THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organization of the market in cereals⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1386/77⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 13 (5) thereof,

Whereas the import levies on cereals, wheat and rye flour, and wheat groats and meal were fixed by Regulation (EEC) No 1729/77⁽³⁾ and subsequent amending Regulations;

Whereas it follows from applying the provisions contained in Regulation (EEC) No 1729/77 to the

offer prices and today's quotations known to the Commission that the levies at present in force should be altered as shown in the Annex to this Regulation,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The import levies to be charged on products listed in Article 1 (a), (b) and (c) of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 are hereby fixed as shown in the table annexed to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 24 August 1977.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No
2727/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organ-
ization of the market in cereals⁽¹⁾, as last amended by
Regulation (EEC) No 1386/77⁽²⁾, and in particular
Article 15 (6) thereof,

Whereas the premiums to be added to the levies on
cereals and malt were fixed by Regulation (EEC) No
1730/77⁽³⁾ and subsequent amending Regulations ;

Whereas, on the basis of today's cif prices and cif
forward delivery prices, the premiums at present in
force, which are to be added to the levies, should be

altered as shown in the tables annexed to this Regula-
tion,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

The scale of the premiums to be added, pursuant to
Article 15 of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75, to the
import levies fixed in advance in respect of cereals
and malt is hereby fixed as shown in the tables
annexed to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 24 August
1977.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member
States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1910/77
of 23 August 1977

fixing the special levies applicable to New Zealand butter and cheese imported into the United Kingdom under Protocol 18

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty of Accession (1),

Having regard to Protocol 18 (2) to the Act annexed thereto,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 226/73 of 31 January 1973 laying down general rules for imports of New Zealand butter and cheese into the United Kingdom (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3067/75 (4), and in particular Article 8 thereof,

Whereas pursuant to Article 2 (1) of the Protocol special levies are applied to New Zealand butter and cheese imported into the United Kingdom under that Protocol;

Whereas, pursuant to Article 2 (2) of the Protocol and to Article 4 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 226/73, these special levies are fixed on the basis of the difference between:

- the market price at which the annual quantities specified in Article 1 (2) of the Protocol can actually be sold, and
- the cif price fixed in Article 3 of Regulation (EEC) No 226/73, plus costs incurred between the cif and first sale stages;

Whereas Article 4 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 226/73 provides that the special levies should be fixed at a level such that the butter and cheese in question can be sold at a consistent rate and should as far as

possible be kept at a uniform level to ensure the stability of the market; whereas these levies may nevertheless be altered, and are in particular to be adjusted where this is necessary to permit steady sales of the annual quantities specified in Article 1 (2) of the Protocol;

Whereas, in order not to endanger the sale of Community butter and cheese, the special levies must not be lower than the level necessary to permit the annual quantities specified in Article 1 (2) of the Protocol to be sold;

Whereas it follows from applying these rules to the situation on the British market that the special levies should be fixed at the levels indicated below;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The special levies referred to in Article 2 of Protocol 18 are hereby fixed at:

- 78.56 u.a./100 kg for butter,
- 95.48 u.a./100 kg for cheese.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 24 August 1977.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 1911/77
of 23 August 1977

re-establishing the levying of the customs duties on plaiting materials bound together in parallel strands etc., falling within heading No 46.02, originating in Hong Kong to which the preferential tariff arrangements set out in Council Regulation (EEC) No 3021/76 apply

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3021/76 of 13 December 1976 establishing preferential tariffs in respect of certain products originating in developing countries⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 4 (2) thereof,

Whereas Article 1 (3) and (4) of that Regulation provides that the customs duties may, for each category of products, be suspended up to a Community ceiling, expressed in units of account, which will be equal — with the exception of certain products the value of the ceilings for which is given in Annex A of the Regulation in question — to the sum arrived at by adding together the value of the products in question imported cif into the Community in 1974 and coming from countries and territories covered by those arrangements, but not including products coming from countries and territories already covered by various preferential tariff arrangements established by the Community, and 5 % of the value of 1974 cif imports coming from other countries and from countries and territories already covered by such arrangements; whereas, however, the ceiling resulting from the sum of this addition may in no case exceed 172.5 % of that resulting from the substitution of the year 1971 for the year 1974 in the first term of the addition and of the year 1972 for the year 1974 in the second term of the addition;

Whereas, having regard to that ceiling, the amounts for products originating in any one of the countries or territories listed in Annex B to that Regulation should be within a maximum Community amount representing 50 % of that ceiling, with the exception of certain products for which the maximum amount is to be reduced to the percentage indicated in Annex A to that Regulation; whereas, for these products, this reduced percentage will be 30 %;

Whereas Article 2 (2) of that Regulation provides that the levying of customs duties may be re-established at any time in respect of imports of the products in question originating in any of the said countries or territo-

ries — with the exception of those listed in Annex C of the same Regulation — once the relevant Community amount has been reached;

Whereas, in respect of plaiting materials bound together in parallel strands etc., falling within heading No 46.02, the ceiling, calculated as indicated above, should be 4 823 000 units of account, and therefore the maximum amount is 1 446 900 units of account; whereas on 19 August 1977, the amounts of imports into the Community of plaiting materials bound together in parallel strands etc., falling within heading No 46.02, originating in Hong Kong, a country covered by preferential tariff arrangements, reached that maximum amount; whereas, bearing in mind the objectives of Regulation (EEC) No 3021/76 which provides that maximum amounts should not be exceeded, customs duties should be re-established in respect of the products in question in relation to Hong Kong,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

As from 27 August 1977, the levying of customs duties, suspended in pursuance of Council Regulation (EEC) No 3021/76, shall be re-established in respect of the following products, imported into the Community and originating in Hong Kong:

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3330/74 of 19 December 1974 on the common organization of the market in sugar⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1110/77⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 15 (7) thereof,

Whereas the import levies on white sugar and raw sugar were fixed by Regulation (EEC) No 1436/77⁽³⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1907/77⁽⁴⁾;

Whereas it follows from applying the rules and other provisions contained in Regulation (EEC) No 1436/77 to the information at present available to the Commis-

sion that the levies at present in force should be altered as shown in the Annex to this Regulation,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

The levies referred to in Article 15 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 3330/74 are, in respect of white sugar and standard quality raw sugar, hereby fixed as shown in the Annex to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 24 August 1977.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

fixing the minimum selling price for butter for the 56th individual invitation to tender under the standing invitation to tender provided for by Regulation (EEC) No 232/75

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 559/76⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 6 (7) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 985/68 of 15 July 1968 laying down general rules for intervention on the market in butter and cream⁽³⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2714/72⁽⁴⁾, and in particular Article 7a thereof,

Whereas, pursuant to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 232/75 of 30 January 1975 on the sale of butter at reduced prices for use in the manufacture of pastry products and ice-cream⁽⁵⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 920/77⁽⁶⁾, intervention agencies have put up for sale by standing invitation to tender certain quantities of butter held by them;

Whereas Article 9 of that Regulation provides that, in the light of the tenders received, a minimum selling price must be fixed which may vary according to the use to which the butter is to be put and according to the fat content of the butter; whereas alternatively a decision may be taken not to proceed with the invitation to tender; whereas the amount of the processing

security must be fixed in the light of the difference between the minimum selling price and the market price of the butter;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 777/76 of 5 April 1976⁽⁷⁾ reduces the scope of Regulation (EEC) No 232/75 to the butter to be used when processed into pastry products (formula A);

Whereas, in the light of the tenders received in response to the 56th individual invitation to tender, the minimum selling price should be fixed at the level specified below and the processing security determined accordingly;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

For the 56th individual invitation to tender under Regulation (EEC) No 232/75, in respect of which the time limit for the submission of tenders is 26 July 1977, the minimum selling price and, without prejudice to the provisions of the second subparagraph of Article 12 (1) of the said Regulation, the processing security, shall be as follows:

fixing, pursuant to the invitation to tender opened by Regulation (EEC) No 1548/77, the maximum amounts for the delivery of butteroil as food aid

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 559/76⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 6(7) thereof,

Whereas, pursuant to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1548/77 of 8 July 1977 on the delivery of various consignments of butteroil as food aid⁽³⁾, the Dutch, the French and the German intervention agencies have invited tenders for the manufacture and delivery of 3 147 tonnes of butteroil destined for the WFP;

Whereas Article 16 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 303/77 of 14 February 1977 laying down general rules for the supply of skimmed-milk powder and butteroil as food aid⁽⁴⁾ provides that in the light of the tenders received a maximum amount for each lot put out to tender is to be fixed or the tendering procedure is to be cancelled;

Whereas, on the basis of the tenders received, the maximum amounts should be those specified below;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The maximum amounts to be set for the purpose of awarding a contract pursuant to Regulation (EEC) No 1548/77 shall be as follows:

- lot A: 1 784 836 units of account,
- lot B: 1 486 452 units of account,
- lot C: 1 487 363 units of account,
- lot D: 1 677 384 units of account,
- lot E: 1 733 140 units of account,
- lot F: 1 196 511 units of account.

This Decision is addressed to the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the Republic of France and the Federal Republic of Germany.

authorizing the French Republic to permit temporarily the marketing of seed
not complying with requirements of Council Directive 66/401/EEC

(77/546/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN
COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European
Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 66/401/EEC of 14
June 1966 on the marketing of fodder plant seed⁽¹⁾,
as last amended by Council Directive 75/444/EEC of
26 June 1975⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 17 thereof,

Having regard to the request made by the French
Republic,

Whereas in France the production of tall fescue seed
complying with requirements of the said Directive has
been insufficient in 1976 and is not adequate to
supply the needs of that country;

Whereas it has not been possible to cover these needs
sufficiently by 'certified seed' from other Member
States or even from third countries of varieties
included in the 'Common catalogue of varieties of agri-
cultural plant species' or included in the national cata-
logues of varieties of the French Republic;

Whereas the French Republic should therefore be
authorized to permit, for a period expiring on 30
September 1977 the marketing of seed of the above-
mentioned species of varieties not included in the
'Common catalogue of varieties of agricultural plant
species' or included in the national catalogues of varie-
ties of the French Republic;

Whereas it appears also desirable to authorize other
Member States which are able to supply the French
Republic with this seed not complying with require-
ments of the Directive to permit the marketing of
such seed provided that it is intended exclusively for
France;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision
are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing
Committee on Seeds and Propagating Material for
Agriculture, Horticulture and Forestry,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The French Republic is authorized to permit for a
period expiring on 30 September 1977 the marketing
in its territory of a maximum of 200 tonnes of tall
fescue seed (*Festuca arundinacea Schreb.*) of the cate-
gory 'certified seed' of the first generation of varieties
not included in the 'Common catalogue of varieties of
agricultural plant species' or in its national catalogues
of varieties. The official label shall state: 'Intended
exclusively for France'.

Article 2

The other Member States are authorized to permit,
subject to the conditions laid down in Article 1, the
marketing in their territories of a maximum of 200
tonnes of tall fescue seed (*Festuca arundinacea
Schreb.*) provided that such seed is intended exclu-
sively for France. The official label shall state:
'Intended exclusively for France'.

Article 3

The Member States shall notify the Commission
before 1 December 1977 of the quantities of seed
marketed in their territories pursuant to this Decision.
The Commission shall inform the other Member
States thereof.

Article 4

This Decision is addressed to the Member States.

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 559/76⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 7 (5) thereof,Whereas, pursuant to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1547/77 of 8 July 1977 on the delivery of various consignments of skimmed-milk powder as food aid⁽³⁾, the intervention agencies of the Member States have invited tenders for the costs of delivery to the WFP of 651 tonnes of vitaminized skimmed-milk powder, bought on the Community market;Whereas Article 16 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 303/77 of 14 February 1977 laying down general rules for the supply of skimmed-milk powder and butteroil as food aid⁽⁴⁾ provides that in the light of the tenders received a maximum amount for each lot offered for tender is to be fixed or the tendering procedure is to be cancelled;

Whereas, on the basis of the tenders received, the maximum amounts should be those specified below:

Whereas the measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The maximum amounts to be set for the purposes of awarding a contract pursuant to Regulation (EEC) No 1547/77 shall be fixed as follows:

- lot A : 190 020 units of account,
- lot B : 423 432 units of account.
