

'Scientific apparatus' Decision**Authorization of relief from import duties**

(Legal basis: Regulations (EEC) No 918/83 ⁽¹⁾ and (EEC) No 2290/83 ⁽²⁾)

By virtue of a Commission Decision of 20 December 1984 the apparatus known as 'SSM — Automatic spreading resistance probe, model ASR-100B' may be imported free of import duties.

This apparatus, the subject of an application made by France on 27 June 1984 and ordered on 15 January 1984 is intended for measurement of dopant profiles on thin-layer silicon structures using the spreading resistance technique.

Reasoning:

- Scientific apparatus;
- Absence of apparatus of equivalent scientific value in the Community at date of order.

**Commission communications pursuant to Article 9 (9) of Council Regulation (EEC)
No 3420/83 of 14 November 1983**

(84/C 346/04)

By virtue of Article 9 (3) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 3420/83 of 14 November 1983 on import arrangements for products originating in State-trading countries, not liberalized at Community level ⁽¹⁾, the Commission has adopted the following change to the import arrangements applied in Ireland with regard to Romania with effect from 20 December 1984:

1. The putting into free circulation in Ireland of tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic purposes of porcelain, china or other kinds of pottery falling within headings No ex 69.11 and ex 69.12 of the Common Customs Tariff originating in Romania is subject to quantitative restrictions.
2. For 1985 the importation into Ireland of the products referred to in paragraph 1 is subject to a quantitative quota of 90 tonnes.
