condition of participation in the procedure or fail to supply this information.

Promoters are therefore required to present as proof that they do not fall under the abovementioned situations a recent extract from the judicial record, or a recent equivalent document issued by a judicial or administrative authority or failing that, a declaration of honour.

Promoters must attach all the required documents to their application form and send them by 7 June 2004 at the latest.

7. ELIGIBILITY

Applications which do not comply with the following criteria are not eligible and will be rejected without further considerations:

- proposals submitted by organisations referred to under chapter 3,
- proposals meeting the transnationality requirement referred to under chapter 3, i.e. involving players from at least three different EU, EEA, acceding or candidate countries,
- submission of the application form (part I, II and III), presented according to the required model, duly completed and including a formal request for grant; the form and the request for grant have to be signed by the legal representative of the promoter,
- submission of signed letters of commitment confirming a financial (cash, not in kind) contribution equivalent to at least 20 % of the project's eligible costs by the promoter and/or its partners and/or other sources,
- submission of signed letters of commitment from other partners, with no financial contributions, confirming their participation to the proposal,
- submission of a balanced budget for the proposal, estimated in euro,
- submission of the curriculum vitae of the head of proposal and of the persons who will perform the main tasks in the proposal,
- the requested grant shall not be more than EUR 500 000,
- the proposal may not benefit from any other Community funding,
- the proposal shall meet the objectives of the call, i.e. 'to develop the capacity of players to promote gender equality effectively, in particular through support for the exchange of information and good practice and networking at Community level' (Chapter 2).

Promoters must attach all the required documents to their application form and send them by 7 June 2004 at the latest.

8. SELECTION CRITERIA

Applications which do not comply with the selection criteria cannot be selected and will be rejected without further consideration. The following selection criteria do not apply to public authorities and administrations:

- The promoter must have the operational resources (technical, management) needed to complete the proposal for which funding is requested. This should be proved in particular by providing the list of qualified staff /persons involved in the proposal.
- Grant applications must show that the promoter has the financial capacity to complete the proposed action. This should be proved in particular by providing the balance sheets for the last two financial years.
- For requested grants exceeding EUR 300 000, the application shall be accompanied by an external audit report produced by an approved auditor. That report shall certify the accounts for the last financial year available and give an assessment of the financial viability of the promoter.

Promoters must attach all the required documents to their application form and send them by 7 June 2004 at the latest.

9. AWARD CRITERIA

All proposals meeting the above eligibility and selection criteria and which do not fall under any exclusion criteria will then be checked against the following award criteria:

- Quality assessment of the proposal:
 - relevance and degree to which the proposal meets the objectives of the call notably the priorities for funding (Chapters 2 and 5),
 - clarity and feasibility of the work programme, including timetable, and methodology,
 - quality of the proposed partnership (adequacy, degree of involvement of the partners in the project) and of transnationality (in particular the degree of involvement of partners at EU level),
 - added value at European level,
 - scope and effectiveness of the dissemination mechanisms proposed,
 - quality of the mechanisms for on-going monitoring and final evaluation.
 - overall quality of the proposal.

- Financial elements of the proposal (budget assessment):
 - a reasonable and realistic budget for the project,
 - a sound cost-efficiency ratio.
- Priority for funding will be reserved to proposals requesting a grant of not less than EUR 250 000. In any case, the requested grant will not be more than EUR 500 000.
- One organisation, national authority or equality body cannot be involved, as promoter or partner, in more than one proposal under this call.

10. DURATION OF PROJECTS

The present call relates to a contractual period which will run possibly from autumn 2004 for a duration of around 15 months. Project activities have to start in 2004.

11. FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

Promoters are invited to read carefully the following financial conditions when preparing their proposal as well as detailed information on eligible and ineligible costs and other financial provisions given in the guidelines of the call.

- The Community's financial contribution will not exceed 80 % of the total eligible costs of the proposal. The costs must be necessary to carry out the planned actions.
- The promoter and/or its partners and/or other sources is/are required to secure co-financing for the remaining 20 % of the total eligible costs of the project in cash (not in kind).
- Promoters cannot include in their budget expenditure before or after the period during which the project is carried out as specified in the grant agreement.

The budget authority has fixed the amount allocated to heading 04030303 for 2004 at EUR 7 million.

This appropriation covers in particular funding of measures aimed at strengthening transnational cooperation between worker and employer representatives in respect of information, consultation and participation within undertakings operating in more than one Member State with priority assistance going to undertakings which are not subject to Directives 94/45/EC and 97/74/EC. It may also be used to fund training for representatives in transnational information, consultation and participation bodies, particularly with a view to increasing the presence of women, and for innovative measures concerning the prevention and resolution of conflicts in multinational undertakings particularly those relating to restructuring.

Measures involving the participation of social partners' representatives from the candidate countries are covered by the appropriation.

In connection with all measures funded under this heading, disabled persons must be afforded unrestricted access.

I. THE AIMS

The comment under the budget heading clearly states the purpose of the funded operations, which is to ensure, in a pragmatic manner, the conditions for fostering the development of employee involvement in undertakings, by promoting Directives 94/45/EC and 97/74/EC on European works councils, Council Directives 2001/86/EC and 2003/72/EC on employee involvement in the European Company and European Cooperative Society, respectively, and Directive 2002/14/EC of the European Parliament and the Council establishing a general framework for informing and consulting employees in the European Community.

A number of priority objectives have been established for the 2004 financial year:

- exchange of information and experience with a view to preparing for information, consultation and participation of employees in the European Company and the European Cooperative Society,
- cooperation between worker and employer representatives to ensure correct information and consultation of employees at, and between, all levels (national and European) in an undertaking or group of undertakings,
- measures aimed at promoting equal opportunities and a better balance between men and women in the context of transnational representational fora,
- strengthening of transnational co-operation in the field of information and consultation between workers' represen-

- tatives, between employers, and between worker and employer representatives in undertakings operating in more than one Member State and in the applicant countries.
- innovative measures relating to the management of information, consultation and participation (including financial participation), the anticipation of change and to the prevention and resolution of disputes within multinational companies in the context of the development and competitiveness strategies of the various sectors of activity and company restructuring, mergers, take-overs and relocation,
- measures aiming at promoting and developing corporate social responsibility agreements between worker and employer representatives within multinational companies,
- aid for the establishing of information and consultation bodies and adoption of best practices in Community-scale undertakings and Community-scale groups of undertakings,
- the production of reports on experience regarding the establishment of European Works Councils and the functioning and effectiveness of information and consultation within them.

II. ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

Eligible measures

The budget heading is intended to finance specific measures. Therefore grants are not intended to finance the normal operation or meetings of bodies representing management or labour (the social partners); they are intended only to cover additional expenditure linked directly to projects. Eligible types of action are:

- Practices, exchange of information and reports on experience in the field of information, consultation and participation within undertakings or groups of undertakings. The relationship between these information and consultation methods within the undertaking and the European sectoral dimension.
- 2. Measures to prepare for employee involvement in the European Company or European Cooperative Society.
- 3. Innovative measures concerning the dissemination of information consultation and participation rights, the anticipation of change and the prevention and resolution of disputes particularly in connection with company restructuring, mergers, take-overs and relocation.

Eligible promoters

Promoters must in general be representatives of workers or employers. Thus

- for workers: promoters may be work councils or similar bodies ensuring the general representation of workers; regional, national, European, sectoral or multi-sectoral trade unions,
- for employers: applications may come from the management of the undertaking or group of undertakings concerned or from organisations representing employers at regional, national, European, multi-sectoral or sectoral level.

Applications from technical bodies such as non-profit training or research bodies will be considered only where such promoters are expressly mandated by one or more of the above parties and are properly constituted legal persons.

Joint worker/employer measures are particularly encouraged. Joint projects should be submitted by one of the parties who will fulfil the contractual commitments vis-à-vis the Commission and the other party must indicate in writing its agreement to the joint implementation of the contract. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, projects involving only one information and consultation body must be submitted as joint projects.

A project promoter cannot be an individual. In the case of legal entities, the applicant must be properly constituted and registered. The applicant's legal status and VAT number should be stated. A copy of the applicant's articles of association or statutes and registration certificate, where applicable, must be submitted with the application.

Grants may be awarded to commercial undertakings only if the immediate objective of the project is non-commercial and certainly not to make a profit.

Persons concerned

Those involved in projects should, in general, be representatives of workers or employers, thus members or future members of information, consultation and participation fora; management of undertakings or groups or members of employers associations; officials of workers organisations/trade union representatives; experts nominated by the abovementioned social partners.

Scope

Applicants must have their registered offices in a Member State of the European Union (¹). Actions involving participation of social partner representatives from the candidate countries are encouraged. The actions must be fully carried out within the Member States or the 13 acceding and candidate countries. Persons resident in third countries may participate in actions under this budget heading but it is not possible to reimburse any expenses of such third country participants for travel, accommodation, subsistence or staff costs.

Selection criteria

The applicant must be able to demonstrate the financial and operational capacity to complete the activity for which funding is requested. Thus the applicant must have access to solid and adequate funding to maintain activities for the period of the project and to help finance it as necessary and must have the operational resources (technical, management) needed to successfully complete the activity.

The applicant must enclose

- the annual balance-sheet for the most recent financial year, or auditor's report,
- CV of the person responsible for the project and, where applicable, of the persons who will perform the tasks associated with the action for which funding is requested and must sign the declaration of honour provided with the application form certifying that
- the applicant has the financial and operational capacity to complete the proposed action, and
- the applicant is not in one of the situations listed in Article 93 of the Financial Regulation concerning social security, taxes, bankruptcy, misconduct, fraud, corruption or any other illegal activity, and that he has not failed to comply with his contractual obligations to the Communities in other grant award or contract procedures.

III. PRACTICAL PROCEDURES

Only projects starting in 2004 will be considered. The normal maximum duration of an operation is twelve months. The final deadline for submission of applications is 10 September 2004 but applications will be examined on three occasions as indicated at point 3.

An application will be regarded as incomplete if:

- it is not signed by the legal representative and dated,
- it does not contain replies to all the questions in the form,
- it is not accompanied by a balanced budget (income and expenditure),
- it does not contain all the required attachments: adequate description, completed bank identification form, letters of support, articles of association, declaration of honour, etc. (see explanatory notes and check list).

3. Examination of applications and award criteria

Applications will be examined and selected — taking account of the comment in the budget, the stipulated selection and award criteria, the priorities set out above and the principle of balanced funding — by an evaluation committee. The committee will meet, within 25 working days after each deadline, to consider completed applications received by the following deadlines:

Incomplete applications will not be considered by the selection committee.

In evaluating the quality of projects regard will be had to the following award criteria aimed at maximising the overall effectiveness of expenditure under the budget heading

- extent to which the proposed action accords with the objectives and priorities of the budget heading,
- degree to which the expected results add value in terms of the aims and priorities of the budget heading,
- extent to which the project concerns innovative measures or measures concerning new subjects in relation to information, consultation and participation,

- the level of participation of representatives of both employers and workers,
- the degree of transnationality (where appropriate),
- the level of participation of social partner representatives form the candidate countries,
- the cost effectiveness of the operation,
- the arrangements to guarantee the visibility of the Community financing.

Unsuccessful applicants will be notified by letter. A rejected proposal may be resubmitted with amendments but will only be considered at a subsequent meeting if a new complete application file (including all supporting documents) is submitted by the deadline for such subsequent meeting.

4. Agreement governing the grant

Successful applicants will receive a letter together with two copies of an agreement for their acceptance and signature. The Commission will then return one of the signed copies to the applicant.

The project may not commence before the date of submission of the grant application. Any expenditure incurred before receipt of an agreement is at the promoter's risk.

A request for an extension of the implementation period specified in the agreement will be accepted only in exceptional circumstances and only if the request is received no later than two months before the end of the specified period. The grant will not cover the full cost of the project. The Commission reserves the right to refuse and/or limit the funding of specific elements in the budget estimate. The project promoter is required to contribute at least 20 % of the total cost of the operation. Contributions in kind are not accepted.

The average grant per project in 2003 was about EUR 70 000 but the Commission is prepared to consider larger scale projects which can increase efficiency in achieving the objectives of the budget heading.

The payment arrangements will be set out in the agreement.

5. Evaluation and monitoring

A report and budget implementation details must be provided in accordance with the conditions laid down in the agreement. They must include expenditure and income presented in the same format as the budget estimate, reports on completed operations with the evaluation form duly completed and the products prepared, either for the project itself or as part of the follow-up, in the languages foreseen in the project proposal. Failure to supply any of these will result in non-payment of the grant.

Supporting documents must be available for inspection on location.
