1. On 23 January 2015, the Commission received a notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EC) No 139/2004 ⁽¹⁾ by which the Onex Corporation ('Onex' of Canada) acquires within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Merger Regulation control of the whole of the SIG Combibloc Group AG (Switzerland) and SIG Holding USA, LLC (USA) (together 'SIG Group') by way of purchase of shares.
2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:
 - Onex is a Canadian-based investment company with interests in a number of companies in various industry sectors, including but not limited to companies active in the supply of products for aseptic carton packaging machines and aseptic cartons,
 - SIG Group is a provider of aseptic carton packaging machines and aseptic cartons.
3. On preliminary examination, the Commission finds that the notified transaction could fall within the scope of the Merger Regulation. However, the final decision on this point is reserved. Pursuant to the Commission Notice on a simplified procedure for treatment of certain concentrations under the Council Regulation (EC) No 139/2004 ⁽²⁾ it should be noted that this case is a candidate for treatment under the procedure set out in this Notice.
4. The Commission invites interested third parties to submit their possible observations on the proposed operation to the Commission.
