COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2024/2001

of 16 October 2001

establishing the standard import values for determining the entry price of certain fruit and vegetables

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EC) No 3223/94 of 21 December 1994 on detailed rules for the application of the import arrangements for fruit and vegetables (¹), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1498/98 (²), and in particular Article 4(1) thereof,

Whereas:

(1) Regulation (EC) No 3223/94 lays down, pursuant to the outcome of the Uruguay Round multilateral trade negotiations, the criteria whereby the Commission fixes the standard values for imports from third countries, in respect of the products and periods stipulated in the Annex thereto.

(2) In compliance with the above criteria, the standard import values must be fixed at the levels set out in the Annex to this Regulation,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The standard import values referred to in Article 4 of Regulation (EC) No 3223/94 shall be fixed as indicated in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 17 October 2001.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2025/2001

of 16 October 2001

amending Regulation (EC) No 1663/95 laying down detailed rules for the application of Council Regulation (EEC) No 729/70 regarding the procedure for the clearance of the accounts of the **EAGGF Guarantee Section**

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 1258/1999 of 17 May 1999 on the financing of the common agricultural policy (1), and in particular Article 4(8), Article 6(2) and Article 7(5) thereof,

Whereas:

- Article 9(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1258/1999 and (1) Article 2(2) of Commission Regulation (EC) No 2390/ 1999 of 25 October 1999 laying down detailed rules of the application of Regulation (EC) No 1663/95 as regards the form and content of the accounting information that the Member States must hold at the disposal of the Commission for the purposes of the clearance of the EAGGF Guarantee Section accounts (2), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1863/2001 (3), require the Member States to make accounting information available to the Commission on request of the latter. Article 4(1) of Commission Regulation (EC) No 1663/95 of 7 July 1995 laying down detailed rules for the application of Council Regulation (EEC) No 729/70 regarding the procedure for the clearance of the accounts of the EAGGF Guarantee Section (4), as last amended by Regulation (EC) 2245/1999 (5), should be adapted to these rules.
- (2) The requirements for reporting on amounts to be recovered in the annual declaration pursuant to Article 5 of Regulation (EC) 1663/95, on the one hand, and in the monthly accounts pursuant to Article 3(6a) of Commission Regulation (EC) No 296/96 of 16 February 1996 on data to be transmitted by the Member States and the monthly booking of expenditure financed under the Guarantee Section of the European Agricultural Guidance and Guarantee Fund (EAGGF) (6), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1934/2001 (7), on the other hand, are different. These requirements should be

harmonised by amending Article 5(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1663/95 accordingly.

- Pursuant to Article 5(2) of Council Regulation (EC) No 1259/1999 of 17 May 1999 establishing common rules for direct support schemes under the common agricultural policy (8), as amended by Regulation (EC) No 1244/ 2001 (9), Member States may use the amounts released by the reductions or cancellations of payments under Articles 3 and 4 of that Regulation for certain measures within the framework of aid for rural development. The amounts thus retained from the aid payments must be credited to a specific account opened for each paying agency or on a specific unique account opened at the level of the Member State and intended exclusively for the financing of the additional Community support. This account should also be part of the annual accounts within the meaning of Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EC) No 1663/95.
- The guidelines for criteria for accreditation as a paying agency in respect of the processing of claims by means of a computer system should be updated in the light of developments in computer processing.
- The measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Fund Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Regulation (EC) No 1663/95 is amended as follows:

- 1. In Article 2(1), the last indent of the first subparagraph and the first sentence of the second subparagraph are deleted.
- 2. In Article 2(3), the words 'paragraph 1' are replaced by the words 'Article 4(1)c of this Regulation'.
- 3. The following text is added at the end of Article 4(1):
 - '(c) a full record of all accounting information required for statistical and control purposes in the form and of the content established on the basis of Article 2(3) of this Regulation.'

- 4. Article 4(2) is replaced by the following text:
 - '2. The documents and the accounting information referred to in paragraph 1 shall be sent to the Commission by 10 February of the year following the end of the financial year which it concerns. The documents referred to in points (a) and (b) of paragraph 1 shall be sent in four copies or, alternatively, in one copy together with an electronic copy.'
- 5. Article 5(1) is replaced by the following text:
 - '1. The accounts referred to in Article 4(1)(a) shall include:
 - (a) the expenditure summarised by item and subitem of the Community budget;
 - (b) a table of differences, by item and subitem, between the expenditure declared in the annual declaration and that declared in the monthly declaration for the same period in the document referred to in Article 3(5) of Regulation (EC) No 296/96. This must be accompanied by an explanation for each difference by subitem;
 - (c) the table, for the end of the financial year, referred to in Article 3(6a)(a) of Regulation (EC) No 296/96;
 - (d) a summary of intervention operations and a statement of the quantity and location of stocks at the end of the financial year;
 - (e) confirmation that the details of each movement of intervention storage is held on the paying agency's files;

- (f) the tables, for the end of the financial year, referred to in Article 3(6a)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 296/96.'
- 6. Point 6(vi) of the Annex is replaced by the following text: The confidentiality, integrity and availability of all computer data should be assured by measures adapted to the administrative structure, staffing and technological environment of each individual paying agency. The financial and technological effort should be in proportion to the actual risks incurred.

In any computer system used, adequate procedures should be in place for:

- (a) general organisation, management and audit,
- (b) physical security,
- (c) logical security,
- (d) systems development, programming and maintenance,
- (e) routine operations,
- (f) telecommunications,
- (g) microcomputers,
- (h) contingency planning,
- (i) application controls.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the seventh day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2026/2001

of 16 October 2001

fixing the rates of the refunds applicable to eggs and egg yolks exported in the form of goods not covered by Annex I to the Treaty

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organisation of the market in eggs (1), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EC) No 1516/96 (2), and in particular Article 8(3) thereof,

Whereas:

- Article 8(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 provides that the difference between prices in international trade for the products listed in Article 1(1) of that Regulation and prices within the Community may be covered by an export refund where these goods are exported in the form of goods listed in the Annex to that Regulation. Whereas Commission Regulation (EC) No 1520/2000 of 13 July 2000 laying down common detailed rules for the application of the system of granting export refunds on certain agricultural products exported in the form of goods not covered by Annex I to the Treaty, and the criteria for fixing the amount of such refunds (3), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1563/2001 (4), specifies the products for which a rate of refund should be fixed, to be applied where these products are exported in the form of goods listed in the Annex to Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75.
- In accordance Article 4(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1520/ (2) 2000, the rate of the refund per 100 kilograms for each of the basic products in question must be fixed for a

- period of the same duration as that for which refunds are fixed for the same products exported unprocessed.
- (3) Article 11 of the Agreement on Agriculture concluded under the Uruguay Round lays down that the export refund for a product contained in a good may not exceed the refund applicable to that product when exported without further processing.
- (4) It is necessary to ensure continuity of strict management taking account of expenditure forecasts and funds available in the budget.
- The measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Poultrymeat and Eggs,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The rates of the refunds applicable to the basic products appearing in Annex A to Regulation (EC) No 1520/2000 and listed in Article 1(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75, exported in the form of goods listed in the Annex I to Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75, are hereby fixed as shown in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 17 October 2001.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2027/2001 of 16 October 2001

fixing the export refunds on eggs

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organization of the market in eggs (¹), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EC) No 1516/96 (²), and in particular Article 8(3) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 provides that the difference between prices on the world market for the products listed in Article 1(1) of that Regulation and prices for those products within the Community may be covered by an export refund.
- (2) The present market situation in certain third countries and that regarding competition on particular third country markets make it necessary to fix a refund differentiated by destination for certain products in the egg sector.

- (3) It follows from applying these rules and criteria to the present situation on the market in eggs that the refund should be fixed at an amount which would permit Community participation in world trade and would also take account of the nature of these exports and their importance at the present time.
- (4) The measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Poultrymeat and Eggs,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The list of codes of products for which, when they are exported, the export refund referred to in Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 is granted, and the amount of that refund shall be as shown in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 17 October 2001.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2771/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organisation of the market in eggs (1), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EC) No 1516/96 (2), and in particular Article 5(4) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2777/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common organisation of the market in poultrymeat (3), as last amended by Commission Regulation (EC) No 2916/95 (4), and in particular Article 5(4) thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2783/75 of 29 October 1975 on the common system of trade for ovalbumin and lactalbumin (5), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 2916/95, and in particular Article 3(4) thereof,

Whereas:

(1) Commission Regulation (EC) No 1484/95 (6), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1835/2001 (7), fixes detailed rules for implementing the system of additional import duties and fixes representative prices in the poultrymeat and egg sectors and for egg albumin.

- It results from regular monitoring of the information providing the basis for the verification of the import prices in the poultrymeat and egg sectors and for egg albumin that the representative prices for imports of certain products should be amended taking into account variations of prices according to origin. Therefore, representative prices should be published.
- It is necessary to apply this amendment as soon as (3) possible, given the situation on the market.
- The measures provided for in this Regulation are in (4) accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Poultrymeat and Eggs,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Annex I to Regulation (EC) No 1484/95 is hereby replaced by the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 17 October 2001.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 2029/2001

of 16 October 2001

setting export refunds on products processed from fruit and vegetables other than those granted for added sugar

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 2201/96 of 28 October 1996 on the common organisation of the market in products processed from fruit and vegetables (1), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 2699/2000 (2), and in particular Article 16(3),

Whereas:

- Commission Regulation (EC) No 1429/95 (3), as last (1) amended by Regulation (EC) No 1962/2001 (4), sets implementing rules for export refunds on products processed from fruit and vegetables.
- Article 16(1) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/96 states that, (2) to the extent necessary to permit exports in economically significant quantities of the products referred to in Article 1(1)(a) of that Regulation, on the basis of prices for those products in international trade, the difference between those prices and prices in the Community may be covered by export refunds; Article 18(4) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/96 provides that, if the refund on sugar incorporated into the products listed in Article 1(1) is insufficient to allow export of the products, the refund fixed in accordance with Article 17 is to be applicable to those products.
- Article 17(2) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/96 states that (3) refunds must be fixed with regard to the existing situation and outlook for prices for products processed from fruit and vegetables on the Community market and supply availability, on the one hand, and prices in international trade on the other hand. Account must also be taken of the costs indicated at (b) in that paragraph and of the economic aspect of the envisaged exports.
- (4) Refunds are, pursuant to Article 16(1) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/96, to be set with due regard to the limits

resulting from agreements concluded in accordance with Article 300 of the Treaty.

- (5) Article 17(3) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/96 states that prices on the Community market are to be determined taking account of those most favourable from the exportation standpoint; whereas international trade prices are to be determined account taken of the prices indicated in the second subparagraph of that paragraph.
- The international trade situation or the special require-(6) ments of certain markets may make it necessary to vary the refund on a given product depending on the destination of that product.
- Economically significant exports can be made at the present time of provisionally preserved cherries, peeled tomatoes, preserved cherries, prepared hazelnuts and some orange juices.
- Application of the rules mentioned above to the present and forecast market situation, in particular to prices of products processed from fruit and vegetables in the Community and in international trade, leads to the refund rates set in the Annex hereto.
- Pursuant to Article 16(2) of Regulation (EC) No 2201/ 96, the most efficient possible use should be made of the resources available without creating discrimination between traders. Therefore, care should be taken not to disturb the trade flows previously induced by the refund arrangements.
- Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3846/87 (5), as last amended by Regulation (EC) No 1502/2001 (6), establishes an agricultural product nomenclature for export refunds.
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 1291/2000 (7) lays (11)down common detailed rules for the application of the system of import and export licences and advance fixing certificates for agricultural products.

amending Council Decision 79/542/EEC drawing up a list of third countries from which the Member States authorise imports of bovine animals, swine, equidae, sheep and goats, fresh meat and meat products, in particular in relation to New Caledonia and the Islands of St Pierre and Miquelon

(notified under document number C(2001) 3080)

(Text with EEA relevance)

(2001/731/EC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 72/462/EEC of 12 December 1972 on health and veterinary inspection problems upon importation of bovine, ovine and caprine animals and swine, fresh meat or meat products from third countries (1), as last amended by Directive 97/79/EC (2), and in particular Article 3 thereof,

Whereas:

- Council Decision 79/542/EEC (3), as last amended by Commission Decision 2001/117/EC (4), draws up a list of third countries from which the Member States authorise imports of bovine animals, swine, equidae, sheep and goats, fresh meat and meat products.
- It is opportune to clarify, with regard to the listing of (2) countries in relation to the different species of live animals covered by the Decision, that the authorisation to import is conditional upon the existence for these countries and for such live animals of Community harmonised health conditions and veterinary certification, laid down in Community legislation under the provisions of Articles 8 and 11 of Council Directive 72/462/EEC. Therefore, it is necessary for transparency that only imports from those countries where harmonised rules have been laid down shall be mentioned in part 1 of the Annex to Decision 79/542/EEC as being authorised.
- Following Community veterinary missions, it appears (3) that New Caledonia and the Islands of St Pierre and Miquelon are covered by sufficiently well-structured and organised veterinary services.
- (4) New Caledonia has during the last 12 months been free from foot-and-mouth disease and rinderpest; no vaccinations have been carried out against any of these diseases for the past 12 months, and the importation of animals vaccinated against foot-and-mouth disease is forbidden.
- (5) New Caledonia can be included on the list of third countries from which Member States authorise the imports of meat from wild animals and can also be

listed for fresh meat and meat products of bovine animals.

- The equine health situation is satisfactorily controlled by (6) the veterinary services of St Pierre and Miquelon and, in particular, the country has been free from African horse sickness and Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis for more than two years, and from dourine and glanders for more than six months.
- St Pierre and Miquelon can be listed for equidae.
- Since the adoption of Commission Decision 2001/ (8) 611/EC of 20 July 2001 amending Decision 92/160/EEC with regard to the regionalisation of Mexico, amending Decisions 92/260/EEC, 93/195/EEC, 93/196/EEC and 93/197/EEC with regard to imports of equidae from Mexico and repealing Decisions 95/392/EC and 96/ 486/EC (5), Member States may again authorise imports of certain categories of equidae from certain areas in Mexico. However, a reference to the regionalisation and to the prohibition on imports of equidae for slaughter was omitted in Decision 79/542/EEC, and this should be clarified.
- Countries appearing in the list being identified according to the ISO codes used by the Community legislation for the nomenclature of countries and territories for the external trade, the provisional status of such codes should be specified whenever appropriate.
- (10)The Annex to Decision 79/542/EEC should be amended accordingly.
- The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing Veterinary Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

Part 1 of the Annex to Decision 79/542/EEC is replaced by the Annex to this Decision.
