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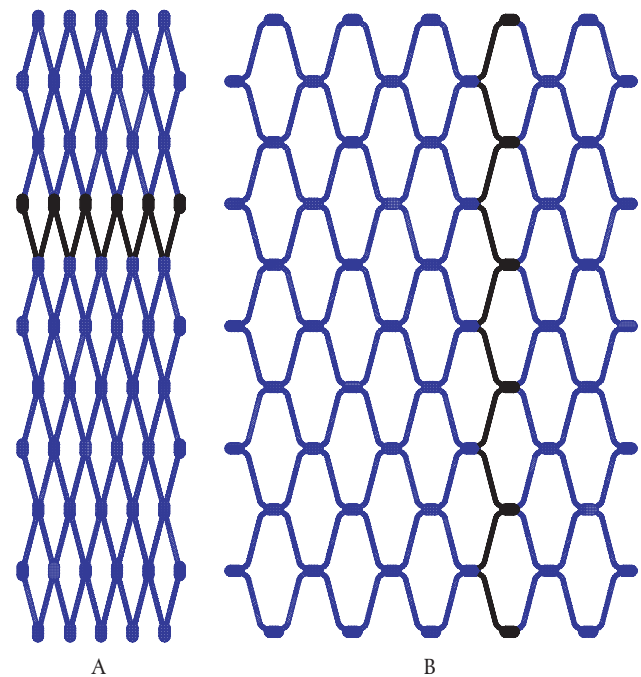

A codend of turned meshes (T90) of trawls, Danish seines or other towed nets is produced from diamond knotted netting turned 90 degrees from its usual orientation. Contrary to the main direction of the run of the netting twine in a diamond mesh codend which is perpendicular to the longitudinal axis of the fishing gear (A), in a turned mesh codend the main run of the netting twine is parallel to this axis (B).

**b. Mesh size measurement**

The mesh size shall be at least 110 mm and must be measured perpendicular to the longitudinal axis of the codend. The meshes of the codend and extension must not be obstructed in any way by either internal or external attachments.

c. Twine thickness

The diameter of the netting twine used in a T90 codend or extension shall be no more than 5 mm for a single twine. In the codend the use of double twine with a maximum thickness of 4 mm is allowable.

2. Construction

a. A T90 codend and its extension shall be constructed from two panels of equal dimensions, with the same number of meshes in width and length, and with the mesh orientation described above, joined by two lateral selvages. Each panel shall be constructed with non-slip knots and in such a way that the meshes remain fully open at all times when in use.

b. The number of open meshes in any circumference must be constant from the front part of the extension to the rearmost part of the codend.

c. At the point of attachment of the codend or extension piece to the tapered part of the trawl, the number of meshes in circumference of the codend or extension piece must be 50% of the last row of meshes of the tapered part of the trawl. A codend and extension piece is illustrated below (figure 1).

3. Circumference

The number of meshes in any circumference in the codend and the extension piece, excluding joinings and selvages, shall be no more than 50.

4. Joining rounds

The forward edge of the panels composing both codend and extension shall be fitted with a braided row of half meshes. The rear edge of the codend panel shall be fitted with a full row of braided meshes able to guide the codline.

5. Length of the codend

The codend shall have a length of at least 50 meshes.

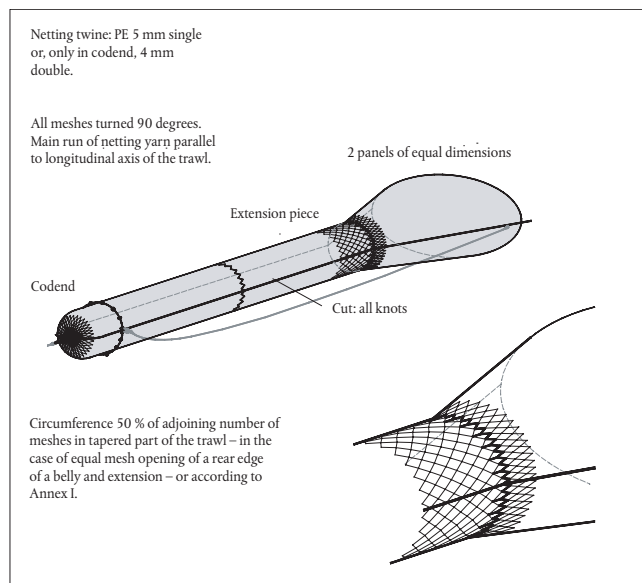
6. Lifting strap

The length of the lifting strap at the point at which it is attached to the codend shall not be less than the stretched length of the meshes in circumference of the codend multiplied by a factor of 0,6.

- (1) *Although* the implementation of the Council recommendation 98/561/EC of 24 September 1998 on European cooperation in quality assurance in higher education ⁽⁴⁾ has been a marked success as demonstrated in the report of the Commission of **30 September 2004**, there is still a need to improve the performance of European higher education, **particularly as regards quality**, for it to become more transparent and trustworthy for European citizens and for students and scholars from other continents.

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- (2) The Council Recommendation called for support to and, where necessary, the establishment of transparent quality assurance systems, and almost all Member States have set up national assurance systems and have initiated or enabled the establishment of one or more quality assurance or accreditation agencies.
 - (3) The Council Recommendation called for quality assurance systems to be based on a series of essential features, including evaluation of programmes or institutions through internal assessment, external review, and involving the participation of students, publication of results and international participation. ***The results of quality assurance assessments play a significant role in helping higher education institutions to improve performance.***
 - (4) These features have generally been implemented in all quality assurance systems and they have been affirmed by European Ministers of Education, gathered in Berlin, in September 2003, in the context of the Bologna Process, working towards the realisation of a European Higher Education Area.
 - (5) The European Network for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA) was established in 2000 and has a growing membership of quality assurance or accreditation agencies in all Member States.
 - (6) ***In the context of the Bologna Process, Ministers of Education from 45 countries adopted the standards and guidelines for quality assurance in the European Higher Education Area, as proposed by ENQA, during their meeting in Bergen on 19-20 May 2005 and as a follow-up to the meeting in Berlin in September 2003. They also welcomed the principle of a European register of quality assurance agencies based on national review and asked that the practicalities of implementation be further developed by ENQA, in cooperation with EUA, EURASHE and ESIB, with a report back to Ministers through the Bologna Follow-up Group. They furthermore underlined the importance of cooperation between nationally recognised agencies with a view to enhancing the mutual recognition of accreditation or quality assurance decisions.***
 - (7) ***EU action supporting quality assurance will be developed in coherence with activities carried out in the context of the Bologna Process.***
 - (8) It is desirable to draw up ***a register*** of independent and trustworthy quality assurance agencies operating in Europe, be they regional or national, general or specialised, public or ***private***, to support transparency in higher education and help the recognition of qualifications and periods of study abroad.
- I. In the context of the Lisbon Strategy, the European Council in Barcelona, in March 2002, expressed their conclusion that European education and training systems should become a 'world quality reference' ⁽¹⁾,
 - I. HEREBY RECOMMEND THAT MEMBER STATES:
 - A. ***encourage*** all higher education institutions active within their territory to introduce or develop rigorous internal quality assurance systems, ***in accordance with the standards and guidelines for quality assurance in the European Higher Education Area adopted in Bergen in the context of the Bologna Process***,
 - B. ***encourage*** all quality assurance or accreditation agencies active within their territory to be independent in their assessments, to apply the features of quality assurance laid down in Recommendation 98/561/EC and to apply the common set of ***general standards and guidelines adopted in Bergen***, for assessment purposes. ***These standards should be further developed in cooperation with representatives of the higher education sector. They should be applied in such a way as to protect and promote diversity and innovation***,
 - C. encourage ***representatives of national authorities, the higher education sector and*** quality assurance and accreditation agencies, together with ***social partners***, to set up a 'European Register of Quality Assurance ***Agencies***' ***based on national review, that takes account of the principles set out in the Annex, and to define the conditions for registration and the rules for management of the register***,

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- D. enable higher education institutions active within their territory to choose among quality assurance or accreditation agencies in the European Register an agency which meets their needs and profile, **provided that this is compatible with their national legislation or permitted by their national authorities**,
 - E. **allow higher education institutions to work towards a complementary assessment by another agency in the European Register, for example to enhance their international reputation**,
 - F. **promote cooperation between agencies in order to build up mutual trust and the recognition of quality assurance and accreditation assessments, thus contributing to the recognition of qualifications for the purpose of study or work in another country**,
 - G. **ensure public access to the assessments made by the quality assurance or accreditation agencies listed in the European Register**.
- II. INVITE THE COMMISSION:
- A. to continue, in close cooperation with the Member States, its support for cooperation between higher education institutions, quality assurance and accreditation agencies, competent authorities and other bodies active in the field.
 - B. to present triennial reports to the European Parliament, the Council, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions on progress in the development of quality assurance systems in the various Member States and on cooperation activities at European level, including the progress achieved with respect to the objectives referred to above.

ANNEX

'The European Register of Quality Assurance Agencies'

The Register should provide a list of reliable agencies whose assessments Member States (and public authorities within Member States) can trust. It should be founded on the following main principles:

1. The list should be drawn up by representatives of **national authorities, the higher education sector (higher education institutions, students, teachers and researchers) and** quality assurance and accreditation agencies active in the Member States, together **with social** partners.
 2. Conditions for registration of agencies **could** include **inter alia**:
 - a commitment to complete independence in reaching their judgement,
 - recognition by **at least the Member State within which they operate** (or public authorities within **that Member State**),
 - operation on the basis of the common set of **standards and** guidelines referred to in **recommendations A and B addressed to the Member States**,
 - regular external review by peers and other experts, including publication of the criteria, methodologies and results of such review.
 3. **In the event of an initial refusal of registration, re-evaluation is possible on the basis of improvements made.**

- having regard to the 7th EU-China summit held in The Hague on 8 December 2004,
 - having regard to its resolution of 18 December 2003 on arms sales to China ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to the Commission policy paper on a maturing partnership — shared interests and challenges in EU-China relations (COM(2003)0533),
 - having regard to its resolution of 19 December 2002 on the human rights situation of Tibetans ⁽²⁾,
 - having regard to its resolution of 11 April 2002 on the Commission communication to the Council and the European Parliament on a EU Strategy towards China: Implementation of the 1998 Communication and future steps for a more effective EU policy (COM(2001)0265) ⁽³⁾, which takes into account the Report from the Commission to the Council and the European Parliament on the Implementation of the Communication entitled 'Building a Comprehensive Partnership with China' (COM(2000)0552),
 - having regard to the decision taken by the Fourth Ministerial Conference of the World Trade Organization (WTO) at Doha, Qatar on 9-14 November 2001 on the accession of China and Chinese Taipei to the WTO,
 - having regard to its resolution of 25 October 2001 on the proposal for a Council decision establishing the Community position within the Ministerial Conference set up by the Agreement establishing the World Trade Organization on the accession of the People's Republic of China to the World Trade Organization (COM(2001)0517) ⁽⁴⁾,
 - having regard to its resolution of 20 January 2000 on the human rights situation in China ⁽⁵⁾,
 - having regard to Rule 45 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on International Trade and the opinion of the Committee on Foreign Affairs (A6-0262/2005),
- A. whereas the rapid development of China over the past 20 years has had a significant impact on EU-China trade and economic relations, and whereas, overall, China is now the EU's second largest trading partner after the United States.; whereas in 2004 the EU had a deficit, *vis-à-vis* China, of EUR 78 500 million, its largest deficit with any trading partner, and one which reflects, among other things, the effect of market access barriers in China,
- B. whereas China became a member of the WTO in 2001, reducing its average tariff and non-tariff barriers following its WTO commitments, leading to a growth in European investment projects in China; whereas, in some cases, however, the protection of Chinese domestic industries persists,
- C. whereas by joining the WTO and opening itself up to international commerce, the most populous state on Earth has become a key player in world trade; whereas the impact of the production of a nation of 1,3 billion people can only increase; and whereas other countries with large populations (such as India, Brazil, Indonesia and many others) are bound to change the current ranking of exporting nations,

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- D. whereas the premise for trade between the EU and China is a strategic partnership with mutual market access on the basis of WTO rules and fair competition,
- E. whereas China does not adequately apply WTO rules and whereas in particular it circumvents the ban on State export aid, infringes the laws on the protection of intellectual property, refuses to allow mutual access to its market in the case of goods and services from EU countries, and uses State intervention deliberately in order to depress the value of its currency, you protect the property, not the rights
- F. whereas many of the rulings in the more than 9 000 piracy trials held in 2004 are not being effectively enforced,
- G. whereas China does not at present meet the conditions for the granting of market economy status,
- H. whereas Taiwan has played an important role in the economic rise of China,
- I. whereas owing to its continental scale, the number of its inhabitants and its dynamic economic growth in recent years, China is an economic superpower able to influence the course of the world economy and one with which all other economic areas are bound to have to compete,
- J. whereas Chinese expansion will bring enormous beneficial possibilities but also raises legitimate concerns for European industry, with an ensuing need for political management of those relations at European level,
- K. whereas trade relations between the EU and China are at the heart of the debate on globalisation, and illustrate all the expectations and contradictions connected with it,
- L. whereas the EU needs to find a response to the increasing public disquiet about the impact of globalisation which will be further fuelled by China's increasing dominance of world markets,
- M. whereas China has tripled its expenditure on research and development in the past five years and Europe must rise to this challenge in order to continue to benefit from world trade in future,
- N. whereas the problems of the European textile industry were foreseeable, since the investments made by Chinese industry in this sector are well known, and this will not be an isolated case since similar situations exist in the production of other goods, such as footwear, and also in the bicycle industry, the car industry and the iron and steel industry, among others,
- O. whereas the EU cannot remain complacent in the face of the challenges posed by China's growing economic strength and must develop a coherent long-term strategic response,
- P. whereas the impact of China's rapid growth on its own natural resources and its environment and on the world market for resources is extremely high, and whereas EU companies are facing difficulties because of growing world market prices for resources due to the high demand from China,
- Q. whereas in 2000 China ranked 97th in the world in terms of per capita emissions of greenhouse gases, but also as the second largest overall emitter in the world and has become the world's second-largest consumer of energy and raw materials; whereas projections for 2025 predict record high growth of Chinese emissions so China must play a very significant role in relieving the burden on the world environment,
- R. whereas the gradual advent of a fairer and safer world requires there to be greater solidarity not only between the peoples of the developed nations and those of the less developed nations, but also within the various nations,

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- S. whereas it is politically and economically in the interests of the EU to support China's development into a free and open State where the rule of law prevails and its full adoption of democracy and the market economy,
- T. whereas the economic development of China also gives the country greater responsibility in the Asian region,
- U. whereas it is the duty of the EU, as the world's leading economic power, not only to nurture its trade relations with all its partners but also to uphold the universal values of humanity, democracy and the rule of law; whereas in this respect China, despite its recent economic success, is far from allowing all its citizens to benefit from the full range of democratic and human rights,

WTO

1. Welcomes China's timely implementation of some of its WTO obligations, but calls for further dialogue to enable China to rapidly address the many outstanding areas of concern to EU industry, particularly in the fields of Intellectual Property Rights enforcement, national treatment, transparency and environmental, social and health standards;
2. Calls on the Commission, in the light of the numerous instances of inadequate implementation or application by China of its WTO obligations, to offer European companies its support in this connection, providing them with effective backing;
3. Takes the view that the EU must seek to establish trade links with China in a spirit of cooperation and complementarity, while ensuring that each can maintain and develop their industrial, agricultural and service sectors harmoniously in order to ensure the best possible living standards for all their inhabitants;
4. Urges China to abide by the spirit as well as the letter of Section 18 of its Accession Protocol so that the Transitional Review Mechanism can become a more effective tool for resolving outstanding areas of concern;
5. Calls on the Commission to assess carefully whether to award China the status of a market economy country, and only to grant it that status once China has fulfilled the relevant criteria;
6. Takes the view that the pirating and counterfeiting of European products and brands by Chinese industries is a serious violation of international trade rules; calls on the Commission to take the appropriate measures to protect the intellectual property of European companies, including supporting the Chinese authorities in the fight which they are starting to wage against piracy, monitoring the problem and, if necessary, bringing it before the WTO;
7. Calls on the Member States to develop effective market controls in order to protect European consumers as well as possible against products which do not comply with the CE standard;
8. Calls on the Commission to adopt the necessary measures to prevent the import into the European Union of any article manufactured with high risk chemical products that European manufacturers would be prohibited to use under European or national legislation;
9. Calls on China to guarantee the same conditions to all its trading partners and not to put up bureaucratic barriers to trade, and to take appropriate account of the concerns expressed by the EU and by industry, including in the areas of corruption, legal certainty, taxation, credit, etc.;
10. Calls on China, as a WTO member, to comply with international standards in the area of statistics;
11. Calls on the Commission to study what impact China's liberalisation of trade and membership of the WTO has had on growth and on social progress in the country;

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12. Calls on China, given its importance in international trade, to bring greater influence to bear in the context of the Doha Development Agenda through its role as a link to third world countries, and thus to contribute to a successful outcome of the next Doha Round in Hong Kong;
13. Calls on China to open up its markets to foreign goods and services, and to carry out appropriate reforms of its market and its economic system;
14. Calls on China, when awarding public contracts, to use a transparent and fair procedure which gives foreign companies an equal chance to participate;
15. Calls on China to improve links between its transport networks and international networks, in order to facilitate the free movement of persons and goods;
16. Calls on the Commission and China to develop effective measures in order, in future, to put an end to the repeated infringements in relation to the correct levying of protective tariffs;

International competitive effects

17. Welcomes the Memorandum of Understanding of 10 June 2005 between the Commission and the Chinese Government on the limitation of Chinese textile exports and calls on the Commission to monitor both compliance with that agreement and the situation with regard to other textile, clothing and footwear sectors in Europe, while also taking account of the long-term interests of European importers and retailers; calls on China to make the calculation system being used to limit exports transparent; urges the Commission to be prepared to adopt emergency measures if it becomes clear that the EU industry faces serious material injury; further urges the Commission and China to find solutions for the developing countries which are most vulnerable to Chinese exports, enabling them to protect parts of their markets, in order to find a solution for some of the poorest people;
18. Is concerned that the way in which the Memorandum of Understanding was initially implemented caused serious disruption to some European retailers; welcomes the fact that, following new discussions with the Chinese authorities, this problem now appears to have been addressed, at least in the short term; calls on the Commission to continue to monitor the situation, with a view to ensuring that there is no further disruption either in the field of textiles or in other sectors where Chinese competition is significantly increasing;
19. Calls on the Commission to study the long-term survival prospects of production of textiles and clothing in the EU, bearing in mind the scope for imports from China and other countries, and welcomes the proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on criminal measures aimed at ensuring the enforcement of intellectual property rights (COM(2005)0276), which it hopes to see rapidly adopted;
20. Urges the Commission to meet the growing unease of developing countries about the effects on their markets of Chinese textile exports by urgently conducting a country-by-country assessment of the full impact of the quota phase-out;
21. Calls on the Council and the Commission to recognise that the challenges currently being experienced by the textile, clothing and footwear sectors, and which will soon be experienced by other sectors such as the bicycle, automobile, machinery and iron and steel industries, are systemic in nature, and that a longer-term strategy for EU industry must urgently be developed in order for the EU's international trade policy to take into account and address in advance the challenges, such as the current imbalances it is experiencing with China, posed not just to EU and developing country jobs, but also to existing assumptions about the winners and losers from globalisation;
22. Calls on the Commission to monitor, and regularly report on, the extent to which Chinese competition is affecting EU industry, as well as on trends in the quantity and sectoral composition of out-sourcing from the EU, in order to evaluate the positive and negative effects of such trends and to develop appropriate policy responses;
23. Calls on the Commission to re-examine thoroughly the various safeguard provisions of the WTO agreements, to evaluate whether they remain adequate in the light of the changing international trade paradigm, and to publish its findings;

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24. Notes that the increase in the volume of Chinese textile exports to the EU has been accompanied by a sharp fall in the value of those products, by as much as 60 % of their purchase value, without European consumers having significantly benefited; calls on the Commission to investigate whether there have been any agreements between importers and/or major distributors and to ensure transparency in the price formation process;
25. Recognises that liberalisation affects men and women differently, and that the threat of the garment industry collapsing in many poor countries after the abolition of quotas risks severely weakening the position of women in these countries;
26. Calls on the Commission to prepare a long-term development forecast for global industry and a strategy for EU industrial development for the purpose of identifying possible future development trends in EU industries to ensure a competitive response to all global challenges;
27. Calls on the Commission to create a closer comprehensive partnership which would be beneficial to China and the EU, to extend this cooperation to more areas and to work towards actively overcoming negative factors between the two parties;
28. Calls for trade relations between the EU and China to contribute to a balanced and sustainable economic, social and environmental development but also to regional development, since unbalanced development would entail great dangers for internal and external security;
29. Calls on the Commission and the Council to make a thorough study of the opportunities for European businesses and industry arising from economic development in China;
30. Calls on the Commission to promote business cooperation, raise awareness and facilitate contacts in order to promote greater regulatory convergence (common standards, conformity assessment, technical regulation, improved accounting practices, improved dispute settlement mechanism, etc.);
31. Calls on the Commission to undertake more extensive research on an ongoing basis to better understand the full scope of the offshoring issue, including adequate programmes for collecting data on jobs that move offshore, precise analysis of the economic costs of off-shoring (including loss of tax revenue), data on redeployment of workers and on their new wage levels, and analysis of the positive and negative wider effects on communities;
32. Calls on the Commission to state to what extent the current low sale and import prices for Chinese products are benefiting consumers in Europe, and what medium and long-term trends the Commission expects to see in this connection;
33. Notes that manufactured products represent practically 75 % of world trade in goods and services, while the manufacturing sector only accounts for around 20 % of world GDP; points out that relocations essentially concern manufactured products with no great added value and that these industrial changes primarily affect the most vulnerable and least qualified workers, and hence those least able to adapt; calls accordingly for strong social solidarity to be shown with such workers, not least in the form of greater investment in their training and retraining, in order to redirect them towards jobs in sectors in which Europe is still a world leader;
34. Asks the Commission to investigate precisely which sectors are currently benefiting, or will benefit in future, from China's tremendous economic growth, how many jobs have been preserved or created in these sectors, what strategies the Commission intends to adopt to identify and promote other similar sectors in order that on balance the effect on European economies in terms of employment and prosperity will be a positive one, and what EU Member States will retain in the high-tech sector that is not capable of being carried out by lower-wage competitors, and in particular by China;
35. Asks the Commission to investigate the introduction of a European labelling scheme that would indicate country of origin, as well as social and environmental standards;

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36. Calls on the Council and the Commission to make use of the EU countries' political and economic influence in order to bring about a change in China's attitude towards compliance with international trade rules and towards transparency in the allocation of State aid to businesses, with a view to preventing any circumvention of the ban on State export aid and to removing administrative and government barriers to imports from the EU Member States and from third countries;

37. Recognises, however, that alongside the evident concerns expressed, China represents a market of great potential for European investors, and that only a fraction of it has been exploited until now; calls on the Commission therefore to pinpoint the most effective means of assisting European industry to seek out and seize all the opportunities offered by that large and expanding market;

38. Notes that China's current account surplus has fallen from 3,1 % of GDP in 2003 to 1,1 % of GDP in 2004, owing not least to a rapid increase in imports to China; notes that China is now the EU's second largest trading partner and that the outlook for European exports to that large market remains promising; takes the view that China will also reach limits to its growth, since the necessary measures taken to restrain population growth will result in an inversion of the age pyramid by 2015 at the latest;

39. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to ascertain whether the aid to China granted under their current and future development programmes also brings financial advantages for Europe or European companies;

40. Stresses that China's rapid rise is due partly to the intense economic ties between China and Taiwan, which are reflected in the presence of one million Taiwanese in China working in more than 60 000 Taiwanese businesses and the many Taiwanese investments in China;

41. Expresses its concerns about the operation of the Chinese non-ferrous metals sector which leads to a structural distortion of the international market for recycling non-ferrous metals; calls on the Commission to investigate the situation and, if appropriate, to pursue WTO remedies so as to ensure that EU firms have access to scrap under fair conditions;

42. Supports the Council and the Commission in their efforts to achieve flexibility and establish a true value for China's currency in relation to the international financial markets, following the introduction of the euro;

43. Calls on China to continue gradually to decontrol its currency's exchange rate, and in the meantime to replace the fixed link to the dollar as soon as possible with a link to a basket of currencies including the euro; further calls on China to liberalise its financial markets;

44. Calls on the Commission, jointly with China to explore ways of opening up Chinese markets more to foreign companies, and enabling and encouraging foreign companies to set up business without being obliged to have a Chinese partner;

45. Welcomes the fact that the Commission is preparing a New Framework Agreement with China and calls for the EU to strengthen its representation in China;

Social and Environmental Impacts

46. Notes that China has managed to extricate over 300 million of its citizens from poverty in 20 years, but expresses its concern that around one quarter of the rural population in China still live in extreme poverty, and that Chinese income inequalities are among the fastest growing in the world; calls on the Commission to support China in further developing a cohesion policy and to take this issue into account in trade relations with China;

47. Recognises that, despite improved economic prospects for many Chinese, this has not alleviated the need for a more even geographical spread of economic development to reduce the threat of even higher unemployment and social displacement in the future;

48. Calls upon China to incorporate into its laws the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the International Covenant on Social, Economic and Cultural Rights as one means — amongst others — of establishing minimum social and environmental standards;

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49. Is deeply concerned at the lack of workers' rights in China, the very low level of wages and the increasing number of industrial accidents due to inadequate health and safety regulations, and urges China to ratify the key Conventions of the International Labour Organization, particularly Convention 87 on Freedom of Association and Protection of the Right to Organise, and 98 on Collective Bargaining, and to abolish the State monopoly on the formation of trade unions provided for in China's legislation; moreover calls on China to take steps to effectively combat all forms of present-day slavery, child labour and exploitation and above all exploitation of women at work, so as to ensure that workers' fundamental rights are respected and so as to put an end to social dumping;

50. Notes the steady rise in the number of industrial disputes since 1998; to address this, urges China to authorise the establishment of independent trade unions for example through the creation of a strong legal status, the introduction of free collective bargaining, the opportunity for democratically elected trade union officials to receive independent training and the setting up of an exchange programme between European and Chinese trade union officials to enable China to benefit from Europe's many years of experience in the area of employee participation; urges China to institute a social protection system appropriate to people's needs and geared towards the unemployed;

51. Acknowledges China's increasing competitiveness in today's international economic climate but calls on China to take effective and swift action against the use of child labour and forced labour; asks the Commission to offer the Chinese its support in this connection;

52. Calls on the Commission and the Council to be vigilant with regard to a possible restriction of the free organisation of trade unions in Hong Kong; draws attention to the positive role which the free organisation of trade unions in Hong Kong could play in improving labour rights in China;

53. Calls on the Commission and the Council, in their dialogue with China, to stress the importance of releasing labour activists;

54. Calls on the Commission to explore suitable ways of increasing mutual understanding and appreciation of respective cultural characteristics and of improving awareness and acceptance of the European legal and economic system;

55. Looks to Western, particularly European, businesses operating in China to give full recognition to trade union rights and behave in an exemplary manner towards workers and the environment;

56. Is seriously concerned about the high levels of pollution caused by China's industries and the growing consumption of natural resources such as timber from unsustainable sources and welcomes recent signs that China is taking serious measures to protect the environment; emphasises that trade and environment are an essential component of the WTO, and urges the Chinese government to play a full and positive role in promoting sustainable development, both inside China and globally; notes that because of China's size, its large-scale adoption of sustainable technologies and practices could have a positive global impact, lowering costs and spurring other nations to follow suit, and urges the Chinese authorities to make full use of this potential for China to play a leadership role in environmental matters;

57. Expresses its concern that the enormous economic growth in China is leading not only to environmental pollution but also to scarcity of resources and rising commodity prices on the world market; calls upon China to accept responsibility for incorporating environmental standards into manufacturing and waste management and for helping to repair damage to the environment; calls on the Commission to start identifying solutions to the problem of how to guarantee in future affordable, stable raw material and energy supplies to people and companies in Europe;

58. Urges, in addition, the Council and the Commission to use all appropriate bilateral channels, as well as multilateral institutions and agreements to which both the EU and China are parties, to further press the case for high standards of social welfare and environmental protection as an essential component of international solidarity;

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59. Recognises the key role of China in finding an effective solution to global warming and urges the Chinese Government to continue its constructive engagement in international negotiations to avoid dangerous climate change; stresses the importance of continuing efforts to reduce fossil fuel use;

60. Calls on the Council and the Commission to ensure, through the EU-China Energy and Environment Programme and other channels, that collaboration on renewable energy/energy efficiency issues will be a priority for future EU-China co-operation, and to encourage China's development of sustainable technologies and industries, particularly to enable cooperation in developing new technologies that will make a sustainable future possible; calls on China, when building new coal-fired power stations, to use the latest, most efficient and most environmentally-friendly technologies, and as soon as possible to use so-called clean coal technologies in the construction of such power stations; further calls on China to improve safety standards in its coal mines; calls on the Commission to offer the cooperation of European mining technology companies; calls on China, in the event of the possible building of new nuclear power stations, to make use of European experience and safety technology and to cooperate closely with European manufacturers and authorities such as the International Atomic Energy Agency;

61. Calls on the Commission to investigate the most effective way of negotiating the introduction of minimum social and environmental standards into trade agreements and ensuring their effective enforcement;

62. Welcomes the Commission's initiative to tackle imports of illegal timber and wood products from countries including China by its proposed Action Plan on Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade (FLEGT); is concerned, however, that the negotiation of partnership agreements with countries on a voluntary basis would not address the problem sufficiently;

63. Notes that most of the wood imported into the EU from China comes in the form of processed products, some of which are derived from wood which China has sourced illegally;

64. Calls on the Commission and the Council to put pressure on the Chinese authorities to take appropriate far-reaching measures to stop the import of illegal timber and wood products, and to encourage China to play a full role in regional and international processes, such as East Asia FLEG, aimed at curbing trade in illegally-sourced timber;

Existing projects, governance

65. Welcomes the Commission's well-developed programme of cooperation with China on environmental matters, through its funding of assistance projects, and calls on it to ensure that the programme is continued and expanded; welcomes the general willingness of the Chinese Government to cooperate on environmental protection;

66. Recognises that many of China's environmental problems stem not from lack of laws but from lack of law enforcement, and therefore calls on the Commission to make capacity building at the local level an important focus of cooperation projects;

67. Encourages an increase in programmes such as the Executive Training Programme to increase trade participation between China and the EU;

68. Calls on the Commission to implement the pledge which it made to the European Parliament on 8 March 2005 and to offer to send European customs officers to China to provide support and training;

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Education

69. Calls on the Commission to agree with the Chinese Government to stimulate mutual learning and student exchange; further urges the Commission to create more Chinese-language schools throughout the EU with the possibility of scholarships or funds for EU students interested in learning Chinese;

Political Dialogue

70. Looks to the EU, in parallel with the development of trade relations, to carry on a more intensive political dialogue, ranging from human rights matters to regional and global security issues;

71. Regrets that China's rapid economic development has not been accompanied by progress in political and civil rights for the population and that the official human rights dialogue in which the EU and China have engaged since 1997 in parallel with their growing trade and economic relations has not been successful; therefore stresses the need for a different approach including the establishment of a clear and effective policy of human rights conditionality with regard to the EU's general trading policy with China;

72. Reiterates its concern about the human rights situation in China; notes that the situation has seen some progress over the past fifteen years; stresses that more needs to be done and considers that the human rights dialogue between China and the EU should be consistently improved;

Arms embargo

73. Draws attention to the fact that the arms embargo was imposed on China by the EU and the US (and others) as a direct result of the Chinese authorities' brutal suppression of the democratic demonstrations in Tiananmen Square in June 1989; deems it inappropriate for the EU to lift the embargo at this juncture;

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74. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission, and the governments and parliaments of the Member States and of China.

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Iran**European Parliament resolution on Iran**

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions on Iran, notably those of 28 October 2004 ⁽¹⁾ and 13 January 2005 ⁽²⁾,
- having regard to the EU-Iran human rights dialogue that took place until recently and at which the Government of Iran expressed its commitment to strengthening respect for human rights and the rule of law,
- having regard to the UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, as well as the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, to which Iran is a party,
- having regard to Iran's decision of 1 August 2005 to resume uranium conversion activities in contravention of the Paris Agreement obligations and whereas on 10 August 2005 Iran removed the seals from its uranium tetrafluoride production lines at its uranium conversion facility near Isfahan and has resumed nuclear fuel cycle activities,

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- having regard to the resolution adopted by the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) on 11 August 2005 on 'Implementation of the NPT Safeguards Agreement in the Islamic Republic of Iran' urging Iran to re-establish full suspension of all enrichment-related activities on the same voluntary, non-legally-binding basis as requested in previous Board resolutions, and to permit the Director General to reinstate the seals that had been removed at that facility without referring to the question whether Iran is in breach of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT),
 - having regard to the resolution of the IAEA Board of Governors of 24 September 2005,
 - having regard to the Council conclusions on Iran, notably those of 16 March 2005 and 3 October 2005,
 - having regard to the EU's 7th Annual Report on Human Rights (2005) adopted by the Council on 3 October 2005,
 - having regard to Rule 103(4) of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas Article IV of the NPT states: 'Nothing in this Treaty shall be interpreted as affecting the inalienable right of all Parties to the Treaty to develop research, production and use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes without discrimination and in conformity with Articles I and II of this Treaty',
- B. whereas Iran has conceded to the EU-3 (Germany, France and the United Kingdom) that it will apply the Additional Protocol to the NPT even without having ratified it,
- C. whereas, according to the IAEA, Iran failed in a number of instances over an extended period of time to meet its obligations under the NPT Safeguards Agreement with respect to the reporting of nuclear material, its processing and its use, as well as the declaration of facilities where such material had been processed and stored,
- D. whereas in its past resolutions the IAEA expressed its uncertainty about Iran's motives in failing to make important declarations and underlined its concern about the continuing gaps in its understanding of many proliferation-sensitive aspects of Iran's nuclear programme,
- E. whereas the IAEA pointed out that the full and sustained implementation of Iran's suspension of all enrichment-related activities notified to the IAEA on 14 November 2004 as a voluntary, non-legally-binding confidence building measure, to be verified by the IAEA, is essential to addressing outstanding issues,
- F. whereas after the suspension of its talks with the EU-3 in August 2005 Iran resumed its uranium conversion activities at its uranium conversion facility in Isfahan, removing the seals placed by the IAEA Director General on the process lines at that facility, but has maintained a freeze on uranium enrichment itself,
- G. whereas the IAEA report of 11 August 2005 stated that the Highly Enriched Uranium (HEU) contamination discovered earlier on Iranian nuclear equipment originated in Pakistan,
- H. whereas, in its resolution of 24 September 2005, the IAEA Board of Governors, while finding that concerns related to Iran's nuclear programme are within the competence of the UN Security Council, requests its Director General to continue his efforts to implement that and previous resolutions and to work towards further developments in the negotiations with Iran,
- I. whereas, thanks to the extended control rights provided for by the Additional Protocol to the NPT, Iran is the country with the most IAEA inspection visits in the last two years, including the re-launched activities in Isfahan, and whereas, therefore, the importance of the demanded ratification by Iran cannot be over-emphasised,

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- J. whereas EU relations with Iran in recent years have been based on a threefold approach characterised by negotiations on a trade and cooperation agreement, political dialogue and a human rights dialogue and whereas these three aspects cannot be separated,
- K. whereas the situation in Iran regarding the exercise of civil rights and political freedoms has further deteriorated since the presidential elections of June 2005 despite several commitments by the Government of Iran to promote universal values,
- L. whereas Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch have increasingly reported human rights violations in Iran during the last few months,
- M. whereas there are increasing reports regarding executions and death sentences, especially against juvenile offenders and members of minorities, which apparently violate internationally recognised criteria and standards,
- N. particularly concerned about the increasing reports regarding arbitrary arrests of and threats against journalists, cyberjournalists and webloggers, notably Ahmand Seraajee, who was arrested on 30 June 2005, while also recalling the continued imprisonment of other journalists for the mere exercise of their right to freedom of expression, notably Akbar Ganji, who was imprisoned over five years ago together with 17 other Iranian journalists and who has been in extremely poor health due to a 60-day hunger strike but whose wife has been denied access to him,
- O. also concerned about the solitary confinement of the lawyer Abdolfattah Soltani, detained since 30 July 2005, who was a guest speaker in the EP in his capacity as a founder member of the Defenders of Human Rights Centre,
- P. whereas Iran is still not a party to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women,
- Q. deeply concerned at Iran's lack of cooperation with regard to the EU-Iran human rights dialogue that took place until recently and perturbed that there are no signs of the enforcement of Iran's commitment within that dialogue to strengthen respect for human rights and the rule of law in Iran,

Nuclear issue

1. Warmly welcomes the EU-3's attempt to find a negotiated solution to the nuclear dispute with Iran, underlines the important role to be played by the IAEA and urges it to exploit its control and inspection capacities to the full;
2. Gives its full support to the resolution adopted on 24 September 2005 by the IAEA Board of Governors, criticising Iran for non-compliance with the IAEA's Statute and underlining the resulting absence of confidence that Iran's nuclear programme is exclusively for peaceful purposes;
3. Urges Iran to re-establish full and sustained suspension of all aspects of its uranium enrichment activities including through tests or production at the uranium conversion facility in Isfahan and to permit the IAEA Director General to reinstate the seals that have been removed at that facility;
4. Urges Iran further to fully cooperate with the IAEA inspectors and to implement transparency measures which extend beyond the formal requirements of the NPT Safeguards Agreement and the Additional Protocol to the NPT and include access to individuals, documentation relating to procurement, dual-use equipment, certain military-owned workshops and research and development sites;
5. Urges Iran furthermore to reconsider the construction of a research reactor moderated by heavy water and to promptly ratify and implement in full the Additional Protocol to the NPT, as these measures would help build further confidence in the exclusively peaceful nature of Iran's nuclear programme;

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6. Urges Iran to use the time before the next IAEA Board of Governors meeting in November 2005 to restart talks with the EU-3 in good faith, free of duress and devoid of threats;
7. Strongly supports the Council conclusions on Iran of 3 October 2005 and especially the EU's continuing support for a diplomatic solution to international concerns over Iran's nuclear programme in the interests of a de-escalation of the situation;
8. Calls on the US Government to actively support the negotiations between the EU-3 and Iran by delivering security guarantees to Iran;
9. Welcomes the statement made by UK Foreign Secretary and President-in-Office of the Council Jack Straw on 28 September 2005 in Brighton that, despite US President George Bush's remark that 'all options are open', neither the US nor Europe is considering military action against Iran over its controversial nuclear programme because it would not resolve the issue;
10. Considers that Iran has the right to develop a nuclear programme in conformity with Article IV of the NPT and supports the proposals of the EU for cooperation with Iran in the nuclear field for peaceful use;
11. Deplores the existing double standards applied to nuclear and non-nuclear weapon states, which can only be countered by credible nuclear disarmament steps, and calls on the EU to take the lead in bringing the nuclear disarmament negotiations out of the current state of deadlock;
12. Stresses the importance of cooperation with the US, Russia, China and non-aligned countries in order to consider complementary concepts (such as the South African proposal) with a view to achieving a comprehensive agreement with Iran on its nuclear facilities and their use which takes into account Iran's security concerns; reaffirms that no military options should be taken into consideration in order to reach a solution to the present crisis;
13. Considers that such a comprehensive agreement should help to achieve a sustainable regional security system comprising India, Pakistan and other nuclear powers and believes that Iran should assume its responsibilities as a regional player and contribute to a Middle East free of weapons of mass destruction;
14. Calls on the Council to launch an initiative on a security dimension for the whole region in order to prevent proliferation and any sources of conflict;
15. Underlines that the conclusion of a cooperation and trade agreement between Iran and the EU depends on the substantial improvement of Iran's human rights situation as well as on Iran's full cooperation with the IAEA and objective guarantees regarding the peaceful nature of its nuclear programme;

Human rights

16. Strongly condemns the death sentences passed against and execution of juvenile offenders and minors, which in numerous cases represent a punishment for sexual acts and sexual orientation not considered crimes on the basis of international legal standards, and calls upon the Iranian authorities to respect internationally recognised legal safeguards, inter alia with regard to minors;
17. Calls on the Iranian authorities to immediately halt all executions of juvenile offenders and to prevent any further application of the death penalty, especially to minors, and, notably, not to execute the minors Milad Bakhtiari aged 17, Hussein Haghi aged 16, Hussein Taranj aged 17, Farshad Saeedi aged 17 and Saeed Khorrami aged 16;
18. Urges the Iranian authorities to respect the provisions of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, which provide that capital punishment shall not be imposed for offences committed by persons below 18 years of age at the time of the commission of the offence, and therefore demands that the legal age of majority in Iran be changed to 18 years;

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19. Condemns the treatment of minorities such as the Kurds, who amount to 9 % of the total population and who are discriminated against and harassed due to their religious beliefs and ethnic background, and the inhabitants of the area around Ahwaz city, the provincial capital of the ethnic Arab-dominated Khuzestan province, who are being displaced from their villages according to statements by Miloon Kothari, UN Special Rapporteur on Adequate Housing;

20. Condemns the arrests and imprisonment of cyberjournalists and webloggers and the parallel censorship of several online publications, weblogs and internet sites as well as the recent arbitrary arrests of journalists and severe restriction of the media in Iran, and therefore calls on the Iranian authorities, especially the Iranian Parliament, to fulfil their obligations under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, and notably to allow the free expression of opinion on internet sites and in weblogs and the press;

21. Calls on the Presidency of the Council and the Member States' diplomatic representatives in Iran urgently to undertake concerted action with regard to the abovementioned concerns, in particular striving for the immediate release of the journalists, cyberjournalists and webloggers prosecuted or sentenced for press- and opinion-related offences;

22. Calls on the Iranian authorities notably to unconditionally release Akbar Ganji, who is in poor health after more than five years of imprisonment and a hunger strike of 60 days, having served five and a half years of his six-year sentence for a press- and opinion-related offence, and also to release the lawyer Abdolattah Soltani, detained since 30 July 2005;

23. Calls on the representatives of the Member States in Teheran to make urgent requests to the Iranian authorities in order to obtain detailed information on Mr Ganji's situation and an authorisation to visit him;

24. Urges Iran to sign the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, and condemns the increasing arrests and punishment of women on grounds of 'improper veiling';

25. Calls on Iran to recommence the EU-Iran human rights dialogue with the European Union and, further, calls upon the Council and the Commission to closely monitor developments in Iran and also to raise concrete cases of human rights abuses within the framework of the dialogue;

26. Calls on the Commission to make effective use of the European Initiative for Democracy and Human Rights in order to intensify contacts and cooperation with Iranian civil society and independent media and furthermore to support, together with the European Parliament, democracy and respect for human rights in Iran;

27. Calls on the Council to examine the way in which Parliament may become involved in the regular updating of Council Common Position No 2001/931/CFSP of 27 December 2001 on the application of specific measures to combat terrorism, taking into account developments from 2001 onwards;

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28. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the High Representative for the CFSP, the governments and parliaments of the Member States and of the countries referred to in this resolution, the IAEA Director General, the UN Commission on Human Rights, the Head of the State Supreme Court of Iran and the Government and Majlis of Iran.

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Situation in Ethiopia

European Parliament resolution on the situation in Ethiopia

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its previous resolutions, in particular that of 7 July 2005 on the human rights situation in Ethiopia ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to the preliminary statements of 17 May and 25 August 2005 by the European Union Election Observation Mission (EU EOM) in Ethiopia,
 - having regard to the final statement of 15 September 2005 by the Carter Center Observation of the Ethiopia 2005 National Elections,
 - having regard to Rule 103(4) of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. recalling that the first properly contested election in Ethiopia took place on 15 May 2005, and noting that the period prior to this date was characterised by a peaceful atmosphere and that, despite some irregularities, the election went ahead without major confrontation between the government and opposition parties,
- B. whereas over 90 % of Ethiopian electors casting their vote expressed their faith in democracy and their strong will to exercise their fundamental rights,
- C. whereas the abovementioned preliminary statements by the EU EOM in Ethiopia, despite an extraordinary turnout by the Ethiopian electorate, revealed serious irregularities and a failure in many fundamental ways to respect democratic standards governing the organisation of elections,
- D. whereas, in a statement by the UK Presidency of 29 August 2005, the European Union endorsed the EU EOM's comments,
- E. whereas the abovementioned final statement by the Carter Center reached the same conclusions as the EU EOM,
- F. whereas the opposition is continuing to challenge the results of the elections held on 15 May 2005,
- G. whereas the ruling party used the outgoing parliament to introduce an amendment under which an absolute majority is required to put forward an agenda, thereby depriving the opposition of their right to submit an agenda or a bill for discussion in the forthcoming parliament,
- H. concerned by the anti-democratic conduct witnessed during the first regular session of the new parliament where opposition MPs who decided to take their seats were denied the right to express their views,
- I. I worried by the first bill of the new parliament which stripped of their parliamentary immunity elected MPs who decided not to participate in the assembly before their preconditions were met, and by the passing of another bill which extends the terms of office of the Addis Ababa city administration, thus ignoring the vote of the city's residents who voted unanimously in favour of the opposition,
- J. whereas the negotiations opened on 2 October 2005 between the government and the two main opposition parties have broken down because of the ruling party's refusal to agree on minimum rules of conduct of multiparty democracy and respect for the opposition,
- K. whereas the opposition parties have said they are willing to work in the framework of the constitution, without resorting to violence,

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- L. whereas the government has accused the opposition of fomenting a *coup d'état* and has arrested a large number of opposition leaders,
- M. whereas the opposition has dropped its call for a general strike and a mass demonstration, which has been banned by the government, because of the risk of violent clashes, thus showing its sense of responsibility,
- N. whereas, during the June 2005 demonstrations challenging the election results, the security forces' actions led to the deaths of at least 42 people and the arrests of thousands,
- O. whereas the climate of threats and intimidation has continued throughout the inquiry into and the challenging of certain election results,
- P. whereas Ethiopia is a signatory to the Cotonou Agreement, Article 9 of which stipulates that respect for all human rights and fundamental freedoms is an essential element of ACP-EU cooperation,
1. Expresses its serious concern that the political dialogue between the government and the opposition, opened on 2 October 2005, was broken by the ruling party, and urges all parties to resume such dialogue without delay and to work to allow multiparty democracy to start functioning with the rights of the opposition fully respected by the government and the ruling party;
2. Welcomes the key role played by the head of the Commission's delegation in Ethiopia and the Council Presidency through its British Ambassador, in cooperation with other international diplomats, in realising the political talks;
3. Would welcome an invitation from the Ethiopian Parliament for a Parliament mission to visit Ethiopia to explore how to build the capacity of the new parliament and respond to the challenges of multiparty democracy;
4. Welcomes the opposition's commitment to working within the constitutional framework without resorting to violence;
5. Calls on the government also to respect the fundamental principles of the constitution, especially fundamental freedoms and human rights;
6. Calls on the government to guarantee opposition access to the media, as was made available in the run-up to the 15 May 2005 election;
7. Expresses its serious concern at the government's attempts to reverse the democratic process, including the introduction of an absolute majority requirement for the submission of agendas in the forthcoming parliament, which render the opposition's gains meaningless;
8. Welcomes the fact that, because of the government ban, the opposition withdrew its call for a mass demonstration on 2 October 2005 that could have given rise to serious clashes;
9. Calls on all political parties to work towards a political solution that will secure the Ethiopian Parliament's democratic prerogatives;
10. Calls for an end to the persecution and intimidation of representatives of the opposition political parties and the immediate release of those still detained;
11. Calls on the Ethiopian Government to guarantee that detainees will not be subjected to ill-treatment and will have access to their families and medical care;
12. Calls on the Ethiopian authorities to bring all political prisoners before the courts within 48 hours of their initial apprehension, as prescribed under Ethiopian law, or to release them without further delay;
13. Calls on the government and political party representatives to reach agreement on the content of a code of conduct enabling the media to operate freely and independently;

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14. Calls on the EU and the international community to remain vigilant, in particular with regard to respect for international human rights principles, and to continue supporting the Ethiopian democratisation process;
15. Calls on the Commission to pursue and, if necessary, to step up the European Union's humanitarian policy with regard to Ethiopia and to adjust its non-humanitarian aid in accordance with progress in the democratic process;
16. Instructs its President to write to the Speaker of the Ethiopian Parliament expressing the Parliament's strong concern about the denial to opposition members of the right to take the floor, about the bill passed stripping parliamentary immunity from all elected opposition members who did not take their seats and about the bill to extend the previous administration of municipalities in disregard of electoral results, and urging the prompt reversal of such measures, since they are incompatible with minimum democratic standards and further exacerbate political tensions and mistrust;
17. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the Ethiopian Government, the President of the Ethiopian Parliament, the President of the Pan-African Parliament, opposition parties and the African Union.

Education as the cornerstone of the Lisbon process

European Parliament resolution on education as the cornerstone of the Lisbon process (2004/2272 (INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Commission staff working paper entitled 'Progress towards the Lisbon objectives in education and training — 2005 Report' (SEC(2005)0419),
 - having regard to the joint interim report of the Council and the Commission on the implementation of the detailed work programme on the follow-up of the objectives of education and training systems in Europe entitled 'Education and Training 2010 — the success of the Lisbon strategy hinges on urgent reforms' ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to the Presidency Conclusions of the Brussels European Council of 22-23 March 2005 on relaunching the Lisbon Strategy,
 - having regard to its resolution of 9 March 2005 on the mid-term review of the Lisbon Strategy ⁽²⁾,
 - having regard to the communication from the Commission entitled 'Integrated guidelines for growth and jobs (2005-2008)' (COM(2005)0141),
 - having regard to the communication from the Commission entitled 'Mobilising the brainpower of Europe: enabling universities to make their full contribution to the Lisbon Strategy' (COM(2005)0152),
 - having regard to Rule 45 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Culture and Education (A6-0245/2005),
- A. whereas the objectives of the Lisbon Strategy cover sustainable economic growth based on knowledge with more and better jobs, job creation, greater social cohesion, the eradication of poverty in the European Union and the promotion of equal opportunities and of the European social model in the context of a knowledge-based economy and society,

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- B. whereas a precondition for the attainment of the Lisbon objectives is the effective implementation of consistent and comprehensive national strategies for lifelong education and training, and an improvement in skills, with national reforms being incorporated into the European context,
- C. whereas there is a need for the effective implementation of the 'Education and Training 2010' programme at national and European levels,
- D. whereas the considerable disparity in performance between education systems in the Union, as illustrated in the 'Pisa 2003' report published by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, is worrying,
- E. whereas investment in education and training is a key factor in terms of human resources as well as improvement in the quality, effectiveness and accessibility of education and training systems in the Union,
1. Calls on the Member States to implement the 'Education and Training 2010' work programme with the involvement of all the relevant players;
 2. Believes that, in order to achieve the Lisbon objectives, more emphasis needs to be placed on education and that the Union should as a matter of urgency promote the convergence of the education systems of the Member States towards higher performance standards;
 3. Believes that the specific measures to be implemented at Community and national levels in the area of education and training must be focused primarily on target groups such as young people, job-seekers and those in search of training in order to be in step with a changing job market;
 4. Calls on the Council, the Commission and the Member States, with the aim of developing skills in keeping with the needs of a knowledge-based society, to adopt the necessary measures and reforms to reduce administrative obstacles in order to:
 - speed up the mobility of students, trainees, workers and their families and researchers as well as the mutual recognition of qualifications,
 - ensure universal and non-discriminatory access to quality education and training and develop social inclusion policies for underprivileged young people living in poverty by enabling them to acquire skills and access the labour market;
 5. Calls on the Member States to put in place suitable policies for developing new sources of jobs such as services for individuals and companies, the social economy, spatial planning and urban management, environmental protection and new industrial trades as well as traditional occupations, especially in the crafts sector;
 6. Believes that, in order to make lifelong learning a reality available to all without discrimination, it is essential to put in place innovative models of work organisation and new forms of cost-sharing between businesses, workers and public authorities by making information and communication technologies (ICT) the top priority so as to allow training within a family context as well;
 7. Records its approval of the appropriateness of the 29 indicators used by the Commission to assess the performance and progress achieved by teaching systems in Europe and of the need to develop new indicators in the key areas where they are lacking (languages, ICT, teachers, return on investment, adult education, social inclusion and active citizenship); on this basis, calls on the Member States, in particular, to take suitable measures as a matter of priority to reduce the high number of young people leaving school prematurely without any kind of qualification since this trend is an obstacle to greater social cohesion in the Union;

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8. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to upgrade guidance for young people into technical courses of study with potential for jobs and integration; to this end, asks that the Union, assisted in turn by the Member States, launch an information campaign to promote technical trades of excellence among young people and their parents in order thereby to remedy their often negative social image; supports more research, research and development, mobility among researchers and students through Erasmus Mundus; urges the Commission to remove barriers to mobility and to create a pilot project aimed at framing an Erasmus-type programme for apprentices in order to facilitate access by apprentices to 'new generation' Community education and training programmes;
9. Asks the Member States to take appropriate measures to reach the objectives fixed by the Council and to ensure a 15 % increase in the number of science graduates between now and 2010 while at the same time correcting the imbalance between men and women;
10. Encourages the Member States to implement a policy for lifelong education and training that is consistent at all levels of teaching including higher education and results in social inclusion as well as being tailored to social, demographic and economic change;
11. Encourages the Member States to establish programmes of systematic training in the use of new technologies in all lifelong learning and training establishments;
12. Calls on the Member States to increase the number of teachers and to put in place initial and continuous teacher training of quality in the context of continuous professional training in order to provide the teaching profession with the qualifications and skills enabling it to assume its role in the knowledge-based society over the coming decades, in particular, through teacher training in new information technologies;
13. Calls on the Member States to make a major effort to reach the crucial objective for the Union of teaching everyone on average at least two foreign languages, notably the languages of neighbouring countries;
14. Believes it is necessary to strengthen the open method of coordination and the exchange of good practice in the field of education and training and fully supports the programme for peer learning activities launched by the Commission in 2005; emphasises the overriding role of European indicators for measuring the progress made towards the Lisbon objectives in the field of education and training;
15. Asks the Commission and the Member States to boost their capacity for statistical analysis in the field of lifelong training;
16. Stresses the need for the Union to guarantee sufficient methods of funding for the new integrated action programme in the field of lifelong education and training; emphasises also the need to ensure that the European Social Fund can continue to be available after 2006 in all Union Member States;
17. Asks the Council and the Commission to provide an appropriate budgetary allocation in the next financial perspectives for all measures relating to lifelong education and training on which attainment of the objectives of the Lisbon Strategy will largely depend;
18. Calls on the Member States to plan for increased investment and more effective use of available resources (efficiently managing partnerships between public and private investment) in the field of education and training;
19. Calls on the Member States to frame more consistent national policies and to improve the conditions for access by job-seekers to education and training; emphasises in this respect the role of the social partners and calls on them to take on this role both in framing and in implementing policies;

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20. Calls on the Member States to ensure that their national Lisbon programmes, to be presented by 2006, contain a detailed account of the measures planned to raise educational performance, with timetables and targets, and that these plans are presented and debated in national parliaments;

21. Stresses the crucial role of universities in creating and spreading knowledge and urges that their importance be reinforced by strengthening synergies between European higher education, the European research area, European lifelong learning and the productive sector;

22. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

European Parliament resolution on integrating immigrants in Europe through schools and multilingual education (2004/2267(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Council Directive 77/486/EEC of 25 July 1977 on the education of the children of migrant workers ⁽¹⁾,
- having regard to the Council resolution of 16 December 1997 ⁽²⁾, which calls on the Member States to encourage the early teaching of languages and Europe-wide cooperation among schools offering this type of teaching,
- having regard to the Council resolution of 25 November 2003 on making school an open learning environment to prevent and combat early school leaving and disaffection among young people and to encourage their social inclusion ⁽³⁾,
- having regard to the Presidency Conclusions of the Barcelona European Council of 15-16 March 2002, which call for at least two foreign languages to be taught from a very early age,
- having regard to the communication of 3 June 2003 from the Commission to the Council, the European Parliament, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions on immigration, integration and employment (COM(2003)0336),
- having regard to the communication of 24 July 2003 from the Commission to the Council, the European Parliament, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions entitled 'Promoting Language Learning and Linguistic Diversity: An Action Plan 2004-2006' (COM(2003)0449),
- having regard to the recommendation by the European Monitoring Centre on Racism and Xenophobia that greater public support be provided in order to reduce the disadvantages suffered by pupils from migrant or minority communities,
- having regard to the conclusions of the symposium on 'The Changing European Classroom — the Potential of Multilingual Education', held on 10 and 11 March 2005 under the auspices of the Luxembourg Presidency,
- having regard to the conclusions issued following the Education Council of 25 May 2005,
- having regard to Rule 45 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on Culture and Education (A6-0243/2005),

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- A. whereas migration has increased significantly since 1977, the year of adoption of the above-mentioned directive establishing the right of immigrants within the Community to be taught the language of their host country and the language and culture of their country of origin,
- B. whereas migration has created new challenges in terms of identity and made integration policies one of the priorities for the EU, the Member States, and regional and local authorities,
- C. whereas Europe has, at different times, seen periods in which minorities have been persecuted and whereas this chapter of European history which, it is to be hoped, has been closed for good, highlights the importance of policies to combat discrimination in the EU,
- D. whereas the body of decisions taken by the European institutions seeks to establish equal rights as regards education for children and teenagers living in the EU, regardless of where they were born, where their parents and grandparents came from, or what particular legal framework applies to them,
- E. whereas the Presidency Conclusions of the Lisbon European Council of 23-24 March 2000 (whereby the number of 18- to 24-year-olds with only lower-secondary level education is to be halved by 2010) imply that education needs to be made generally accessible to the sons and daughters of immigrants, and schools must be ready to promote their integration without any form of discrimination,
- F. whereas the learning difficulties experienced by pupils whose families communicate in a language other than the one used at school are often combined with material, social, and psychological circumstances that militate against normal school achievement,
- G. whereas the linguistic separation between the family and school environments aggravates the tendency for pupils to drop out of school and for families to become isolated from the community, and linguistic integration must therefore start early, at preschool age; whereas the measures to be promoted to that end should enable the children of immigrants both to continue to develop their knowledge of their mother-tongue — since this is crucial for their future progress at school — and simultaneously to learn the languages of their respective host countries,
- H. whereas multilingual education is helping to foster understanding of differences from a cross-cultural perspective at a time when more and more young people of the second and third generation of immigrants are experiencing difficulties in coping with the many and varied dimensions that make up their identity,
- I. whereas the widespread use of a lingua franca in education systems sometimes dispenses pupils from the obligation to learn their mother tongue and study their native culture as soon as they start school,
- J. whereas European institutions are seeking to capitalise on the experiments in Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) ⁽¹⁾,
- K. whereas one means of translating educational objectives for immigrant communities into practice might be through bilateral agreements which, however, are generally subject to severe budgetary constraints, if not undermined by a lack of political will,
- L. whereas EU action has been brought to bear mainly in the areas of teacher training, youth exchanges and the organisation of seminars and studies; whereas this is nowhere near the sum total of measures that could serve to develop good practice and enable it to be applied across the board,

Rights of children in the school system and duties of the Member States

1. Believes that the school-age children of immigrants have a right to State education, irrespective of the legal status of their families, and that this right extends to learning the language of their host country, without prejudice to their right to learn their mother tongue;

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2. Believes that even when the children and/or descendants of immigrants (second and third generations) are proficient in the language of their host country, they should be given the opportunity to familiarise themselves with their mother tongue and the culture of their country of origin, without public funding being ruled out for that purpose;
3. Stresses that primary and secondary schools must provide educational support for immigrant children, especially when they are not proficient in the language of their host country, so as to enable them to adapt more easily and prevent them from finding themselves at a disadvantage compared with other children;
4. Maintains that the integration of immigrants at school must not adversely affect the development of the language of the education system, especially if that language is itself a minority language;
5. Urges the Member States to encourage educational establishments at the various levels to take measures ensuring linguistic diversity without the choice of alternatives to the official language being restricted to the most widely spoken European languages;
6. Urges the Member States to remove the teaching, administrative and legal obstacles which, as a result of language barriers, make it difficult to achieve the above objectives;
7. Considers that such measures must be taken in such a way as to ensure that immigrant children will not have a disproportionately heavy timetable compared with other pupils, and hence will be less likely to tend to refuse to attend extra study periods;

Role of the EU in promoting good practice

8. Supports the Commission's advocacy of education systems enabling pupils to learn two languages in addition to their mother tongue at an early age;
9. Takes note of the need to make use of different methods of promoting integration through multilingualism, such as the CLIL method, which is proven to be quite efficient both for learning the language and for the intercultural integration of children of different origins;
10. Calls on the Commission to increase its support for the specific training of teachers, particularly those who come from immigrants' countries of origin, interested in the development of various methods of promoting integration through multilingualism (e.g. CLIL or multilingual or mother-tongue literacy) and, under the Leonardo da Vinci, Youth and Socrates programmes (Comenius and Grundtvig projects), in widening the range of target languages to cover immigrants' mother tongues, bringing particular attention to bear on activities involving the sons and daughters of immigrants and the trainers and facilitators who work with immigrant communities;
11. Stresses that support should be channelled into educational projects which, over and above curriculum requirements, teach the language and culture of the host country to immigrants who are not of school age, and towards bridge-building projects to foster dialogue between the culture and history of the host region and the culture and history of immigrant communities; stresses also that consideration should be given especially to projects including persons with parental control, and mothers in particular;
12. Maintains that one way of translating the above policy into reality would be for the EU provide support for the setting-up of a European network of schools employing different methods to promote integration through multilingualism; believes that schools could apply to join such network, with the agreement of the authorities of the Member States, if they wished to implement educational and community projects to meet the learning, socialisation and cultural needs referred to above;
13. Recommends to the Commission that, under the 'transversal' lifelong learning programme, the 2007-2013 budget allocations make provision for support for the above initiatives;

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14. Maintains that the dissemination, by the education systems of host countries, of cultural works from immigrants' countries of origin must be a focus of special EU attention, whether to further foreign policy aims and the neighbourhood strategy or under Community programmes in the spheres of culture, education, youth or the media;

15. Calls on local authorities in the Member States to bear the above approach in mind in making their twinning decisions;

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16. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, and the governments and parliaments of the Member States.

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New challenges for the circus

European Parliament resolution on new challenges for the circus as part of European culture (2004/2266(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to its Resolution of 16 March 1984 on education for children whose parents have no fixed abode⁽¹⁾,
- having regard to Resolution of the Council and the Ministers of Education meeting within the Council of 22 May 1989 on school provision for children of occupational travellers⁽²⁾,
- having regard to Resolution of the Council and the Ministers of Education meeting within the Council of 22 May 1989 on school provision for gypsy and traveller children⁽³⁾,
- having regard to the Commission's reports on the implementation of measures envisaged in the Resolution of the Council and of the Ministers of Education meeting with the Council, 22nd May 1989 (COM(1996)0494 and COM(1996)0495),
- having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 of 9 December 1996 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein⁽⁴⁾,
- having regard to Council Directive 1999/22/EC of 29 March 1999 relating to the keeping of wild animals in zoos⁽⁵⁾,
- having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 539/2001 of 15 March 2001 listing the third countries whose nationals must be in possession of visas when crossing the external borders and those whose nationals are exempt from that requirement⁽⁶⁾,
- having regard to Commission Regulation (EC) No 1808/2001 of 30 August 2001⁽⁷⁾ laying down detailed rules concerning the implementation of Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97,
- having regard to Rule 45 of its Rules of Procedure,

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- A. whereas most cultural, education policy, technical and legal aspects of circus activities are regulated at Member State level rather than at Community level,
- B. whereas by and large there are no specific laws to regulate circus-related matters and, as a rule, the circus is subject to the laws governing other areas such as education, entertainment, infrastructure, transport, equipment, artists, mobility, public gatherings, fire safety and animal protection,
- C. whereas the fact that cross-border mobility is a main feature of circuses highlights the need to look at the status of the circus from a European point of view and to consider EU measures in this area,
- D. whereas owing to the mobility of circuses, the schooling of children in such travelling communities is problematic, since attendance at school must be regular, and whereas it would also be useful to promote and provide support for vocational training centres for circus professions, thus justifying the need for Europe-wide measures,
- E. whereas the integration of these children and their assimilation into European social and professional life must be effectively ensured,
- F. whereas it would be desirable for it to be recognised that the classical circus, including the presentation of animals, forms part of European culture;

Recognition of the circus as part of European culture

- 1. Calls on the Commission to introduce specific measures to ensure that the circus is recognised as part of European culture;
- 2. Urges the Member States who have not already done so to recognise the circus as part of European culture;

School education and vocational training

- 3. Calls on the Commission to draw up a study on the school education of children from travelling communities to bring the abovementioned 1996 report on implementation in the Member States of the Council Resolution of 22 May 1989 up to date and to submit the results of this study to the European Parliament within a year;
- 4. Urges the Commission, together with the organisations representing the parents of these children, to introduce mechanisms for the cooperation of the Member States in order to guarantee and promote an adequate education for children from travelling communities regardless of the Member State in which they happen to be; to this end, it would be useful to prepare a new Council resolution guaranteeing high-quality school education and vocational training for children, young people and adults in travelling communities and recognising and supporting the vocational training offered by circus schools;
- 5. Calls on the Commission, together with the Member States and the organisations representing the parents of these children, to make a commitment to improving the welcome extended to such families and to stepping up the dialogue with school establishments in order to raise parents' awareness of the need to enrol their children in school, with such establishments appointing someone to take charge of this communication and monitoring;
- 6. Calls on the Commission, in connection with the integrated action programme on life-long learning, to provide the necessary means, inter alia, for pilot projects to determine appropriate models for the schooling of children from travelling communities, notably as regards:
 - developing and supporting e-learning and distance learning projects as a component of a comprehensive education initiative for travelling communities;
 - developing concepts for independent/self-reliant learning;

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- developing concepts for school education, notably through the introduction of pedagogical monitoring tools;
- developing a teacher profile for tutoring children from travelling communities;
- Europe-wide exchange of information and experience for teaching staff tutoring travelling children;
- the introduction by the Member States working together with the Commission of a system for the regular assessment of scholastic attainment of children from travelling communities;
- the establishment of temporary measures to remedy the academic difficulties facing children from travelling communities;

7. Considers it at the same time necessary to provide support to enable a 'service point' to be established to coordinate a network linking all relevant bodies within the Union, and act as a point of contact for travelling communities seeking information on educational and vocational training requirements and opportunities;

8. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to carry out an information campaign to guarantee quality assurance in education and vocational training and to ensure that the education and vocational training of children from travelling communities are based on the standards applicable to conventional education and professional-training systems;

Temporary structures

9. Calls on the Commission, following consultations with the European circus community, to create a standardisation mandate for the European Committee for Standardisation (CEN) to prepare a comprehensive set of standards relevant to mobile circus facilities, including finalisation of current work on the Safety Standard for Temporary Structures (such as tents), to facilitate the movement of circuses among the Member States through harmonisation and thereby contribute to the conservation of the classical European circus and public safety;

10. Calls on the Member States to publish in a user-friendly way applicable requirements and then to adjust those requirements once standards are created;

Circus workers: mobility, employment of third country nationals

11. Calls on the Commission to carry out an analysis of the current visa and work permit issuing systems for peripatetic artists and on that basis to draw up a proposal for a European regulation in this area; such a European regulation should:

- take account of current difficulties in obtaining visas allowing for work permits and their current unreliability;
- eliminate existing requirements which are hard for artists with short-term contracts to meet (e.g. the requirement to prove a lack of equally-qualified people within the EU);
- provide the possibility of issuing short-term visas/residence permits valid for up to 12 months, taking due care to avoid any conceivable abuse of such a possibility in order to engage in human trafficking;

12. Considers that it would be desirable in this connection to draw up a uniform and comprehensible guide for the artists and the public administrative bodies concerned, explaining the new provisions;

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13. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.

 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Regional Development and the opinion of the Committee on Women's Rights and Gender Equality (A6-0272/2005),
- A. whereas towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas, where 78 % of the European Union population is concentrated, are:
- the place where both the most complex and the most common problems are concentrated (social exclusion, spatial and ethnic segregation, housing shortages, insecurity, drugs, pollution, contaminated former industrial sites, traffic, unemployment, lack of competitiveness, poverty, demographic changes, and so on),
 - the place where the future is built: universities, research centres, and so on,

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- B. whereas towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas, including small and medium-sized ones, are key players in regional and local development and in achieving the revised Lisbon and Gothenburg objectives,
 - C. having regard to the great disparities in terms of urban policy between the 25 Member States, particularly as a result of the enlargement to include 10 new Member States, which often have no clear and comprehensive urban policy at national or regional level,
 - D. whereas urban policy does not fall within the direct remit of the European Union; whereas, however, the European Union is responsible for policies which directly influence sustainable urban development: regional and cohesion policy, transport, the environment, employment and social affairs, research, the single market, competitiveness, and so on,
 - E. whereas towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas form part of regional territory, and hence sustainable urban development must be pursued in harmony with neighbouring suburban and rural areas,
 - F. whereas the problems of towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas simultaneously involve political decision-makers, civil society, economic and social actors and regional interest groups, including associations of towns and municipalities,
 - G. whereas an end must be put to resources being spread in an unsustainable way by the implementation of a clear and comprehensive approach which takes account of all the issues involved,
 - H. whereas the concept of sustainable urban development is defined as the contribution of towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas to growth, innovation and economic, social and territorial cohesion, which includes urban revitalisation, for example the renovation of urban transport infrastructure and urban housing with particular attention on revitalisation of prefabricated slab housing estates,
1. Is convinced that towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas, including small and medium-sized ones, have a central role to play in achieving the revised Lisbon and Gothenburg objectives;
 2. Calls for recognition of urban policy in general and calls on its Conference of Presidents of the European Parliament to propose an amendment to Annex VI to the Rules of Procedure on the subject of the areas of competence of the Committee on Regional Development with a view to incorporating the urban dimension specifically, in addition to regional and cohesion policy, in its objectives and competencies, taking account of the work of the other committees concerned (transport, environment, research, employment and social affairs, internal market, culture, and so on) in a horizontal approach;
 3. Calls on the Commission to move towards a horizontal application of the urban dimension and towards coordination between the departments of the Commission which are directly or indirectly concerned with urban issues, such as the Regional Policy, Enterprise and Industry, Competition, Energy and Transport, Employment, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities, Research, Environment, Education and Culture Directorates-General, adopting an approach based on identifying specific problems of the urban situation in each field of action and at the same time highlighting the positive impacts of those policies on local contexts, and therefore proposes the setting up of an interdepartmental task force along the lines of the Urban-housing intergroup in the European Parliament;
 4. Calls on the Council to hold an annual meeting of the ministers of the Member States with responsibility for urban policy;
 5. Calls on the Commission and Member States to announce the setting up, in parallel with the social dialogue and the civil dialogue, a 'spatial dialogue' which would enable regional and local authorities and their associations to take part in negotiations and decision-making relating to policies and measures in the urban sphere, particularly in the framework of cohesion policy and the management of the Structural Funds; calls in parallel for a high-level meeting to be held before each Spring Summit, in which, as well as the participants in the spatial dialogue, senior political representatives of the Council Presidency, the Commission, the European Parliament and the Committee of the Regions (representing towns and cities and urban agglomerations) would participate;

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6. Calls on the Commission to develop and propose models and tools for sustainable urban development which would be accessible to all towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas:

- (i) calls for development that respects the complexity of life-realities in the urban areas, regular updating and dissemination of data allowing better evaluation of the situation in towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas, as well as major support for the URBAN AUDIT programme;
- (ii) underlines the importance of promoting cooperation between towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas by expanding virtual and physical partnership networks for the exchange of best practice and experience, as well as through shared projects which would reinforce the cross-border, inter-regional and transnational dimension;
- (iii) calls for effective, efficient communication by means of promotional activities such as symposiums;
- (iv) calls for support for existing networks established by towns and cities, such as the European Urban Knowledge Network and Eurocities as well as for the continuation of those initiated by the Community, such as Urbact;

7. Recalls that urban policy development priorities must continue to be reinforced at Member State and regional level after enlargement, to include housing and revitalisation of urban areas, infrastructure, transport, tourism, the environment, waste disposal, water supply, culture, training, education, social care and health;

8. Therefore calls on national governments of Member States to deepen and formalise the dialogue with towns and their associations and assert the strategic and consultative approach to urban policy-making;

9. Stresses the importance of developing an integrated spatial and thematic urban policy on a human scale, with the drafting of a reference document containing guidelines for 'European urban models' such as indicated in the European Urban Charter of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe;

10. Calls for measures for greater involvement of the public in drafting the revitalisation and development plans for urban areas, given that a number of problems are caused by insufficient dialogue between the public and political representatives;

11. Recognises the need to strengthen the partnership between urban and rural areas, taking account of the emerging periurban areas between towns or cities and the countryside, in order ultimately to achieve territorial cohesion and balanced regional development;

12. Stresses that the urban perspective of Objective 2 should receive more attention in financial and territorial terms; considers that an important part of this perspective is the sound development of urban areas with problems associated with economic growth, social cohesion and environmental pollution;

13. Advocates the idea that the Structural and Cohesion Funds should be involved in sustainable urban development, and welcomes the incorporation of the urban dimension into the Structural and Cohesion Funds; calls, nevertheless, on the Commission to ensure that intervention in towns and cities and urban agglomerations or areas is strengthened by comparison with that provided for in the current rules by clearly identifying the urban dimension in the framework of the strategic follow-up report (as provided for in Articles 27 and 28 of the proposal for a Council Regulation laying down general provisions on the European Regional Development Fund, the European Social Fund and the Cohesion Fund) and the establishment of monitoring; calls on the Commission to pay specific attention to the role of towns and cities in drawing up the reports on the impact of cohesion policy on the achievement of the revised goals of the Lisbon agenda;

14. Takes the view that urban planning should take account of the specific nature of European cities in demographic and quality-of-life terms, incorporating a wide spectrum of policies and opportunities involving citizens and, in particular, young people and women, with a view to ensuring people-friendly cities in terms of transport, economic activity, the environment, planning, social policy, public health, migration policy, social integration, housing, more nursery facilities and health centres for the elderly, higher safety standards, and so on and to encouraging solidarity between generations; considers that the development of this strategy should be accompanied by systematic gender mainstreaming throughout;

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15. Calls on local authorities in urban areas to encourage the participation of women in civic life;
 16. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.
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Women and poverty in the EU

European Parliament resolution on women and poverty in the European Union (2004/2217(INI))

The European Parliament,

- having regard to United Nations General Assembly Resolutions A/RES/46/121, A/RES/47/134 and A/RES/49/179 on human rights and extreme poverty, A/RES/47/196 on observance of an international day for the eradication of poverty and A/RES/50/107 on observance of the International Year for the Eradication of Poverty and proclamation of the first United Nations Decade for the Eradication of Poverty,
- having regard to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which was adopted by the UN General Assembly in its Resolution 217A(III) of 10 December 1948,
- having regard to United Nations Economic and Social Council documents E/CN.4/Sub.2/1996/13, E/CN.4/1987/NGO/2, E/CN.4/1987/SR.29 and E/CN.4/1990/15 on human rights and extreme poverty, E/CN.4/1996/25 on the right to development and E/CN.4/SUB.2/RES/1996/25 on the realisation of economic, social and cultural rights,
- having regard to the report of the Fourth World Conference on Women in 1995 and the Beijing Platform for Action programme,
- having regard to the work of the Council of Europe in this area and in particular the revised European Social Charter,
- having regard to its resolution of 4 October 2001 on the United Nations World Day to Overcome Extreme Poverty ⁽¹⁾,
- having regard to its resolution of 24 February 1994 on poverty among women in Europe ⁽²⁾,
- having regard to the Community acquis in the field of women's rights and gender equality,
- having regard to Articles 136, 137(1) and 141(3) of the Treaty establishing the European Community and especially point (j) of Article 137(1) concerning the combating of social exclusion,
- having regard to the Presidency Conclusions of the European Council meeting in Nice on 7, 8 and 9 December 2000, Annex I to which contains a call to 'Ensure a follow-up to the 1992 recommendation on minimum guaranteed resources to be provided by social protection systems' and also to the Presidency Conclusions of the European Council meeting in Santa Maria da Feira on 19 and 20 June 2000, especially the agreement that indicators should be defined as common references in the fight against social exclusion and the eradication of poverty,
- having regard to Council Recommendation 92/442/EEC of 27 July 1992 on the convergence of social protection objectives and policies ⁽³⁾,
- having regard to the Social Protection Committee's Report on Indicators in the field of poverty and social inclusion (October 2000),

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- having regard to the revised common objectives for the second round of National Action Plans 'Fight against poverty and social exclusion', 25 November 2002 (SOC 508) and also to the Commission's draft joint Report on Social Protection and Social Inclusion (COM(2005)0014),
 - having regard to its position of 14 May 2002 on the proposal for a European Parliament and Council regulation on Community statistics on income and living conditions (EU-SILC) ⁽¹⁾,
 - having regard to Rule 45 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - having regard to the report of the Committee on Women's Rights and Gender Equality (A6-0273/2005),
- A. whereas the leitmotif of the World Day to Overcome Extreme Poverty (17 October) is 'Wherever men and women are condemned to live in extreme poverty, human rights are violated. To come together to ensure that these rights are respected is our solemn duty',
- B. whereas it is essential to promote the emergence of a new Europe based on the creative coexistence of cultures and mentalities and full respect for otherness, in which the concept of responsible freedom does not cover solely the free movement of capital and in which citizens pool their abilities irrespective of their social status so as to harness the creativity and protect the dignity of each citizen for the common good, both in the East and in the West,
- C. whereas in 17 Member States the risk of extreme poverty amongst women greatly exceeds the risk of extreme poverty amongst men,
- D. whereas new forms of poverty and marginalisation exist, in response to which specific, innovative measures must be adopted in order to assist those in need,
- E. whereas the longer the period of living in poverty with a particularly low income, the greater the risk of falling into a state of permanent economic privation and social exclusion; whereas, therefore, measures to combat poverty should not simply aim to help those who are already living in extreme economic deprivation but should also seek promptly to prevent and tackle factors which lead citizens into extreme economic and social deprivation,
- F. whereas, the link between the Beijing Platform for Action and the Lisbon Strategy being obvious, the need to utilise the productive potential of the European labour force is a key to achieving the overall Beijing and Lisbon Strategy goals,
- G. whereas less attention has been paid to the eradication of poverty and the social aspects of the Lisbon Strategy than to price stability, cost-cutting and the budget deficit,
- H. whereas in the Member States the proportion of children and young people living in extreme poverty is higher than average, and whereas extreme poverty is more prevalent among women,
- I. whereas although globalisation and computerisation have brought greater economic opportunities and autonomy to some women, many others have been marginalised and deprived of the benefits of this process, owing to the related inequalities among and within countries,
- J. whereas poverty is often closely associated with racial discrimination and related intolerance and these practices worsen the conditions of poverty, marginality and social and economic exclusion of women in minority groups,
- K. whereas employment itself does not constitute adequate protection against extreme poverty; whereas, mainly as a consequence of occupational segregation, more women than men work in lower-paid jobs, whilst it is often the case that social-security payments alone offer no protection against extreme poverty either,

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- L. whereas the wage gap between men and women in Europe is still on average between 16 % and 33 %; whereas there has not been any real progress made with regard to the implementation of the principle of equal pay for work of equal value, which was introduced 30 years ago through Council Directive 75/117/EEC ⁽¹⁾ on equal pay for men and women, and whereas, compared with 6,6 % of men, 30 % of working women in the EU have a part-time job, a choice often forced on them by a lack of affordable childcare facilities,
- M. whereas female-headed households earn from 9 % to 26 % less than their male counterparts, with the UK (26 %) leading, followed by Sweden (14 %), France (12 %), the Netherlands (11 %), Germany (10 %) and Italy (9 %),
- N. whereas a job constitutes both a source of income and a means of social integration for families and individuals living in poverty, since, apart from providing financial support, it promotes the participation of the individual in society as a whole and helps to develop the individual's personality; whereas a job does not suffice for the purpose of developing citizenship,
- O. whereas the risk of poverty and extreme deprivation also affects people over the age of 65; whereas two thirds of the population over the age of 65 in Europe are women; whereas the failings of insurance and pension schemes affect those in the weakest position on the labour market, such as women, who work for fewer years, are paid less than men or even perform unpaid work,
- P. whereas the number of single-parent families has increased in recent years; whereas members of those families run a considerably greater risk of falling into poverty; whereas, moreover, 85 % of single-parent households are headed by a woman, which highlights even more the disadvantaged position of women in relation to poverty,
- Q. whereas poverty among women cannot be eradicated unless due consideration is given to the role of men in the open coordination method and in national plans for employment and social inclusion,
- R. whereas the problem of domestic violence against women impairs their mental health, leaves them socially isolated and reduces their job performance, which has an adverse impact on their position in their workplace; whereas, moreover, a large percentage of homeless women have left their family home because of the violence inflicted on them and have reached the borderline of extreme social deprivation and poverty,
- S. whereas women who are members of ethnic or religious minorities suffer double discrimination because of their gender and their origin or religion, which very often prevents them from finding a job; whereas, as a result of this situation, these women either live as dependants on their spouses in extreme poverty or are forced to work illegally without social security and in atrocious working conditions,

Indicators and methodology

1. Stresses that poverty and social exclusion cannot be understood solely in economic terms, on the basis of figures, but must also be understood in terms of human rights;
2. Points out that poverty has various manifestations, including a lack of income and productive resources sufficient to ensure a sustainable livelihood, hunger and malnutrition, ill-health, limited or non-existent access to education and other basic services, increasing mortality from illness, homelessness and inadequate housing, unsafe environments and social discrimination and exclusion; points out in this context that it is also characterised by a lack of participation in decision-making and in civil, social and cultural life;
3. Refers to the Presidency Conclusions of the Barcelona European Council, which commit the Member States to eliminating obstacles to the participation of women in the labour market and to introducing by 2010 childcare for at least 90 % of children between three years old and the mandatory school age, and for at least 33 % of children under three years old; stresses, however, that in order to achieve these objectives, the national, regional or local authorities must step up their financial contribution to the creation and/or operation of high-quality childcare services at affordable prices;

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4. Welcomes the Luxembourg Presidency's initiatives regarding the development of gender-specific indicators, and calls on the UK Presidency to continue with this work;
5. Stresses that extreme poverty gives rise to trafficking in women, to prostitution, to violence and more generally to exploitation of all kinds; calls for these consequences of poverty also to be taken into account in the open coordination method and in the Social Policy Agenda;
6. Recognises that the principle of free movement of capital and goods will not, in itself, enable poverty to be eradicated and that chronic poverty (especially persistent poverty) deprives those affected of opportunities and prevents them from fully taking part in the life of their community, particularly by making them indifferent to their surroundings;
7. Calls on the Commission and Council to take steps without delay to recognise the informal economy and to quantify the 'economics of life' using gender-specific approaches;
8. Calls accordingly for Eurostat and its counterparts in the Member States to develop, in close cooperation with representatives of those who can understand the experience of living in extreme poverty, a methodology and indicators broken down by gender, with a view to measuring the impact of poverty and social exclusion on women and on men;
9. Recommends that, on the basis of gender-related statistics, a study be carried out into the effects which the economic and political transformation undergone by the new Member States has had on the actual situation regarding equality between men and women;
10. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to keep records of the cases of women who belong to minority groups and who work with no social security and pension rights, and to help them integrate smoothly into the labour market;

Partnership with the poorest women

11. Deplores the fact that, despite the political will shown to combat poverty and social exclusion through Community strategies, particularly the Lisbon Strategy and the Social Policy Agenda, the Union has failed adequately to tackle the issue of the feminisation of poverty;
12. Calls for measures to promote at all levels of the decision-making process a close partnership with the poorest women and families, so that the means and resources suited to combating chronic poverty effectively and to eradicating social exclusion can be drawn from their experience;
13. Calls for assessments to be made of the impact of all Community legislative measures on the lives of the most disadvantaged groups, with specific reference to women;
14. Calls, in order to make the above-mentioned partnership possible, on all the institutions concerned to adjust the open coordination method and the operational framework for the Social Policy Agenda to the needs of women in situations of poverty;
15. Calls on the Commission and the Member States to involve social partners at local and regional level, whose members include rural women living on the edge of poverty, in social dialogue on the development and implementation of policy concerning education, employment and pension schemes;
16. Calls on the Council and Commission to cooperate closely with the Council of Europe in order to draw on the large amount of work it has performed in this area, and to forward detailed reports on such cooperation to the Parliament on a regular basis;
17. Calls on all its parliamentary committees to consider the issue of poverty within their own terms of reference, particularly as it affects women, and to base their deliberations on the experience of the Parliament's European Fourth World Committee intergroup;

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Balancing family life and work by those living in poverty

18. Stresses that access to high-quality employment, including reasonable and fair remuneration, is the only way to avoid and combat poverty; at the same time, points out that part-time work and low-quality employment, which affect mostly women, contribute to the increase of women amongst poor workers; points out that this is a source of social exclusion;

19. Recognises the direct link between economic inequality and female dependency and the inequalities still existing between men and women in terms of access to education, family responsibilities and the general upkeep of a family, and expresses indignation at the fact that (despite legislation which has been in existence for decades yet is still ineffective) the pay gap between the two sexes stood at 16 % in 2001 and 15 % in 2003; calls accordingly on the Council and Commission to draw up a Green Paper on the matter and to take appropriate steps to put an end to this iniquity;

20. Stresses that unpaid work, which is mainly performed by women, is not systematically recorded in national statistics and is, therefore, not taken into account when employment policy is drawn up by the competent national and Community bodies; calls, therefore, on the Commission and the Member States to compile data relating to unpaid jobs with a view to promoting measures for a fairer distribution of those jobs, which will enable women to take part in the labour market to a greater extent and will also strengthen their economic position and independence;

21. Calls on the Member States to take targeted action to ensure that women in a disadvantaged environment have fair access to public health systems⁽¹⁾ — in particular to primary health care (including the protection of mothers and children) as defined by the World Health Organisation⁽²⁾ — and also to gynaecological and obstetric health care, decent housing, justice, education, training, life-long learning, sport and culture, to prevent the premature abandonment of schooling and facilitate a smooth transition from school to the labour market, and calls on the Commission and Council to integrate the gender dimension in the annual reports on social cohesion;

22. Calls on the Member States to take further concrete steps to develop strategies to increase the net participation of women of all ages in the labour market and in decision making, to encourage a gender mainstreaming approach in order to realise the general Lisbon objectives, to handle the differences in pay and to promote working conditions and quality that enable both women and men to participate fully in the labour market;

23. Calls on the Member States to take action to ensure fair access by men and women to social security and pension systems, while allowing for career breaks and part-time working, and to ensure that in pension-insurance subsystems the principle of equal treatment and social justice is applied consistently, in informal sectors, in order to guard against the pauperisation of the elderly, with specific reference to women, and calls on the Commission and Council to integrate the gender dimension in the annual reports on social cohesion;

24. Points out that in most Member States, social welfare systems do not take sufficient account of the specific conditions of women living in poverty; stresses that the risk of falling into poverty is greater for women than for men, particularly in old age, where social security systems are based on the principle of continuous remunerated employment; points out that in some cases, women do not fulfil this requirement because of interruptions to their work and that they are penalised because of discrimination on the labour market, in particular because of the wage gap and part-time work; stresses moreover that older women also face greater obstacles to re-entry into labour market;

25. Calls on the Member States to ensure that appropriate social security is available for women responsible for the care of sick, elderly or disabled members of their families, and for elderly women who receive a particularly low pension;

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26. Calls on the Member States to analyse, in close cooperation with research units and the groups concerned (women, families, entrepreneurs, local authorities and associations), the real needs of women and men in a disadvantaged environment, so as to enable them effectively to balance work and family life, while showing due respect for otherness and gender-specific differences, and calls on the Commission and Council to integrate the gender dimension in the annual reports on social cohesion;

27. Calls on the Member States to devise effective ways of fostering a balance between work and family life for men and fathers as well, with due respect for their national legislation, given that the increased participation by women in the labour market has not been accompanied by a commensurate increase in male involvement in family responsibilities;

28. Calls on the Member States to adopt additional support measures, especially for working mothers who are members of single-parent families, either by making it easier to find forms of employment with flexible working hours so that they can meet their more extensive family commitments, or by providing suitable childcare facilities;

29. Calls on the Member States to develop appropriate measures to support teenage mothers, who often have difficulty finding jobs and live in poverty owing to their frequently low level of education and to social prejudices; considers, moreover, that it would be very useful in this context for Member States to exchange methods and practices, with the emphasis on the practices which various Member States have pursued in the field of preventing teenage pregnancies;

30. Calls for a ban on removing children from their families for socio-economic reasons and for measures to be devised and implemented in close cooperation with groups concerned that will enable people living in poverty to start a family, so as to ensure that both parents are able fully to exercise their parental responsibility, particularly in situations of chronic poverty;

31. Calls on the Member States to take the necessary measures to ensure the due recording, analysis and study of the factors which lead to domestic violence so that policies can be developed immediately to prevent and deal with the consequences of such violence, such as providing shelter for homeless women who are victims of domestic violence;

Contribution of civil society

32. Commends the daily struggle by the poorest women against extreme poverty and the work performed by those who assist and support them on a voluntary basis;

33. Calls upon the Member States to make a greater effort to improve the availability of social services, in view of the fact that the availability of high-quality social services providing care for children and other family members determines whether or not the groups which are at greatest risk (i.e. women who are the heads of single-parent families) are able to work;

34. Pays tribute to the work of NGOs which are committed to working with the most disadvantaged groups on a long-term basis;

35. Calls on the Commission substantially to simplify the eligibility criteria imposed on NGOs and the procedures for obtaining European grants, so as to guard against the monopolies on grants that large NGO networks based in Brussels tend to have;

36. Stresses the importance of the European Economic and Social Committee to structured social dialogue, and calls on it to continue to host Fourth World People's Universities meetings, which provide a forum for genuine dialogue between the poorest groups and EU administrators, elected representatives at all levels and representatives of organised civil society, with the special aim of enabling members of the most disadvantaged groups to share viewpoints and to contribute to overcoming extreme poverty, which provides a concrete example of the very best practice at European level in this area;

37. Stresses the importance of Europe's local and regional authorities in the promotion of equality between the sexes, and urges them to include gender policy in their decentralised-cooperation projects, so as to provide poor women in particular with access to new information technologies and to micro-financing with which to fund commercial activities;

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38. Calls on the Commission and Council to assess the EU's contribution to the first United Nations Decade for the Eradication of Poverty (1997-2006) and its impact within Europe, with particular attention to partnership with the poorest groups and with specific reference to women, and to submit proposals for future action to build on the impetus built up over this first decade;

39. Calls on institutions at all levels to involve themselves closely in the celebrations for the World Day to Overcome Extreme Poverty (17 October);

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40. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission and Council, the parliaments of the Member States, the Council of Europe, the UN Ecosoc and social-sector NGOs.

Rheumatic diseases

European Parliament declaration on rheumatic diseases

The European Parliament,

— having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,

- A. whereas there are over 100 million people of all age groups in the EU with arthritis, and whereas arthritis constitutes the greatest single cause of physical disability,
- B. whereas effective research will foster new therapies for rheumatic diseases, bringing enormous savings to the EU economy and to Member States,
- C. whereas rheumatic diseases can be serious, disabling and painful, and whereas people affected frequently experience social exclusion and reduced life expectancy,
- D. whereas people with rheumatic diseases can lead full and independent lives but require appropriate support,

1. Calls on the Commission and Council to:

- ensure that the EU's 7th Research Framework Programme makes rheumatic diseases one of its explicit priorities;
- ensure that the EU's new health strategy makes arthritis (musculoskeletal disorders) one of its priorities;
- strengthen legislation to outlaw disability discrimination through a specific Disability Directive;
- encourage Member States to take measures to ensure better access to the full range of treatments in all Member States;

2. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the Council, the Commission and the governments of the Member States;
