The President proposed moving to the vote on the Roubatis report (A4-0409/98) provided that the I-EDN Group would agree to withdraw its request for a roll-call vote on am. 2; Mr Fabre-Aubrespy, however, refused to do so on behalf of the I-EDN Group.

As the voting system was now working again, the President continued the votes as planned.
