Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Communities laid down by Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (Euratom, ECSC, EEC) No 2339/88⁽²⁾, and in particular Articles 63, 64, 65 and 82 of the Staff Regulations and the first subparagraph of Article 20 and Article 64 of the Conditions of Employment,

Having regard to Council Decision 81/1061/Euratom, ECSC, EEC of 15 December 1981 amending the method of calculation of the remuneration of officials and other servants of the Communities⁽³⁾, as last amended by Decision 87/530/Euratom, ECSC, EEC⁽⁴⁾,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas a review of the remuneration of officials and other servants carried out on the basis of a report by the Commission has shown that the remuneration and pensions of officials and other servants of the Communities should be adjusted under the 1988 annual review,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

With effect from 1 July 1988 :

COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC) No 3983/88**of 19 December 1988****increasing the volume of the Community tariff quota opened for 1988 for newsprint****THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,**

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 113 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas, for newsprint, the Community has reached an agreement which provides in particular for the opening of a Community tariff quota of 650 000 tonnes, of which 600 000 tonnes are reserved, until 30 November of each year, exclusively for products from Canada, in accordance with Article XIII of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade; whereas this agreement provides equally for the obligation to increase, by 5 %, that part of the quota reserved for imports from Canada, in the event that that part is used up before the end of a given period of one year; whereas the quota of 650 000 tonnes was opened for 1988 by Council Regulation (EEC) No 4103/87⁽¹⁾;

Whereas the economic data at present available give rise to the belief that the requirements for importing newsprint from Canada could reach a level higher than the said volume of 600 000 tonnes; whereas the volume

of that part of quota reserved for these imports should be increased, therefore, by 30 000 tonnes,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. The volume of the Community tariff quota opened by Regulation (EEC) No 4103/87 for newsprint from Canada shall be increased from 600 000 tonnes to 630 000 tonnes.
2. This increase of 30 000 tonnes shall be added to the Community reserve set up by Article 3 (2) of the said Regulation, thus increasing the reserve from 240 000 tonnes to 270 000 tonnes.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

opening and providing for the administration of a Community tariff quota for a
certain type of polyvinyl butyral

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 28 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the Community temporarily depends on imports from third countries for its supplies of polyvinyl butyral; whereas it is in the Community's interest to suspend fully the normal duty applicable for the product in question, within a Community tariff quota of appropriate volume; whereas in order not to interfere with the prospects for developing production of this product in the Community and at the same time ensure an adequate supply to satisfy user industries, it is advisable to limit the benefit of the tariff quota to a quantity of 1 500 tonnes to open the quota for the period from 1 January to 31 December 1989;

Whereas it is in particular necessary to allow all Community importers equal and uninterrupted access to the quota and to ensure uninterrupted application of the rates laid down for that quota to all imports of the products concerned into all Member States until the quota has been used up; whereas, in the present case, it seems

advisable not to allocate this quota among the Member States but to allow them to draw against the quota volume such quantities as they may need, under the conditions and according to the procedure specified in Article 1 (2); whereas this method of management requires close cooperation between the Member States and the Commission and the latter must, in particular, be able to monitor the rate at which the quota is being used up and inform the Member States thereof;

Whereas, since the Kingdom of Belgium, the Kingdom of the Netherlands and the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg are united within, and jointly represented by, the Benelux Economic Union, all transactions concerning the administration of shares allocated to that economic union may be carried out by any one of its members,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. From 1 January to 31 December 1989, the customs duty applicable to imports of the product mentioned below shall be suspended at the level and within the limits of a Community tariff quota as follows:

Within the limits of this tariff quota, the Kingdom of Spain and the Portuguese Republic shall apply customs duties calculated in accordance with the relevant provisions in the Act of Accession.

preferential benefit for a product covered by this Regulation and if this declaration is accepted by the customs authorities, the Member State concerned shall inform the Commission and draw an amount corresponding to its requirements from the quota amount.

The drawing requests, with indication of the date of acceptance of the said declarations, must be transmitted to the Commission without delay.

The drawings are granted by the Commission by reference to the date of acceptance of the declarations of entry into free circulation by the customs authorities of the Member State concerned to the extent that the available balance so permits.

If a Member State does not use the quantities drawn, it shall return them as soon as possible to the quota amount.

Article 2

The tariff quota referred to in Article 1 shall be managed by the Commission, which may take all appropriate administrative measures in order to ensure effective administration thereof.

Article 3

If an importer presents in a Member State a declaration of entry into free circulation, including a request for

If the quantities requested are greater than the available balance of the quota amount, allocation shall be made on a *pro rata* basis with respect to the requests. Member States shall be informed by the Commission in accordance with the same procedures.

3. Member States shall charge imports of the said goods against their drawings as and when the goods are entered with the customs authorities for free circulation.

4. The extent to which the quota has been used shall be determined on the basis of the imports charged in accordance with paragraph 3.

Article 4

1. Member States shall take all appropriate measures to ensure that their drawings pursuant to Article 3 enable imports to be charged without interruption against their accumulated shares of the Community quota.

2. Each Member State shall ensure that importers of the product concerned have free access to the quota for such time as the residual balance of the quota volume so permits.

At the request of the Commission, Member States shall inform it of imports actually charged against the quota.

Article 5

Member States and the Commission shall collaborate closely in order to ensure that this Regulation is complied with.

Article 6

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1989.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Whereas, if the levy system is to operate normally, levies should be calculated on the following basis:

— in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last paragraph of Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85,

— for other currencies, an exchange rate based on the arithmetic mean of the spot market rates of each of these currencies recorded for a given period in relation to the Community currencies referred to in the previous indent, and the aforesaid coefficient;

Whereas these exchange rates being those recorded on 20 December 1988;

Whereas the aforesaid corrective factor affects the entire calculation basis for the levies, including the equivalence coefficients;

Whereas it follows from applying the detailed rules contained in Regulation (EEC) No 2401/88 to today's offer prices and quotations known to the Commission that the levies at present in force should be altered to the amounts set out in the Annex hereto,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The import levies to be charged on products listed in Article 1 (a), (b) and (c) of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 22 December 1988.

fixing the export refunds on white sugar and raw sugar exported in its unaltered state

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81 of 30 June 1981 on the common organization of the markets in the sugar sector (¹), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2306/88 (²), and in particular point (a) of the first subparagraph of Article 19. (4) thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas Article 19 of Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81 provides that the difference between quotations or prices on the world market for the products listed in Article 1 (1) (a) of that Regulation and prices for those products within the Community may be covered by an export refund ;

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) No 766/68 of 18 June 1968 laying down general rules for granting export refunds on sugar (³), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1489/76 (⁴), provides that when refunds on white and raw sugar, undenatured and exported in its unaltered state are being fixed account must be taken of the situation on the Community and world markets in sugar and in particular of the price and cost factors set out in Article 3 of that Regulation ; whereas the same Article provides that the economic aspect of the proposed exports should also be taken into account ;

Whereas the refund on raw sugar must be fixed in respect of the standard quality ; whereas the latter is defined in Article 1 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 431/68 of 9 April 1968 determining the standard quality for raw sugar and fixing the Community frontier crossing point for calculating cif prices for sugar (⁵) ; whereas, furthermore, this refund should be fixed in accordance with Article 5 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 766/68 ; whereas candy sugar is defined in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 394/70 of 2 March 1970 on detailed rules for granting export refunds on sugar (⁶), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1714/88 (⁷) ; whereas the refund thus calculated for sugar containing added flavouring or colouring matter

must apply to their sucrose content and, accordingly, be fixed per 1 % of the said content ;

Whereas the world market situation or the specific requirements of certain markets may make it necessary to vary the refund for sugar according to destination ;

Whereas, in special cases, the amount of the refund may be fixed by other legal instruments ;

Whereas, if the refund system is to operate normally, refunds should be calculated on the following basis :

- in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last paragraph of Article 3 (1) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85 (⁸), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1636/87 (⁹) ;
- for other currencies, an exchange rate based on the arithmetic mean of the spot market rates of each of these currencies recorded over a given period in relation to the Community currencies referred to in the previous indent, and the aforesaid coefficient ;

Whereas the refund must be fixed every two weeks ; whereas it may be altered in the intervening period ;

Whereas it follows from applying the rules set out above to the present situation on the market in sugar and in particular to quotations or prices for sugar within the Community and on the world market that the refund should be as set out in the Annex hereto ;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Sugar,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

The export refunds on the products listed in Article 1 (1) (a) of Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81 undenatured and exported in their unaltered state shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 22 December 1988.

Whereas, according to the information communicated to the Commission, catches of sprat in the waters of ICES division VII d and e by vessels flying the flag of Denmark or registered in Denmark have reached the quota allocated for 1988; whereas Denmark has prohibited

fishing for this stock as from 29 November 1988; whereas it is therefore necessary to abide by that date,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Catches of sprat in the waters of ICES division VII d and e by vessels flying the flag of Denmark or registered in Denmark are deemed to have exhausted the quota allocated to Denmark for 1988.

Fishing for sprat in the waters of ICES division VII d and e by vessels flying the flag of Denmark or registered in Denmark is prohibited, as well as the retention on board, the transhipment and the landing of such stock captured by the abovementioned vessels after the date of application of this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

It shall apply with effect from 29 November 1988.

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2746/75 of 29 October 1975 laying down general rules for granting export refunds on cereals and criteria for fixing the amount of such refunds (³), and in particular Article 8 (2), second subparagraph, and (3) thereof, and to the corresponding provisions of the other Regulations laying down general rules on the grant of export refunds for agricultural products;

Whereas the rate of refund is determined by the tariff classification of a product; whereas that classification may, for certain goods, put up in sets and classified pursuant to paragraph 3 (b) of the general rules for the interpretation of the combined nomenclature, lead to the grant of a higher refund than is economically justified; whereas special provisions must therefore be adopted for determining refunds in the case of goods put up in sets;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3665/87 (⁴), as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3494/88 (⁵), replaces Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2730/79 (⁶), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1180/87 (⁷), and whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2730/79 had earlier replaced Commission Regulation (EEC) No 192/75 (⁸), which in turn had replaced Regulation No 1041/67/EEC (⁹); whereas a number of Regulations still contain references to Regulations No 1041/67/EEC and (EEC) No 192/75; whereas, for reasons of clarity and comprehension, a table which sets out the changes in the

references to the texts in force should be included in Annex I to Regulation (EEC) No 3665/87;

Whereas by the same token a number of errors in the original text of Regulation (EEC) No 3665/87 should be corrected, such corrections not entailing any changes of substance;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the management committees concerned,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 3665/87 is hereby amended as follows:

(b) Where proof that all the requirements laid down by Community rules have been fulfilled is produced within six months of expiry of the periods specified in Article 47 (2), (4) and (5) but the time limit specified in Article 4 (1) or 38 (1) has been exceeded, the refund paid shall be the reduced refund as specified in paragraph 1 further reduced by 15 % of the amount which would have been paid if all the time limits had been complied with.

Whereas experience has shown that it is impossible to exclude the presence of particles of other varieties of hops in samples; whereas that fact does not impair the characteristics of the product to be certified; whereas very small quantities of such particles should therefore be allowed; whereas Regulation (EEC) No 890/78 should be amended accordingly;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Hops,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

In line (c) in the column headed 'Description' of Annex I to Regulation (EEC) No 890/78, 'which generally do not come from the cone' is replaced by the following:

'which generally do not come from the cone; the maximum contents indicated may include particles of varieties of hops other than those to be certified, amounting to up to 2 % of the weight'.

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Cereals,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

The following is hereby added to points A and B of Annex II ('Term of validity of export licences') to Regulation (EEC) No 2042/75:

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 822/87 of 16 March 1987 on the common organization of the market in wine (¹), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2964/88 (²), and in particular Article 45 (9) thereof,

Whereas Article 3 (4) of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2635/88 of 24 August 1988 laying down detailed rules for implementing an aid scheme for the use of concentrated grape must in feedingstuffs (³), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3522/88 (⁴), provides for a mechanism enabling the total quantity laid down for the Community as a whole of concentrated grape must which may be delivered for use in such feedingstuffs to be kept within a given annual maximum quantity;

Whereas information forwarded to the Commission by the Member States shows that, on expiry of the time limit laid down for the presentation of the contracts, the total quantity of concentrated grape must in such contracts exceeds by approximately 136 600 hectolitres the quantity provided for in Article 45 (7) of Regulation (EEC) No 822/87 as estimated for the 1988/89 wine year; whereas, under those circumstances, pursuant to Article 3 (4) of Regulation (EEC) No 2635/88, use in animal feedingstuffs of the quantity laid down should be limited and the quantities shown in each contract should be reduced accordingly in the same proportion;

Whereas, in view of certain administrative difficulties arising in the first year of application of Regulation (EEC)

No 2635/88, certain time limits laid down must be extended once more for operations in the 1988/89 wine year in order to permit the measure to be implemented;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Wine,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

For the 1988/89 wine year the quantity of concentrated grape must which may be used in feedingstuffs as provided for in Regulation (EEC) No 2635/88 shall be 42 % of the quantity in each contract submitted for approval.

Whereas the import levies on products processed from cereals and rice were fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3689/88 ('), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3913/88 (');

Whereas, if the levy system is to operate normally, levies should be calculated on the following basis:

— in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band

of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last paragraph of Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85,

— for other currencies, an exchange rate based on the arithmetic mean of the spot market rates of each of these currencies recorded over a given period in relation to the Community currencies referred to in the previous indent, and the aforesaid coefficient;

Whereas these exchange rates being those recorded on 20 December 1988;

Whereas the aforesaid corrective factor affects the entire calculation basis for the levies, including the equivalence coefficients;

Whereas the levy on the basic product as last fixed differs from the average levy by more than 3,02 ECU per tonne of basic product; whereas, pursuant to Article 1 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1579/74 ('), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1740/78 ('), the levies at present in force must therefore be altered to the amounts set out in the Annex hereto,

The import levies to be charged on products processed from cereals and rice covered by Regulation (EEC) No 2744/75 as fixed in the Annex to amended Regulation (EEC) No 3689/88 are hereby altered to the amounts set out in the Annex.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 822/87 of 16 March 1987 on the common organization of the market in wine (¹), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2964/88 (²), and in particular Article 54 (8) thereof,

Whereas, pursuant to the cooperation agreements which the Community has concluded with certain Mediterranean third countries, reduced free-at-frontier reference prices were fixed in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3418/88 (³) for wine originating in such countries and put up in containers holding not more than two litres within the limit of the annual quotas; whereas those agreements provide for a further reduction in prices from 1 January 1989 for Algeria, Tunisia and Yugoslavia; whereas the free-at-frontier reference prices must be fixed at the corresponding level;

Whereas Article 21 (4) of the Cooperation Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Morocco (⁴), as amended with effect on 1 October 1988 by the Additional Protocol of 26 May 1988 (⁵), provides for a reduced reference price for wine originating in Morocco to be fixed at the same level as

that fixed for the abovementioned countries; whereas that reduced price is applicable to wine put up in containers holding not more than two litres subject to an annual ceiling of 10 000 hectolitres; whereas the list of reference prices should therefore be supplemented;

Whereas the application of additional note 3 (B) of Chapter 22 of the combined nomenclature should be made clearer in order to ensure uniform interpretation,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The Annex to Regulation (EEC) No 3418/88 is hereby replaced by the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1989.

At the request of the party concerned, it shall apply from 1 October 1988 onwards as far as the lower reference prices fixed for wines falling within CN code 2204 21 and originating in Morocco are concerned.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
