Re:

First, application for annulment of the implied decision rejecting the applicant's request for a copy of the consignment note relating to the dispatch of his personal effects from Angola to Italy and, second, an application for damages.

Operative part of the order

1. *There is no need to adjudicate on the claims for annulment;*
2. *The claims for compensation are rejected as manifestly unfounded;*
3. *Mr Marcuccio shall bear his own costs and all the costs incurred by the Commission of the European Communities.*

Operative part of the order

**Action brought on 28 September 2007 — Bernard v
Europol**

(Case F-99/07)

Language of the case: Dutch

Parties

Applicant: Marjorie Bernard (Woerden, Netherlands) (represented by: P. de Casparis, lawyer)

Defendant: European Police Office (Europol)

Form of order sought

- Annul the decision of 26 June 2007, notified on 28 June 2007, concerning the complaint, and the assessments of 5 February 2007 and 25 July 2007;
- Order Europol:
 - to grant the applicant an increase in monthly salary with effect from 1 September 2006, together with interest;
 - to pay damages in the amount of EUR 7 500 net;
- Order Europol to pay the costs.

Pleas in law and main arguments

The present proceedings relate to the assessment of the applicant's work during the period from 1 September 2005 to 31 August 2006. The applicant's work was assessed as a '2', which corresponds to the criterion 'does not entirely meet the standard required'.
