COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) No 1262/2014**of 18 November 2014****entering a name in the register of protected designations of origin and protected geographical indications (Pecorino Crotonese (PDO))**

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 1151/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 21 November 2012 on quality schemes for agricultural products and foodstuffs ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 52(2) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Pursuant to Article 50(2)(a) of Regulation (EU) No 1151/2012, Italy's application to register the name 'Pecorino Crotonese' was published in the *Official Journal of the European Union* ⁽²⁾.
- (2) As no statement of opposition under Article 51 of Regulation (EU) No 1151/2012 has been received by the Commission, the name 'Pecorino Crotonese' should therefore be entered in the register,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The name 'Pecorino Crotonese' (PDO) is hereby registered.

The name specified in the first paragraph denotes a product in Class 1.3 Cheeses, as listed in Annex XI to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 668/2014 ⁽³⁾.

COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU) No 1263/2014
of 26 November 2014
providing for temporary exceptional aid to milk producers in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 1308/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 December 2013 establishing a common organisation of the markets in agricultural products and repealing Council Regulations (EEC) No 922/72, (EEC) No 234/79, (EC) No 1037/2001 and (EC) No 1234/2007 ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 219(1) in conjunction with Article 228 thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) On 7 August 2014 the Russian government introduced a ban on import of certain products from the Union to Russia, including milk products. The ban has particularly affected the milk and milk products sectors of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, which are particularly dependent on exports to Russia. In 2013 those three Member States had more than 15 % of their milk production exported to Russia and exports to Russia from those Member States accounted for more than 60 % of their total exports of dairy products to third countries.
- (2) Farm gate milk prices sharply decreased in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania in August and September, while the Union average stayed relatively stable. Compared to last year, September farm gate milk prices are 26-27 % lower in Estonia and Latvia and 33 % lower in Lithuania, while the Union average is only around 5 % lower. Milk prices in the three Baltic Member States are the closest to intervention levels in the Union.
- (3) The fall in farm gate milk prices to unsustainable levels puts in danger the milk production sector in the three Baltic Member States, which in 2014 were in the process of building a sustainable market position. In addition, milk products produced in the Baltic Member States were largely dependent on the Russian market needs and tastes. Time is needed for the sector to find new outlets or to adapt production to new products that could meet demand.
- (4) The milk and milk products sector in the three Baltic Member States is mostly oriented to products other than butter and skimmed milk powder and, therefore, those products are not covered by public intervention and aid for private storage.
- (5) Therefore, in order to address the existing market disturbance caused by a significant price fall efficiently and effectively, it is appropriate to grant aid to the three Baltic Member States in the form of a one-time financial envelope with a view to supporting milk producers who are affected by the Russian import ban and, as a result, encounter liquidity problems.
- (6) The financial envelope available to each Member State concerned should be calculated on the basis of 2013/2014 milk production within national quotas. In order to ensure targeting the support to those producers affected by the ban while taking into account the limited budget resources, the Member States concerned should distribute that national amount on the basis of objective criteria and in a non-discriminatory way, while avoiding any market and competition distortion.
- (7) As the financial envelope allocated to each Member State concerned will compensate only a limited portion of the actual loss suffered by the producers, the Member States concerned should be allowed to grant additional support to milk producers, under the same conditions of objectiveness, non-discrimination and non-distortion of competition.

- (8) As the financial envelope for each Member State concerned is fixed in euro, it is necessary, in order to ensure a uniform and simultaneous application, to fix a date for the conversion of the amount allocated to Lithuania into its national currency. It is therefore appropriate to determine the operative event for the exchange rate in accordance with Article 106 of Regulation (EU) No 1306/2013. In view of the principle referred to in Article 106(2)(b) of Regulation (EU) No 1306/2013 and the criteria laid down in Article 106(5)(c) of that Regulation, the operative event should be the date of the entry into force of this Regulation.
- (9) The aid provided for in this Regulation should be granted as a measure supporting agricultural markets in accordance with Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) No 1306/2013.
- (10) For budgetary reasons, the Union should finance the expenditure incurred by the Member States concerned in relation to the support to milk producers only where such payments are made by a certain deadline.
- (11) In order to ensure transparency and the monitoring and proper administration of the amount available to them, the Member States concerned should inform the Commission of the objective criteria used to determine the methods for granting the support and the provisions taken to avoid distortion of competition.
- (12) In order to ensure that milk producers receive the aid as soon as possible, the Member States concerned should be enabled to implement this Regulation without delay. Therefore, this Regulation should enter into force on the third day following that of its publication,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. Union aid of a total amount of EUR 28 661 259 shall be available to Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania to provide targeted support to milk producers affected by the Russian ban on import of Union products.

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania shall use the amounts available to them as set out in the Annex on the basis of objective and non-discriminatory criteria, provided that the resulting payments do not cause distortion of competition. For this purpose, the Member States concerned shall take into account the extent of the effects of the Russian import ban on the producers concerned.

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania shall make those payments by 30 April 2015 at the latest.

2. In respect of Lithuania, the operative event for the exchange rate as regards the amounts set out in the Annex shall be the date of entry into force of this Regulation.

Article 2

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania may grant additional support to the milk producers receiving the aid referred to in Article 1, up to a maximum equal to their corresponding amount as set out in the Annex, and under the same conditions of objectiveness, non-discrimination and non-distortion of competition.

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania shall pay the additional support by 30 April 2015 at the latest.

Article 3

Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania shall notify the Commission of the following:

- (a) without delay and no later than 31 March 2015, the objective criteria used to determine the methods for granting targeted support and the measures taken to avoid distortion of competition;
- (b) no later than 30 June 2015, the total amounts paid and the number and type of beneficiaries.

Article 4

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following that of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) No 1264/2014**of 26 November 2014****amending Regulation (EU) No 408/2011 implementing Regulation (EC) No 1185/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council concerning statistics on pesticides, as regards transmission format****(Text with EEA relevance)**

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EC) No 1185/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 November 2009 concerning statistics on pesticides ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 5(1) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Regulation (EC) No 1185/2009 establishes a framework for the production of comparable European statistics on the sales and agricultural use of pesticides.
- (2) In accordance with Article 3(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1185/2009 Member States should transmit the statistical data in electronic form, in conformity with an appropriate technical format to be adopted by the Commission.
- (3) Commission Regulation (EU) No 408/2011 ⁽²⁾ does not provide for the transmission format for the pesticide use statistics, due for transmission in 2015, and therefore should be amended.
- (4) The measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the European Statistical System Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Commission Regulation (EU) No 408/2011 is amended as follows:

- (1) Articles 1 and 2 are replaced by the following:

'Article 1

Member States shall transmit the statistical data on pesticides referred to in Annexes I and II to Regulation (EC) No 1185/2009 using the SDMX data structure definitions. The data shall be provided to the Commission (Eurostat) through the single entry point services or the data shall be made available for retrieval by the Commission (Eurostat) by electronic means.

Article 2

The data structure for the transmission on the placing on the market of pesticides to the Commission (Eurostat) shall be as specified in Annex I.

The data structure for the transmission on the agricultural use of pesticides to the Commission (Eurostat) shall be as specified in Annex II.'

- (2) The Annex to Regulation (EU) No 408/2011 is amended as set out in the Annex to this Regulation.

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 1308/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 December 2013 establishing a common organisation of the markets in agricultural products and repealing Council Regulations (EEC) No 922/72, (EEC) No 234/79, (EC) No 1037/2001 and (EC) No 1234/2007 ⁽¹⁾,

Having regard to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 543/2011 of 7 June 2011 laying down detailed rules for the application of Council Regulation (EC) No 1234/2007 in respect of the fruit and vegetables and processed fruit and vegetables sectors ⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 136(1) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Implementing Regulation (EU) No 543/2011 lays down, pursuant to the outcome of the Uruguay Round multilateral trade negotiations, the criteria whereby the Commission fixes the standard values for imports from third countries, in respect of the products and periods stipulated in Annex XVI, Part A thereto.
- (2) The standard import value is calculated each working day, in accordance with Article 136(1) of Implementing Regulation (EU) No 543/2011, taking into account variable daily data. Therefore this Regulation should enter into force on the day of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The standard import values referred to in Article 136 of Implementing Regulation (EU) No 543/2011 are fixed in the Annex to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

COUNCIL DECISION

establishing the position to be adopted on behalf of the European Union in the relevant Committees of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe as regards the proposals for amendments to UN Regulations Nos 4, 6, 11, 13, 13-H, 19, 25, 34, 37, 43, 44, 48, 53, 70, 96, 98, 104, 105, 106, 107, 112, 113, 121, 128, on the new UN Global Technical Regulation on tyres, and on an amendment to Mutual Resolution No 1

(2014/831/EU)

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 114, in conjunction with Article 218(9) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the European Commission,

Whereas:

- (1) In accordance with Council Decision 97/836/EC ⁽¹⁾, the Union acceded to the Agreement of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) concerning the adoption of uniform technical prescriptions for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts which can be fitted to and/or be used on wheeled vehicles and the conditions for reciprocal recognition of approvals granted on the basis of these prescriptions ('Revised 1958 Agreement').
- (2) In accordance with Council Decision 2000/125/EC ⁽²⁾, the Union acceded to the Agreement concerning the establishing of global technical regulations for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts which can be fitted and/or be used on wheeled vehicles ('Parallel Agreement').
- (3) Directive 2007/46/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council ⁽³⁾ replaced the approval systems of the Member States with a Union approval procedure and established a harmonised framework containing administrative provisions and general technical requirements for all new vehicles, systems, components and separate technical units. That Directive incorporated UN regulations in the EU type-approval system, either as requirements for type-approval or as alternatives to Union legislation. Since the adoption of that Directive, UN regulations have increasingly replaced Union legislation in the framework of the EU type-approval.
- (4) In the light of experience and technical developments, the requirements relating to certain elements or features covered by UN Regulations Nos 4, 6, 11, 13, 13-H, 19, 25, 34, 37, 43, 44, 48, 53, 70, 96, 98, 104, 105, 106, 107, 112, 113, 121, 128 need to be adapted.
- (5) In order to harmonise the relevant safety provisions for the type-approval of motor vehicles, the new UN Global Technical Regulation on tyres should be adopted. Also, an amendment to Mutual Resolution No 1 needs to be adopted to reflect technical progress.

COUNCIL DECISION**of 7 November 2014****establishing the position to be adopted on behalf of the European Union in the Administrative Committee of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe on the draft new Regulation on hydrogen and fuel cell vehicles**

(2014/832/EU)

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 114, in conjunction with Article 218(9) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the European Commission,

Whereas:

- (1) By Council Decision 97/836/EC ⁽¹⁾, the Union has acceded to the Agreement of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) concerning the adoption of uniform technical prescriptions for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts which can be fitted to and/or be used on wheeled vehicles and the conditions for reciprocal recognition of approvals granted on the basis of these prescriptions ('Revised 1958 Agreement').
- (2) The standardised requirements of the draft new UNECE Regulation on hydrogen and fuel cell vehicles are intended to remove technical barriers to the trade in motor vehicles and their components between the Contracting Parties to the Revised 1958 Agreement and to ensure that such vehicles and components offer a high level of safety and protection.
- (3) It is appropriate to establish the position to be adopted on the Union's behalf in the Administrative Committee of the Revised 1958 Agreement concerning the adoption of that draft UNECE Regulation,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The position to be adopted on the behalf of the European Union in the Administrative Committee of the Revised 1958 Agreement shall be to vote in favour of the draft new UNECE Regulation on hydrogen and fuel cell vehicles, as contained in document ECE TRANS/ WP.29/2014/78.

Article 2

This Decision shall enter into force on the date of its adoption.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION**of 25 November 2014****concerning certain protective measures in relation to recent outbreaks of highly pathogenic avian influenza of subtype H5N8 in the Netherlands***(notified under document C(2014) 9126)***(Only the Dutch text is authentic)****(Text with EEA relevance)**

(2014/833/EU)

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Council Directive 89/662/EEC of 11 December 1989 concerning veterinary checks in intra-Community trade with a view to the completion of the internal market ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 9(4) thereof,Having regard to Council Directive 90/425/EEC of 26 June 1990 concerning veterinary and zootechnical checks applicable in intra-Community trade in certain live animals and products with a view to the completion of the internal market ⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 10(4) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Avian influenza is an infectious viral disease in birds, including poultry. Infections with avian influenza viruses in domestic poultry cause two main forms of that disease that are distinguished by their virulence. The low pathogenic form generally only causes mild symptoms, while the highly pathogenic form results in very high mortality rates in most poultry species. That disease may have a severe impact on the profitability of poultry farming.
- (2) Avian influenza is mainly found in birds, but under certain circumstances infections can also occur in humans even though the risk is generally very low.
- (3) In the event of an outbreak of avian influenza, there is a risk that the disease agent might spread to other holdings where poultry or other captive birds are kept. As a result it may spread from one Member State to other Member States or to third countries through trade in live birds or their products.
- (4) Council Directive 2005/94/EC ⁽³⁾ sets out certain preventive measures relating to the surveillance and the early detection of avian influenza and the minimum control measures to be applied in the event of an outbreak of that disease in poultry or other captive birds. That Directive provides for the establishment of protection and surveillance zones in the event of an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza.
- (5) Following the notification by the Netherlands of an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza of subtype H5N8 in a laying hen holding in Hekendorp in the province of Utrecht, on 16 November 2014, Commission Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU ⁽⁴⁾ was adopted. As a precautionary measure and in order to evaluate the situation and minimise any risk of further possible spread from the confirmed outbreak the Dutch authorities have temporarily prohibited movements of live poultry and certain poultry products on the whole territory of that Member State.
- (6) Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU provides that the protection and surveillance zones established by the Netherlands, in accordance with Directive 2005/94/EC, are to comprise at least the areas listed as protection and surveillance zones in the Annex to that Implementing Decision. Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU is to apply until 22 December 2014.

- (7) The interim protective measures put in place following the outbreak in Hekendorp in the Netherlands were reviewed within the framework of the Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed on 20 November 2014.
- (8) Two further outbreaks were confirmed in the Netherlands on 21 November 2014 in another laying hen holding in Ter Aar in the province of Zuid-Holland and in a breeding poultry holding in Kamperveen in the province of Overijssel. The measures provided for in Directive 2005/94/EC were immediately implemented, including the establishment of protection and surveillance zones. The Netherlands also decided to order again a temporary prohibition on the movements of live poultry and certain poultry products on the whole territory of that Member State.
- (9) The list of protection and surveillance zones set out in the Annex to Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU should be updated in order to take into account the establishment of the protection and surveillance zones around the two outbreaks in Ter Aar and Kamperveen where the measures provided for in Directive 2005/94/EC are being implemented.
- (10) In order to prevent any unnecessary disturbance to trade within the Union and to avoid unjustified barriers to trade being imposed by third countries, it is necessary to define the protection and surveillance zones established in the Netherlands at Union level in collaboration with that Member State and to fix the duration of that regionalisation.
- (11) For the sake of clarity, Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU should be repealed and replaced by this Decision.
- (12) The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The Netherlands shall ensure that the protection and surveillance zones established in accordance with Article 16(1) of Directive 2005/94/EC comprise at least the areas listed as protection and surveillance zones in Parts A and B of the Annex to this Decision.

Article 2

Implementing Decision 2014/808/EU is repealed.

Article 3

This Decision is addressed to the Kingdom of the Netherlands.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION**of 25 November 2014****concerning certain protective measures in relation to highly pathogenic avian influenza of subtype H5N8 in the United Kingdom***(notified under document C(2014) 9127)***(Only the English text is authentic)****(Text with EEA relevance)**

(2014/834/EU)

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Council Directive 89/662/EEC of 11 December 1989 concerning veterinary checks in intra-Community trade with a view to the completion of the internal market ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 9(4) thereof,Having regard to Council Directive 90/425/EEC of 26 June 1990 concerning veterinary and zootechnical checks applicable in intra-Community trade in certain live animals and products with a view to the completion of the internal market ⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 10(4) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Avian influenza is an infectious viral disease in birds, including poultry. Infections with avian influenza viruses in domestic poultry cause two main forms of that disease that are distinguished by their virulence. The low pathogenic form generally only causes mild symptoms, while the highly pathogenic form results in very high mortality rates in most poultry species. That disease may have a severe impact on the profitability of poultry farming.
- (2) Avian influenza is mainly found in birds, but under certain circumstances infections can also occur in humans even though the risk is generally very low.
- (3) In the event of an outbreak of avian influenza, there is a risk that the disease agent might spread to other holdings where poultry or other captive birds are kept. As a result it may spread from one Member State to other Member States or to third countries through trade in live birds or their products.
- (4) Council Directive 2005/94/EC ⁽³⁾ sets out certain preventive measures relating to the surveillance and the early detection of avian influenza and the minimum control measures to be applied in the event of an outbreak of that disease in poultry or other captive birds. That Directive provides for the establishment of protection and surveillance zones in the event of an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza.
- (5) Following the notification by the United Kingdom of an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza of subtype H5 in a breeder duck holding in the East Riding of Yorkshire, England, on 16 November 2014, Commission Implementing Decision 2014/807/EU ⁽⁴⁾ was adopted.
- (6) Implementing Decision 2014/807/EU provides that the protection and surveillance zones established by the United Kingdom, in accordance with Directive 2005/94/EC, are to comprise at least the areas listed as protection and surveillance zones in the Annex to that Implementing Decision. Implementing Decision 2014/807/EU is to apply until 22 December 2014.
- (7) The interim protective measures put in place following the outbreak in the United Kingdom have now been reviewed within the framework of the Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed.

- (8) In order to prevent any unnecessary disturbance to trade within the Union and to avoid unjustified barriers to trade being imposed by third countries, it is necessary to define the protection and surveillance zones established in the United Kingdom at Union level in collaboration with that Member State and to fix the duration of that regionalisation.
- (9) For the sake of clarity, Implementing Decision 2014/807/EU should be repealed.
- (10) The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The United Kingdom shall ensure that the protection and surveillance zones established in accordance with Article 16(1) of Directive 2005/94/EC comprise at least the areas listed as protection and surveillance zones in Parts A and B of the Annex to this Decision.

Article 2

Implementing Decision 2014/807/EU is repealed.

Article 3

This Decision is addressed to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
