#### **COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC) No 2913/90**

of 8 October 1990

derogating from the definition of the concept of 'originating products' to take account of the special situation of the Netherlands' Antilles with regard to cigarettes falling within CN code 2402 20 00

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 113 thereof,

Having regard to Council Decision 86/283/EEC of 30 June 1986 on the association of the overseas countries and territories with the European Economic Community (1), as last amended by Decision 90/146/EEC (2),

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas Article 28 of Annex II to the said Decision, concerning the definition of the concept of 'originating products' and methods of administrative cooperation, provides that derogations from the rules of origin may be adopted by the Council where the development of existing industries or the creation of new industries in a country or territory justifies them;

Whereas the Dutch Government has requested, on behalf of the Netherlands' Antilles, a derogation from the rules of origin for cigarettes manufactured there, which, for a temporary period, cannot satisfy the rules of origin laid down in the abovementioned Annex II;

Whereas the said Article 28 sets out the conditions which must be fulfilled in order for a derogation to be granted; whereas the derogation requested is not likely to cause serious injury to an established Community industry;

Whereas the percentage of raw materials used, originating in the African, Caribbean and Pacific States (the ACP States), in the overseas countries and territories (OCT) or in the Community, would confer originating status on the final product, except for one processing operation being carried out in a third country for technical, financial and geographical reasons;

Whereas a derogation is indispensable for the realization of an important investment programme and to enable the company concerned to investigate diversification possibi-

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

By way of derogation from the provisions of Annex II to Decision 86/283/EEC, cigarettes falling within CN code 2402 20 00 shall be considered as originating in the Netherlands' Antilles when they are manufactured there, subject to the conditions set out in this Regulation.

#### Article 2

- 1. The derogation provided for in Article 1 shall relate to an annual global quantity of 216 million cigarettes, exported from the Netherlands' Antilles during the period from 1 January 1991 to 31 December 1993 and obtained from tobacco processed in Brazil.
- 2. The derogation shall be granted subject to the condition that, on an annual basis, at least 70 % in weight of the tobacco manufactured originates in the ACP States, in the OCT or in the Community.
- 3. For the purpose of implementing paragraphs 1 and 2, a proof of origin shall be submitted on import into Brazil by means of a movement certificate EUR. 1 drawn up by the competent authorities of the exporting state for tobacco intended to be processed in Brazil prior to its manufacture as such in the Netherlands' Antilles.
- 4. For each re-export to the Netherlands' Antilles of tobacco processed in Brazil, the exporter shall draw up a declaration in accordance with the layout in the Annex.

The declaration shall be authenticated by the 'Carteira de Comercio Exterio do Banco do Brasil SA' subject to compliance with the conditions laid down in paragraphs 2 and 3,

This declaration shall be submitted to the authorities in the Netherlands' Antilles which are competent for issuing movement certificates EUR. 1.

# Article 3

- 1. The competent authorities of the Netherlands' Antilles shall carry out quantitative checks on exports as referred to in Article 2 (1) and shall forward to the Commission every three months a statement of the quantities in respect of which movement certificates EUR. I have been issued on the basis of this Regulation.
- 2. Not later than three months after the end of each year of application of the derogation, the aforementioned authorities shall also forward to the Commission a statement of the quantities of tobacco imported, with the references to the EUR. 1 certificates presented in Brazil

and to the declarations referred to respectively in Article 2 (3) and (4).

#### Article 4

- 1. This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.
- 2. It shall apply only where the government of the Netherlands' Antilles and the 'Carteira de Comercio Exterior do Banco do Brasil SA' have undertaken to comply with the terms of this Regulation and to provide the administrative cooperation between themselves and with the Community in order to ensure the correct issue and verification of the relevant documentation.
- 3. Notwithstanding Article 2, this Regulation shall cease to apply at the latest on the date of expiry of Decision 86/283/EEC or of any equivalent trade provisions which may replace that Decision.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member

#### fixing the import levies on cereals and on wheat or rye flour, groats and meal

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organization of the market in cereals (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1340/90 (2), and in particular Article 13 (5) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85 of 11 June 1985 on the value of the unit of account and the exchange rates to be applied for the purposes of the common agricultural policy (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2205/90 (4), and in particular Article 3 thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas the import levies on cereals, wheat and rye flour, and wheat groats and meal were fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1801/90 (5) and subsequent amending Regulations;

Whereas, if the levy system is to operate normally, levies should be calculated on the following basis:

- in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last paragraph of Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85,

— for the other currencies, an exchange rate based on an average of the ecu rates published in the Official Journal of the European Communities, C series, over a period to be determined, multiplied by the coefficient referred to in the preceding indent;

Whereas these exchange rates being those recorded on 9 October 1990;

Whereas the aforesaid corrective factor affects the entire calculation basis for the levies, including the equivalence coefficients;

Whereas it follows from applying the detailed rules contained in Regulation (EEC) No 1801/90 to today's offer prices and quotations known to the Commission that the levies at present in force should be altered to the amounts set out in the Annex hereto,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

The import levies to be charged on products listed in Article 1 (a), (b) and (c) of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 11 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas the premiums to be added to the levies on cereals and malt were fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1802/90 (5) and subsequent amending Regula-

Whereas, if the levy system is to operate normally, levies should be calculated on the following basis:

- in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last paragraph of Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85,

 for the other currencies, an exchange rate based on an average of the ecu rates published in the Official Journal of the European Communities, C series, over a period to be determined, multiplied by the coefficient referred to in the preceding indent;

Whereas these exchange rates being those recorded on 9 October 1990;

Whereas, on the basis of today's cif prices and cif forward delivery prices, the premiums at present in force, which are to be added to the levies, should be altered to the amounts set out in the Annex hereto,

#### HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

- The premiums referred to in Article 15 of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 to be added to the import levies fixed in advance in respect of cereals and malt coming from Portugal shall be zero.
- The premiums referred to in Article 15 of Regulation (EEC) No 2727/75 to be added to the import levies fixed in advance in respect of cereals and malt coming from third countries shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 11 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

# fixing the export refunds on white sugar and raw sugar exported in its unaltered state

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81 of 30 June 1981 on the common organization of the markets in the sugar sector (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1069/89 (2), and in particular point (a) of the first subparagraph of Article 19 (4) thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas Article 19 of Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81 provides that the difference between quotations or prices on the world market for the products listed in Article 1 (1) (a) of that Regulation and prices for those products within the Community may be covered by an export refund;

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) No 766/68 of 18 June 1968 laying down general rules for granting export refunds on sugar (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1489/76 (4), provides that when refunds on white and raw sugar, undenatured and exported in its unaltered state are being fixed account must be taken of the situation on the Community and world markets in sugar and in particular of the price and cost factors set out in Article 3 of that Regulation; whereas the same Article provides that the economic aspect of the proposed exports should also be taken into account;

Whereas the refund on raw sugar must be fixed in respect of the standard quality; whereas the latter is defined in Article 1 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 431/68 of 9 April 1968 determining the standard quality for raw sugar and fixing the Community frontier crossing point for calculating cif prices for sugar (5); whereas, furthermore, this refund should be fixed in accordance with Article 5 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 766/68; whereas candy sugar is defined in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 394/70 of 2 March 1970 on detailed rules for granting export refunds on sugar (6), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1714/88 (7); whereas the refund thus calculated for sugar containing added flavouring or colouring matter must apply to their sucrose content and, accordingly, be fixed per 1 % of the said content;

Whereas the world market situation or the specific requirements of certain markets may make it necessary to vary the refund for sugar according to destination;

Whereas, in special cases, the amount of the refund may be fixed by other legal instruments;

Whereas, if the refund system is to operate normally, refunds should be calculated on the following basis:

- in the case of currencies which are maintained in relation to each other at any given moment within a band of 2,25 %, a rate of exchange based on their central rate, multiplied by the corrective factor provided for in the last subparagraph of Article 3 (1) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 1676/85 (8), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2205/90 (°),
- for the other currencies, an exchange rate based on an average of the ecu rates published in the Official Journal of the European Communities, C series, over a period to be determined, multiplied by the coefficient referred to in the preceding indent;

Whereas the refund must be fixed every two weeks; whereas it may be altered in the intervening period;

Whereas it follows from applying the rules set out above to the present situation on the market in sugar and in particular to quotations or prices for sugar within the Community and on the world market that the refund should be as set out in the Annex hereto;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Sugar,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

The export refunds on the products listed in Article 1 (1) (a) of Regulation (EEC) No 1785/81, undenatured and exported in the natural state, are hereby fixed to the amounts shown in the Annex hereto.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 11 October 1990.

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

The unit values provided for in Article 1 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1577/81 are hereby established as set out in the table in the Annex hereto.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 12 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

#### of 8 October 1990

amending Regulation (EEC) No 4128/87 which lavs down conditions for the entry of certain types of tobacco falling within subheadings 2401 10 10 to 2401 10 49 and 2401 20 10 to 2401 20 49 of the combined nomenclature

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2658/87 of 23 July 1987 on the tariff and statistical nomenclature and on the Common Customs Tariff (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2472/90 (2) and in particular Article 11 thereof,

Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 4128/87 (3), as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3885/88 (4), laid down conditions for the entry of flue-cured Virginia type, light air-cured Burley type (including Burley hybrids), light air-cured Maryland type and fire-cured tobacco, falling within subheadings 2401 10 10 to 2401 10 49 and 2401 20 10 to 2401 20 49 of the combined nomenclature, whereas these conditions include the presentation of a certificate of authenticity complying with the requirements laid down in this Regulation, whereas the said certificate can only be issued in accordance with Article 5 paragraph 1 of the aforementioned Regulation by an issuing authority appearing on the list in Annex II of the same Regulation;

Whereas it is suitable to include in Annex II the issuing authority recognized by the Swiss Confederation which satisfies the requirements laid down in Article 6 of Regulation (EEC) No 4128/87;

Whereas, also it is suitable to include in the said Annex II, at the request of the Argentinian Republic, the

'Camara de Comercio Exterior de Misiones' which satisfies the requirements laid down in Article 6 of the said Regulation;

Whereas in the interests of clarity and in order to facilitate the work of economic operators and of customs administrations there is a need to replace the abovementioned Annex II by a new Annex which includes the amendments arising from the corrigendum which appeared in Official Journal of the European Communities No L 157 of 24 June 1988 as well as the abovementioned Regulation (EEC) No 3885/88;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Nomenclature Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

Annex II to Regulation (EEC) No 4128/87 is replaced by the Annex to this Regulation.

## Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the 21st day after its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

# **COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2919/90**

of 10 October 1990

fixing for Great Britain the level of the variable slaughter premium for sheep and the amounts to be charged on products leaving region 1

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 of 25 September 1989 on the common organization of the market in sheepmeat and goatmeat (1),

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84 of 8 June 1984 laying down detailed rules for applying the variable slaughter premium for sheep and repealing Regulation (EEC) No 2661/80(2), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1075/89 (3), and in particular Articles 3 (1) and 4 (1) thereof,

Whereas the United Kingdom is the only country which grants the variable slaughter premium, in region 5, within the meaning of Article 22 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 whereas it is necessary therefore for the Commission to fix, for the week beginning 17 September 1990, the level of the premium and the amount to be charged on products leaving that region;

Whereas Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84 stipulates that the level of the variable slaughter premium is to be fixed each week by the Commission;

Whereas Article 4 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84 lays down that the amount to be charged on products leaving region 1 shall be fixed weekly by the Commis-

Whereas in the Annex to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3618/89 of 1 December 1989 on the application of the guarantee limitation arrangements for sheepmeat and goatmeat (4) the weekly amounts of the guide level are set out pursuant to Article 25 of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89;

Whereas, pursuant to the provisions of Article 24 (2) and (3) of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89, for the week beginning 17 September 1990, the variable slaughter premium for sheep certified as eligible in the United Kingdom is to be in accordance with the amounts fixed in the Annexes hereto; whereas, for that week, in the light of the Judgment of the Court of Justice of 9 February 1988 in Case 61/86, the provisions of Article 9 (5) of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 and of Article 4 of Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84 lead to the amounts to be charged on products, leaving region 12, being fixed in accordance with those Annexes;

Whereas, as regards the controls necessary for the application of the provisions relating to the said amounts, the system of controls provided for by Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84 should be maintained without prejudice to the preparation of any more specific provisions;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

For sheep or sheepmeat certified as eligible in the United Kingdom in region 1, within the meaning of Article 22 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89, for the variable slaughter premium during the week beginning 17 September 1990, the level of the premium is fixed at ECU 83,778 per 100 kilograms of estimated or actual dressed carcase weight within the limits laid down by Article 1 (1) (b) of Regulation (EEC) No 1633/84.

#### Article 2

For products referred to in Article 1 (a) and (c) of Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 which left the territory of region 1 during the week beginning 17 September 1990, the amounts to be charged shall be equivalent to those fixed in the Annexes hereto.

# Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply with effect from 17 September 1990.

## **COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2920/90**

of 10 October 1990

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1062/87 on provisions for the implementation of the Community transit procedure and for certain simplifications of that procedure

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 222/77 of 13 December 1976 on Community transit (1) as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 474/90 (2), and in particular Article 57 thereof,

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1062/87 (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1429/90 (4), contains, inter alia, provisions peculiar to the Community transit procedure for the carriage of goods by rail as well as provisions relating to the document used to establish the Community status of goods which are not transported under the internal Community transit procedure;

Whereas, because of the development of road-rail transport and for the purposes of such development it has appeared necessary to provide that, in agreement with the railways, the latter assume liability for the payment of duties and other charges in certain situations peculiar to this type of transport;

Whereas it has been found useful, in the light of the progressive completion of the internal market to simplify the means of establishing the Community status of goods by allowing the use of commercial documents for this purpose;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Committee on the Movement of Goods,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1062/87 is amended as follows:

1. Article 1 (7) is replaced by the following:

'Without prejudice to the provisions of Article 96a, the document referred to in Article 6 (3) of Regulation (EEC) No 678/85, which certifies the Community

status of goods which are not being moved under the internal Community transit procedure, shall be drawn up on a form which conforms to copy 4 of the specimen in Annex I to Regulation (EEC) No 679/85 or to copy 4/5 of the specimen in Annex II to the said Regulation.'

2. After Article 61, the following subtitle and Article 61 (a) are inserted:

#### 'Combined road-rail transport

Article 61a

Where a consignment of goods being carried by combined road-rail transport under cover of one or more Community transit documents is accepted by the railways in a rail terminal and is loaded on wagons, the railway authorities shall assume liability for payment of duties and other charges where offences or irregularities occur during the journey by rail, if there is no valid guarantee in the country where the offence or irregularity has occurred or is deemed to have occurred, and if it is not possible to recover such amounts from the principal.'

3. After Article 96, Chapter III comprising Articles 96a and 96b, is inserted:

#### 'CHAPTER III:

#### USE OF A DOCUMENT OTHER THAN THE DOCU-MENT T 2 L

Article 96a

- Without prejudice to the conditions set out in Articles 82 and 83, the Community status of goods shall be established under the conditions referred to in this Article, by the production of an invoice, or a transport document.
- The invoice or transport document referred to in paragraph 1 must include at least the full name and address of the consignor/exporter or the declarant where the declarant is not the consigner/exporter, the quantity, kind, marks and numbers of the packages, the description of the goods and the gross mass in kilograms and, where necessary, the numbers of the containers.

The declarant must indicate clearly on the invoice or transport document the symbol T 2 L, accompanied by his signature.

- 3. Where the person concerned wishes to benefit from the provisions of this Article, the invoice or transport document duly filled in and signed by the person concerned shall, on his application, be authenticated by the customs authorities of the Member State of departure. That authentification must include the references contained in Article 84 (2) (a).
- 4. If the total value of the Community goods covered by the invoice or transport document filled in and signed in accordance with paragraph 2, does not exceed ECU 4 800 the person concerned is not required to present that invoice or transport document for authentification by the customs authorities of the Member State of departure.

In the case referred to in the first subparagraph, the invoice or transport document must include, in addition to the information set out in paragraph 2, the office of the Member State of departure.

5. The provisions of this Article shall apply only where the invoice or transport document covers solely Community goods and do not apply to cases covered by Article 88.

Article 96b

As far as the authorized consignor referred to in Article 89 is concerned, the provisions of Chapter II shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the invoice or transport document used to establish the community status of goods in accordance with the provisions of Article 96a (1), (2) and (5).

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 March 1991.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States

## COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2921/90

#### of 10 October 1990

on aid for the production of casein and caseinates from skimmed milk

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 804/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in milk and milk products (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3879/89 (2), and in particular Articles 11 (3) and 28 thereof,

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) No 987/68 (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1435/90 (4), lays down general rules on aid for the processing of skimmed milk into casein and caseinates; whereas detailed provisions for the application of these rules were adopted in Commission Regulation (EEC) No 756/70 (5), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2832/90 (6);

Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 756/70 contains a number of provisions on final use verification of casein and caseinates in connection with the application of Article 2 (4) of Regulation (EEC) No 987/68; whereas pursuant to Article 6 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2204/90 (7) the latter provision will no longer be applicable from 15 October 1990; whereas the relevant provisions of Regulation (EEC) No 756/70 should therefore be repealed with effect from that date;

Whereas experience indicates that provisions on surveillance, in particular with regard to the frequency and type of inspection to be carried out on the spot and on the penalties for non-compliance with the conditions laid down for the granting of aid, should be specified; whereas in view of the abovementioned changes to be made in the aid arrangements the detailed rules of application should be regrouped in a new Regulation and Regulation (EEC) No 756/70 repealed;

Whereas the Management Committee for Milk and Milk Products has not delivered an opinion within the time limit set by its chairman,

- Aid shall be granted to producers of casein and caseinates only if these products

Article 1

- have been produced from skimmed milk of Community origin or raw casein extracted from milk of Community origin,
- meet the composition requirements of Annex I, II or
- are packaged as stipulated in Article 3.
- Aid shall be paid on the basis of a written application to the competent authority stating:
- (i) the producer's name and address,
- (ii) the quantity of casein or caseinates covered by the application and its quality,
- (iii) the relevant production batch numbers.
- For the purposes of this Regulation a production batch must consist of products of identical quality made on the same day. However, where the total production of casein and caseinates of the establishment concerned during the previous calendar year did not exceed 1 000 tonnes, the production batch may consist of products made during the same calendar week.

# Article 2

- The aid per 100 kilograms of skimmed milk processed into casein or caseinates as indicated in paragraph 2 shall be ECU 7,94.
- For calculation of the aid it shall be considered that:
- (a) one kilogram of acid casein as defined in Annex I was produced from 32,17 kilograms of skimmed milk;
- (b) one kilogram of:
  - caseinate as defined in Annex I
    - or
  - rennet-casein as defined in Annex I
  - acid casein as defined in Annex II

was produced from 33,97 kilograms of skimmed milk;

- (c) one kilogram of:
  - rennet-casein as defined in Annex II
  - caseinate as defined in Annex II was produced from 35,77 kilograms of skimmed milk;
- (d) one kilogram of casein as defined in Annex III was produced from 24,97 kilograms of skimmed milk;
- (e) one kilogram of caseinate as defined in Annex III was produced from 28,57 kilograms of skimmed milk.
- 3. Aid shall be granted at the rate applicable on the day of production of the casein or caseinates.
- 4. The aid shall be converted into national currency using the representative rate applicable on the day of production of the casein or caseinates.

#### Article 3

Containers and packages of caseins and caseinates must show:

(a) the description of the product and either the minimum or maximum or the actual percentage content of components indicated in Annexes I, II and III. The description to be shown for products referred to in Annex III is the following, as appropriate:

'Casein/caseinates containing more than 5 % but not more than 17 %, calculated on the total with protein content, of simultaneously precipitated milk protein other than casein';

- (b) the words 'Regulation (EEC) No 2921/90';
- (c) the production batch number.

#### Article 4

- 1. Producers may not receive the aid unless they:
- (a) keep monthly abstracts of the quantities of milk and milk products, including casein and caseinates, delivered, produced, used and disposed of;
- (b) submit to surveillance by the competent authority.
- 2. Monthly abstracts referred to in paragraph 1 (a) shall cover at least the following:
- (a) entries of milk and cream;
- (b) purchases of raw casein;
- (c) purchases of casein and caseinates;
- (d) quantities of casein and caseinates produced, identified by production batch number, with date of production;
- (e) quantities of other milk products produced;
- (f) quantities of casein and caseinates sold, with date of sale and name and address of the recipient;

(g) losses, samples and quantities returned and replaced of milk, milk products, casein and caseinates.

The abstracts shall be supported in particular by delivery notes, invoices and the undertaking's records.

#### Article 5

1. To ensure that the provisions of this Regulation are complied with Member States shall carry out unannounced on-the-spot inspections to be decided on the basis of the establishment's production schedule. At least one inspection per period of seven production days shall be made.

The inspections shall involve the taking of samples from each production batch and shall cover the conditions of production, quantity and composition of the casein and caseinates produced.

2. The inspection referred to in paragraph 1 shall be supplemented, at intervals depending on the quantity of casein and caseinates produced, by thorough scrutiny and sampling in order to reconcile the information given in the aid application and the monthly abstract referred to in Article 4 with relevant commercial documents and product stocks actually held.

These further checks must cover at least 25 % of the total quantity covered by aid applications and each establishment must be checked at least once every six months.

- 3. Should
- (a) significant irregularities affecting 5 % or more of the aid operations checked,
- (b) significant discrepancies by comparison with the recipient's previous operations

be discovered, the Member State shall intensify the inspection operations provided for in paragraph 2 and immediately inform the Commission.

- 4. Member States shall recover sums wrongly paid out, plus interest. The interest rates to be applied shall be those fixed pursuant to Article 3 or 4 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 411/88 (') and shall be calculated from the date of payment of the aid.
- 5. Except in cases of *force majeure*, if a check reveals that the aid applied for or paid is higher than that actually due under the provisions of this Regulation:
- it shall be reduced by 15% if the difference is less than 8% and by 50% if the difference is between 8% and 20%. If it has already been paid, 15% or 50% of the amount, as appropriate, must be repaid,
- no aid shall be granted, or all aid shall be repaid, if the difference is more than 20 %.

6. If the check shows that the difference referred to in paragraph 5 stems from an error in the application made either deliberately or by gross negligence, the applicant shall be debarred from aid for six months from the date of notification of such exclusion.

# Article 6

Regulation (EEC) No 756/70 is hereby repealed.

Securities lodged under the second indent of the first subparagraph of Article 4 (1) (b) of that Regulation shall be released as soon as the Member State has introduced the control arrangements specified in Article 3 of Regulation (EEC) No 2204/90 and issued the authorizations specified in Article 1 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2742/90 (1) and for those quantities which, on 14

October 1990, have not yet reached the destinations specified in the second and third indents of the first paragraph of Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 756/70. Where the above destinations have been reached by 14 October 1990, the parties concerned may request the immediate release of the securities by submitting an application accompanied by supporting documents fulfilling the conditions laid down in Article 12 or 20 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 569/88 (2).

#### Article 7

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply to casein and caseinates produced from 15 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

#### ANNEX IV

#### CONTROL

#### (a) Method of analysis

For the purpose of applying this Regulation, the reference methods set out in the first Commission Directive 85/503/EEC of 25 October 1985 on methods of analysis for edible caseins and caseinates as listed below are binding:

- 1. determination of moisture content (expressed as water),
- 2. determination of protein content (proteins),
- 3. determination of titratable acidity (free acidity),
- 4. determination of ash (including P2O5).

#### (b) Definitions

#### 1. Fat content

'Fat content' means the quantity of total substance obtained by the Schmid-Bondzjnski-Ratzlaff method or the Röse-Gottlieb method, expressed as a percentage weight.

#### 2. Milk protein content other than casein

'Milk protein content other than casein' means the content determined by measuring the -SH and -S-S- groups linked with proteins, the reference values being 0,25 % and 3 % respectively for pure casein and whey protein.

#### 3. Lactose content

'Lactose content' means the content determined by colour reaction with a solution of sulphuric phenol after breakdown of the product in a medium of sodium bicarbonate and after separation of the whey by precipitation of the protein in an acid medium.

#### 4. Total bacterial count

'Total bacterial count' means the content determined by counting the colonies developed on a culture medium after incubation for 72 hours at a temperature of 30 °C.

#### 5. Coliforms

'Absence of coliforms' in 0,1 grams of the product means the negative reaction obtained on a culture medium after incubation for 24 hours at a temperature of 30 °C.

#### 6. Thermophilic bacterial count

'Thermophilic bacterial count' means the content determined by counting the colonies developed on a culture medium after incubation for 48 hours at a temperature of 55 °C.

#### (c) Sampling

Samples shall be taken in accordance with the procedure laid down in International Standard ISO 707; however, Member States may use another method of sampling provided that it complies with the principles of the abovementioned standard.

- The final date for the submission of tenders for the last partial invitation to tender shall be 29 November 1990.

### **COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2927/90**

#### of 10 October 1990

### amending the export refunds on oil seeds

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation No 136/66/EEC of 22 September 1966 on the establishment of a common organization of the market in oils and fats (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2902/89 (2),

Having regard to Council Regulation No 142/67/EEC of 21 June 1967 on export refunds on colza, rape and sunflower seeds (3), as last amended by the Act of Accession of Greece, and in particular the second sentence of Article 2 (3) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1678/85 of 11 June 1985 fixing the conversion rates to be applied in agriculture (4), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2929/90 (5),

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1569/72 of 20 July 1972 laying down special measures for colza, rape and sunflower seed (6), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2206/90 (7), and in particular Article 2 (3) thereof,

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2041/75 of 25 July 1975 on special detailed rules for the application of the system of import and export licences and advance fixing certificates for oils and fats (8), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2662/87 (9), and in particular Article 13 thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas, the target price and the monthly increases in the target price for colza, rape and sunflower seed for the 1990/91 marketing year were fixed by Regulations (EEC) No 1317/90 (10) and (EEC) No 1318/90 (11);

Whereas the prices fixed by the Council are to be reduced in accordance with Article 2 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 784/90 of 29 March 1990 fixing the reducing coefficient for agricultural prices in the 1990/91 marketing year as a result of the monetary realignment of 5 January 1990 and amending the prices and amounts fixed in ecus for that marketing year (12);

Whereas Article 28 of Regulation No 136/66/EEC provides that a refund may be granted on exports to third countries of oil seeds harvested within the Community; whereas the amount of this refund may not exceed the difference between prices within the Community and prices on the world market where the former are higher than the latter; whereas Article 21 of Regulation No 136/66/EEC provides that, at present, Article 28 of that Regulation applies only to colza, rape and sunflower seeds;

Whereas the refund for colza and rape seeds produced in Spain or Portugal is adjusted in accordance with Council Regulation (EEC) No 478/86 (13);

Whereas Article 3 of Regulation No 142/67/EEC provides that when the refund is being calculated account must be taken of prices ruling on the various Community markets which are representative from the point of view of processing and exportation; the most favourable quotations recorded on the various markets of importing third countries and costs incurred in placing the goods on the world market; whereas, when the amount of the refund is being fixed, account must also be taken of the level of market prices within the Community for the oil seeds referred to in Article 21 of Regulation No 136/66/EEC and the future trend of these prices; whereas, furthermore, account should be taken of the economic aspect of the proposed exports and the situation in the Community regarding the supply of and demand for these seeds;

Whereas the abatement of the subsidy for colza and tape seed wich arises from the system of maximum guaranteed quantities for the 1990/91 marketing year has been fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2509/90 (14);

Whereas Article 1 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 651/71 of 29 March 1971 on certain detailed rules for the application of export refunds on oil seeds (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1815/84(2), provides that the amount of the refund must be calculated on the basis of the weight of exported seeds; whereas this weight must be adjusted to take account of any differences between the percentages of moisture and impurities found to exist and those used to define the standard quality for which the target price is fixed; whereas, when this adjustment is being made, the weight of the exported seeds must be increased by the amount of the difference between the actual moisture and impurities content and that used to define the standard quality if the former is lower than the latter; whereas, if the opposite applies, the weight of the exported seeds must be reduced by the same amount;

Whereas the standard quality referred to above was defined in Article 2 of Council Regulation (EEC) No  $1102/84(^3);$ 

Whereas Article 2 of Regulation No 142/67/EEC provides that the refund may be varied according to destination where the world market situation or the specific requirements of certain markets make this necessary;

Whereas Article 4 of Regulation (EEC) No 651/71 provides for the publication of the amount of the final refund obtained from the conversion into each of the national currencies of the amount of the refund in ecus plus or minus the differential amount; whereas Article 1 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1813/84 (4), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1539/90 (5), defined the elements which determine the differential amounts; whereas these elements are equal to the incidence on the target price reduced by 7,5 % or the refund of the coefficient derived from the percentage referred to in Article 2 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1569/72; whereas, according to these provisions, this percentage represents:

- (a) for those Member States whose currencies are maintained as between themselves within a spread at any given moment of 2,25 %, the difference between:
  - the conversion rate used under the common agricultural policy, and
  - the conversion rate resulting from the central rate of the correcting factor referred to in Article 6 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1677/85 (16) as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2205/90 (17).

  - the agricultural conversion rate, and
  - the average rate of the ecu as published in the C Series of the Official Journal of the European Communities during a period to be determined, multiplied by the factor referred to in the second indent of (a).

Whereas pursuant to Article 2 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 1569/72 forward differential amounts are to be determined where the forward exchange rate for one or more currencies differs from the spot rate by at least a given percentage; whereas this percentage has been fixed at 0,5 by Regulation (EEC) No 1813/84;

Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 1813/84 specifies the spot and forward exchange rates and the period to be used for calculating the differential amounts; whereas in cases where, for one or more months, quotations of forward exchange rates are not available, the rates adopted for the previous months or the following months, as the case may be, must be used;

Whereas it follows from applying these provisions to the current situation of the oil seeds market and to the rates or prices of these products that, pursuant to Article 4 of Regulation (EEC) No 651/71, the amount of the refund in ecus and the amount of the final refund in each of the national currencies must, in the case of colza and rape seed, be fixed in accordance with the Annex to this Regulation; whereas it is not necessary to fix a refund for sunflower seed;

Whereas Article 13 of Regulation (EEC) No 2041/75 makes provision for the period of validity of certificates fixing refunds in advance to be reduced if the market situation warrants; whereas in the interests of sound market management a reduction should be made,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

- In the case of colza and rape seed, the amounts of the refund referred to in Article 4 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 651/71 shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.
- There shall be no refund on sunflower seed.
- Certificates fixing the export refund in advance shall be valid from their date of issue until the end of the following month.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 11 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1491/85 of 23 May 1985 laying down special measures in respect of soya beans (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2217/88 (2), and in particular Article 2 (7) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation 2286/88 of 19 July 1988 providing for the granting of special aid for soya beans produced and processed in Portugal (3),

Wheareas the abatement of the subsidy which arises, where appropriate, from the system of maximum guaranteed quantities for the 1990/91 marketing year, has not yet been fixed; whereas the amount of the subsidy for the 1990/91 marketing year has been calculated provisionally on the basis of the abatement for the 1989/90 marketing year;

Whereas the amount of the aid referred to in Article 2(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 1491/85 was fixed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2534/90 (4), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2815/90 (5);

Whereas it follows from applying the rules and other provisions contained in Regulation (EEC) No 2534/90 to the information at present available to the Commission that the amount of the aid at present in force should be altered as set out in this Regulation,

#### HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

- The amount of the aid provided in article 2 for in Regulation (EEC) No 1491/85 and the amount of the special aid provided for in Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 2286/88 in the case of Portugal shall be as set out in the Annex hereto.
- However, the amount of the subsidy in the case of advance fixing for the 1990/91 marketing year for soya beans, will be confirmed or replaced as from 11 October 1990 to take into account the application of maximum guaranteed quantities for the 1990/91 marketing year.

### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 11 October 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES. Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1677/85 of 11 June 1985 on monetary compensatory amounts in agriculture (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2205/90 (2), and in particular Articles 6 (2) and 6a (2) thereof,

Whereas the agricultural conversion rates currently applicable were fixed by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1678/85 (3), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2496/90 (4);

Whereas, where the currency exchange rates are realigned within the European Monetary System, Article 6 of Regulation (EEC) No 1677/85 stipulates that, under the procedure laid down in Article 12 of that Regulation, the Member States' agricultural conversion rates must be adapted in such a way as to eliminate, in stages, newly created monetary gaps; whereas pursuant to Article 6a of

that Regulation, the agricultural conversion rate of a Member State for the pigmeat product sector is to be adapted so as to avoid, within certain limits, the application of new monetary compensatory amounts;

Whereas, as a result of the currency realignment of 6 October 1990 and having due regard to the provisions of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3578/88 of 17 November 1988 laying down detailed rules for the application of the arrangements for the automatic dismantling of negative monetary compensatory amounts (3), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1848/90 (°), new agricultural conversion rates must be fixed; whereas, to facilitate the establishment of the agricultural conversion rates resulting from the automatic dismantling arrangements, and without prejudice to any changes resulting from Council decisions or developments relating to currency exchange rates, the reductions in the monetary gaps to be calculated on the basis of the market rates applicable on 11 October 1990 should be specified:

### **COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 2930/90**

#### of 10 October 1990

on the date of public announcement of new agricultural conversion rates

#### THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3155/85 of 11 November 1985 providing for the advance fixing of monetary compensatory amounts (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3247/89 (2), and in particular the last subparagraph of Article 6 (3) thereof,

Whereas monetary compensatory amounts fixed in advance are adjusted if a new agricultural conversion rate comes into effect that was publicly announced before the application for advanced fixing was lodged; whereas the date of public announcement of the new agricultural conversion rates resulting from the automatic dismantling of the gaps newly created by the monetary realignment announced by press release on 6 October 1990 must be fixed;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the relevant management committees,

#### HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

### Article 1

In the case of the monetary realignment of 6 October 1990 the date of public announcement referred to in Article 6 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 3155/85 shall be 8 October 1990.

#### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
