In Case 361/85: Commission of the European Communities (Agent: Alberto Prozzillo) against Italian Republic (Agent: Luigi Ferrari Bravo, assisted by Ivo Braguglia, Avvocato dello Stato) — application for a declaration that, by failing to adopt within the prescribed period the provisions necessary to comply with Directives 80/509/EEC, 79/373/EEC, 80/511/EEC 80/695/EEC on the marketing of compound feedingstuffs, the Italian Republic has failed to fulfil its obligations under the EEC Treaty — the Court, composed of Lord Mackenzie Stuart, President, T. F. O'Higgins and F. Schockweiler (Presidents of Chambers), U. Everling, K. Bahlmann, R. Joliet and J. C. 'Moitinho de Almeida, Judges; M. Darmon, Advocate-General; D. Louterman, Administrator, for the Registrar, gave a judgment on 29 January 1987, the operative part of which is as follows:

- 1. The Italian Republic has failed to fulfil its obligations under the EEC Treaty by failing to adopt within the prescribed period the provisions necessary to comply with Council Directive 79/373/EEC of 2 April 1979 on the marketing of compound feedingstuffs, Commission Directive 80/509/EEC of 2 May 1980 amending the Annex to Council Directive 79/373/EEC on the marketing of compound feedingstuffs, Commission Directive 80/511/EEC of 2 May 1980 authorizing, in certain cases, the marketing of compound feedingstuffs in unsealed packages or containers and Commission Directive 80/695/EEC of 27 June 1980 amending the Annex to Council Directive 79/373/EEC on the marketing of compound feedingstuffs.
- 2. The Italian Republic is ordered to pay the costs.

F. O'Higgins and F. Schockweiler (Presidents of Chambers), G. Bosco, T. Koopmans, O. Due and K. Bahlmann, Judges; M. Darmon, Advocate-General; H. A. Rühl, Principal Administrator, for the Registrar, gave a judgment on 29 January 1987, the operative part of which is as follows:

- 1. By failing to adopt within the prescribed period the provisions necessary to comply with Council Directive 80/219/EEC of 22 January 1980 and Council Directives 80/1098/EEC and 80/1102/EEC of 11 November 1980, the Italian Republic has failed to fulfil its obligations under the EEC Treaty.
- 2. The Italian Republic is ordered to pay the costs.
